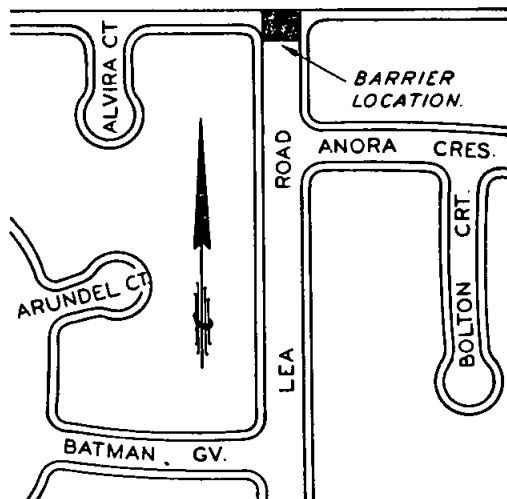

WELLINGTON ROAD



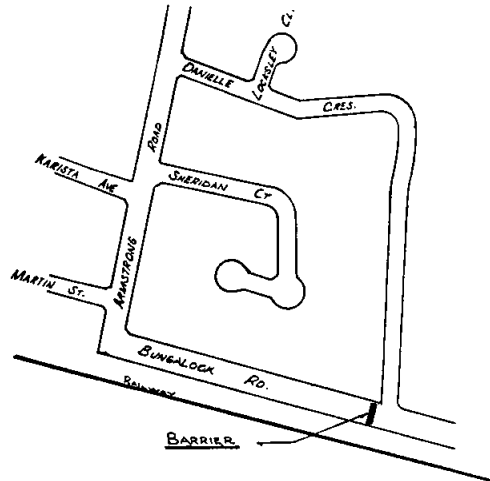

DETERMINATION OF LIQUOR CONTROL COMMISSION

No. 2 OF 1978

The Liquor Control Commission, pursuant to powers conferred upon it by Section 11A *Liquor Control Act 1968* as amended, hereby determines the prices below which licensed persons may not sell and dispose of packaged beer to unlicensed persons in the State of Victoria.

By this determination, the Liquor Control Commission determines different prices for different types and sizes of packaged beer and different prices at which packaged beer may be sold in different parts of Victoria as set out in the table hereunder. The different parts of Victoria in respect of which different prices are hereby determined are referred to as "METROPOLITAN AREA", "COUNTRY AREAS" Groups 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 and "SPECIAL AREA GROUP 1", respectively, in the said table. The areas referred to in the said table are defined by reference to municipal districts or subdivisions within the meaning of the *Local Government Act 1958* as amended.

"METROPOLITAN AREA" means the municipal districts of Altona, Box Hill, Brighton, Broadmeadows, Brunswick, Bulla, Camberwell, Caulfield, Chelsea, Coburg, Collingwood, Croydon, Dandenong, Diamond Valley, Doncaster and Templestowe, Eltham, Essendon, Fitzroy, Footscray, Hawthorn, Heidelberg, Keilor, Kew, Knox, Malvern, Melbourne, Melton, Moorabbin, Mordialloc, Northcote, Nunawading, Oakleigh, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Preston, Richmond, Ringwood, Sandringham, South Melbourne, Springvale, St. Kilda, Sunshine, Waverley, Whittlesea, Williamstown, and the subdivision of the municipal district of Werribee known as the East Riding.

"COUNTRY AREA GROUP ONE" means the municipal districts of Bacchus Marsh, Bannockburn, Berwick, Broadford, Corio, Cranbourne, Frankston, Geelong, Geelong West, Gisborne, Kilmore, Mornington, Lilydale, Newham and Woodend, Newton, Pakenham, Romsey, Sherbrooke, Upper Yarra and Werribee, save and except the subdivision of the municipal district of Werribee known as the East Riding.

