INSTALLATION, SERVICE AND WARRANTIES

The Contractor shall be responsible for the safe transport of the goods and any damage occasioned to the goods during transit or during handling on site shall be his responsibility and no goods will be accepted unless placed in position on site or rail free from any damage.

If, during the currency of the contract, a new model of any item for which the Contractor holds a contract becomes available, the Tender Board reserves the right to order the new model in lieu of the contract item. Variation in price, if any, must be approved by the Tender Board prior to issue of the order.

All equipment must be provided with approved guards over any working parts to prevent accidental bodily contact. These guards must comply with safety regulations of the Labour and Industry Act.
