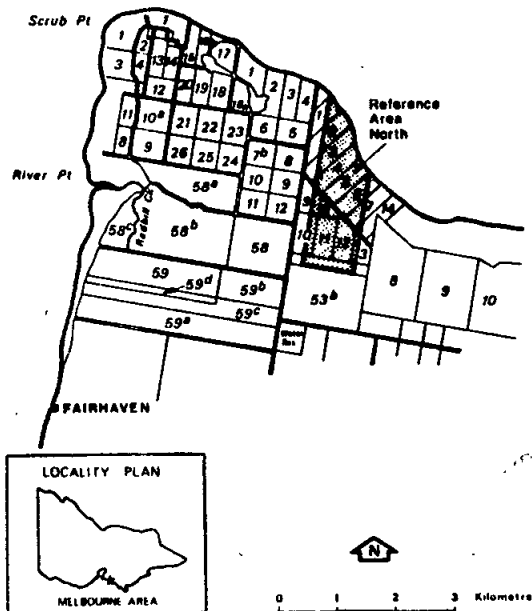

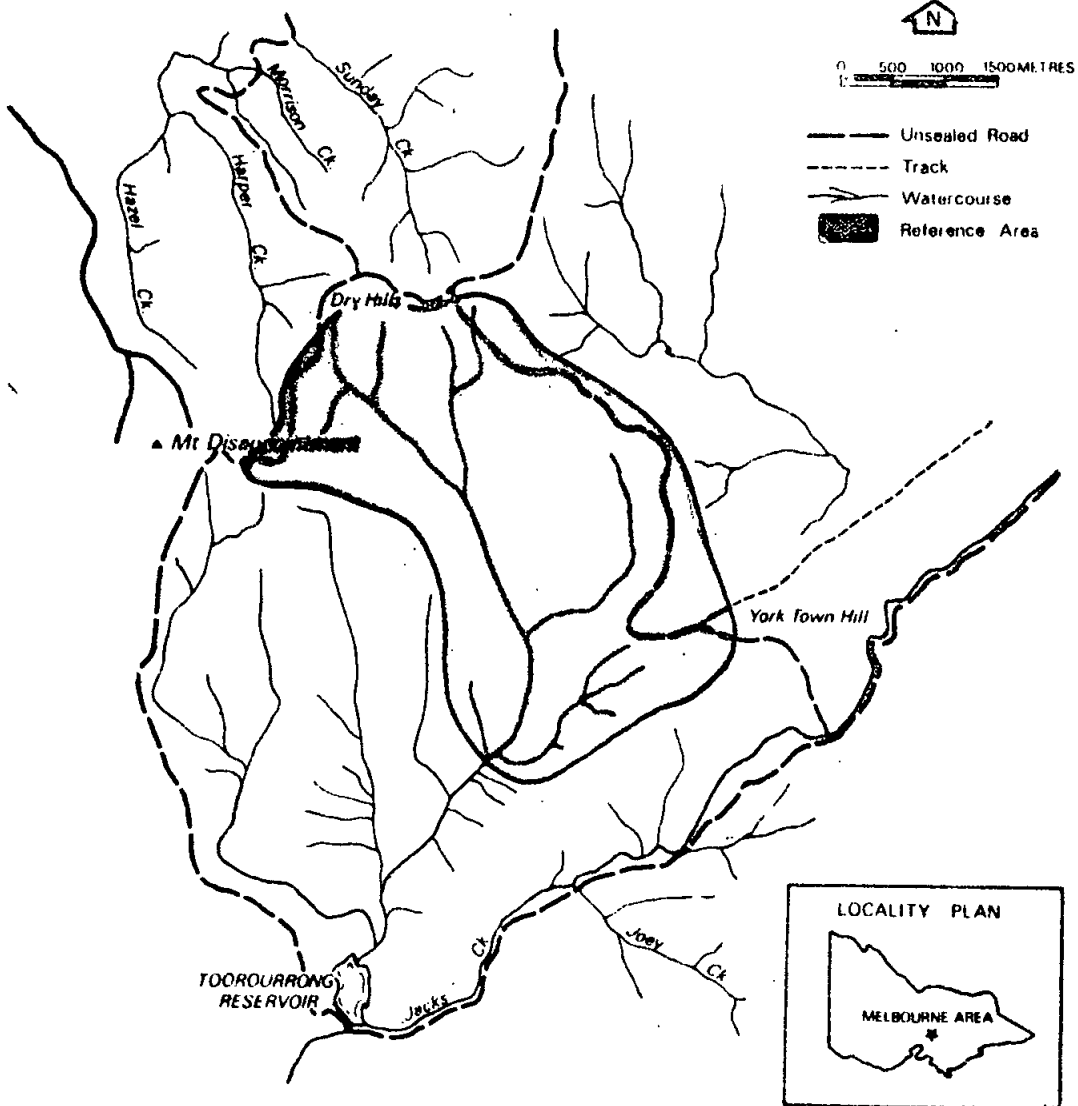

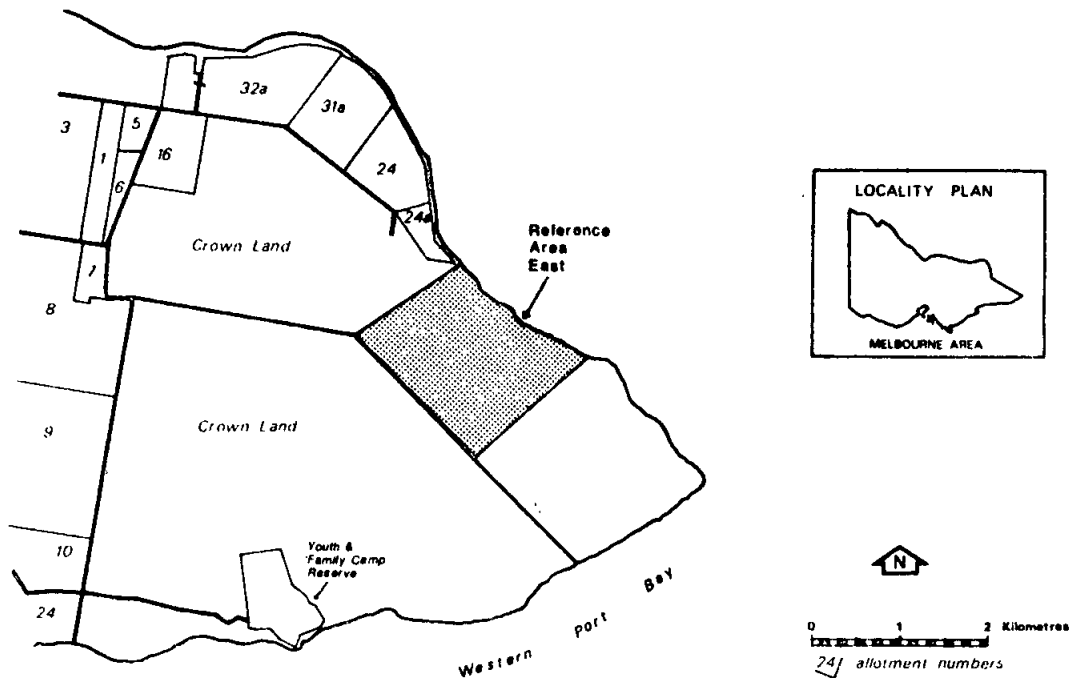

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and having considered a recommendation of the Land Conservation Council in pursuance of the provisions contained in Section 22 (1) of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1970 (No. 8008) do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment area to be known as the Mitchell River Water Supply Catchment.

The area proclaimed is the catchment to an offtake weir to be constructed for the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust on unreserved Crown land adjacent to Crown Allotment 30A, Parish of Glenaladale.

