PROCLAMATION

Community Welfare Services Act 1970
HER MAJESTY'S PRISON BEECHWORTH

NOTICE

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 114 of the Community Welfare Services Act 1970 provision is made whereby the Governor in Council may by Notice published in the Government Gazette proclaim buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places and premises to be prisons.

And whereas by sub-section (3) of section 114 of the said Act the Governor in Council may from time to time revoke or vary any Proclamation under that section.

And whereas by Notice, dated 26 April 1972 and published in the Government Gazette, dated 3 May 1972, the Governor in Council did proclaim all buildings, erections, houses, enclosed places and premises within the area described in the Schedule included in that Notice to be a prison under the title of—

"BEECHWORTH TRAINING PRISON"—

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do vary the aforementioned Notice of 26 April 1972, by substituting:

- (a) for the expression "Beechworth Training Prison" contained therein, the expression "Her Majesty's Prison Beechworth", and
- (b) for the description of the area in the Schedule included therein, the following description—

"SCHEDULE

- (i) 2.137 hectares of land set apart for the purposes of a gaol in the Township of Beechworth, as described and approved by Order in Council, dated 15 October 1860 and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on 15 February 1861;
- (ii) 5589 square metres of land temporarily reserved for gaol purposes in the Township of Beechworth, as described and approved by Order in Council, dated 5 January 1869, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on 12 January 1869;
- (iii) 8688 square metres of land temporarily reserved for gaol purposes in the Township of Beechworth, as described and approved by Order in Council, dated 4 December 1930 and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on 10 December 1930;

- (iv) 277.23 hectares of land temporarily reserved as a site for Penal purposes in the Parish of Beechworth, as described and approved by Order in Council dated 23 April 1940 and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on 24 April 1940;
- (v) 120 hectares of land temporarily reserved as a site for Penal purposes in the Parish of Beechworth as described and approved by Order in Council, dated 16 March 1948 and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on 24 March 1948;
- (vi) 4047 square metres of land temporarily reserved as a site for Penal purposes in the Township of Beechworth, as described and approved by Order of the Governor in Council, dated 22 June 1954, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette of 30 June 1954;
- (vii) 48.64 hectares of land temporarily reserved as a site for Penal purposes in the Parish of Beechworth, as described and approved by Order in Council, dated 11 January 1955, and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on 19 January 1955; and
- (viii) 6.229 hectares of land temporarily reserved for Prison purposes in the Parish of Beechworth, as described and approved by Order in Council, dated 1 July 1980 and published in the Victoria Government Gazette on 9 July 1980."

Labour and Industry Act 1958

ORDER OF EXEMPTION UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 80E

Pursuant to an application from the Council of the City of Footscray, I, Robert Roy Cameron Maclellan, Acting Minister of Labour and Industry, hereby make the order exempting shopkeepers of shops conducted on the market site at 45 Moreland Road, Footscray and promoted by the Footscray Community Arts Centre, from being required to close and keep closed their shops in accordance with Part VI of the *Labour and Industry Act 1958*.

This Order—

- (a) Does not apply to shopkeepers of shops selling motor vehicles, new major electrical appliances commonly known as white goods, uncooked meat or new furniture other than wooden or hand crafted furniture;
- (b) Does not exempt any shopkeeper from being required to close and keep closed his shop on Good Friday or Anzac Day in accordance with Part VI and Part VIII;
- (c) Does not operate to permit the sale or disposal of liquor within the meaning of the *Liquor Control Act 1968* by any shopkeeper at any time when he would, but for the Order be required to close and keep closed his shop in accordance with Part VI;
- (d) Is issued subject to the proviso that all stalls are to be cleared of stock at the end of each day's trading and the site left in a clean and tidy state;
- (e) Is subject to review from time to time in the light of experience in its operation and may be amended, varied or revoked;
- (f) Shall, subject to any amendment or variation, operate from year to year until revoked, whilst the market site continues to be registered in accordance with the Provisions of Section 49 (1) (c) of the Act.

ORDER OF EXEMPTION UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 80E

Pursuant to an application from the Council of the City of Preston, I, Robert Roy Cameron Maclellan, Acting Minister of Labour and Industry, hereby make this Order exempting shopkeepers of shops conducted on the market site at the Village Twin Drive-In Theatre, Murray Road, East Preston, and promoted by Trash and Treasure (Australia) Pty. - (f) Shall, subject to any amendment or variation, operate from year to year until revoked, whilst the market site continues to be registered in accordance with the Provisions of Section 49 (1) (c) of the Act.