"COUNTRY AREA GROUP TWO" means the municipal districts of Ballan, Ballarat City, Bendigo, Barrabool, Bass, Bellarine, Buln Buln, Castlemaine, Colac, Colac City, Daylesford and Glenlyon, Eaglehawk Borough, Euroa, Flinders, Goulburn, Hastings, Healesville, Korumburra, Kyneton, Melvor, Maldon, Maryborough City, Metcalfe, Moe, Morwell, Narracan, Newstead, Phillip Island, Pyalong, Queenscliffe Borough, Ripon, Seymour, South Barwon, Strathfieldsaye, Talbot and Clunes, Traralgon, Traralgon City, Tullaroop, Violet Town, Warragul, Wonthaggi Borough, Winchelsea, Yallourn and Yea.

"COUNTRY AREA GROUP THREE" means the municipal districts of Alberton, Alexandra, Ararat, Ararat City, Avon, Bairnsdale, Bairnsdale Town, Ballarat, Beechworth, Belfast, Benalla, Benalla City, Bet Bet, Bright, Bungaree, Buninyong, Camperdown Town, Charlton, Chiltern, Cobram, Cohuna, Creswick, Deakin, Donald, Dunmunkle, East Loddon, Echuca City, Gordon, Grenville, Hamilton City, Hampden, Heytesbury, Horsham City, Huntly, Kara Kara, Kerang, Kerang Borough, Koroit Borough, Korong, Kyabram Town, Leigh, Lexton, Maffra, Marong, Minhamite, Mirboo, Mortlake, Mt. "COUNTRY AREA GROUP FOUR" means the municipal district of Arapiles except that part of the said municipal district which is within the Parish of Bungalally, the municipal districts of Avoca, Birchip, Dimboola, Dundas, Glenelg, Kaniva, Karkaroc, Lowan, Mansfield, Portland, Portland City, Swan Hill, Swan Hill City, Tambo, Wannon, Warracknabeal, Wycheproof and Yackandandah.

"COUNTRY AREA GROUP FIVE" means the municipal districts of Kowree, Omeo, Orbost, Tallangatta, Upper Murray and Walpeup.

"SPECIAL AREA GROUP ONE" means the municipal districts of Mildura and Mildura City.

1. This By-law is known as the Proceedings of Council By-law.

2. By-law No. 163 of the Shire of Lillydale is hereby repealed.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

DEFINITIONS

4. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“Committee” means a standing committee or an occasional committee of the Council and to the extent applicable, includes the Council in committee of the whole.

“Officer” means an officer appointed by the Council.

Division 1—REGULATIONS APPLYING TO ORDINARY MEETINGS OF COUNCIL ONLY

Business

5. No business shall be conducted at an ordinary meeting of the Council unless it is business of which notice has been given either by inclusion in the agenda or in any report accompanying the same or as provided for in clauses 9 and 10 hereof.

Agenda

6. A copy of the agenda of business for any ordinary meeting of the Council shall be posted or delivered to every Councillor of the Shire, not later than 96 hours before the time fixed for the holding of the meeting.

Order of Business

7. After the reading of the opening prayer and the confirmation of the minutes and the signing thereof, the business of an ordinary meeting of the Council shall be as follows or as near to as may be practicable but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

AGENDA

1. Apologies and Requests for Leave of absence.
2. Declarations by Councillors of any direct or indirect pecuniary interest in any item on the agenda.
3. Correspondence—dealing with and ordering thereon.
4. Reception and reading of Petitions, Joint letters and memorials.
5. Presentation of reports by:—
 - (i) President
 - (ii) Committees of Council
 - (iii) Councillors
 - (iv) Officers
6. Questions with/without notice:—
 - (i) Submitted by members of the public
 - (ii) Submitted by Councillors
7. Items for Sealing:—
 - (i) Subdivisions
 - (ii) Other documents
8. Orders of the Day (including matters deferred or continuing from proceedings of a former meeting):
9. Motions for which previous notice has been given.
10. Consideration of matters of Delegation.
11. Urgent Business.

Correspondence

8. The Municipal Clerk shall determine what inwards correspondence should be placed before the Council for its decision or information.

Notice of Motion

9. No Councillor shall propose a motion initiating a subject for discussion at an ordinary meeting of the Council (being a matter not listed in the agenda) except by giving notice as prescribed in clause 10 hereof.