The use of land within this catchment is subject to specification by notice or by determination made by the Soil Conservation Authority, acting under the provisions of Sections 22 (2) and 23 (1) (a) (b) and (c) of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958, as amended.

The area described is indicated on Plan No. S-915 hereunder, the original of which is lodged at Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham Road, Kew, 3101.

a permit to remove from any place within the proclaimed area to any place outside that area or to any other place in that area any plant or soil and to refrain from such removal until a permit is granted.

Section 6 (1) of the Lotteries Gaming and Betting Act 1966 provides that the Raffles and Bingo Permits Board, upon application made to it in writing in a form approved by the Board by any person or body of persons desiring to conduct a raffle the net proceeds whereof are intended to be appropriated exclusively to a fund intended to be appropriated exclusively to a purpose coming within paragraph (a) of the interpretation of "Community purpose" or to the purposes of any cultural, social or sporting club or association of a kind approved for the purposes of this section by Order of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette, and upon payment of the fee (if any) prescribed in relation thereto may issue a consent in writing to the conduct of such raffle.

2. Section 6 (7) of the Lotteries Gaming and Betting Act 1966 provides that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and in like manner revoke amend or vary Orders for the purposes of sub-section (1) and may make Regulations for or with respect to—

- forms for the purposes of this section;
- conditions to which consents and permits issued or granted under this section shall be subject; and
- generally, all matters which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed for the purposes of this section.

3. By Order in Council dated 29 September 1959, and published in the Government Gazette of 7 October 1959, approval was given to cultural, social or sporting clubs or associations, other than professional sporting clubs or associations, for the purposes of section 88 of the Police Offences Act 1958.

4. By Order in Council dated 20 June 1967, and published in the Government Gazette of 12 July 1967, the Order in Council of 29 September 1959 was amended in relation to paragraph (c) by providing that approvals given pursuant to section 6 of the Lotteries Gaming and Betting Act 1966, formerly section 88 of the Police Offences Act 1958, shall be in relation to those cultural, social or sporting clubs or associations whose rules provide that its income and property whencesoever derived, shall be applied solely towards the promotion of its objects and that no member of its governing body shall be appointed to any salaried office or office of profit in the club or association and that no remuneration or other benefit in money or moneys worth shall be given by the club or association to any such member except the repayment of out-of-pocket expenses, interest on money lent or reasonable and proper rent for premises demised or let to the club or association.

5. It is proposed to remove the restrictions placed on professional sporting clubs and associations holding raffles.

RESERVE"GRANGE BURN" PUBLIC PARK AND RECREATION
RESERVE, HAMILTON

I, William Vasey Houghton, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 13 of the *Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978*, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Crown lands described in the Schedule hereunder, hereinafter referred to as the "Reserves".

The Reserves have been placed under the control of the Corporation of the City of Hamilton (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

SCHEDULE

- The land in the Township of Hamilton, Parish of North Hamilton, temporarily reserved for an Ornamental Plantation by Order in Council of 2 April 1906 (see *Government Gazette* dated 11 April 1906) ("Victoria Park" Ornamental Plantation Reserve)—(Rs.4331).
- The land in the Township of Hamilton, Parishes of North Hamilton and South Hamilton, temporarily reserved for a Public Park and for Public Recreation by Order in Council of 11 July 1972 (see *Government Gazette* dated 19 July 1972 ("Grange Burn"))—(Rs.9614).

