Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958

DECLARING A PROCLAIMED AREA

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by section 25 of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958* it is provided that where the Governor in Council is of the opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypetae* (commonly known as fruit flies), he may by Proclamation declare any portion of Victoria specified therein to be a proclaimed area, and prohibit the removal from any place in the proclaimed area to any place outside that area or from any place in the proclaimed area to any other place in that area of any fruit fly or any fruit or vegetables of a kind or species which in his opinion may provide a host for fruit flies and require occupiers and owners of land in the proclaimed area to take such action for the eradication or prevention of the spread of fruit fly, as is specified in the Proclamation.

Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being of opinion that it is necessary to protect the fruit industry of Victoria against the introduction or spread of the insects of the family *Trypetae* (commonly known as fruit flies) and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

- (1) declare that portion of Victoria described in the First Schedule to this Proclamation to be a proclaimed area;
- (2) prohibit the removal from any place within the proclaimed area to any place outside that area or to any other place in that area of any fruit fly or any fruit or vegetables of a kind or species grown within the proclaimed area and named in the Second Schedule to this Proclamation unless such removal is made on the instruction of an Inspector or with his written permission, provided that fruit and vegetables passing through the proclaimed area may leave the proclaimed area without such instruction if the vehicle carrying such fruit or vegetables does not come to a halt within the proclaimed area except as required by traffic regulations.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Portion of Victoria Declared by this Proclamation to be a Proclaimed Area

The area bounded by Barkers Road, Glenferrie Road, Ridgeway Avenue, Disraeli Street, Childers Street, Park Crescent, Earl Street, Eastern Freeway, Merri Creek and the Yarra River being part of the Municipal District of the City of Kew.

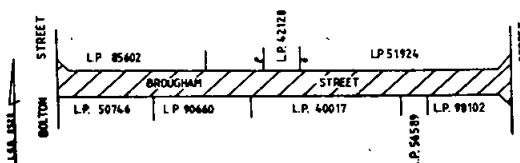
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by the *Local Government Act 1958*, section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way or any street, road, lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street, road, lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX of the *Local Government Act 1958* or a corresponding previous enactment to be a public highway and that land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Eltham has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, being a street, road, lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan of subdivision delineating the street, road, lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX of the *Local Government Act 1958*, or a corresponding previous enactment, be so declared to be a public highway.

Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that the part of Brougham Street (formally named Wellington Street), Eltham, between Bolton and Susan Streets as shown by hatching on the plan hereunder shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

PRESCRIPTION OF EXAMINATION LEVELS

Pursuant to Regulation 6 of the State Electricity Commission (Licensing of Electrical Mechanics) (Amendment) Regulations 1981, Statutory Rules No. 461/81, the levels to be attained by a candidate at the examinations conducted by the State Electricity Commission of Victoria for the issue of a "B" Grade or an "A" Grade licence in accordance with the provisions of Regulations 7 and 8 respectively of the abovementioned Regulations are hereby prescribed as follows:

in the case of a "B" Grade licence—

50 marks or more in the State Electricity Commission of Victoria "B" Grade Licence Practical Examination Paper and 50 marks or more in the State Electricity Commission of Victoria "B" Grade Licence Written Examination Paper; or

50 marks or more in the Education Department of Victoria Grade III. Electrical Wiring Practice Examination Paper and 50 marks or more in the Education Department of Victoria Grade III. Electrical Wiring Theory Examination Paper

and, in the case of an "A" Grade licence—

attainment of the level prescribed above in the "B" Grade Licence examination and 50 marks or more in the State Electricity Commission of Victoria "A" Grade

Licence Practical Examination Paper and 50 marks or more in the State Electricity Commission of Victoria "A" Grade Licence Written Examination Paper; or attainment of the level prescribed above in the "B" Grade Licence examination and 50 marks or more in the Education Department of Victoria Grade IV. Electrical Wiring Practice Examination Paper and 50 marks or more in the Education Department of Victoria Grade IV. Electrical Wiring Theory Examination Paper.

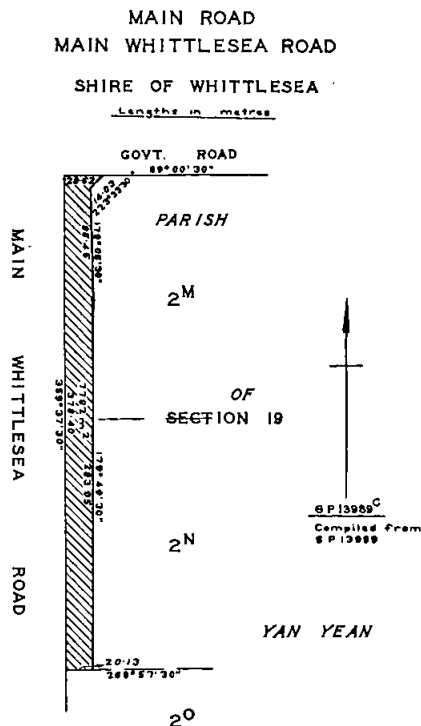

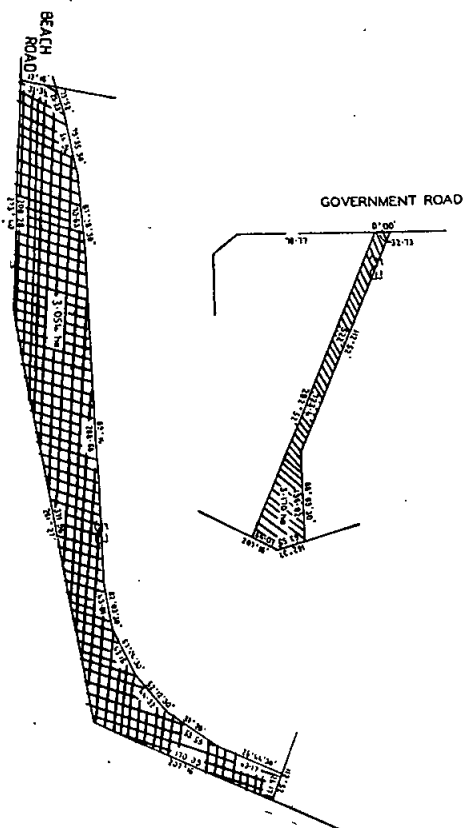

ROAD DISCONTINUED—CITY OF DONCASTER AND TEMPLESTOWE