Lengths in metres



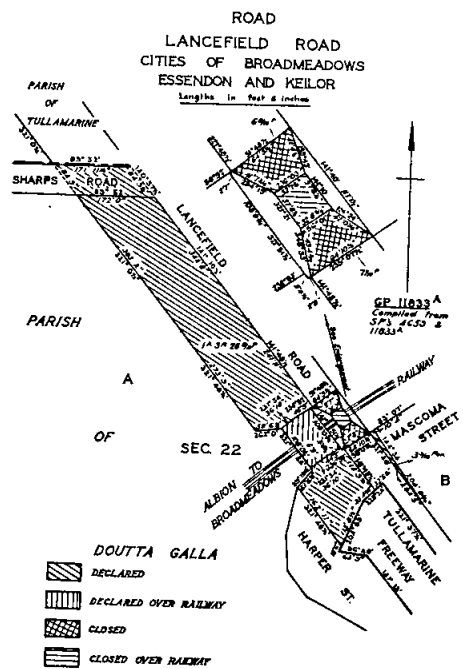

EILDON STATE PARK—HUNTING OF DEER BY STALKING

CARRYING AND USE OF FIREARMS

Under section 37 (3) of the National Parks Act 1975, the Director of National Parks may by notice published in the *Government Gazette*, authorize any class or classes of persons to carry and use any firearms or class or classes of firearms in the Eildon State Park (the park described in part 17 of Schedule Three to the Act) for such periods as are specified and subject to such conditions and restrictions as are specified in the notice.

Now therefore I, Donald Sydney Saunders, Director of National Parks, hereby give the following authorization for the part of Eildon State Park indicated by hatching on plan hereunder.

Class of Persons

Persons who are the holders of a current shooters licence with appropriate current Deer Stamp attached.

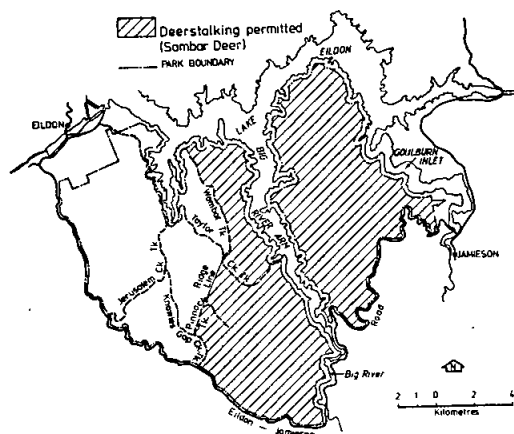
Persons who hold a current bow hunters licence with appropriate Deer Stamp attached.

Class of Firearms

Firearm (including bow or cross bow) authorized for the purpose of hunting sambar deer in accordance with the Wildlife (Game) Regulations 1976, No. 2.

Conditions and Restrictions

1. Carrying and use of the abovementioned firearms is limited to the class of persons specified above for the purpose of hunting of sambar deer during the period from the first Saturday after Easter until 30 November inclusive, and in accordance with the Wildlife (Game) Regulations 1976, No. 2.
2. The carrying or use of a spotlight is not permitted.
3. Dogs are not allowed.
4. The current shooters licence must be carried, and produced for inspection on request of an authorized officer of the Director.