10. (a) Every notice of motion shall be in writing and dated and be given by the intending mover to the Municipal Clerk at the close of a meeting or at such other times as will permit the Municipal Clerk to give notice thereof in the manner and in the time required for a special meeting.

(b) A notice of motion to revoke a previous resolution of the Council—

(i) shall be given to the Municipal Clerk as provided in section 185 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and in sufficient time to enable him to give seven clear days' notice to all Councillors;

(ii) shall be deemed to have been withdrawn if the motion is not moved at the next meeting of the Council at which such business may be transacted; and

(iii) if it is a second or subsequent notice to revoke an earlier resolution, shall not be accepted by the Municipal Clerk until a period of one month has elapsed after the date of the meeting at which the first or last motion of revocation was dealt with.

11. The Municipal Clerk shall number notices of motion when received and enter them in a Notice of Motion book in the order in which they have been received.

12. Should a Councillor who has given notice of motion—

(a) be absent from the meeting; or

(b) fail to move the motion when called upon by the Chairman—

then any other Councillor may himself move the motion forthwith, or move to defer consideration thereof.

13. Except by leave of the Council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Municipal Clerk in the Notice of Motion book and, if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

Petitions, Joint Letters, Memorials

14. A petition or a joint letter—

(i) Shall be in any legible and permanent form of writing, typing or printing;

(ii) shall not be defamatory, indecent, abusive or objectionable in language or substance; and

(iii) shall not relate to a matter beyond the powers of the Council.

15. (a) Every page of a petition or joint letter shall bear the wording of the whole of the petition or request.

(b) Any signature appearing on a page which does not bear the wording of the whole of the petition or request, shall not be considered by the Council.

(c) Every page of a petition or joint letter shall be a single piece of paper and shall not be pasted, stapled, pinned or otherwise affixed to any piece of paper other than another page of the petition.

16. Any person appending to a petition or joint letter, a signature purporting to be that of any other person or in the name of any other person is guilty of an offence.

17. (a) No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover at some previous meeting has submitted a draft of same.

(b) No motion, except that of receiving same shall be made on any petition, memorial or like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Council after that at which it has been presented. Provided that this restriction shall not apply where the Council determines by a two-thirds majority of those present that the matter is one of urgency and should be dealt with at the meeting at which it is presented.

(c) No petition shall be presented after the Council has proceeded to the next item of Business.

18. Every Councillor presenting a petition to the Council shall state the names of the persons from whom it comes, the number of signatures attached to it, the material allegations contained in it, and the prayer thereof. He may also speak to the petition.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

19. The Municipal Clerk shall cause a report of each Committee Meeting to be prepared and presented to the next Ordinary Meeting of the Council.

20. Meetings of all proceedings of Committee shall be entered in the Committees' Minute Book and signed by the Chairman of the Committee who shall present the Report to the Ordinary Meeting of the Council.

21. Committee Reports presented to Council shall be submitted in two parts—

- (a) a summary of items and recommendations therein where the decision is to be made by the Council and
- (b) a schedule of decisions made and acted upon by the Committee in the exercise of any power delegated it by the Council.

22. (a) The Council may adopt the whole of the recommendations made by a Committee pursuant to clause 22 (a) hereof and contained in its report or may adopt such recommendations other than that of those specified and may vary or reject any specified recommendations.

(b) The Council shall formally ratify the decisions made by a Committee and included in its report pursuant to clause 22 (b) hereof.

23. Upon the adoption of the Report by the Council each recommendation contained in the Report as adopted, each decision made and acted upon, shall be treated in Law as being a resolution of the Council.

QUESTIONS WITH AND WITHOUT NOTICE

24. Every Councillor present at every Ordinary Meeting of the Council shall be given the opportunity of asking questions either with or without notice of any Councillor present or any member of the Council's staff, and if such questions to such officers cannot be answered then it shall be incumbent upon the Municipal Clerk to ascertain the answer thereto in order that it may be read by the Chairman at the next Ordinary Meeting of the Council.

25. Questions upon Notice shall be notified to the Municipal Clerk at least six days before the time fixed for holding of the next Ordinary Meeting of the Council.

26. All questions and answers shall be as brief as possible and discussion on any question or answer may be allowed only at the discretion of the Chairman.

