SUSPECTED MURDER

REWARD

Notice is hereby given that a reward of fifty thousand dollars (\$50 000) will be paid by the Government of Victoria for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person or persons responsible for the disappearance and suspected murder of Roger Anthony Wilson, last seen in Pakenham, Victoria on the evening of 1 February 1980.

On Friday, 1 February 1980, Roger Anthony Wilson, 32 years, was driving his Porsche sedan registered number IWA 121 in an easterley direction along the Princes Highway towards his home at Nar Nar Goon when it is believed that he was intercepted by a person or persons unknown. It is further believed that at that time or shortly afterwards he was murdered and his body disposed of in an unknown manner. On the morning of Saturday 2 February 1980, his motor vehicle was found abandoned in the long term car park at Tullamarine Airport.

The allocation of the reward of \$50 000 will be at the sole discretion of the Chief Commissioner of Police.

Any information which will be treated as confidential, may be given at any time of the day or night, to the Officer in Charge, Criminal Investigation Branch, Russell Street, Melbourne (telephone 662 0911) or to the Officer in Charge of any Police Station.