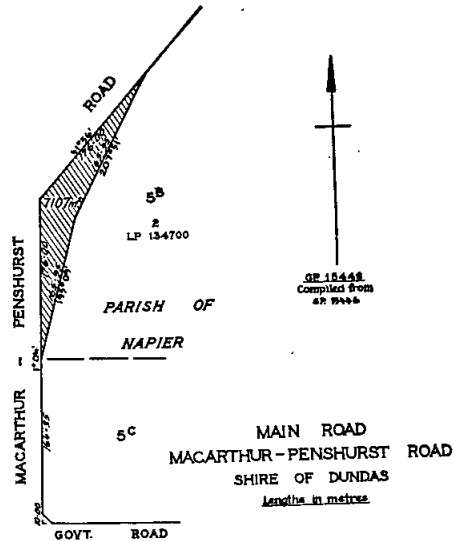

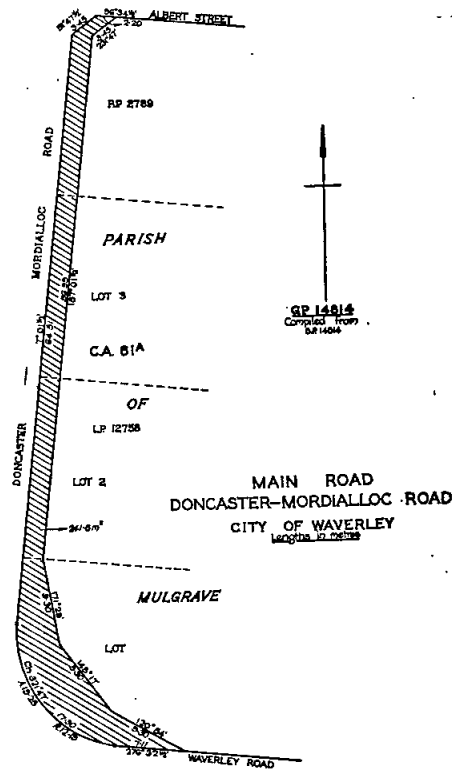

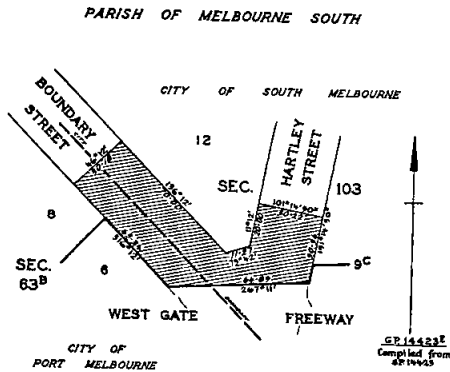

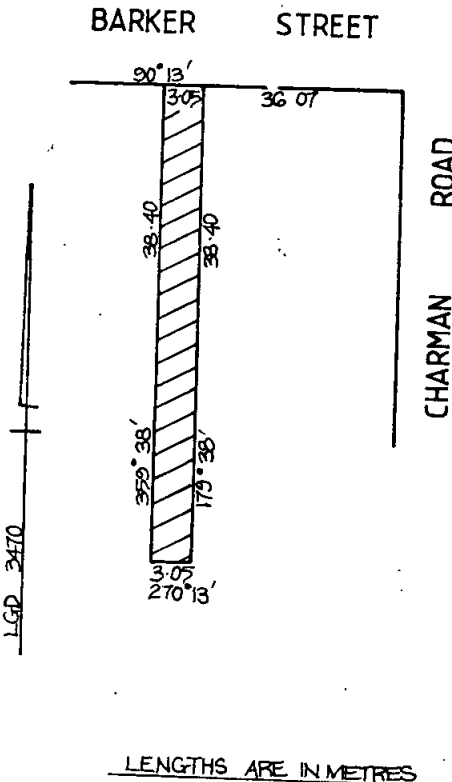
ROAD DISCONTINUED—CITY OF MOORABBIN

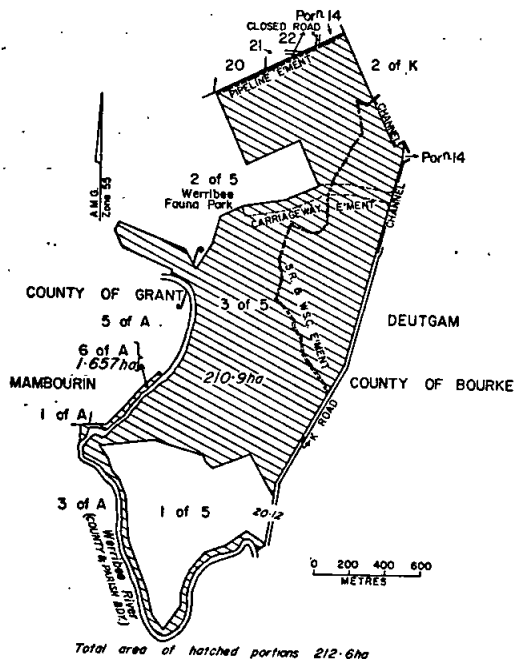

CONSERVATION OF AN AREA OF NATURAL INTEREST RESERVE, PARISH OF MORANDING

 - (d) interfere with, mark, deface or damage any buildings, gates, fences, barriers, seats, signs or any other improvement in the Reserve;
 - (e) leave or deposit any glass, bottle, tin, can, waste paper refuse or any other rubbish except in receptacles provided for the purpose in the Reserve;
 - (f) erect buildings, nor sell or offer to sell or hire any article or commodity while on the Reserve or from any building thereon;

- (g) permit any dog to be in the Reserve unless such dog is at all times controlled by a chain, cord or leash.
3. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the managing body—
- (a) interfere with, mark, deface, damage, pick or injure any tree, shrub, flower, plant or any other vegetation within the Reserve;
 - (b) remove any soil, sand, gravel or rock from the Reserve;
 - (c) light or cause to be lit any fire in the Reserve except in any properly constructed fireplace provided for that purpose;
 - (d) drive any vehicle off any formed road or parking area provided within the Reserve or in contravention of any authorized sign therein;
 - (e) put or allow to remain in the Reserve any sheep, horses, cattle, pigs or other animals, except as hereinbefore provided;
 - (f) organize or take part in any public entertainment, game or sport in the Reserve;
 - (g) camp on the Reserve—(Rs.10886).

