MOTOR BOATING ACT 1961

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas pursuant to section 2 of the Motor Boating Act 1961 the Governor in Council, by Proclamation dated 8 July 1980 and published in the Government Gazette on 16 July 1980 appointed the Council of the City of Wangaratta to be the Authority over the waters of the Ovens River within the boundaries of the City for the purposes of the said Act.

And whereas pursuant to section 4 of the said Act, the said Authority has recommended that all the waters of the Ovens River within the boundaries of the City of Wangaratta be prohibited for all motor boats having an engine capacity exceeding eight kilowatts developed power.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act and all other powers me thereunto enabling, do by this my Proclamation prohibit for all motor boats with an engine capacity exceeding eight kilowatts developed power the use of the waters of the Ovens River within the boundaries of the City of Wangaratta.

MENTAL HEALTH ACT 1959.





POLICE GAOLS

Whereas it is provided in section 115 of the Community Welfare Services Act 1970 that whenever it appears to the Director-General after consultation with the Chief Commissioner of Police to be necessary to do so, the Director-General may recommend to the Minister that a lock up is fit for the reception of prisoners sentenced to imprisonment for a term not exceeding the term the Director-General thinks fit and specifies in his recommendation;

And whereas it is further provided in the said section that upon receiving any such recommendation the Minister may, by notice published in the Government Gazette, proclaim any police lock up so recommended to be a "police gaol" for the reception of prisoners for any term up to the term specified but not exceeding in any case thirty days;

And whereas it is further provided in the said section 115 that the Minister may from time to time by notice in the Government Gazette revoke or vary any proclamation under this section;

And whereas by notice published in the Government Gazette on 21 January 1970, certain police lock ups were proclaimed to be police gaols for the reception of prisoners sentenced to imprisonment for terms not exceeding the terms of imprisonment specified in the notice.

And whereas the aforementioned notice of 21 January 1970, has been further varied by notices published in the Government Gazette of 9 December 1970; 23 August 1972; 1 August 1973; 13 February 1974; 8 January 1975; 5 April 1978; 29 November 1978 and 5 January 1979.

And whereas the Director-General after consultation with the Chief Commissioner has recommended that the abovementioned notices be further varied.

Now therefore I, the Minister for Community Welfare Services in the State of Victoria in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Community Welfare Services Act 1970 do by this notice further vary the notice published in the Government Gazette on 21 January 1970 and varied by notices published in the Government Gazette of 9 December 1970; 23 August 1972; 1 August 1973; 13 February 1974; 8 January 1975; 5 April 1978; 29 November 1978 and 5 January 1979 by substituting therefore the following notice—

- (a) proclaiming the lock ups referred to in the First Schedule hereunder to be police gaols for the reception of prisoners sentenced to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one day.
- proclaiming the lock ups referred to in the Second Schedule hereunder to be police gaols for the reception of prisoners sentenced to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two days;
- proclaiming the lock ups referred to in the Third Schedule hereunder to be police gaols for the reception of prisoners sentenced to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three days;
- proclaiming the lock ups referred to in the Fourth Schedule hereunder to be police gaols for the reception of prisoners sentenced to imprisonment for a term not exceeding seven days;
- proclaiming the lock ups referred to in the Fifth Schedule hereunder to be police gaols for the reception of prisoners sentenced to imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty days.





MAIN ROAD DARLINGTON — CARRANBALLAC ROAD SHIRE OF MORTLAKE







COCKATOO RECREATION RESERVE

I, William Vasey Houghton, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 13 of the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978 do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Crown Land in the Parish of Gembrook permanently reserved for the purposes of Public Recreation by Order in Council of 25 March 1980 (vide Government Gazette dated 2 April 1980 hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public between the hours from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, excepting on such days (not exceeding 75 in one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports or holiday amusements.

Definitions

 $2.\ \mbox{In}$ these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:

"authorised officer" means any person appointed, in writing by the Committee as an authorised officer for the purposes of these Regulations and (except for the purpose of receipt of any fees or the grant, variation or revocation of any permit) also includes any member of the Police Force.