REGULATIONS

- The Reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
- No person shall—
 - enter or remain in the Reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner or create or take part in any disturbance;
 - enter or remain in the Reserves whilst in a state of intoxication;
 - use indecent or offensive language in the Reserves;
 - offer any article of food, drink or any other commodity whatsoever for sale, or bring intoxicating liquor into the Reserves without the consent of the Committee first obtained;
 - obstruct, hinder or interfere with any person employed on the Reserves;
 - climb, jump on or get over any of the gates or fences in or around the Reserves; or stick bills or advertisements or cut names thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, furniture or fittings, gates, stiles, fences, seats or other structures in the Reserves;
 - interfere with, break or damage in any way any of the trees, shrubs or plants, or pluck flowers or destroy or cut grasses in the Reserves;
 - leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, refuse, or rubbish whatsoever in the Reserves; nor roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein, or leave anything that might injure a person;
 - light fires in the Reserves, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee;
 - carry or discharge any firearms or air guns in the Reserves, or shoot, snare or destroy any animals or birds thereon;
 - bet publicly in the Reserves without the consent of the Committee;
 - spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure in the Reserves;

- (m) erect any building, tent or structure or camp on any portion of the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee;
- (n) bring into the Reserves any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained;
- (o) dig or remove any sand, soil, stone or other material from the Reserves;
- (p) do anything whatsoever in the Reserves for the purpose of making money without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
3. For the purpose of good order, any person authorized by the Committee may refuse admission to any person to the Reserves.
4. No person shall remain in the Reserves at any time when lawfully directed by a member or employee of the Committee to leave the same.
5. No club, association or person shall hold or take any part in any game of any description, entertainment, performance, show or ceremony in any part of the Reserves without the written authority of the Committee first obtained and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms and conditions as the Committee deems to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.
6. No person, except the Committee or its officers and employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserves when a charge for admission is made without first paying the fee chargeable for admission.
7. No person shall park a motor vehicle within the Reserves except at such places, if any, as are set apart for the purpose.
8. No person shall take or put or allow to be taken or put in the Reserves any horses, cattle, sheep or other animals, except as hereinbefore provided, without the consent, in writing of the Committee first obtained.
9. No person shall enter any building in the Reserves or enter upon the arena therein without the permission of the Committee, and any person having done so shall leave the same on having been requested to do so by any member of the Committee, a member of the Police Force or a Bailiff of Crown Lands.
10. The driver of a motor vehicle entering the Reserves shall proceed at a speed not exceeding twenty (20) kilometres per hour.

"SOLOMON GULLY FLORA RESERVE" AT BENDIGO PARISH OF SANDHURST

 - (c) carry or use any trap, snare, net or other device for the capture of animals;
 - (d) disturb, interfere with or destroy any bird or other animal or its lair or nest;
 - (e) interfere with, mark, deface, or damage any buildings gates, fences, barriers, seats, signs or other improvements;
 - (f) disturb or remove any soil sand gravel or rock;
 - (g) leave or deposit any glass bottle, tin can, waste paper, refuse or any other rubbish except in receptacles provided for the purpose;
 - (h) erect buildings, nor sell or offer to sell or hire any article or commodity;
 - (i) camp;
 - (j) bring any dog;
 - (k) put or allow to remain any sheep, horses, cattle, pigs or other animals.

QUEENSTOWN PRESERVATION OF NATIVE FLORA RESERVE

I, William Vasey Houghton, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 13 of the *Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978* do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Crown land in the Township and Parish of Queenstown temporarily reserved for the Preservation of Native Flora by Order in Council of 23 June 1959 (*vide Government Gazette* dated 1 July 1959) hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS

- (i) No person shall—
 - (a) carry or discharge any firearm, air gun or other lethal weapon in the Reserve or catch or destroy or interfere with any bird, fish or other game in the Reserve;
 - (b) dig up or remove any sand, soil, turf or loam in or from the Reserve;
 - (c) leave or deposit or cause to be left or deposited any unwanted material or rubbish of any kind in the Reserve;
 - (d) bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep or any other animals;
 - (e) ride any bicycle or motor cycle or drive any motor vehicle or any other vehicle within the Reserve;

