PROCLAMATIONS

Fisheries Act 1968

POINT COOK MARINE RESERVE

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, the Governor in the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 79A of the *Fisheries Act 1968* and all other powers me thereto enabling do by this my Proclamation provide as follows, that is to say:

- (a) That this Proclamation may be cited as the Point Cook Marine Reserve Proclamation 1982;
- (b) That the area of marine underwater terrain and superjacent water with their associated flora and fauna which are described in Schedule 2 to this Proclamation and shown by hatching on the plans therein shall be set aside as a marine reserve for educational, scientific, conservational and recreational purposes as on and from 1 December 1982;
- (c) That the area so set aside shall be known as the Point Cook Marine Reserve; and
- (d) That—
 - (i) the rules set out in Part A of Schedule 1 to this Proclamation shall as on and from 1 December 1982 be in force in all of the area so set aside; and
 - (ii) the rules set out in Part B of Schedule 1 to this Proclamation shall as on and from 1 December 1982 be in force in such part or parts of the area so set aside as are set forth in these rules.

PART A—RULES IN FORCE GENERALLY IN THE POINT COOK MARINE RESERVE

Rule 1. In the Rules contained in this Part of this Schedule the words "the marine reserve" mean the area set aside as marine reserve by the Point Cook Marine Reserve Proclamation 1982.

Rule 2. (1) No person shall operate a boat at a speed in excess of 8 kilometres per hour on the waters of the marine reserve.

(2) No person shall operate a boat, aircraft or other vehicle in a manner likely to cause damage to any flora or fauna in the marine reserve or in a manner likely to constitute a nuisance or a danger to any person therein.

Rule 3. No person shall behave in a disorderly, offensive or indecent manner in the marine reserve.

Rule 4. (1) No person shall remove or cause to be removed from the marine reserve any ballast, stone, rock, shingle, gravel, sand, boulders, clay, earth, silt, mud or other material whatsoever.

(2) This Rule shall not apply to—

- (a) persons carrying out works authorized by or under any Act of Parliament for establishing or maintaining navigation aids or survey works or for stabilizing the foreshore; or
- (b) persons carrying out works of any kind in accordance with the written instructions of the Director.

Rule 5. (1) No person shall perform any action which causes or is likely to cause a direct and substantial alteration to the physico-chemical or aesthetic environment in the marine reserve and in particular (without limiting the generality of the foregoing)—

- (a) no person shall disturb or cause to be disturbed any ballast, stone, rock, shingle, gravel, sand, boulders, clay, earth, silt, mud or other material whatsoever in the marine reserve;

(b) no person shall discharge or cause to be discharged into the marine reserve any matter which is or may become deleterious to the flora or fauna therein;

(c) no person shall deposit or release any rubbish or refuse in the marine reserve; and

(d) no person shall place any buoy, stone, post, structure or mooring in the marine reserve.

(2) This Rule shall not apply to—

(a) persons carrying out works authorized by or under any Act of Parliament for establishing or maintaining navigation aids or survey works or for stabilizing the foreshore; or

(b) persons carrying out works of any kind in accordance with the written instructions of the Director.

Rule 6. (1) This Rule applies to the use of the Marine Reserve for educational purposes.

(2) No person shall organize an educational excursion to the reserve without first obtaining the approval in writing of the Director, and

(a) every application for approval to conduct an educational excursion to the reserve shall be in writing and shall disclose the name, address and status of the person who will supervise the excursion; and

(b) every supervisor of an educational excursion to the reserve shall familiarize himself/herself with the Rules; and

(c) on any educational excursion to the reserve the student : supervisor ratio shall not exceed 20 : 1.

Rule 7. (1) No person shall have in his possession in the reserve any firearm, spear, spear gun, hawaiian sling, dredge, any kind of fishing net or commercial fishing equipment (except a handheld landing net or abalone fishing equipment).

(2) No person shall use or attempt to use in the reserve any firearm, spear, spear gun, hawaiian sling, dredge, any kind of fishing net or commercial fishing equipment (except as provided for in Rule 10 (3) of the Rules).

Rule 8. Any Inspector of Fisheries or member of the Police Force may order a person committing a breach of any of the Rules in this Schedule (including Part B of this Schedule) to leave the marine reserve and each such person upon being so ordered shall leave the marine reserve forthwith.

PART B—RULES IN FORCE IN CERTAIN PARTS OF THE POINT COOK MARINE RESERVE

Rule 9. (1) This Rule applies to that part of the Point Cook Marine Reserve which is described in Schedule 2 to this Proclamation and shown by vertical hatching on the plan therein (which part is referred to in this Rule as "within 200 metres from highwater mark on the shoreward boundary").