"camp" without limiting the generality of the verb includes:

erect, occupy or use any tent, or any temporary, makeshift or similar form of accommodation.

"firearm" includes any rifle, gun, pistol, air pistol or like thing using gas cartridges, catapult, bow and arrow or cross-bow, and any other implement designed to discharge missiles capable of injuring or destroying animal life.

"permit" includes any authority, approval, consent, permission, receipt, ticket or the like given, granted or issued by the Committee or an authorised officer pursuant to these Regulations.

"vehicle" includes any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, horse-drawn vehicle, trailer or water craft.

Behaviour

3. No person shall-

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regard dress, language or conduct:
- conduct;

 (b) commit or create or knowingly permit or allow to continue any public or private nuisance or any annoyance to the public or any persons lawfully in the Reserve whether such nuisance or annoyance takes place in any building, tent or other structure or in any enclosed or unenclosed area in the Reserve, or do or suffer to be done any act which in the opinion of an authorised officer is or is likely to be to the annoyance or disturbance of any person using the Reserve;

 (c) except in an area set apart from the purpose
- except in an area set apart from the purpose, play any game in which a hard ball is used or engage in any game or sport likely to cause interference, disturbance or danger to other persons using the Reserve.

Shooting, &c.

- 4. No person shall in the Reserve except in accordance with a written permit— $\,$
 - (a) shoot, trap, maim, injure, kill or destroy any bird or animal;
 - (b) have in his possession or carry or use any fire-arm, poison, trap or snare.
- 5. (a) Any person carrying or using any firearm, poison, trap or snare in the Reserve without a permit shall surrender the same on demand to any authorised officer who shall issue a receipt therefor.

(b) The person apparently entitled to any such article may collect it from the office of the Committee, after completion of investigations and legal proceedings (if any) by the Committee in relation to any offence alleged against the person who surrendered the same.

Damage

- 6. (a) No person shall in the Reserve, remove, cut, damage, displace, deface or interefere with any rock, timber, tree, shrub, plant, wild flower or other vegetation, or any sign, notice board, seat, table, gate, post, fence, bridge, building, structure or any other thing of a like nature.
- (b) No person shall dig up or remove from or bring into the Reserve any gravel, stone, shell-grit, sand, soil or loam.

Missiles

7. No person shall roll or throw any stone or any other substance or missile within the Reserve.

Refuse and Litter

8. No person shall within the Reserve deposit or cause to be deposited, except in a receptacle provided for the purpose, any bottle, glass object, vessel or other container, broken glass, tins, waste paper, foodstuff, vegetable matter, offal or other refuse or litter.

Glass

 \cdot 9. No person shall intentionally break any glass, bottle or other container within the Reserve.

Conoral

- 10. No person shall in any part of the Reserve except in accordance with an upon the terms of a permit in writing—
 - (a) sell or offer for sale any article whatsoever;
 - (b) give out, distribute, erect, leave, set up or display any handbills, placards, notices, pamphlets, books, papers, advertising matter or like thing;
 - (c) occupy, use or enter any building, booth, shed, stand or enclosure unless the same is set aside for public use;
 - (d) erect or place therein any building, booth, shed or other structure;
 - (e) solicit or collect money or orders for goods or services;
 - (f) take part in or advertise any entertainment for gain;
 - (g) preach, declaim, harangue or deliver any address of any kind, or use any amplifier, public address system, loud hailer or similar device;
 - (h) let for hire any article, device or thing;
 - (i) ply any vehicle for hire or carry passengers for fee or reward;
 - (f) conduct any school or provide any form of instruction for gain;
 - (h) advertise for sale or trade or hire any article, device, service or thing;
 - (1) enter or remain in any Reserve in a state of intoxication;
 - intoxication;

 (m) take into, or consume in or on, or sell or distribute on the Reserve or any building situated thereon or appurtenant thereto, any intoxicating liquor without first obtaining a permit from the Committee and a licence or permit, as required, pursuant to the provisions of the Liquor Control Act, and then only in such place or places, or portion of the Reserve as may be set apart for the purpose by the Committee;

 (n) use any vehicle in the Reserve for recreational
 - (n) use any vehicle in the Reserve for recreational purposes.