27. A question may be disallowed by the Chairman upon the ground that it—

- (a) relates to a matter ultra vires the Council
- (b) is defamatory, indecent, abusive or objectionable in language or obscene
- (c) is repetitive of a question already answered whether at the same or an earlier Meeting
- (d) is asked to embarrass a fellow Councillor or the Officer concerned.

28. (a) Members of the public present in the gallery shall also be permitted to ask questions of the Council by submission of their question in writing prior to commencement of the meeting.

(b) Such questions shall be either answered, placed on Notice or disallowed in accordance with section 27 of this By-law insofar as it is applicable.

CONSIDERATION OF MATTERS OF DELEGATION

29. It shall be competent for any Committee or for the Municipal Clerk to submit for consideration by the Council the delegation (with or without direction or limitation) of any matter or class of matter to a Committee or to an Officer, as the Council may resolve.

URGENT BUSINESS

30. Business shall only be dealt with at any ordinary meeting of the Council in accordance with clauses 5 and 9 of these Regulations provided that the Council may resolve by a two-thirds majority of those present to admit (without the required notice) an item considered to be urgent business and of significant import to warrant consideration but not being a matter where the law requires that notice shall be given.

DIVISION 2—REGULATIONS APPLYING TO SPECIAL MEETINGS ONLY

Business

31. (a) No business shall be transacted at a special meeting except such as is stated in the notice thereof.

(b) Officers of the Council and persons engaged by the Council to advise it and members of the public may attend a special meeting of the Council, unless the Council otherwise resolves.

(c) The order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

Division 3—REGULATIONS APPLYING TO MEETINGS OF COMMITTEES OF THE COUNCIL ONLY

Business

32. No business shall be conducted at any Committee meeting of the Council unless it is business of which notice has been given by inclusion in the agenda or any report accompanying such or is regarded as a matter of urgency and of significant import to be considered by the Committee and such, is resolved by a two-thirds majority of those present.

Committee Meetings

33. The Council shall, at its Statutory Meeting each year, resolve upon the dates on which its Standing Committees shall meet, and the Municipal Clerk shall convene every Committee in accordance with such dates.

Attendance at Meetings

34. Members of the public shall not be admitted to meetings of any committee of the Council, unless the Council or the Committee otherwise resolves.

Correspondence

35. The Municipal Clerk shall determine whether any items of inwards correspondence should be placed before the Committee for its information or recommendation.

DIVISION 4—REGULATIONS APPLYING TO ALL ORDINARY AND SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETINGS AND TO ALL COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Procedure

36. In all cases not otherwise provided for herein, resort shall be had to the rules, forms and usages of Parliament which shall be followed, so far as the same are applicable, to the proceedings of the Council and its Committees.

Minutes

37. The minutes of any meeting of the Council (including a special meeting) shall, unless confirmed at such meeting, be confirmed at the next meeting of the Council.

38. Where minutes are to be confirmed at the next meeting of the Council the first item of business thereat shall be—

- (a) where a copy of the minutes of the previous meeting has been delivered to each Councillor at least 96 hours prior to the meeting, the putting of a motion for confirmation of the minutes without the reading of same; or
- (b) if a copy of the minutes of such previous meeting has not been so delivered the reading of and the putting of a motion for the confirmation of such minutes provided that no discussion shall be permitted on such minutes except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

Motions to be in Writing

39. (a) Where so required by the Chairman, the mover of any motion at any meeting of the Council or a Committee of the Council shall reduce such motion into writing.

(b) Every motion shall be so worded that the meaning is clear and unambiguous and shall not be defamatory or objectionable in language or nature.

Addressing Meeting

40. Any Councillor desirous of moving a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman and, subject to clauses 41

and 47 hereof, shall not be interrupted unless called to order when he shall sit down until the Councillor calling to order has been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the Councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

Moving Motions or Amendments

41. (a) Any Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the meeting thereon.

(b) Before the proposer speaks to a motion or amendment the Chairman shall call for a seconder. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote until it be seconded except that a Councillor may require the enforcement of any standing order of the Council by drawing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

(c) By proposing or seconding a motion or amendment, a Councillor shall not be deemed to have spoken to the motion or amendment.

