POISONS ACT 1962

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by section 4 of the Poisons Act 1962 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, amend any of Schedules One, Two, Three, Four, Five, Six, Seven or Eight to such Act by adding to any such Schedule or removing therefrom any item:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my Proclamation remove all items in Schedules One, Two, Three, Four, Five, Six, Seven and Eight to such Act and add the following:

SCHEDULE ONE

(Dangerous Poisons)

ACONITE—(Root of Aconitum Napellus) and substances for internal use containing more than 0.02 per centum of the alkaloids of Aconite, and liniments for external application containing more than 0.1 per centum of the alkaloids of Aconite.

ALKALOIDS—The following alkaloids and their salts, all derivatives of the following alkaloids and the salts of such derivatives:

Atropine in substances containing more than 0.25 per centum of the organic base except—

(a) Atropine Sulphate when included in Schedule Two;

(b) Atropine Methonitrate when included in Schedule Three or in Schedule Four.

Brucine and substances containing more than 0.2 per centum of Brucine.

Colchicine and substances containing more than 0.5 per centum of Colchicine.

Coniine and substances containing more than 0.1 per centum of Coniine.

Cotarnine.

Homatropine and substances containing more than 0.25 per centum of Homatropine.

Hyoscine and substances containing more than 0.25 per centum of Hyoscine except Hyoscine Butylbromide.

Hyoscyamine and substances containing more than 0.25 per centum of Hyoscyamine.

Strychnine and substances containing more than 0.2 per centum of Strychnine.

BELLADONNA and substances containing more than 0.25 per centum of the alkaloids of Belladonna calculated as Hyoscyamine.

BROMINE (LIQUID) excluding its salts and derivatives.

CANTHARIDES, Cantharidin and substances containing more than 0.01 per centum of Cantharidin.

CROTON OIL.

ELATERIUM.

HYDROCYANIC ACID for therapeutic use and substances for therapeutic use containing more than 0.15 per centum of Hydrocyanic Acid.

HYOSCYAMUS and substances containing more than 0.25 per centum of the alkaloids of Hyoscyamus calculated as Hyoscyamine.

LOBELIA and substances containing more than 0.5 per centum of the alkaloids of Lobelia except for smoking or burning.

MERCURIC CHLORIDE and substances containing more than 0.2 per centum of Mercuric Chloride except in batteries.

MERCURIC IODIDE and substances containing more than 2 per centum of Mercuric Iodide.

MERCURIC NITRATE and substances containing more than the equivalent of 3 per centum of Mercury (Hg) in such form.

MERCURIC POTASSIUM IODIDE and substances containing more than the equivalent of 2 per centum of Mercuric Iodide in such form.

NUX VOMICA and substances containing more than 0.2 per centum of Strychnine.

PHOSPHORUS (YELLOW) and substances containing more than 0.5 per centum of Yellow Phosphorous.

POTASSIUM CHLORATE.

SAVIN, OIL of.

STRAMONIUM and substances containing more than 0.25 per centum of the alkaloids of Stramonium except for smoking and burning.

TANSY, OIL of.

Any substances not specifically included in this or any other Schedule which, if taken in a single dose of 60 milligrams or less, would be dangerous to human life.

SCHEDULE TWO

(Medicinal Poisons)

ACETIC ACID in substances for therapeutic use containing more than 80 per centum of Acetic Acid.

ACETYLDIHYDROCODEINE in substances containing 1 per centum or less of Acetyldihydrocodeine.

ACONITE in substances for internal use containing 0.02 per centum or less of the alkaloids of Aconite and liniments for external use containing 0.1 per centum or less of the alkaloids of Aconite.

ANTI-HISTAMINE substances in preparations for topical application.

ARSENIC in substances for therapeutic use containing the equivalent of 0.5 per centum or less of Arsenic Trioxide.

ATROPINE except Atropine Methonitrate in preparations containing 0.25 per centum or less of Atropine, and Atropine Sulphate, 0.5 milligram tablets in packs of six when labelled for the treatment of organophosphorus poisoning.