Dogs

11. No person shall cause, suffer or permit any dog belonging to him or in his charge—

nging to him or in his charge—

(a) to be brought into or enter or remain in the Reserve unless such dog is and continues to be at all times under proper control on a chain, cord or leash, and is effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person and from damaging or interfering in any way with any property in the Reserve;

(b) to be brought into or enter or remain in any camping area or any portion of the Reserve prohibited to the entry of dogs and indicated by notice.

Horses

12. No person shall ride, drive, or lead any horse upon the Reserve, except in those areas set aside by the Committee for that purpose.

Animals Generally

- 13. (a) Except as hereinbefore provided, no person shall cause or suffer or knowingly permit any animal belonging to him or in his charge to be brought into or enter or remain in the Reserve without a permit.
- (b) Any animal found in the Reserve contrary to these Regulations may be seized by an authorised officer and impounded or destroyed, and the owner or custodian therefor shall be liable to pay compensation for any damage done by such animal to any property in the Reserve.

Enclosures

14. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Committee, enter any area in the Reserve which is enclosed for the plantation of young trees, shrubs or grass plots or enclosed for the growth or preservation of native flora.

Fires

15. No person shall without a permit light a fire within the Reserve except in a fireplace provided by the Committee for the purpose and any person who lights a fire in the Reserve shall take all reasonable and proper precautions to ensure that the fire does not escape from control; nor shall any person wilfully, carelessly or negligently do, make or permit any act or omission which may result or be likely to result in damage by fire to anything growing or being on the Reserve.

Roadways, &c.

16. No persons shall, unless authorised by the Committee, drive, ride, push, pull, place or leave any vehicle in or on the Reserve except in or upon such roadways or areas as are set aside for the purpose, and no person shall allow any vehicle to remain stationary in any position where it may cause undue or unreasonable obstruction of the lawful passage of others.

Parking

- 17. No person shall park any vehicle within the Reserve except— $\,$
 - (a) in an area set apart for the purpose and clearly defined by signs;
 - (b) as and where directed or authorised by the Committee or an authorised officer;
 - (c) upon payment of such fees (if any) as may be prescribed.

Stranded Vehicles

- 18. An authorised officer may remove or cause to be removed or order the removal of any parked, stranded or broken-down vehicle from any roadway or area within the Reserve provided that the removal of any vehicle—
 - (a) shall be at the sole risk of the owner of the vehicle who shall be deemed to have accepted such risk as a condition of entry to the Reserve; and
 - (b) may be effected in such manner as the authorised officer deems fit,

Abandoned Vehicles

19. Any vehicle left unattended within the Reserve for a continuous period exceeding 48 hours may be removed by the Committee at the risk and expense of the owner.

Use of Facilities

- 20. No person shall---
 - (a) use any laundry, shower, toilet or other convenience or any part thereof in the Reserve except for its proper purpose and upon payment of such fees (if any) as may be prescribed;
 - (b) enter or use or permit any child under his care or control to enter or use any place, room, convenience or structure set apart for the use of the

opposite sex, provided that this Regulation shall not apply to a child under the age of six years when accompanied by an adult of the opposite

Directions by Sign

- 21. (a) The Committee may, by clear notices or signs established in such prominent position or positions as the case requires, prohibit or regulate any act, matter or thing within the Reserve or any part thereof.
- (b) No person shall erect or remove any such notice or sign except with the authority of the Committee.
 (c) No person shall disobey the directions indicated in any such notice or sign.

Directions to Leave

- 22. (a) Any authorised officer may direct a person who in his opinion offends against these Regulations forthwith to leave the Reserve or any place therewith.
- (b) Every person who fails to comply forthwith with any such direction shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and may be removed from the Reserve or any place therein.

Giving of Name

23. If, in the opinion of an authorised officer, any person has contravened or failed to comply with any provision of these Regulations then such officer may demand and receive the name and address of such person and any person who refuses when asked by such officer to furnish his name and address shall be deemed to have committed an offence against these Regulations an offence against these Regulations.