- (f) remove, disfigure or displace any board, plate or tablet or any support, fastening or fitting used or constructed for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee in the Reserve;
 - (g) climb, jump on or over or under any fences or gates in the Reserve, or cut or in any way remove or damage any of such fences or gates or any of the buildings, seats or equipment therein;
 - (h) throw or discharge any missile in the Reserve to the damage, danger or annoyance of any person in the Reserve;
 - (i) enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct or who may behave in a disorderly or offensive manner or create or take part in any disturbance;
 - (j) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst under the influence of alcohol or drugs;
 - (k) wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any officer or servant of the Committee in the proper execution of his duty or work;
 - (l) remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by a member of the Police Force, a Bailiff of Crown Lands, or any officer or servant of the Committee, to leave the same;
 - (m) camp in the Reserve;
 - (n) bring a caravan into the Reserve.
- (ii) No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained—
- (a) make any excavation in the Reserve;
 - (b) remove or damage any native flora or fauna in the Reserve;
 - (c) light any fire in the Reserve;
 - (d) plant any trees, shrubs or other plants in the Reserve;
 - (e) sell or offer for sale in the Reserve any article or any commodity whatsoever;
 - (f) in the Reserve, pluck, cut, dig, pick up, damage or otherwise interfere with or have in his or her possession the whole or any part of any shrubs, flowers, grasses, trees or plants of any kind—(Rs.7834).

By-Law No. 57

A By-law of the Shire of Healesville made under Section 197 and Section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1958* as amended and every and any other power it thereunto enabling, and numbered 57 for the purpose of—

- (a) Regulating restricting or prohibiting the use of caravan or camping parks or sites and regulating the conduct or management thereof;
- (b) Prohibiting or regulating the placing of caravans on private property;
- (c) Providing for the health of the residents in the municipal district and against the spreading of contagious diseases;
- (d) Suppressing nuisances;
- (e) Preserving public decency;
- (f) Other purposes.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* as amended and every and any other power it thereunto enabling the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Healesville order as follows:

1. This By-Law shall come into operation on the day after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

2. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“Annexe” includes any structure, awning, verandah, lean-to or carport or other enclosed or partly enclosed area used or capable of being used in conjunction with or appurtenant to a caravan.

“Camp Site” means an area within a caravan or camping park designated on the ground by means of a numbered peg or sign and defined by fences, hedges, walls, posts or any suitable markings above ground level and includes a caravan site.

“Camper” includes each and every person camping in tents, caravans or similar temporary accommodation on any caravan or camping park or site with or without the permission of the Council or the Manager and with or without payment of any fee or the giving of any consideration to the Council or the Manager.

“Camping” includes the erection or placing of a caravan annexe tent or vehicle on a camp site or within a caravan park but does not include the placing of a vehicle by a person who is also camping in or occupying a camping or caravan park in some other manner.

“Caravan” includes any object or structure having the general characteristics of a caravan, a house on wheels, a covered van, and any vehicle used or adapted for living or sleeping purposes whether the wheels or axles thereof having been removed or not and whether it is resting directly on the ground or is placed on blocks or other supports.

“Caravan Park” and “Camping Park” means any premises owned by the Council which persons are frequently, seasonally or intermittently permitted to use for camping whether or not any lease or licence in respect of such premises has been granted to any other persons and whether or not the premises are managed or operated by the Council or by some other persons.

“Council” means the Council of the Shire of Healesville.

“Council Officer” means any officer, employee or agent appointed by the Council for the inspection, supervision or management of any caravan or camping park or parks.

“Manager” means and includes the occupier, lessee, licensee or person having the control or management of a caravan or camping park or the servants or agents of such person.

“Occupier” includes any person in fact in occupation of a camp site whether in conjunction with a person camping or otherwise.

“Refuse” includes food and any other waste or discarded matter.

“Tent” includes any structure, awning or lean-to made of canvas, nylon, plastic or similar material and intended for the purposes of accommodation or shelter.