BELLADONNA in substances containing 0.25 per centum or less of the alkaloids of Belladonna calculated as Hyoscyamine.

BRUCINE in substances containing 0.2 per centum or less of Brucine except in alcohol for use in perfumes when such alcohol is denatured by the addition of 0.02 per centum or less of Brucine.

CAMPHORATED OIL.

CANTHARIDES—Cantharidin and substances containing 0.01 per centum or less of Cantharidin.

CARBENOXOLONE SODIUM for topical oral use.

CHLOROFORM (excluding its derivatives), except—

(a) in preparations containing 10 per centum or less of Chloroform; or

(b) when included in Schedule Four.

CODEINE in substances containing 1 per centum or less of Codeine.

COLCHICINE in substances containing 0.5 per centum or less of Colchicine.

COLCHICUM.

CONIUM in substances containing 0.1 per centum or less of Coniine.

CREOSOTE, CRESOL, PHENOL (carbolic acid), any homologue of phenol boiling below 220°C. and preparations containing more than 3 per centum by weight of such substances or homologues when such substances, homologues or preparations are for therapeutic use.

DEXTROMETHORPHAN in substances containing 1 per centum or less of Dextromethorphan.

DEXTRORPHAN in substances containing 1 per centum or less of Dextrorphan.

DIHYDROCODEINE in substances containing 1 per centum or less of Dihydrocodeine.

ETHOHEPTAZINE CITRATE in substances containing 1 per centum or less of Ethoheptazine Citrate.

ETHYLMORPHINE in substances containing 1 per centum or less of Ethylmorphine.

FLUORIDES—metallic, including ammonium fluoride when intended for human therapeutic purposes except—

- (a) in dentifrices containing 0.5 per centum or less of fluoride ion; and
- (b) in substances containing 15 parts per million or less of fluoride ion.

GELSEMIUM.

HOMATROPINE in substances containing 0.25 per centum or less of Homatropine.

HYDROCYANIC ACID in substances for therapeutic use containing 0.15 per centum or less of Hydrocyanic Acid.

HYOSCINE and its derivatives in substances containing 0.25 per centum, or less of Hyoscine and its derivatives except Hyoscine Butylbromide.

HYOSCYAMINE in substances containing 0.25 per centum or less of Hyoscyamine.

HYOSCYAMUS in substances containing 0.25 per centum or less of the alkaloids of Hyoscyamus calculated as Hyoscyamine.

IODINE except—

- (a) in substances containing 2.5 per centum or less of free iodine; and
- (b) in iodophors containing 5 per centum or less of available iodine.

LEAD SALTS and compounds for therapeutic or cosmetic use except preparations containing 1 per centum or less for cosmetic use.

LOBELIA in substances containing 0.5 per centum or less of alkaloids of Lobelia except for smoking and burning.

MEBENDAZOLE for human therapeutic use.

MERCURIC AMMONIUM CHLORIDE.

MERCURIC CHLORIDE in substances containing 0.2 per centum or less of Mercuric Chloride except in batteries.

MERCURIC IODIDE in substances containing 2 per centum or less of Mercuric Iodide.

MERCURIC NITRATE in substances containing the equivalent of 3 per centum or less of Mercury (Hg) in such form.

MERCURIC OXIDES.

MERCURIC POTASSIUM IODIDE in substances containing the equivalent of 2 per centum or less of mercuric iodide.

MERCURY—organic compounds and substances containing more than the equivalent of 0.2 per centum of Mercury (Hg) w/w except for parenteral use.

NICLOSAMIDE for human therapeutic use.

NICODODINE in substances containing 1 per centum or less of Nicododine.

NICODICODINE when compounded with one or more other medicaments in preparations containing 1 per centum or less of Nicodicodine.

NORCODEINE in substances containing 1 per centum or less of Norcodeine.

