PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the twenty-eighth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, intituled the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1980, No. 9501, it is amongst other things enacted that the several provisions of this Act shall come into operation on the day or respective days to be fixed by Proclamation or successive Proclamations of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette.

Now, therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation fix Tuesday, 3 February 1981, as the day on which sections 1, 2, 4, 5, 6 (a), 8 (2), 11 and 12 of the said Act shall come into operation and Wednesday, 1 April 1981, as the day on which sections 3, 6 (b) and (c), 7 and 8 (1) of the said Act shall come into operation, and Wednesday, 1 July 1981, as the day on which sections 9 and 10 of the said Act shall come into operation.

Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958 DECLARING A PROCLAIMED AREA

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

&c., &c., &c.

Whereas by Section 25 of the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958 it is provided that where the Governor in Council is of the opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidae (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the removal from any place in the proclaimed area to any place outside that area or from any place in the proclaimed area to any fruit fly or any fruit or vegetables of a kind or species which in his opinion may provide a host for fruit flies and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly, as is specified in the Proclamation:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family Trypetidæ (commonly known as fruit flies) and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

1. Declare those portions of Victoria described in the First Schedule to this Proclamation to be a proclaimed area.

2. Prohibit the removal from any place within the proclaimed area to any place outside that area or to any other place in that area of any fruit fly or any fruit or vegetables

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of a kind or species grown within the proclaimed area and named in the Second Schedule to this Proclamation unless such removal is made on the instruction of an Inspector or with his written permission, provided that fruit and vegetables passing through the proclaimed area may leave the proclaimed area without such instruction if the vehicle carrying such fruit or vegetables does not come to a halt within the proclaimed area except as required by traffic regulations.

3. Require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area within 25 metres of any property known to be infested with fruit fly to apply to an Inspector for a permit to remove from any place within the proclaimed area to any place outside that area or to any other place in that area any plant or soil and to refrain from such removal until a permit is granted,



APPLICATION FOR A PERMIT TO OWN AND USE A PIPELINE

1. In accordance with the provisions of section 11 (1) of the Pipelines Act 1967, notice is given that an application has been received by me from the Gas and Fuel Corporation of Victoria for a permit to own and use a pipeline for the purpose of conveying natural gas from Ballan to Ballarat.


ROAD SHIRE OF KILMORE Lengths in metree






MAIN ROAD WARRNAMBOOL - CARAMUT ROAD SHIRE OF WARRNAMBOOL



26. No person shall in the Parks-

TEACHING SERVICE (TEACHERS TRIBUNAL) REGULATIONS

AMENDMENT No. 537 (T.T. 95)

The Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Teaching Service Act 1958, hereby amends Regulation I of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations as follows:

Regulation 1

Rescind clause 24 and substitute therefor the following clause:

- "24. Where a member of the Teaching Service working in a country area as defined in paragraph (ii) of sub-clause 20(a) -
 - (a) satisfies the Director-General that he is disadvantaged by being compelled to reside more than 20 kilometres from his school and there is no regular means of public transport between his place of residence and the school;

(b) is administratively transferred to or located other than by his personal application in a school which is more than 20 kilometres from his established home and there is no regular means of public transport between his home and the school-

such member may receive an allowance for the current year for distances travelled to and from school in excess of 40 kilometres per day.

Provided that allowances paid under (b) shall not be renewed.

- 1. (1) This By-law may be cited as the City of Mel-bourne Good Order in Buildings (Amendment) By-law
- (2) In this By-law, the City of Melbourne Good Order in Buildings By-law 1965, By-law No. 458, is referred to as the Principal By-law.
 - 2. Clause 8 of the Principal By-law is amended-
 - (a) by inserting after the expression "climb onto," the expression "slide down,"; and
 - (b) by inserting after the expression "flagpole," the expression "fountain,".

- 3. The Principal By-law is amended by inserting after clause 9 the following clause:
 - "9A. No person shall-
 - (a) bathe, immerse any part of his body, paddle, swim, or wade in; or
 - (b) float, deposit, throw or otherwise place any article or thing on or into—
 any cascade, fountain, pond; pool, or water course in any building unless authorized to do so."
- 4. The Principal By-law is amended by inserting after clause 10 the following clauses:
 - '10A. No person shall in any building play on any escalator or ascend or descend any moving escalator in a direction other than that in which the escalator is moving.
 - 10B. No person shall in any building-
 - (a) bet, or play or take part in any gambling or unlawful game;
 - (b) display or erect any advertisement, notice, placard, or sign;
 - (c) solicit or collect gifts of money or subscriptions;
 - (d) enter any part of the building that is not open to the public-unless authorized to do so.
 - 10C. No person shall in any building hawk, sell, or offer or expose for sale any service or any article or thing except in a part of the building set apart for the purpose or unless authorized to do so.
 - 10D. No person shall in any part of any building open to the public be in possession or control of any liquor within the meaning of the Liquor Control Act 1968 ("liquor") other than liquor in a sealed container or receptacle, except in such part of the building as may for the time being be—
 - (a) licensed premises within the meaning of the Liquor Control Act 1968;
 - (b) a part in which the consumption of liquor is permitted in-accordance with a permit-granted under the Liquor Control Act 1968; or
 - (c) a part in which the Council has consented in writing to permit the consumption of liquor.'
- 5. Clause 16 of the Principal By-law is amended by omitting the expression "Land Act 1958" and substituting the expression "Land Act 1958 or the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1968".