(d) Upon the seconding of any motion or amendment, the Chairman shall call upon the mover to address the meeting. Thereafter the seconder shall be entitled to speak after which the Chairman shall call upon any Councillor who wishes to speak in opposition and, if no Councillor speaks in opposition, the Chairman may put the motion. If the motion is not then put, any other Councillor may be called upon to speak.

Debate

42. Any Councillor, except the mover or seconder of the original motion, may propose or second an amendment. Any Councillor may address the meeting on an amendment whether or not he has spoken to the motion.

Right of Reply

43. The mover of an original motion which has not been amended shall have a right of reply to matters raised during debate immediately after which the motion shall be put from the chair; however, no right of reply shall be extended where the amendment is before the chair or the original motion has been amended.

Amendments

44. No second or subsequent amendment whether upon any original proposition or of an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

45. If any words of an original motion be rejected the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

46. If an amendment be negatived or adopted then a second may be moved to the motion to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted for discussion at any time.

47. Except by the express leave of the meeting in any particular case to grant an extension of time, no Councillor shall speak to any question for a longer time than—

The mover of a motion	for 5 minutes
Any other Councillor	for 3 minutes
The mover of a motion where entitled to a right of reply	for 2 minutes

48. A motion to confirm a special order must be carried or rejected without amendment.

Withdrawal of Motions

49. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the meeting.

Use of Titles

50. The Councillors and Officers in any meeting shall designate each other by their official titles.

Order of Speaking

51. If two or more Councillors rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

Chairman May Speak

52. The Chairman may address any meeting upon any matter under discussion and shall not be deemed to leave the chair on such occasions.

Speaking Twice

53. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same motion, except where entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood, or as provided for in clauses 42 and 43 hereof.

Points of Order

54. The Chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

Speaking to Subject-matter

55. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the motion and discussion or comment upon the words used by any other Councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on Councillors shall be deemed disorderly and contrary to clause 58.

Call to Order

56. A Councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

Disorderly Expressions

57. Wherever any Councillor makes use of any expression that is disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other Councillor, the Councillor so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the meeting.

58. Any Councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

Strangers Disorderly Conduct

59. Any person not being a Councillor who, having been admitted to a meeting of the Council and who is guilty of an improper or disorderly conduct or who does not leave when requested by the Chairman so to do, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

Removal

60. Any person referred to in clause 59 who being requested by the Chairman to leave any such meeting may be forthwith removed; and any member of the police force or any person requested by the Chairman so to do, may remove such person.

Adjournment

61. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the meeting; but if on being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper or any other that may be allowed precedence shall be discussed before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

Lapsed Question

62. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded or a debate on any Order of the Day be interrupted by the number of the Councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may at the next meeting be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

Demand Documents

63. Any Councillor may of right demand at a meeting the production of any of the documents of the municipality applying to the motion under discussion.

Voting

64. When called upon the Councillors present at any meeting shall vote by a show of hands and any Councillor present and not voting, not being debarred by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

Questions How Determined

65. (a) The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the meeting, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

(b) Questions shall be decided by open voting and, unless otherwise specifically provided, by the majority present.

Casting Vote

(c) If there is an equal division of votes upon any question the Chairman at such meeting shall, in addition to his own vote as a Councillor, have a second or casting vote, except in the case of any election of the Chairman of any municipality or of any meeting.

(d) A decision on a motion to revoke or alter a resolution of the Council shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of Section 185 of the *Local Government Act 1958*.

Division

66. Wherever a division is demanded by any Councillor, the Councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands and the result be declared by the Chairman.

Suspension of Regulations

67. Any one or more of these regulations may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given; and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the meeting.

68. If any person be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this Schedule, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding \$100.00.

Seal

69. (a) The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in safe custody by the Municipal Clerk and shall not be affixed to any document except by authority of the Council.

(b) (i) the Chairman of the municipality and any other Councillor or, in the absence of the Chairman, by two Councillors; and

(ii) the Municipal Clerk or some other officer authorised by the Council to act in the absence of the Municipal Clerk.