(2) No person shall take or interfere with or attempt to take any flora or fauna within 200 metres of highwater mark on the shoreward boundary or permit any such flora or fauna to be taken or interfered with.

Rule 10. (1) This Rule applies to that part of the Point Cook Marine Reserve which is described in Schedule 2 to this Proclamation and shown by horizontal hatching on the plan therein (which part is referred to in this Rule as "seaward of 200 metres from highwater mark on the shoreward boundary").

(2) Except as provided in sub-rule (3) of this Rule, no person shall take or interfere with or attempt to take any flora or fauna in the part seaward of 200 metres from highwater mark on the shoreward boundary or permit any such flora or fauna to be taken or interfered with.

(3) Sub-rule (2) of this Rule shall not apply to—

(a) a person taking or attempting to take fish by rod and line or trolling line with not more than two hooks attached;

(b) the holder of an abalone licence taking or attempting to take abalone;

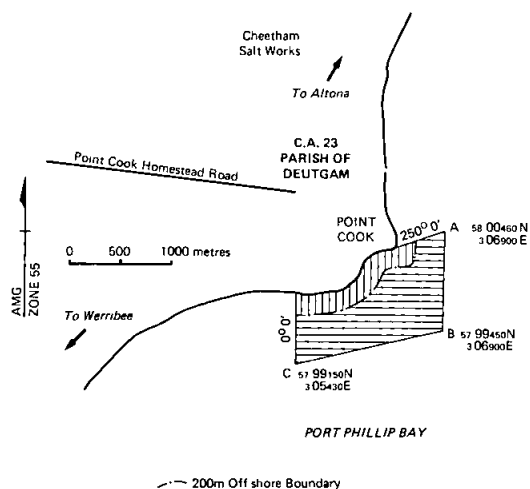
(c) any person other than the holder of an abalone licence taking abalone in accordance with the Fishing (General) Regulations 1981.

(4) For the purposes of paragraph (a) of sub-rule (3) of this Rule, where a person fishing with rod and line or trolling line is doing so by means of spinners, spoons, flashes or other items of artificial bait, each such spinner, spoon, flash or other item shall be counted as one hook.

Schedule 2

POINT COOK MARINE RESERVE

All that area of underwater terrain and superjacent water near Point Cook enclosed within a line commencing at Point A located at AMG reference Zone 55 "58 00 460N", "3 06 900E" to Point B located at AMG zone 55 "57 99 450N", "3 06 900E" thence by a line to Point C located at AMG zone 55 "57 99 150N", "3 05 430E" thence by a line bearing 0° to the highwater mark on shore, and again commencing at Point A by a line bearing 250° to the highwater mark on shore and by a line following the highwater mark to the intersection of the highwater mark by the line from Point C. (both bearings magnetic).

Agricultural Chemicals Act 1958

PRESCRIBED STANDARDS FOR AGRICULTURAL CHEMICALS—HOUSEHOLD INSECTICIDES

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by Section 4 of the *Agricultural Chemicals Act 1958* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation prescribe a standard for any agricultural chemical.

And whereas by Section 6A of the *Agricultural Chemicals Act 1958* it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may amend, vary or revoke any Proclamation made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette*.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation amend the Proclamation made on 29 June 1982, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 7 July 1982, prescribing Standards for Agricultural Chemicals—Household Insecticides as follows:

- In paragraph (b) of Item 2 of the Schedule:
 - After the entry "bioallethrin" there shall be inserted the entry "bioresmethrin";
 - for the entry "isobornyl" and the entry "thiocyanoacetate" there shall be substituted the entry "isobornyl: thiocyanoacetate".
- In paragraph (b) of Item 3 of the Schedule:
 - For the entry "ammonium fluosilicate" there shall be substituted the entry "ammonium fluorosilicate";
 - after the entry "maldison" there shall be inserted the entry "orthoboric acid".
- In paragraph (b) of Item 4 of the Schedule:
 - The entry "1, 1-bis (p-ethylphenyl)-2, 2-dichloroethane" shall be deleted;
 - for the entry "Z-9-tricosine" there shall be substituted the entry "Z-9-tricosene".