NUX VOMICA in substances containing 0.2 per centum or less of Strychnine.

p-ETHOXYPHENYLUREA.

PHOLCODINE in substances containing 1 per centum or less of Pholcodine.

PROPOXYPHENE in substances containing 1 per centum or less of Propoxyphene.

PYRITHIONE ZINC in substances containing more than 2 per centum of Pyrithione Zinc.

SILVER—Salts, compounds, and solutions thereof.

STAVESACRE and substances containing more than 0.2 per centum of the alkaloids of Stavesacre.

STRAMONIUM in substances containing 0.25 per centum or less of the alkaloids of Stramonium calculated as Hyoscyamine, except for smoking or burning.

STRYCHNINE in substances containing 0.2 per centum or less of Strychnine.

SCHEDULE THREE

(Potent Substances)

ADRENALINE.

AMYL NITRITE.

ANAESTHETICS LOCAL—the following only—Benzocaine, Butylcaine, Butylcaine Picrate, Orthocaine, Benamine Lactate, and Lignocaine, when included in:

- (a) Lozenges, pastilles, tablets and capsules containing 30 milligrams or less of such substances in each;
- (b) Suppositories or bougies containing 200 milligrams or less of such substances in each;
- (c) Preparations for external use, other than eye drops, containing 10 per centum or less of such substances.

ANTI-HISTAMINE substances (except Chlorcyclizine, Cyclizine, Meclozine and their salts and derivatives) in preparations labelled and packed solely for motion sickness in packs of ten doses or less, or in liquid preparations containing 0.75 per centum or less of Anti-histamine substances.

ATROPINE METHONITRATE in preparations for external use.

BARBITURIC ACID and derivatives thereof in substances containing 0.2 per centum or less of Barbituric Acid or its derivatives.

BROMETHOL.

BROXYQUINOLINE.

BUCLIZINE DIHYDROCHLORIDE in preparations containing 25 milligrams or less of buclizine dihydrochloride per dose unit in packs of ten dose units or less.

BUFEXAMAC in preparations containing 5 per centum or less of Bufexamac.

CARBETAPENTANE.

CHLORAL HYDRATE in substances containing 5 per centum or less of Chloral Hydrate.

CHLOROBUTOL in oral preparations containing 250 milligrams or less of Chlorbutol per adult dosage unit.

CINNAMYLPHEDRINE.

CLEMASTINE in oral preparations containing 2 milligrams or less of Clemastine per dose in packs of 10 doses.

CYCLOPENTAMINE in solutions for topical use.

DEXCHLORPHENIRAMINE in oral preparations containing 2 milligrams or less of Dexchlorpheniramine Maleate per dose in packs of 10 doses.

DICOPHANE (DDT) in preparations for human therapeutic use.

DICYCLOMINE in preparations containing 0.1 per centum or less of Dicyclomine.

DIMETHISOQUIN in preparations for topical use.

DIPHEMANIL METHYLSULPHATE in preparations for topical use.

DOXYLAMINE in oral preparations containing 25 milligrams or less of Doxylamine Succinate per dose in packs of 10 doses.

EPHEDRINE and PSEUDOEPHEDRINE except—

- (a) preparations containing 0.5 per centum or less of Ephedrine and Pseudoephedrine;
- (b) in preparations for external use containing 1 per centum or less of Ephedrine and Pseudoephedrine.

ERYTHRITYL TETRANITRATE and other nitric esters of Polyhydric alcohols.

FLAVOZATE.

GLYCERYL TRINITRATE.

GUAIPHENESIN in liquid preparations containing 2 per centum or less of Guaiphenesin and in solid preparations containing 120 milligrams or less per dose form of Guaiphenesin.

HEXACHLOROPHANE in preparations, other than preparations for use on infants, containing 3 per centum or less of hexachlorophane for skin cleansing purposes when such preparations are labelled with the following warnings:

- (i) Do not use internally or on areas of burnt or damaged skin.
- (ii) Do not use on infants except under medical direction.
- (iii) Wash off the skin immediately after use.