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council of the City of Melbourne 15 December 1980, and confirmed 9 February 1981.

By-law No. 532

A, By-law, of the City of Melbourne made under section 800 of the Local Government Act 1958 and numbered 532 for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in land purchased or rented or otherwise provided by the Council of the City of Melbourne for the providing of places of public resort.

Whereas the Council of the City of Melbourne has purchased or rented or otherwise provided the pieces of land described in Schedule 2 to this By-law for the providing of places of public resort.

Now in pursuance of the powers conferred by the abovementioned enactment and of every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Melbourne orders as follows:

- 1. (1) This By-law may be cited as the City of Melbourne Places of Public Resort By-law 1981.
 - (2) The By-laws specified in Schedule 1 are repealed.

- In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires— "clause" means clause of this By-law;
 - "Corporation" means the Corporation of the City of Melbourne;
 - "Council" means the Council of the City of Melbourne; "employee" means employee of the Corporation;
 - "officer" means officer of the Corporation; "place of public resort" means so; much of any piece of land described in Schedule 2 as is not demised by the Corporation or subject to an agreement to demise entered into by the Corporation;
 - "Schedule" means schedule to this By-law;
 - "vehicle" means any conveyance designed to be propelled or drawn by any means, but does not include a wheel-chair;
- Words importing the masculine gender include the feminine, and the singular number includes the plural and the plural the singular.
- 3. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Melbourne in relation to each and every place of public resort.
- 4. A person shall not while using or being upon or in a place of public resort-
 - (a) commit any nuisance or any indecent or offensive
 - (b) be clothed in an indecent or improper manner;
 - (c) use profane, indecent, or obscene language, or any threatening, abusive, or insulting words;
 - (d) behave in a riotous, indecent, offensive, or insulting manner;
 - (e) sing any obscene song or ballad;
 - (f) assault any other person;
 - (g) annoy, disturb, interrupt, molest, or obstruct any other person lawfully and peacably using or upon or in the place of public resort;
 - (h), play, or operate any musical; instrument, radio, play or operate any musical instrument, radio, or television; set in such a manner as to materially interfere with the reasonable comfort and convenience of any other person (but nothing in this paragraph shall operate to prevent the playing, of any musical or noisy instrument in the place of public resort where the consent of the Council has been given pursuant to paragraph. (g) of clause 5);
 - clause 5);

 (i) damage, deface, destroy, disfigure, draw or write on, interfere with, remove, or, subject to paragraph. (d) of clause 5, affix anything to any building, decoration, drain, electrical or otherfitting or equipment; embellishment, fence, fountain, gate, improvement, light, notice, notice board; pole, post, property, seat, sign, statue, stonework, tree, tree-guard; water feature, water pipe, water tap, or other structure of any kind (but nothing in this paragraph-shall-operate-to-prevent-anyperson from writing or drawing on the stovenamelled metal panels standing vertically in the north-eastern part of the City Square—being the place of public resort designated in Schedule 2 as "Place of Public Resort No. 2"—and known as "the graffiti wall");
 - (j) write or draw, exhibit or display any indecent or obscene word, figure, or representation;
 - (k) disturb, interfere with, raise, or remove any part-of any pavement or other surface, whether of asphalt, brick, concrete, earth, grass, gravel, stone, or other material; or remove any soil or other material;
 - (I) damage, destroy, injure, interfere with, or remove any animal, bird, fish, flower, grass, hedge, lawn, plant, or shrub (but nothing in this paragraph shall operate to prevent the removal from any place of public resort of any dog lawfully brought into that place pursuant to paragraph (ν) of this clause).
 - enter or trespass or walk on or over any flower bed, flower box, or, garden plot, or any plantation or shrubbery;