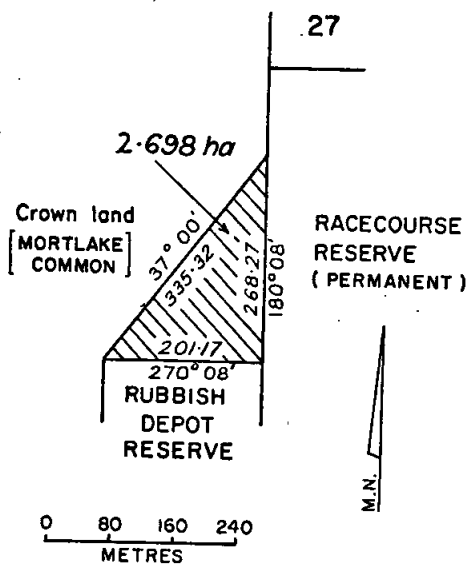

CITY OF SPRINGVALE

By-Law No. 206

Meetings Procedure By-Law

A By-Law of the City of Springvale made under Section 197 of the Local Government Act 1958 and numbered 206 for the purpose of regulating the proceedings of Council Meetings, Committee Meetings and other meetings conducted by the City of Springvale and for other purposes.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958 and in pursuance of all other powers it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Springvale order as follows:

SHORT TITLE

1. This By-Law may be cited as the Meetings Procedure By-Law.

2. By-laws numbered 147 and 200 of the City of Springvale are hereby repealed.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

Definitions

4. In this by-law unless the contrary appears—

"Act"

"Act" means the Local Government Act 1958 as from time to time amended and consolidated;

"Agenda"

"Agenda" means the notice of an ordinary, special or committee meeting;

"By-Law"

"By-Law" means a by-law of the City;

"Chairman"

"Chairman" means the chairman of a meeting, and includes a temporary or substitute chairman;

"Committee"

"Committee" means a committee of the Council;

"Common Seal"

"Common Seal" means the common seal of the City;

"Municipal District"

"Municipal District" means the area from time to time comprising the municipal district of the City;

"Ordinary Meeting"

"Ordinary Meeting" means an ordinary meeting of the Council;

"Special Meeting"

"Special Meeting" means a special meeting of the Council;

"Visitor"

"Visitor" means any person other than a Councillor or an officer or employee of the City.

Agenda

5. No business shall be considered at an Ordinary meeting unless it appears either on the agenda or in any report accompanying the same except—

(a) if the matter has been referred to the Council by a Committee which has met earlier on the same day;

(b) if the matter has arisen since the preparation of the agenda and reports, and is of such importance that a decision of the Council cannot be delayed, and the matter is submitted to the Council in writing either in the form of a supplementary agenda or report by the officer concerned so that it may be incorporated in the Minutes and the Council then and there deeming it urgent resolves that it be considered without notice.

6. A copy of the agenda of business together with a copy of all reports to be considered at any ordinary meeting shall be posted or delivered to every Councillor not later than two clear days before the time fixed for the holding of the meeting.

ADMISSION OF PUBLIC

Attendance at Special and Committee Meetings

7. (1) Special and Committee Meetings shall be held in camera, unless at least a majority of the whole Council votes in favour of the meeting or some part of it being held with open doors.

(2) Officers of the City and persons engaged by the City to advise the Council may attend a meeting held in camera, unless the Council otherwise directs.

Special Seating for Certain Visitors

8. The Mayor may invite a visitor to sit beside him or at the Council Table, unless in the particular case the Council otherwise resolves.

MINUTES

Minutes

9. The minutes of any meeting of the Council (including a special meeting) shall, unless confirmed at such meeting, be confirmed at the next meeting of the Council.

10. Where minutes are to be confirmed at the next meeting of the Council the first item of business thereat shall be—

(a) where a copy of the minutes of the previous meeting has been delivered to each councillor at least 48 hours prior to the meeting, the putting of a motion for confirmation of the minutes without the reading of same; or

(b) if a copy of the minutes of such previous meeting has not been so delivered the reading of and the putting of a motion for the confirmation of such minutes provided that no discussion shall be permitted on such minutes except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

ORDER OF BUSINESS

Order of Business

11. (1) After the confirmation of the minutes and the signing Order of thereof as by-law required the business of an Ordinary Business Meeting shall be as follows or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect.

(i) Apologies.

(ii) Declarations by councillors of any direct or indirect pecuniary interest in any items on the agenda.

(iii) Resumption of debate on motions or orders of the day lapsed at previous meeting.

