Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958 DECLARATION OF A PROCLAIMED AREA

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by section 25 of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958*, it is provided that where the Governor in Council is of the opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidae (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the removal from any place in the proclaimed area to any place outside that area or from any place in the proclaimed area to any other place in that area of any fruit fly or any fruit or vegetables of a kind or species which in his opinion may provide a host for fruit flies and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly, as is specified in the Proclamation:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidae (commonly known as fruit flies) and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

1. Declare those portions of Victoria described in the First Schedule to this Proclamation to be a proclaimed area.

2. Prohibit the removal from any place within the proclaimed area to any place outside that area or to any other place in that area of any fruit fly or any fruit or vegetables of a kind or species grown within the proclaimed area and named in the Second Schedule to this Proclamation unless such removal is made on the instruction of an Inspector or with his written permission, provided that fruit and vegetables passing through the proclaimed area may leave the proclaimed area without such instruction if the vehicle carrying such fruit or vegetables does not come to a halt within the proclaimed area except as required by traffic regulations.

3. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area within 25 metres of any property known to be infested with fruit fly to apply to an Inspector for a permit to remove from any place within the proclaimed area to any place outside that area or to any other place in that area any plant or soil and to refrain from such removal until a permit is granted.

4. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to give access to such land at all times to an Inspector with or without assistants for the purpose of

inspection and/or applying on such properties any spray material and/or for the purpose of removing any fruit or vegetables or prohibited plant, and/or performing such other acts which in the opinion of an Inspector are necessary for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit flies.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Portion of Victoria Declared By This Proclamation To Be a Proclaimed Area

Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 5, section 5 of the parish of Carlyle; thence westerly by the southern boundary of that allotment to the south-western angle of that allotment then by a line westerly to the eastern bank of the Murray River, thence generally northerly by the eastern bank of that river to a point which is an extension of the northern boundary of allotment 4, section 3, then by a line easterly to the north-western angle of that allotment, then by the northern boundary of that allotment, and the northern boundary of allotment 1, section 3, to the Wahgunyah-Howlong Road, thence generally southerly by that road to the point of commencement.

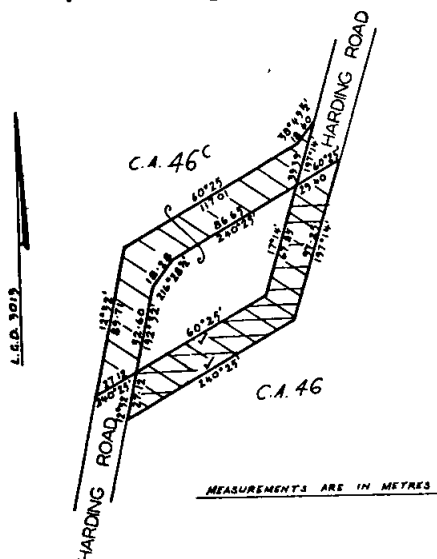

APPLICATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS TO AN AREA NOT BEING PART OF A MUNICIPAL DISTRICT PURSUANT TO SECTION 916B OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1958

Whereas it is provided in section 916B (1) of the *Local Government Act 1958* that the Minister for Local Government may by notice published in the *Government Gazette* direct that the operation of Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958* and all or any of the regulations made thereunder shall apply to an area defined in such notice (not being part of a municipal district) and—

- that the Part and such regulations shall be administered in the area defined in such notice by any public authority as if such authority were a municipal council; or
- that the Part and such regulations shall be administered in the area defined in such notice by the council of an adjacent municipality;

And whereas the Council of the City of Geelong has made application pursuant to section 916B (1) (b) of the *Local Government Act 1958* to have portion of an area under the jurisdiction of the Geelong Harbour Trust Commissioners designated as part of the municipal district for the purpose of administering Part XLIX. of the said Act.

Now therefore, I, Digby Glen Crozier, Her Majesty's Minister for Local Government for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by sub-section (1) (b) of section 916B of the *Local Government Act*

1958 hereby direct that the area described in the Schedule hereunder shall be deemed to be part of the municipal district of the City of Geelong for the purposes of Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958*.

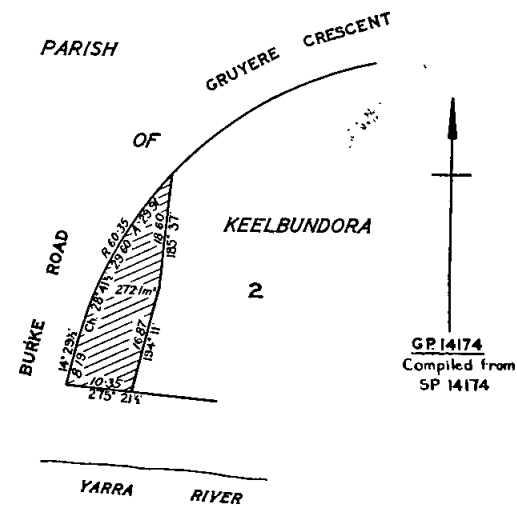

Whereas sub-section (3) of section 30 of the *Pipelines Act 1967* provides that the Minister may by notice published in the *Government Gazette* amend vary add to or revoke any conditions stated or included in a licence, I, James Charles Murray Balfour, Minister for Minerals and Energy, do now hereby vary the conditions of Pipeline Licence No. 3 in the manner indicated in the Schedule hereto:—