8-HYDROXYQUINOLINE and its derivatives for external human use.

IDOXURIDINE for cutaneous use.

IMIDAZOLINE DERIVATIVES with vasoconstrictor activity, including the following when used for application as decongestants—Naphazoline, Oxymetazoline, Phedrazone, Phenamazoline, Rinidol, Tetrahydrozoline, Trimizoline, Tymazoline and Xylometazoline.

INSULIN and preparations containing the specific hypoglycaemic principle of the pancreas.

IRON salts and complexes in preparations intended for human therapeutic use by oral administration, except preparations containing 5 mg or less of elemental iron per dose.

ISOPRENALINE—

- (a) in nebulizer solutions containing one per centum or less of Isoprenaline except when in metered aerosols;
- (b) in metered aerosols delivering 80 micrograms or less of Isoprenaline per metered dose.

ISOPROPAMIDE in preparations containing 2 per centum or less for topical use.

ISOSORBIDE DINITRATE.

MALDISON in preparations containing 2 per centum or less of Maldison for external use by humans.

MANNITYL HEXANITRATE

MERCUROUS CHLORIDE (Calomel) for therapeutic use, except preparations intended for internal use by children.

METHOXAHINE for topical use.

METHOXYPHENAMINE.

MORANTEL for human therapeutic use.

NORADRENALINE.

NOSCAPINE.

OCTYL NITRITE.

OXETHAZAINE in preparations for internal use.

PAPAVERINE.

PENTAERYTHRITYL TETRANITRATE.

PHENAZONE.

PHENYLEPHRINE, except preparations containing 0.5 per centum or less and except any preparation for external use containing 1 per centum or less.

PHENYLPROPANOLAMINE.

PHOLEDRINE in solutions for topical use.

PROCYCLIDINE in preparations containing 5 per centum or less of Procyclidine for topical use.

PROPANTHELINE BROMIDE in preparations for topical use.

PROPYLHEXEDRINE in approved appliances for inhalation in which the substance is suitably absorbed and protected by inert solid material.

PYRANTEL for human therapeutic use.

SANTONIUM.

TUAMINOHEPTANE in solutions for topical use.

VIPRYNIUM.

ZINC SALTS for human internal use except in preparations containing 5 per centum or less of Zinc Salts.

Any compound preparation or admixture of the substances specified in this Schedule unless otherwise provided for in this or any other Schedule.

(Restricted Substances)

ACETANILIDE and alkyl acetanilides.

ACETAZOLAMIDE.

ACETYLDIHYDROCODEINE in substances containing 2.5 per centum or less of Acetyldihydrocodeine, except in substances containing 1 per centum or less.

AMITRIPTYLINE.

ANAESTHETICS—the following—when specifically prepared and packed as therapeutic agents for the induction and maintenance of inhalation anaesthesia—Ether, Cyclopropane, Chloroform, Ethyl Chloride, Ethylene, Halothane, Fluroxene, Methoxyflurane, Nitrous Oxide, Trichloroethylene, Vinyl Ether.

ANAESTHETICS LOCAL being synthetic cocaine substitutes, except when included in Schedule Three.

ANALEPTICS, including Bemegride, Leptazol, Picrotoxin and Nikethamide.

ANGIOTENSIN AMIDE.

ANTIBIOTICS, Penicillin, Penicillanic Acid, Streptomycin, Chloramphenicol, Tetracycline and any other antibiotic substances however derived and their chemical derivatives, except—

- (a) when included in Schedule Six;
- (b) animal feedstuffs for growth promotion containing: Bacitracin and its salts, Benzyl Penicillin and its salts (including Procaine Penicillin), Chlorotetracycline, Erythromycin and its salts, Flavomycin, Oleandomycin and its salts, Oxytetracycline, Tylosin and its salts and Virginiamycin and its salts in concentrations of 50 parts per million or less of the total active antibiotic principle;
- (c) preparations containing 50 parts per million or less of Hygromycin B;
- (d) milk replacers for calves and starter rations for pigs containing Bacitracin and its salts, Benzyl Penicillin and its salts (including Procaine Penicillin), Chlorotetracycline, Erythromycin and its salts, Oxytetracycline and its salts and Tylosin and its salts in concentrations of 100 parts per million or less of the total active antibiotic principle.