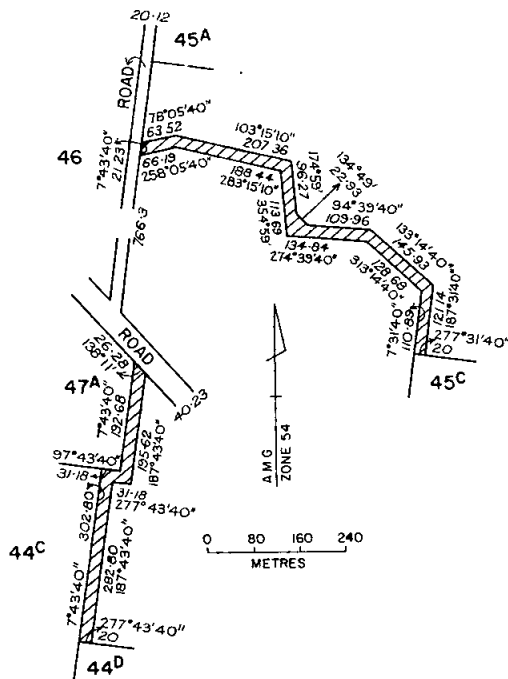

ORDER FIXING AND DECLARING THE MAXIMUM PRICE OF DECLARED FUELS UNDER SECTION 7 OF THE PRICES REGULATION ACT 1981

Whereas by notice dated 30 July 1982 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 4 August 1982 the Minister declared—

- (a) the whole of Victoria to be a proclaimed area; and
 - (b) certain kinds of fuel to be declared fuels—
- for the purpose of the *Fuel Prices Regulation Act 1981* with effect as from 4 August 1982:

And whereas, pursuant to Section 7 of the said Act, the Prices Commissioner may, with respect to any declared fuel, from time to time, by Order published in the *Government Gazette* fix and declare the maximum price at which any such fuel may be sold generally or in any part of the State or in any proclaimed area:

Now therefore, I, Allan Herbert Miller Fels, Prices Commissioner, do hereby fix and declare maximum prices inclusive of existing taxes as set out below in the whole of Victoria with effect from 12.01 a.m., Thursday 2 December 1982.

The maximum prices set out below are applicable except that in addition the companies may add to the wholesale price and resellers may add to the retail price an additional amount equal to the simple average for all companies of any increase which may be granted by the Petroleum Products Pricing Authority during the month of January 1983 on account of increases in the supply cost to the major companies provided that:

- (1) The price increase to be applied will be the simple average for all companies as determined by the Prices Commissioner and will apply to the supply costs;
- (2) The relevant supply costs will be supply costs as determined by the Commissioner;
- (3) Any increases are of an interim nature and subject to final determination and consideration by the Prices Commissioner.

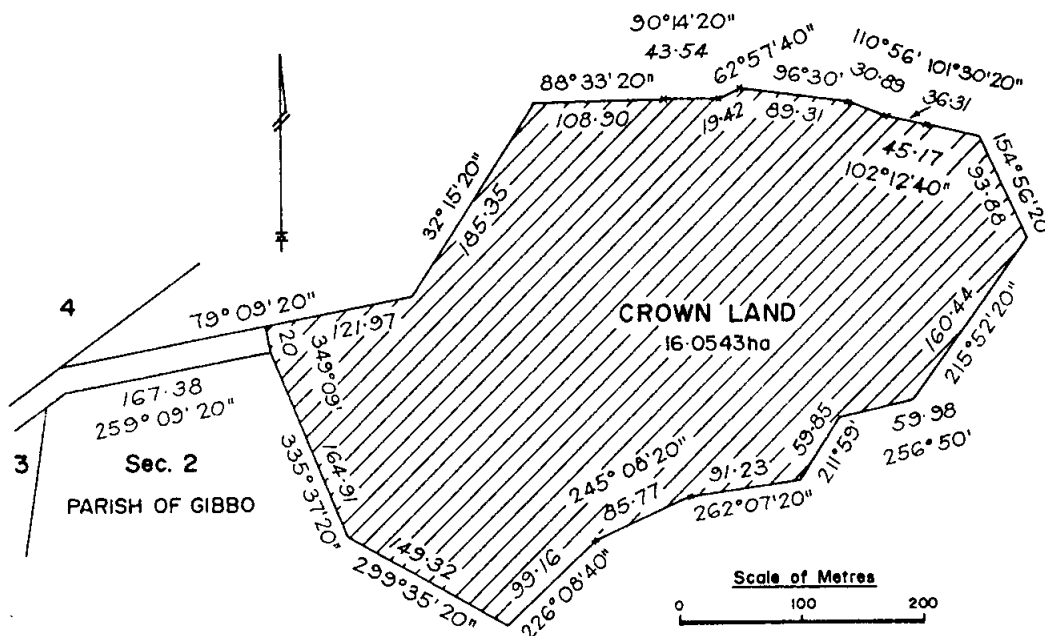

MORTUARY INDUSTRY AND CEMETERIES ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE

The Victorian Parliament has recently appointed a Joint Select Committee to inquire into and report upon all aspects of the Mortuary Industry and related industries in Victoria, including both private and Government operations, together with any aspect of cemeteries administration, funding or provision of land encompassed by the *Cemeteries Act 1958*, the *Trustee Act 1958*, or any other provision relating thereto.