Obstruction of Officers

24. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with any authorised officer or any employee of the Committee in the execution of his duty in the Reserve.

Vehicles

- 25. No person shall---
 - (a) damage any vegetation or interfere with or dis-turb any sand, stone, gravel, rock, clay or earth by driving any vehicle or by any other means;
 - (b) drive any vehicle in a manner dangerous to the
 - (c) drive any vehicle so as to cause noise which is unreasonable in the circumstances.

General Powers

- 26. The Committee may-
 - (a) provide and maintain conveniences, facilities and amenities of any description in any part of the Reserve or arrange for the provision and main-tenance thereof and may from time to time determine or vary the conditions of entry or use thereof;
 - (b) make such arrangements as it deems necessary or desirable for or in connection with the proper and efficient management and operation of the Reserve or any portion thereof.

- 27. (a) Any permit may be granted for such period and subject to such terms, conditions and fees consistent with these Regulations as the Committee may from time to time determine, either generally or in the particular case.
 - (b) No permit shall be transferable.
- (c) Any permit may be revoked or withdrawn at the discretion of the Committee.
- (d) The holder of any permit shall observe and comply with all conditions thereof.
- (e) Any person purporting to hold any permit shall produce the same on demand by an authorised officer and unless such permit is thereupon produced that person shall not be entitled to claim the benefit of any such

 - (b) the owner of any portion of a fence within 10 metres of the junction of any streets or roads to reduce such portion of a fence to a height not exceeding 1 metre.

Where any such tree, shrub or hedge shall not be so removed or so lopped or such portion of a fence shall not be so reduced in height in manner and within the time stated in the notice hereinbefore prescribed by this By Law, the Council, at the expense of the owner of such private property or of such portion of a fence, as the case may be, may-
 - (a) remove or lop any such tree, shrub or hedge;
 - (b) reduce in height any such portion of a fence, provided such removal, lopping or reduction in height is consistent with the order of the Council contained in the said notice.
 - 6. Such notice hereinbefore prescribed-
 - (a) shall specify the removal, lopping or reduction in height ordered and state the time within the same shall be done;
 - (b) may be served on such owner by-
 - (i) causing the same to be handed personally to such owner; or

- (ii) posting the same in a prepaid registered letter addressed to such owner at his last address appearing in the rate books of the Council: or
- (iii) if no address of such owner appears in the said rate books, by posting such notice in a conspicuous position on such property or on such portion of a fence as the case may be.

- 5. No person shall cause or permit water supplied for irrigation to flow from any lands or premises owned or occupied by him onto or upon any street, road, footpath or right-of-way.
- 6. Any person who offends against this By Law shall for b. Any person who offends against this By Law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty of not more than \$100 (one hundred dollars) and he shall be liable to a further penalty of \$10 (ten dollars) for each and every day on which he continues to cause or permit water to flow onto or upon any road, street, footpath or right-of-way, providing however that he has been notified in writing by the Council to cease such discharge.
- 7. Any person offending against the above provisions, who by the discharge of waters causes damage to any street, road footpath or right-of-way shall in addition to such penalties as may have been imposed be liable to an action to recover the cost of such damage, in a Court of competent jurisdiction.
- 8. In this By Law the word "person" shall include any incorporated body.
- 9. The words road, street, footpath or right-of-way shall include any private street, road, path or right-of-way.

 10. This By Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire
- of Cohuna.





Publication will be facilitated by the submission of carbon copies for the use of the Gazette Officer.

1. Matter submitted to the Executive Council

Matter submitted to the Executive Council which requires gazettal will normally be published in the issue of the following week.

Where urgent gazettal is required, special arrangements should be made with the Gazette Officer, Room 15, first floor, Old Treasury Building.

2. Other matter

- (a) All other matter duly certified by a responsible officer for publication should be lodged with the Gazette Officer not later than half-past Nine a.m. on Tuesday.
- (b) Lengthy or involved notices should be forwarded several days before publication.