(iv) Dealing with the correspondence referred to in Clause 12 hereof and considering and ordering thereon.

(v) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.

(vi) Presentation of reports and the authorizing of payments.

(vii) Business not elsewhere included.

(viii) Question time.

(ix) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.

(x) Reports from delegates appointed by the Council to other bodies.

(xi) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.

(xii) Urgent business.

(2) (a) No business shall be transacted at a special meeting except such as is stated in the notice thereof.

(b) The order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

Correspondence

12. (1) Unless otherwise directed by the Council, the Town Clerk shall determine what inwards and outwards correspondence should be placed before the Council for its decision or information.

(2) Correspondence addressed to any Councillor personally which requires a decision or direction of the Council shall be referred by the Councillor receiving the same to the Town Clerk.

(3) No correspondence, officers' or committee reports, shall be read in full at any meeting of the Council unless a Councillor requests that any particular item or items of correspondence or any of the reports be so read.

MOTIONS AND AMENDMENTS

Notice of Motion

13. No councillor shall propose a motion initiating a subject for discussion at an ordinary meeting of the Council (being a matter not listed on the agenda) except by giving notice as prescribed in Clause 14 hereof.

Provided that the Council may resolve by a two-thirds majority of those present to admit (without such notice) an item considered to be urgent business, not being a matter where the law otherwise requires that notice shall be given.

14. (a) Every notice of motion shall be in writing and dated and be given by the intending mover to the Town Clerk at such time as will permit the Town Clerk to give notice thereof in the manner and in the time required for a special meeting.

(b) A notice of motion to revoke a previous resolution of the Council

(i) shall be given to the Town Clerk as provided in section 185 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and in sufficient time to enable him to give two clear days' notice to all Councillors;

(ii) shall be deemed to have been withdrawn if the motion is not moved at the next meeting of the Council at which such business may be transacted; and

(iii) if it is a second or subsequent notice to revoke an earlier resolution, shall not be accepted by the Town Clerk until a period of one month has elapsed after the date of the meeting at which notice to revoke such earlier resolution was dealt with.

15. The Town Clerk shall number notices of motion when received and enter them in a notice of motion book in the order in which they have been received.

16. Except by leave of the Council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Town Clerk in the notice of motion book and, if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

Failure to Proceed with Notice of Motion

17. If a Councillor who has given a notice of motion:

(a) is absent from the meeting; or

(b) fails to move the motion when called upon by the Chairman, any other Councillor may himself move the motion forthwith.

Motions to be in writing

18. (a) Where so required by the chairman, the mover of any motion at any meeting of the council or a committee of the council shall reduce such motion into writing.

(b) Every motion shall be so worded that the meaning is clear and unambiguous and shall not be defamatory or objectionable in language or nature.

Form of Motion

19. (1) A motion or amendment shall be—

(a) within the powers of the Council; and

(b) relevant to an item of business properly before the Council as provided for in Clause 5 hereof.

(2) No motion or amendment shall be—

(a) defamatory; or

(b) objectionable in language or nature.

Motion to be moved and seconded without discussion

20. (1) The procedure upon any motion or amendment is:—

(a) the mover shall propose it without speaking to it and shall shortly state its nature; and

(b) the seconder shall indicate that he seconds it.

(2) A Councillor moving or seconding a motion or amendment shall not be deemed to have spoken thereon.

21. (1) If a motion or amendment is seconded—

(a) the chairman shall ask—

“Is the motion opposed?” or

“Is the amendment opposed?” and

(b) if no Councillor indicates opposition it shall unless the chairman permits further discussion be forthwith declared to be carried and shall be treated in law as having been passed unanimously.

Course of Debate of Opposed Motion

(2) If any Councillor indicates opposition to a motion or amendment which has been seconded—

(a) the mover shall address the Council upon it;

(b) the Councillor who has indicated opposition to it may address the Council upon it;

(c) the seconder shall address the Council upon it;

(d) it shall then be open to debate.

Motion Confirming a Special Order

22. A motion to confirm a special order must be carried or rejected without amendment.

Amendments

23. No second or subsequent amendment whether upon any original proposition or of an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

24. If any words of an original motion be rejected the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

25. If an amendment be negated or adopted then a second may be moved to the motion to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted for discussion at any time.

26. Except by the express leave of the meeting in any particular case to grant an extension of time, no councillor shall speak to any question for a longer time than—

The mover of a motion for five minutes;

Any other councillor for three minutes;

The mover of a motion where entitled to a right of reply for two minutes.

Right of Reply

27. The mover of an original motion which has not been amended shall have a right of reply to matters raised during debate immediately after which the motion shall be put from the chair; however, no right of reply shall be extended where the amendment is before the chair or the original motion has been amended.