The Committee is aware, from its preliminary investigations, that major problems have arisen at a number of cemeteries, involving matters such as land acquisitions, inadequate finance and certain irregularities on the part of some Cemetery Trusts, as well as abuse of positions held by members of those particular Trusts. In addition, following complaints by members of the public, the practices of certain monumental masons and the activities of a few funeral directors have also come under increasing scrutiny and the Committee will be inquiring into all these areas.

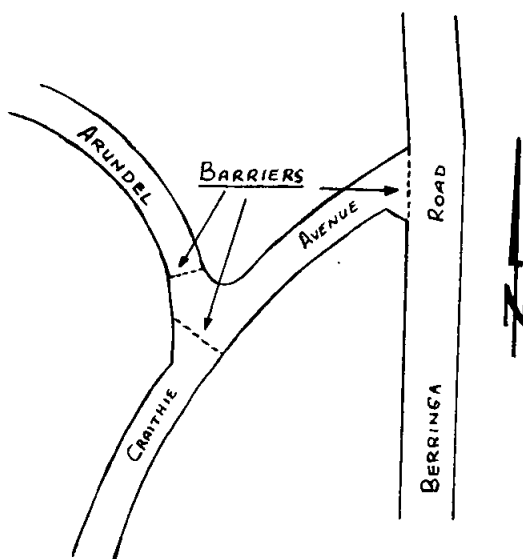

DECLARATION OF PRIVATE STREETS AS PUBLIC HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE SHIRE OF DONALD

Whereas pursuant to section 107 of the *Housing Act 1958* it is among other things enacted that where works have been carried out in accordance with an agreement for the full construction of any roads, pavements, culverts or drains made pursuant to the provisions of the said section 107 such roads, pavements, culverts or drains shall be under the care and management of the Municipality which shall be liable for the cost of any maintenance, repair, alteration or reconstruction thereof and the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* declare any road so constructed to be a public highway.

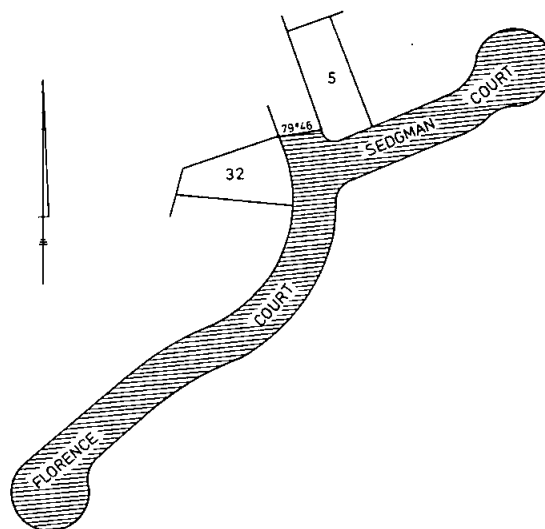

And whereas the works of road pavements, culvert and drainage construction have now been carried out in accordance with the said Agreement between the Housing Commission and the City of Shepparton.

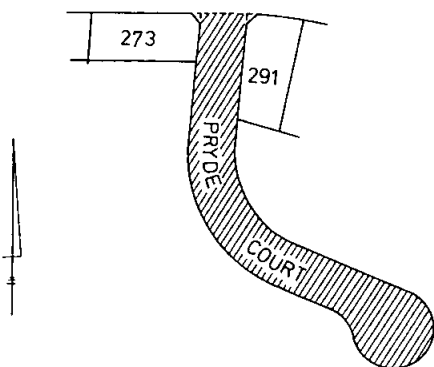

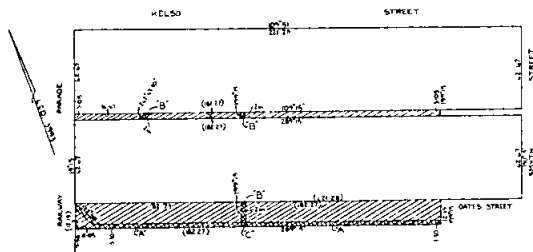
ROAD DISCONTINUED—CITY OF FRANKSTON

- (a) that the said parts of roads which are shown by hatching and cross hatching marked "A", "B" and "C" on the plan hereunder shall be discontinued;

or appliances or surf skis, water skis or under-water breathing equipment on the foreshore of the City of South Melbourne or in the 100 metres of water adjacent thereto, and

- (b) Thereby providing for the care of bathers on the said foreshore or in the said waters.

