VARIATION OF PROCLAMATION OF THE REFRIGERATION MECHANICS TRADE AS AN APPRENTICESHIP TRADE

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,

Whereas Section 19 of the *Industrial Training Act 1975*
provides, *inter alia*, that after the Minister has taken into
consideration any recommendation made by the Industrial
Training Commission, the Governor in Council, for the
purposes of the said Act, may from time to time by
Proclamation proclaim any trades to be apprenticeship
trades and that the Governor in Council (whether with or
without any recommendation of the said Commission) may
by Proclamation at any time revoke, amend or vary any
such Proclamation.

And whereas by Proclamation on 16 March 1955, the
trade of Refrigeration Mechanic as carried on in the low
pressure commercial refrigeration industry in the whole of
the State of Victoria was proclaimed to be an apprentice-
ship trade:

And whereas by Proclamation on 17 December 1963, the
trade of Refrigeration Mechanic as carried on in the in-
stallation, maintenance, alteration, replacement, repair and
servicing of commercial refrigeration plants in the whole
of the State of Victoria was proclaimed to be an apprentice-
ship trade:

And whereas by Variation of Proclamation on 24 March
1970 the trade of Refrigeration Mechanics in so far as it
is carried on in the installation, maintenance, alteration,
replacement, repair and servicing of commercial refrigera-
tion plants anywhere in the State of Victoria was pro-
claimed to be an apprenticeship trade:

And whereas the Industrial Training Commission of
Victoria has recommended to the Minister that the said
proclamation be varied in the manner following:

And whereas the Minister has taken the said recom-
mendation into consideration:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria
in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice
of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my
Proclamation vary the aforesaid Proclamation by deleting

therefrom the words, "in so far as it is carried on in the installation, maintenance, alteration, replacement, repair and servicing of commercial refrigeration plants anywhere in the State of Victoria."

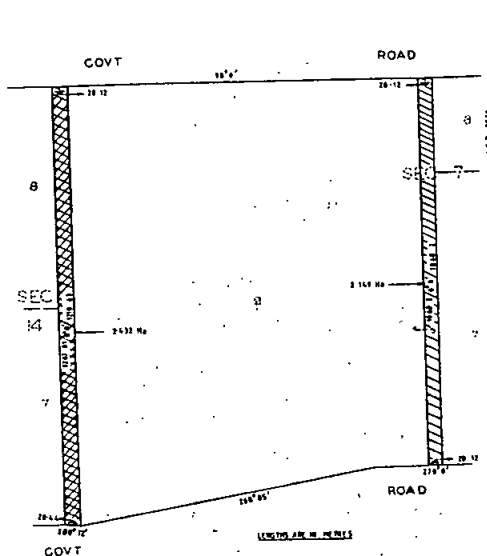

MANAGEMENT OF CERTAIN CROWN LANDS IN THE
PARISH OF DRUMDLEMARA RESERVED FOR PUBLIC
RECREATION AND CONSERVATION OF AN AREA OF
NATURAL INTEREST

I, William Vasey Houghton, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 13 of the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Crown land in the Parish of Drumdlemara (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve") temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation and Conservation of an Area of Natural Interest by Order in Council dated 26 June 1979 (*vide Government Gazette* of 4 July 1979):—

REGULATIONS

1. The Reserves shall be open to the public at all times free of charge.
2. No person shall:—
 - (a) enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;
 - (b) carry, use or discharge any firearm, air-rifle or any other weapon in the Reserves;
 - (c) disturb, interfere with or destroy any animal or bird or its lair or nest in the Reserves;
 - (d) interfere with, mark, cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings; gates, fences, barriers, seats, signs or any other improvements in the Reserves;

- (e) interfere with, mark, cut names on or in any way damage, injure or disturb any tree, shrub, plant or other vegetation or any sand, stone, gravel, rock or any other earth in the Reserves;
 - (f) remove any sand, soil, gravel or rock from the Reserves;
 - (g) pick leaves, bark or flowers from any vegetation in the Reserves;
 - (h) leave or deposit any glass, bottle, tin, can, waste paper, refuse or any other rubbish except in receptacles provided for the purpose in the Reserves;
 - (i) erect any building, tent, booth or other structure in the Reserves, nor sell or offer for sale or hire any article or any other commodity whatsoever therein or within any structure thereon;
 - (j) light or cause to be lit any fire in the Reserves except in any properly constructed fireplace provided for the purpose;
 - (k) drive any motorised vehicle off any formed road or parking area provided in the Reserves or in contravention of any authorised sign therein;
 - (l) put or allow to remain in the Reserves any sheep, horses, cattle, pigs or other animals except as hereinafter provided;
 - (m) organise or take part in any public entertainment, game or sport in the Reserves.
3. No dog shall be in the Reserves unless such dog is and continues to be at all times controlled by a chain, cord or leash and any dog found wandering at large in the Reserves may be seized and delivered to the proper officer of the municipality concerned by any Bailiff of Crown lands or destroyed by such Bailiff.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge except on such days as the Committee may set the Reserve or portions thereof aside for the purpose of holding fêtes, carnivals, entertainments, musical performances, shows or sports and may grant the use of the portions so set apart to any club, association or person subject to the observance of such terms and conditions and the payment of such fees as may be prescribed by the Committee from time to time.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way any of the trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserve, nor light fires therein without the permission of the Committee.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish whatsoever therein, or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein except with the permission of the Committee.

5. No person shall put or bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals, except any dog controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

6. The Committee shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1958*.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling, booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article whatsoever without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve or parts thereof.

11. Persons occupying or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure in the Reserve on the occasions of any fêtes, sports or any other holiday amusements may be required to deposit a sum which the Committee may at any time determine, not exceeding \$100, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so occupying or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any lawful order given by the Committee—(Rs.2163).