“Vehicle” includes—

- (a) motor cars within the meaning of the *Motor Car Act 1958*;
- (b) caravans and trailers; and
- (c) motorised vehicles for recreational purposes, including all mini bikes, trail bikes, motor bikes, motor scooters, go-carts and any other vehicle which may be propelled by a motor or a recreation vehicle within the meaning of the *Recreation Vehicle Act 1973* and which is normally used for recreation.

3. No person shall, without permission in writing of the Council first obtained, and subject to such conditions as the Council thinks fit within a Camping or Caravan Park—

- (i) Camp on or occupy any portion thereof except on such portions as are specially set apart as camp sites.
- (ii) Erect or place any building, booth, shed, stand, screen, post, rail, fence, swing, seat, obstruction or structure of whatsoever kind other than a caravan or annexe or a tent of similar structure.
- (iii) Let for hire or grant any permission or licence for fee or reward to use any caravan, tent, annexe, seat, chair, building structure, vehicle or other item.
- (iv) Operate or use any loudspeaker, amplifier or broadcasting equipment either mechanical or electrical for broadcasting music, speech or other noises or sounds and which may be heard beyond the confines of his allocated camp site.
- (v) Preach, declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public.
- (vi) Affix any bill, sign or notice board to any tree or structure.
- (vii) Discharge any firearm or set off any fireworks or carry any firearm or other offensive weapon. (This subsection shall not apply to any member of the Police Force in the execution of his duties.)
- (viii) Take or consume intoxicating liquor.
- (ix) Drive a vehicle upon any area other than defined roadways or on areas set aside for the parking of vehicles provided always that any Council Officer or the Manager may in the execution of their duties to inspect, supervise, manage or conduct the park, drive upon such other areas as may be reasonably necessary.

4. Any permission issued hereunder by the Council, Council Officer or Manager to a person may be cancelled or withdrawn at any time by the Council, Council Officer or Manager and where such cancellation or withdrawal relates to the use of camp site a proportional amount of any fees or charges paid in advance shall be refunded. The Council, Council Officer or Manager at it or his discretion may deduct and retain from any such proportional amount a sum as it or he determines will be necessary to clean up and put in order the site so vacated.

5. All persons camping in or occupying any camp site shall be responsible for maintaining such site in a clean sanitary and tidy condition and before vacating such site shall collect and dispose of all refuse thereon in the receptacles provided for that purpose.

6. Any person camping or occupying a camp site and in charge of a vehicle who desires to park the vehicle in a camping or caravan park shall park it within the confines of a parking area or camp site allocated to him for that purpose by a Council Officer or the Manager, or in the absence of any such person, on a vacant parking or camping site in the said park.

7. Within the confines of a camping or caravan park—

- (i) No person shall dig any trench around vehicles, caravan, trailer or tent.
 - (ii) No animals shall be permitted with or to be brought with any person.
 - (iii) No fires shall be lighted in the open except in such places as provided by the Council or the Manager for that purpose.
 - (iv) No person shall mark, write, deface, cut, saw, dig, mow, displace or in any way damage any tree, notice or structure.
 - (v) No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited refuse other than in the receptacles provided for that purpose by Council or the Manager.
 - (vi) Waste water shall be placed in or directed into receptacles or gully traps provided by the Council or the Manager and under no circumstances shall waste water be deposited on or allowed to overflow onto the grounds of the camping or caravan park.
 - (vii) Any camper or occupier shall be responsible for the emptying of waste water receptacles used by him as and when required or directed by a Council Officer or the Manager and then only into gully traps provided for the purpose.
 - (viii) No person shall drive or ride any vehicle at a speed greater than 10 kilometres per hour.
 - (ix) No person shall drive or ride any recreational vehicle.
 - (x) No person shall launch or moor any boat except from or at such places as are set apart for such purposes.
 - (xi) No person shall park, store or leave a boat without first having obtained permission from a Council Officer or the Manager.
 - (xii) No person shall offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
 - (xiii) No male over the age of six years save and except a Council Officer or the Manager shall enter or use any place, room, convenience or building set apart for the use of females, and no females save and except a Council Officer or the Manager shall enter or use any place, room, convenience or building set apart for the use of males.
 - (xiv) No person shall spit or expectorate.
 - (xv) No person shall remove or displace or damage any board, plate or fitting used for the exhibition of any By-law, Regulation or the like, or any sign or notice board set up by the Council or the Manager.
 - (xvi) No person shall wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any Council Officer or the Manager in the proper execution of his work or duty.
 - (xvii) No person shall wilfully obstruct, disturb, annoy or cause a nuisance to any other person.
 - (xviii) Every person holding or purporting to hold any receipt or permission, in writing issued by the Council shall, on demand by any Council Officer or any member of the Police Force, produce such receipt or permission.
8. (i) Except in accordance with clauses 9 and 10 of this By-law no person shall camp in any caravan park for more than a total of 182 days during any continuous period of 12 months.
- (ii) Such total of 182 days shall be made up of no less than 4 periods each of not more than 42 days.
- (iii) Any two camping periods of 42 days shall be separated by not less than 42 days.