FORMAL MOTIONS

28. The formal motions are—

(a) adjournment of the debate;

(b) adjournment of the meeting;

(c) the closure;

(d) laying the question upon the table;

(e) the previous question; and

(f) proceeding to the next business.

Adjournment of Debate or Meeting

29. (1) The adjournment of the debate or of a meeting may be moved—

(a) to a later hour on the same day;

(b) to a later date; or

(c) indefinitely.

(2) Any Councillor may move the adjournment even if he has already spoken to the motion then before the Council or to any amendment of it.

- (3) The adjournment shall not be moved—
 (a) during the election of a chairman; or
 (b) while any Councillor is speaking.

Motion for Adjournment

30. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

Closure

31. (1) The closure may be sufficiently moved—

“That the question be now put.”

(2) The closure may be moved in respect of a motion or of an amendment.

(3) No Councillor who has spoken to the motion then before the Council or to any amendment of it may move or second the closure.

(4) If the closure is carried, the motion or amendment in respect of which it is carried shall be put to the vote forthwith.

Laying the question upon the Table

32. (1) A motion to lay the question upon the table may be moved—

(a) in respect of a motion or amendment or in respect of any document or question before the Council; and

(b) by any Councillor who has not spoken to the matter in respect of which this motion is moved.

(2) If this motion is carried in respect of—

(a) a motion or amendment, neither the motion nor any amendment of it shall be further discussed or voted upon;

(b) a document or question, the document or question shall not be further discussed or voted upon, until the Council resolves to take the question from the table.

(3) The Council may at the same or any later meeting resolve to take the question from the table and the debate shall thereupon be resumed at the point at which it was interrupted by the laying of the question on the table.

The previous question

33. (1) The previous question shall not be moved—

“That the question be not now put.”

(2) The previous question shall not be moved—

(a) when any amendment is before the Council;

(b) during the election of a chairman; or

(c) while any Councillor is speaking.

(3) No Councillor who has spoken to the motion then before the Council or to any amendment of it may move or second the previous question.

(4) If the previous question is carried the motion then before the Council cannot be further debated or voted upon at that meeting.

(5) If the previous question is not carried the motion then before the Council must be put to the vote forthwith without further amendment or discussion.

(6) The previous question may be moved only by leave of the chairman.

Proceeding to the next business

34. (1) The motion to proceed to the next business shall not be moved—

(a) by any Councillor who has spoken to the motion then before the Council or to any amendment of it; or

(b) while any Councillor is speaking.

(2) The motion to proceed to the next business shall not be amended and shall be put to the vote immediately it is moved and seconded.

(3) If the motion to proceed to the next business is carried in respect of an amendment the consideration of the motion then before the Council shall proceed without reference to that amendment.

(4) If the motion to proceed to the next business is carried in respect of a motion, that motion cannot be further debated or voted upon at that meeting.

Addressing Meeting

35. Any Councillor desirous of moving a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman and, subject to Clauses 20, 21 and 26 hereof, shall not be interrupted unless called to order when he shall sit down until the Councillor calling to order has been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the Councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

Nature of Motion to be stated

36. Any Councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Council thereon.

37. Any Councillor, except the mover or seconder of the original motion, may propose or second an amendment. Any Councillor may address the meeting on an amendment whether or not he has spoken to the motion.

Motion how withdrawn

38. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the meeting.

Motion to be Seconded

39. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Council unless it be seconded, but a Councillor may require the enforcement of any standing order of the Council by directing the Mayor's or Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

40. At the conclusion of the item being dealt with at the hour of 11.30 p.m. at any meeting, no further item of business shall be dealt with at that meeting except such as shall be agreed to be dealt with in accordance with a motion to that effect duly moved and seconded and passed by a majority of the members of the Council then present. All items of business not dealt with at that meeting shall be dealt with at the next meeting and immediately following the confirmation of minutes.

Designation of Titles

41. The Councillors and Officers in any meeting shall designate each other by their official titles.

Priority of Councillors

42. If two or more Councillors rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

Chairman May Speak

43. The Chairman may address any meeting upon any matter under discussion and shall not be deemed to leave the chair on such occasions.

44. No Councillor shall speak a second time on the same motion, except where entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood, or as provided for in Clauses 27 and 37 hereof.

Speaking to Subject Matter

45. No Councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the motion and discussion or comment upon the words used by any other Councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on Councillors shall be deemed disorderly and contrary to Clause 50.