SCHEDULE

1. Insert the following under Condition I. (B)—

(B) *Materials of Construction*

"Except as hereinafter provided in Condition II. (E) the materials and appurtenances used in the pipeline shall conform to the following specifications:—"

2. Add to Condition I. (D) (i) the following—
"unless otherwise approved by the Minister."

3. Replace Condition II. (B) with the following—
(B) *Maintenance and Routine Test Procedures*

The pipeline shall be maintained in accordance with section 8 of the Australian Standard 2018-1977: SAA Liquid Petroleum Pipeline Code to the extent that this standard is not inconsistent with the following:—

(i) *Corrosion Control*

Subject to compliance with the State Electricity Commission Cathodic Protection Regulations 1970, the licensee shall—

- (a) carry out a monthly check of the transformer and rectifier units of any impressed current systems that may be installed to ensure they are operating satisfactorily. A log of such checks, giving details of amperage output and meter readings shall be maintained by the licensee;
- (b) at intervals not exceeding six months conduct corrosion surveys of the pipeline including tests for stray current electrolysis. Measuring instruments approved for the purpose by the Chief Electrical Inspector, State Electricity Commission of Victoria shall be used for these surveys which shall be carried out only after the licensee has used his best endeavours to ensure that no abnormal condition exists which is likely to affect the validity of the results;
- (c) submit a summary of the results of these surveys annually to the said Chief Electrical Inspector for advice on action to be taken to maintain the cathodic nature of the pipeline so that corrosion is limited, and shall take all reasonable steps to give effect to the advice received;
- (d) submit to the Director, Oil and Gas Division of the Department of Minerals and Energy an annual report outlining the results of the corrosion surveys, the recommendations made by the said Chief Electrical Inspector and the details of the resulting action taken by the licensee.

(ii) *Pipeline Markers and Signs*

The licensee shall check the signs required by the *Pipelines (Construction and Operation) Regulations 1971* at intervals not exceeding three months and shall where necessary forthwith replace, repair and repaint the same.

(iii) *Patrol of Pipeline*

The licensee shall cause the pipeline to be patrolled on a regular working day basis in accordance with the procedure laid down in Rule 7.2.5 of the Australian Standard 2018-1977: SAA Liquid Petroleum Pipeline Code and shall on demand produce to the Director, Oil and Gas Division of the Department of Minerals and Energy a written report on the results of such patrolling.

4. Replace Condition II. (D) with the following—
(D) *Alterations to Pipeline*

Except in the case of emergencies, the licensee shall not effect any repairs or make any additions or alterations to the pipeline without the prior approval in writing of the Director, Oil and Gas Division of the Department of Minerals and Energy.

(b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause the charge is hereby fixed at 27.1 cents per kilolitre for any meter year.

4. Subject as is hereinafter provided the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at 27.1 cents per kilolitre.

5. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Eighty Dollars.

6. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven days of demand upon the owner or occupier at the office of the Trust during normal business hours.

7. The provisions of Clauses 3, 4 and 5 of this By-law shall not apply to any land tenement or property supplied with water by the Trust under a special agreement pursuant to Section 215 of the Water Act 1958.

2. Section 4 (2) of the said Act provides that the eight members of the Commission referred to in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) of the said sub-section (1) shall be appointed by the Governor in Council.

3. Section 4 (3) of the said Act provides that the person appointed as Chairman of the Commission shall be a private practitioner of not less than seven years standing.

4. Section 4 (4) of the said Act provides that of the persons appointed as members of the Commission under paragraph (b) of the said sub-section (1)—

- (a) one shall be a person who is engaged in or has had experience in the provision of legal aid services in Victoria on a voluntary basis; and
- (b) one shall be a person, not being a practitioner, who is in the opinion of the Attorney-General an appropriate person to represent the interests of assisted persons.

5. Section 5 (1) of the said Act provides that subject to the said Act a member of the Commission shall hold office for such period not exceeding—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BRIGHT RECREATION RESERVE"

I William Vasey Houghton, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 13 of the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Crown land in the Parish of Bright (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve") temporarily reserved as sites for Public Recreation and Show Yards by Orders in Council dated 29 June 1891, 6 May 1913, 10 January 1924 and 16 November 1936 together with the land in the said Parish temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation by Order in Council dated 18 September 1973:—