9. During that part of each year from 25 May to 7 August inclusive a maximum number of 12 caravan sites in each caravan park may be occupied where occupancy starts between 25 May and 26 June inclusive for a period in excess of 42 days providing such occupancy shall end no later than 7 August and such days in excess of 42 shall be in addition to the total of 182 days prescribed in clause 8.

10. During that part of each year from 19 September to 30 November inclusive a maximum number of 12 caravan sites in each caravan park may be occupied where occupancy starts between 19 September and 19 October inclusive for a period in excess of 42 days providing such occupancy shall end no later than 30 November and such days in excess of 42 shall be in addition to the total of 182 days prescribed in clause 8.

11. Every person found committing an offence against the provisions of this By-law or who fails to obey an order by a Council Officer or member of the Police Force to cease committing such offence shall, in addition to the offence being committed, be guilty of another offence against this By-law.

Every person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$400.00 and further penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Healesville.

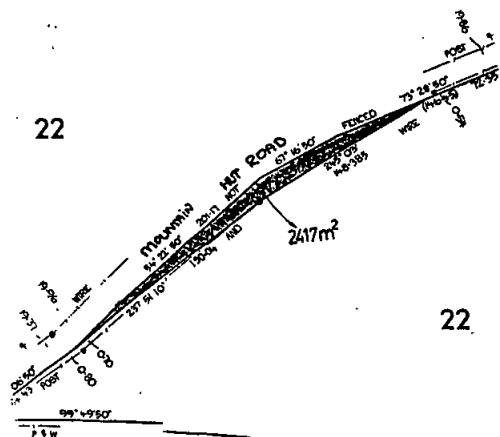

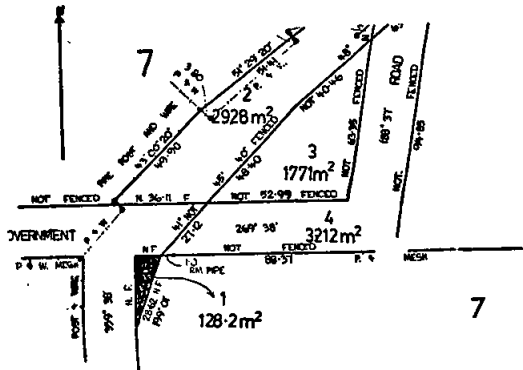

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, intituled the *Port of Melbourne Authority (Amendment) Act 1980, No. 9444*, it is amongst other things enacted that Section 2 of the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this my Proclamation fix Wednesday 25 February 1981 as the day on which Section 2 of the *Port of Melbourne Authority (Amendment) Act 1980, No. 9444* shall come into operation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eighty-one and in the thirtieth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.