Councillor Called to Order

46. A Councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

POINTS OF ORDER

How Point of Order Taken

47. (1) A point of order shall be taken by stating:
- the matter complained of; and
 - the clause constituting the point of order.
- (2) A Councillor may take a point of order by drawing the attention of the Chairman to—
- the fact that a Councillor is out of order; or
 - an act of disorder, notwithstanding that the Chairman or a Councillor is speaking at the time.
- (3) The Chairman may take a point of order although it has not been taken by any Councillor.
- (4) Rising to express a difference of opinion or to contradict a speaker shall not be treated as taking a point of order.
- (5) The Chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision rule or practice which he deems applicable to the case without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

Chairman to Decide Point of Order

48. (1) The Chairman may adjourn the meeting to consider a point of order, but shall otherwise rule upon it as soon as it is taken.
- (2) A Councillor may move that the Chairman's ruling be disagreed with.
- (3) A motion under sub-clause (2)—
- shall specify the ruling to be substituted the Chairman's ruling;
 - shall be considered in priority to any other business; and
 - if carried—shall be acted upon instead of the ruling given by the Chairman.
- (4) A personal explanation arising out of a statement at a Council Meeting shall be made immediately.
- (5) A personal explanation shall not be debated except upon a motion to censure the Councillor who has made it.

Disorderly Expressions

49. Wherever any Councillor makes use of any expression that is disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other Councillor, the Councillor so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the meeting.

Councillor Guilty of an Offence

50. Any Councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw or to apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

Strangers Disorderly Conduct

51. Any person not being a Councillor who, having been admitted to a meeting of the Council and who is guilty of any improper or disorderly conduct or who does not leave when requested by the Chairman so to do, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

Removal

52. Any person referred to in Clause 51 who being requested by the Chairman to leave any such meeting may be forthwith removed; and any member of the police force or any person requested by the Chairman so to do, may remove such person.

53. Any meeting disrupted by the disorderly conduct of any person or the refusal of a Councillor to accept the ruling of the Chairman may be adjourned by the Chairman until order is restored.

Councillor May Demand Documents

54. Any Councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Council applying to the question under discussion.

COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Meetings of the Committee

55. The Municipal Clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the Council, or on the written order of the Chairman of the Committee or of any two members of the Committee.

56. Unless otherwise directed by the committee, the Town Clerk shall determine whether any items of inwards and outwards correspondence should be placed before the committee for its information or recommendation.

Committee Reports

57. (1) It shall not be necessary to keep minutes of the proceedings of any Committee.

(2) All reports of committee shall contain a recommendation to the Council on the matters considered.

(3) The Town Clerk shall cause a copy of all reports of Committees to be included in the agenda for the meeting of the Council at which such reports are to be presented.

Council Consideration of Committee Report

58. (1) When the committee report is placed before the Council the Chairman of the Council Meeting shall say—
"Is any clause of the report opposed?"

Adoption of Report Unopposed

(2) If no Councillor indicates opposition the report shall be forthwith declared to be adopted in full.

59. If a Councillor indicates opposition he shall state whether he objects to the whole report or part only of it.

Whole Report Contested

60. If the objection is to the whole of the report—

(a) the Councillor objecting to it shall move accordingly, but without speaking to his objection;

(b) the seconder of the motion of objection shall say—

"I second it."

(c) the Councillor objecting shall address the meeting;

(d) the seconder shall speak to the motion; and

(e) the matter shall be open to debate.

Objection to Part Only of Report

61. (1) If the objection is taken to part only of the report—

(a) the Councillor objecting shall name the clause or clauses of the report to which he objects;

(b) the clauses objected to shall be considered separately in their order in which they appear in the report;

(c) the Town Clerk shall read the clause;

(d) the Councillor objecting shall move accordingly without speaking to it;

(e) the seconder of the motion of objection shall second it without speaking to it;

(f) the mover and seconder of the motion of objection shall speak to it; and

(g) it shall be open to debate.

(2) When all objections to the report have been determined the Chairman shall say—

"The question is that the report be adopted."

or

"The question is that the report as amended be adopted."

and he shall put the question to the vote accordingly.

Effect of Adopting Report

62. Upon the adoption of a report by the Council each recommendation contained in the report as adopted shall be treated in law as being a resolution of the Council.

PETITIONS AND JOINT LETTERS

Petitions and Joint Letters

63. A petition or a joint letter—
- (a) shall be in any legible and permanent form of writing, typing or printing;
 - (b) shall not be defamatory, indecent, abusive or objectionable in language or substance; and
 - (c) shall not relate to a matter beyond the powers of the Council.

64. (a) Every page of a petition or joint letter shall bear the wording of the whole of the petition or request.

(b) Any signature appearing on a page which does not bear the wording of the whole of the petition or request shall not be considered by the Council.

(c) Every page of a petition or joint letter shall be a single piece of paper and shall not be pasted, stapled, pinned or otherwise affixed to any piece of paper other than another page of the petition.