REGULATIONS

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge except on such days as the Committee may set the Reserve or portions thereof aside for the purposes of holding fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, shows or sports and may grant the use of the portions so set apart to any club, association or person subject to the observance of such terms and conditions and the payment of such fees as may be prescribed by the Committee from time to time.
2. No club, association or person shall hold or take part in any organised games, fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances or shows in any portion of the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
3. No person shall drive or ride a horse, bicycle or motor cycle or drive a motor vehicle or any other vehicle within the Reserve recklessly or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, or on any area other than that set aside by the Committee for the particular purpose.
4. No person shall:—
 - (a) Enter or leave the Reserve except by means of the entrances or other openings provided.
 - (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
 - (c) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner or create or take part in any disturbance.
 - (d) Spit or expectorate or commit any nuisance on the paths or in or on any building, structure or erection in the Reserve.
 - (e) Climb, jump, get on or over any of the gates, seats, or fences in or around the Reserve, or stick bills or advertisements or cut names thereon or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings furniture, fittings, gates, fences, seats or other structures in the Reserve.
 - (f) Interfere with, break or damage in any way any of the trees, shrubs, plants or other vegetation, or walk on or over any of the beds or borders in the Reserve.
 - (g) Bet publicly in the Reserve.
 - (h) Obstruct, hinder or interfere with any person employed on the Reserve.
 - (i) Leave or deposit any unwanted material or thing or rubbish of any kind on any part of the Reserve except in receptacles provided by the Committee for the purpose.
 - (j) Roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind on the Reserve.
 - (k) Break glass or leave or deposit anything in the Reserve that might injure a person.
 - (l) Dig up or remove any sand, soil or other material in or from the Reserve.

- (m) Remove or in any way interfere with or damage any sign or notice board fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserve.
 - (n) Interfere with or interrupt any game, sports, competition or entertainment or amusement or practice thereat in the Reserve.
 - (o) Obtain or attempt to obtain admission to any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission under these Regulations.
 - (p) Remain within the Reserve or on any property therein, when lawfully directed to leave the same by any bailiff of Crown Lands or member of the Police Force or authorized officer of the Committee.
5. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained:—
- (a) Light fires in the Reserve except in any fireplace provided by the Committee for the purpose.
 - (b) Carry or discharge any firearm or air gun in the Reserve, or shoot, trap, snare or destroy any game or birds therein.
 - (c) Hawk or offer any articles of food or drink or any other commodity whatsoever for sale in the Reserve, or conduct any business therein.
 - (d) Camp in the Reserve or erect therein any building, booth, tent or other structure and then only subject to the observance of such terms and conditions and the payment of such fees as may be prescribed by the said Committee from time to time.
 - (e) Organise or take part in any assemblies for fêtes, concerts, public worship, preaching or public speaking in the Reserve.
 - (f) Put or cause to be put on any part of the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or any other animals except as hereinunder provided.
 - (g) Ride or lead or bring any horse or pony onto the Reserve, or tether or permit any horse or pony to remain on any part of the Reserve.
 - (h) On any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any outcry, sound or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loud speaker, public address system or like instrument.
 - (i) Park any motor vehicle or other vehicle in the Reserve except at such place or places set apart for that purpose by the Committee, or bring a caravan into the Reserve.
6. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Committee first obtained, cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or in his charge to enter or remain in the Reserve unless such dog is and continues to be at all times under proper control or on a chain, cord or leash and is effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person or from damaging or interfering with the Reserve or any property therein in any way.
7. Any dog found in this Reserve except as provided in this Regulation shall be liable to be seized and/or destroyed by the officers and/or servants of the Committee and the owner or any person having the custody of any dog so found shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation and shall also make compensation for any damage or injury done to the Reserve or any property or person therein by such dog.
8. No person shall use the closets or urinals or any portion of such closets or urinals in the Reserve for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed and shall then only use such portion of such closets and urinals as are specially constructed for the purpose.
9. For the purpose of maintaining good order the Committee or its authorised officers may refuse the admission of any person to the Reserve.
10. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations, authorised officers or employees of the Committee may at any time enter the Reserve and carry out any

work, make any alterations or erect any structures for the maintenance, improvement or good management of the Reserve (Rs.790).

9. The charges for camping in the portion or portions set apart for the purpose are as follows:—

Weekly—\$25.00 for two people plus \$4.00 for each extra person; \$2.00 for those under the age of 15 years.

Unpowered sites—

Daily—\$3.00 for two people plus 60 cents for each extra person; 30 cents for those under the age of 15 years.

Weekly—\$20.00 for two people plus \$4.00 for each extra person; \$2.00 for those under the age of 15 years.

Extra charges—

Air conditioners—30 cents daily; \$2.00 weekly.

Additional cars (over one) at any campsite—20 cents daily.

Vans and caravans over 7.62 metres in length—10 cents per day each additional 30.5 centimetres.—(Rs.2541).

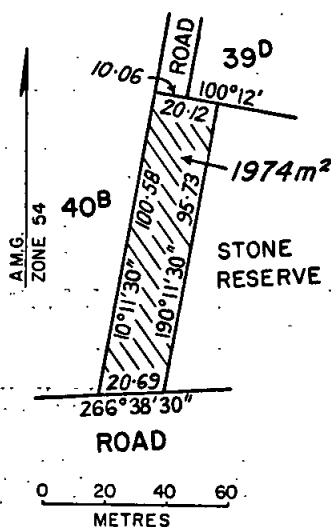