ANTI-CHOLINE ESTERASES, including neostigmine, dyflos.

ANTICHOLINERGIC SUBSTANCES, including Dicyclomine, Diphepanil, Methylsulphate, Methantheline, Oxyphenonium and Propantheline Bromide, except when specifically included in Schedule Three.

ANTI-CONVULSANT substances, including hydantoin derivatives, oxazolidine-dione derivatives and primidone.

ANTI-DIABETIC (Hypoglycaemic) substances which are sulphonamide or diguanide derivatives or urea including Carbutamide and Tolbutamide.

ANTI-FOLIC ACID substances—Aminopterin, Orthopterin and Tetropterin.

ANTI-HISTAMINE substances except when included in Schedule Two, Schedule Three or Schedule Seven.

ANTI-LEPROSY substances.

ANTI-MALARIAL substances including Amodiaquin, Chloroquine, Mepacrine, Pamaquin, Primaquine, Pyrimethamine, Proguanil and Sontopuine and the salts of such substances (except Quinine and its salts).

ANTIMONY, and substances containing more than the equivalent of 10 per centum of Antimony Trioxide when intended for therapeutic use.

ANTI-PARKINSONIAN substances including Benzhexol, Caramiphen, Cycrimine, Diethazine, Ethopropazine, and Procyclidine except when specifically included in Schedule Three.

ANTI-THYROID substances including Carbimazole, Methimazole and Thiouracil and its derivatives.

ANTI-TUBERCULAR SUBSTANCES including Isoniazid, Para-aminosalicylic acid, Prothionamide and Thiazetazone.

APOMORPHINE.

ARSENIC, organic compounds of, for therapeutic use, except when included in Schedule Five or Schedule Six.

ATARACTIC SUBSTANCES, including—

- (i) Phenothiazine derivatives including Chlorpromazine, Promazine and Mepazine;
- (ii) Benzoic acid derivatives including Benactyzine and Cevanol;
- (iii) 1 : propane diol derivatives including Meprobamate;
- (iv) Benzhydrol derivatives including Azacyclonal;
- (v) Piperazine derivatives including Hydroxyzine;
- (vi) Methylpentynol;
- (vii) Butyrophenone derivatives including Droperidol, Haloperidol, Methylperidol and Triperidol;

3. Subject as is hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust shall be as set out in the schedule below:

- (d) a person having control of the proceeds of a policy or policies with the Society left on deposit with the Society or the Corporation after maturity;
- (e) the manager, trustee or other proper officer of a superannuation plan in relation to deposits of further contributions made to the Society in respect of the contributor concerned where the proceeds of a policy or policies have been left on deposit with the Society or the Corporation after maturity, until the death or retirement of the contributor concerned;

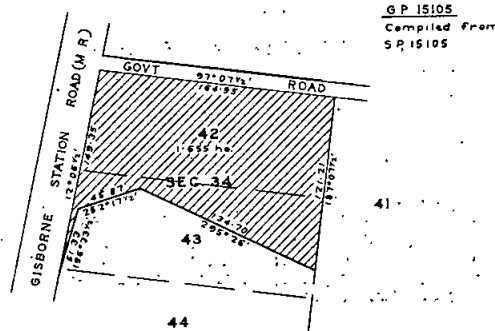

1. Matter submitted to the Executive Council

2. Other matter

(b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.

(c) Proofs, which will be supplied only when specifically requested or at the direction of the Gazette Officer, should be returned promptly to avoid delay in publication.

(d) No additions or amendments to matters for publication will be accepted by telephone.