65. Any person appending to a petition or joint letter; a signature purporting to be that of any other person or in the name of any other person is guilty of an offence.

66. (a) No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover at some previous meeting has submitted a draft of same.

(b) No motion, except that of receiving same shall be made on any petition, memorial or like application until the next ordinary meeting of the council after that at which it has been presented. Provided that this restriction shall not apply where the council determines by a two-thirds majority of those present that the matter is one of urgency and should be dealt with at the meeting at which it is presented.

(c) No petition shall be presented after the council has proceeded to the orders of the day.

67. Every Councillor presenting a petition to the Council shall state the names of the persons from whom it comes, the number of signatures attached to it, the material allegations contained in it, and the prayer thereof. He may also speak to the petition.

VOTING

Voting

68. When called upon the Councillors present at any meeting shall vote by a show of hands and any Councillor present and not voting, not being debarred by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

Questions How Determined

69. (a) The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the meeting, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

(b) Questions shall be decided by open voting and, unless otherwise specifically provided, by the majority present.

Casting Vote

(c) If there is an equal division of votes upon any question the chairman at such meeting shall, in addition to his own vote as a Councillor, have a second or casting vote, except in the case of any election of the chairman of the municipality or of any meeting.

Division

70. Wherever a division is demanded by any Councillor, the Councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands and the result be declared by the chairman.

Protests

71. Any Councillor may protest against any resolution of the Council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Council by the

protesting Councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Municipal Clerk, and signed by such Councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest is given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Council.

Lapsed Questions

72. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the Councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business; such debate may at the next meeting of the Council be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

Lapsed Order of the Day may be Restored

73. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of numbers as aforesaid happening, such debate may at the next meeting of the Council be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

CRITICISM OF COUNCIL OFFICERS

How Officers May Reply to Criticism

74. (1) A City Officer may make a brief statement at a Council or Committee Meeting in respect of any statement (whether made at a Council Meeting or not) affecting him as an officer or any officer under his control.

(2) A statement under this clause—

(a) in respect of a statement made at a Council or Committee Meeting shall be made immediately the Councillor concerned resumes his seat; and

(b) in respect of a statement made other than at a Council or Committee Meeting shall be at such time during the meeting at which the officer desires to bring it forward as the Chairman thinks appropriate.

CORRESPONDENCE

Councillor's right to inspect correspondence and require its production to Council

75. At any time during office hours or during a Council or Committee Meeting a Councillor may inspect the inward correspondence record and any correspondence referred to in it or any file of correspondence, and may require the Town Clerk to place any particular correspondence upon the agenda of the next ordinary, special or committee meeting delivered to Councillors.

QUESTION TIME

Question Time at every Ordinary Meeting

76. (1) There shall be a question time at every Ordinary Meeting to enable Councillors to address questions to City Officers, but the provisions of a question time shall not restrict the right of a Councillor to ask for information in the course of debate.

(2) Question time shall be part of ordinary business.

Questions with or without notice

77. (1) Questions may be asked with or without notice.

(2) A question upon notice shall be delivered to the Town Clerk not later than ninety-six hours before the time fixed for holding the meeting.

(3) An officer shall not be required to answer a question without notice.

(4) If an officer replies to a question asked without notice that he needs notice of it, notice shall be treated as having been given for the next Ordinary Meeting.

Questions and answers to be brief

78. All questions and answers shall be as brief as possible, and no discussion shall be allowed.

79. A question may be disallowed by the Chairman upon the ground that it—

(a) relates to a matter *ultra vires* the Council;

(b) is defamatory indecent abusive or objectionable in language or substance;

- (c) is repetitive of a question already answered (whether at the same or any earlier meeting); or
 (d) is asked to embarrass the officer or the municipal administration.

Reply may be in camera

80. (1) An officer shall advise the Council if it is his opinion that the reply to a question be given in camera.

(2) Any Councillor may require the officer to state briefly the reason why the reply should be given in camera, and unless the Council resolves to the contrary, the reply to such question shall be given in camera.

SEAL

81. (a) The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in safe custody by the Town Clerk and shall not be affixed to any document except by the authority of the Council.

(b) The affixing of the seal shall be witnessed by—

(i) the Mayor and any other Councillor or by two Councillors; and

(ii) the Town Clerk or some other officer authorized by the Council to act in the absence of the Town Clerk.

SUSPENSION OF REGULATIONS

82. Any one or more of these regulations may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given; and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the meeting.

83. In all cases not provided for by this by-law resort shall be had to the rules forms and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Council and its Committees.

84. Every person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than the maximum amount provided by the Act for each and every offence.