- (n) climb, climb on to or over, jump on to or over, sit or stand on, slide down, or walk on or over any air-intake cover or housing, balustrade, canopy, cascade, embellishment, fence, flower bed, flower box, fountain, garden plot, gate, hedge, plant container, pole, post, refuse container, refuse receptacle, shrub, stair handrail, statue, table, tree, tree container, tree-guard, ventilation-shaft cover or housing, wall, or water course;
- (o) jump over or stand on any chair or seat;
- (p) throw, or discharge any frisbee, stone, arrow, quarrel, or other missile;
- (q) bathe, immerse any part of his body, paddle, swim, or wade in any cascade, fountain, pond, pool, or water course;
- (r) float, deposit, throw, or otherwise place any article or thing on or into any cascade, fountain, pond, pool, or water course;
- (s) be in possession of, carry, or use any firearm (being a firearm within the meaning of the Firearms Act 1958), or any offensive weapon or instrument;
- (t) spit, defecate or urinate, except in a public convenience;
- (u) bring into or allow to remain in the place of public resort or be in possession or charge of any animal (other than a dog), bird, or reptile;
- (v) bring into or cause or permit to be in the place of public resort any dog, unless the dog at all times while in the place of public resort is held by him by means of a chain, cord, handle, lead, leash, strap, or other device of a length in any case not exceeding 120 centimetres;
- (w) be in possession or control of any liquor within the meaning of the Liquor Control Act 1968 ("liquor") other than liquor in a sealed container or receptacle, except in such part of the place of public resort as may for the time being be—
 - (i) licensed premises within the meaning of the Liquor Control Act 1968;
 - (ii) a part in which the consumption of liquor is permitted in accordance with a permit granted under the Liquor Control Act 1968; or
 - (iii) a part in which the Council has consented in writing to permit the consumption of liquor;
- (x) be under the influence of any intoxicating liquor or drug;
- (y) bet, or play or take part in any gambling or unlawful game or sport;
- (z) launch or operate any model aircraft or model aeroplane;
- (za) use or cause to be used in the place of public resort any caravan, structure, tent, trailer, or vehicle for camping or living in; or
- (zb) hinder, impede, insult, interfere with, obstruct, or resist any officer or employee in the execution of his duty.
- 5. A person shall not while using or being upon or in a place of public resort, without the consent in writing of the Council or an officer authorized by the Council in that behalf—
 - (a) hawk, sell, or offer or expose for sale any service, or any appeal button, article, beverage, confectionery, foodst button, article, beverage, confectionery, foodstuff, fruit, goods, merchandise, raffle ticket or the like, tobacco, or other thing;
 - (b) erect any booth, kiosk, tent, or other temporary building or structure;
 - (c) display or erect any advertisement, notice, placard, or sign;
 - (d) affix, interfere with, make, or remove any bill, marking of any kind, notice, placard, or sign in, on or over any building, fence, gate, notice board, pole, post, sign, tree or other structure of any kind in or on the place of public resort;
 - (e) solicit or collect gifts of money or subscriptions;

- (f) bring into or allow to remain in the place of public resort any vehicle;
- (g) declaim, deliver any address, harangue, preach, speak to any assembly of other persons, or play on any musical or noisy instrument;
- (h) assemble with any other persons for the purposeof holding any concert, fete, function, gathering, meal, meeting, or picnic, or for the purpose of preaching, public speaking; or worship;
- (i) bring into the place of public resort any amplifier, loud hailer, loudspeaker, or other public-address apparatus of any kind;
- (j) operate any amplifier, loud hailer, loudspeaker, or other public-address apparatus of any kind, or speak into any live microphone connected to any amplifier, loud hailer, loudspeaker, or other publicaddress apparatus of any kind;
- (k) light any fire whether in any barbecue or elsewhere;
- (1) play at cricket, football, or any other game;
- (m) ride any bicycle or any scooter, skates, skate board, or other like toy vehicle;
- (n) take photographs for gain; or
- (o) enter any building, enclosed area, place, room, or structure that is not open to the public.
- 6. Every person upon or in a place of public resort shall at all times observe and comply with any reasonable order, direction, or request of any officer or employee or any member of the police force.
- 7. Where any advertisement, notice, placard, or sign, or the like, or any booth, kiosk, tent, or other temporary building or structure, or the like, has been displayed, placed, or erected in contravention of any provision of this By-law, then, apart from being liable to prosecution for so doing, the person displaying, placing, or erecting that thing shall on demand by an officer or employee take down or dismantle that thing and, if the officer or employee so requires, immediately remove that thing from the place of public resort.
- 8. Nothing in this By-law shall operate to prevent any officer or employee, or any member of—
 - (i) the police force;
 - (ii) any governmental security force or service;
 - (iii) any security service employed by the Council; or
 - (iv) the armed services of the Commonwealth of Australia—

or any member of the staff of or workman employed by any contractor doing any work for and on behalf of the Corporation, from doing such things and taking such action as may be required of him, either with or without vehicles and other equipment, in the course of his duties or work.

- 9. Any person who (whether wilfully or not)-
 - (a) does not do anything directed to be done; or
- (b) does anything forbidden to be done by or under the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.