CALL OF THE COUNCIL

70. If a call of the Council has been made then immediately after the opening prayer:

(a) the Municipal Clerk calls the name of:

- (i) the President
(ii) each Councillor in alphabetical order

(b) each person present answers to his name

(c) all excuses for absence are considered; and

(d) as to each excuse individually the questions:

"Is the excuse of Cr. a reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the Council?"
is put to the vote of the Council.

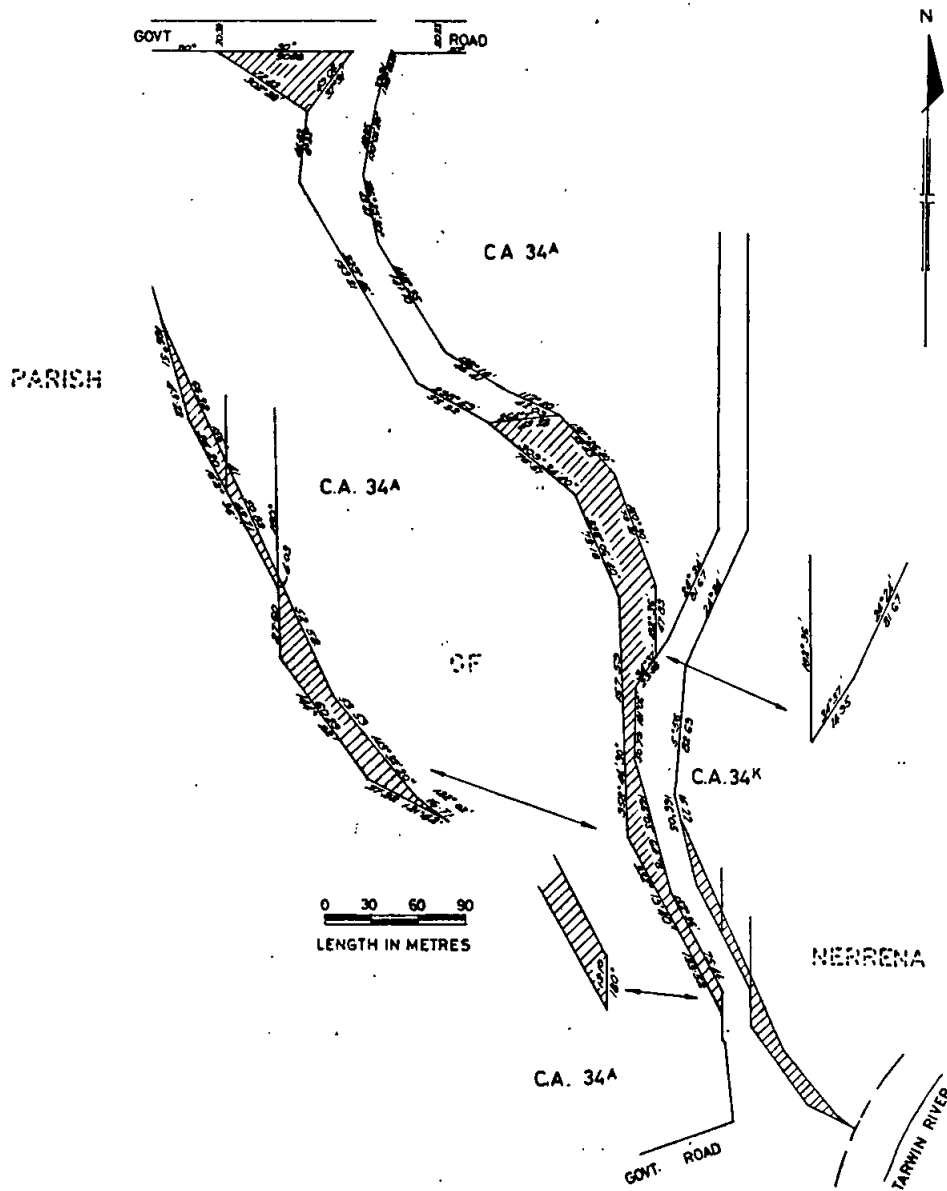
