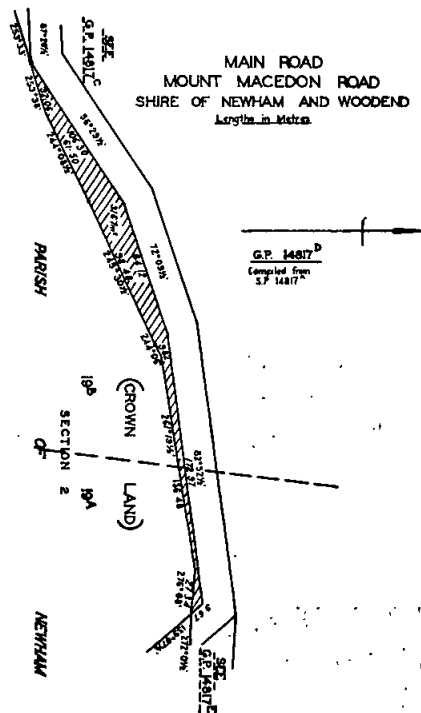
MAIN ROAD

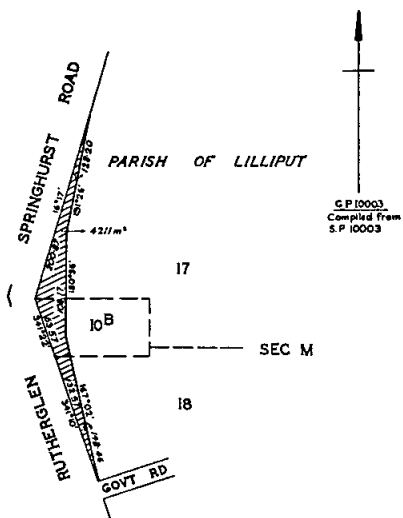




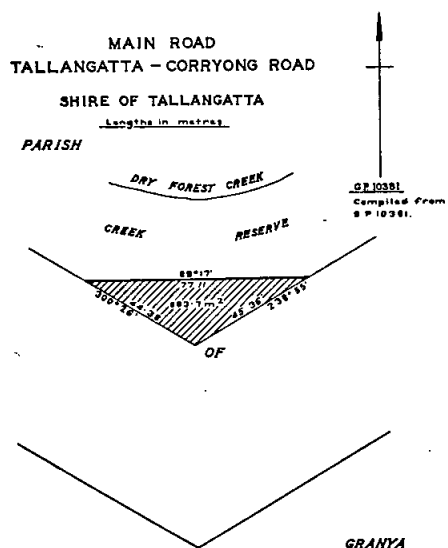
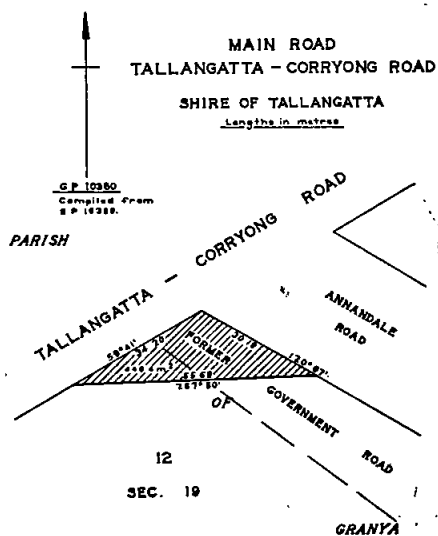

Lengths in metres

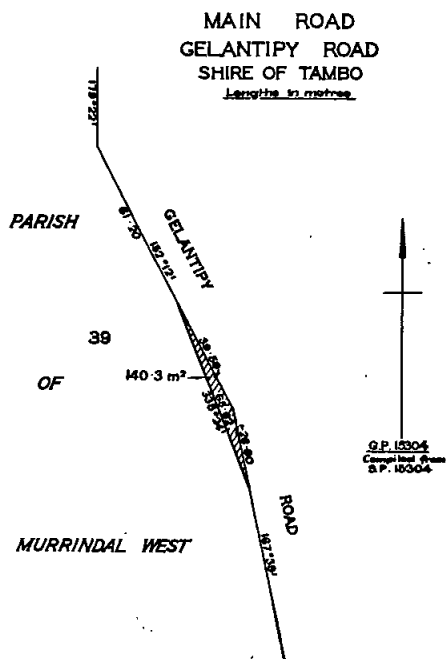

- (h) erect buildings, nor sell or offer to sell or hire any article or commodity;

- (j) bring any dog;
- (k) put or allow to remain any sheep, horses, cattle, pigs or other animals.

3. No person shall unless authorized by consent in writing of the managing body—

- (a) interfere with, mark, deface or damage, pick or injure any tree, shrub, flower, plant, or any other vegetation in the Reserve;

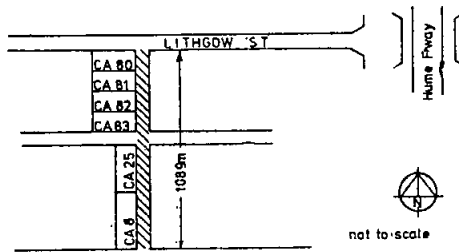