Short Title—(1) This By-Law may be cited as the Foreshore Reserve and Waters By-Law.

Definitions—(3) In this By-Law unless otherwise indicated by the context or subject-matter:

- (a) "Council" means the Council of the City of South Melbourne;
- (b) "Foreshore Reserve" means that portion of land in the City of South Melbourne temporarily reserved for the recreation, convenience and amusement of the people by order in Council dated 26 July 1910 being that area of 12 acres, more or less, County of Bourke, City of South Melbourne; commencing at a point on ordinary highwater mark in Hobsons Bay where the boundary between the City of South Melbourne and the City of Port Melbourne abuts thereon; bounded thence by the said boundary north-easterly to the southern side of Beaconsfield Parade; thence by Beaconsfield Parade south-easterly to a point in line with the eastern boundary of McGregor Street; thence by an extension of that boundary south-westerly to the ordinary high water mark; and thence by that boundary north-westerly to the point of commencement;
- (c) "Foreshore Waters" means that area between high water mark along the shore, being the boundary of the City of South Melbourne, and an imaginary line following the course of the shore at a distance of 100 metres from the high water mark along the shore in the Municipal District of the City of South Melbourne, and between McGregor Street and Pickles Street in the Municipal District of the City of South Melbourne.

Prohibition or Regulation of the Use of Surf Boards, Skiffle Boards or other Similar Boards or Appliances or Surf Skis and Water Skis on the Foreshore Reserve and in the foreshore waters.

(4) (a) The Council may, at any time by notice fixed or set up in the Foreshore Reserve, prohibit or regulate the bringing onto, conveying across or depositing or using in the Foreshore Reserve, any surf boards, skiffle boards or any other similar boards or appliances or surf skis or water skis

(b) Except with the prior consent in writing of the Town Clerk a person shall not bring onto, convey across, deposit or otherwise use in the Foreshore Reserve any surf boards, skiffle boards or any other similar boards or appliances or surf skis or water skis at the times, or in the manner prohibited by the notice herein referred to.

(5) (a) The Council may at any time by notice fixed or set up on the Foreshore Reserve, prohibit or regulate the bringing onto, conveying across, depositing or using in the Foreshore waters, any surf boards or any other similar boards or appliances or surf skis or water skis.

(b) Except with the prior consent in writing of the Town Clerk a person shall not bring onto, convey across, deposit or otherwise use in the Foreshore Waters any surf boards, skiffle boards or any other similar boards or appliances or surf skis or water skis at the times, or in the manner prohibited by the notice herein referred to

(6) **Penalties**—Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$400.

(7) **Application of This By-Law**—This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the Municipal District of the City of South Melbourne and within 100 metres of the foreshore between McGregor Street and Pickles Street.

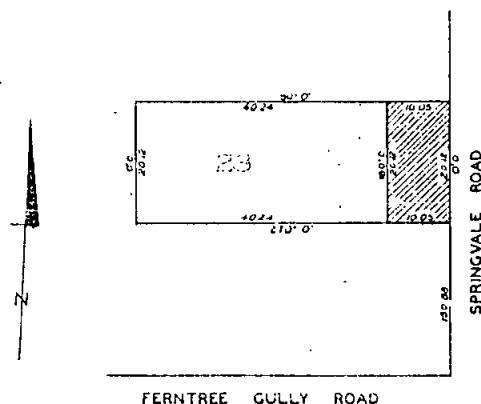

LIBRARY COUNCIL OF VICTORIA—PUBLIC LIBRARIES DIVISION
Model By-Law for the Management and Control of Libraries
By-Law No. 69

A By-Law of the Shire of Flinders made under Section 197 (1) of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 69 for the purpose of:

- regulating the management and control of library services provided by the Council jointly with the Peninsula Regional Library Committee;
- imposing penalties not exceeding \$100 for breaches of this By-Law.

Pursuant to the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Flinders order as follows:

A. Title

- This By-Law shall be known as the Library By-Law.

B. Operation

- This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Flinders.

C. Definitions

3. In this By-Law unless the context or subject matter otherwise indicates or requires—

- “Book” includes any and every book, magazine, newspaper, pamphlet, music score, gramophone record, video recording, audio-tape recording, picture, print, photograph, map, chart, plan, film, slide, manuscript, toy, or any other article forming part of the contents of the library available for borrowing reference or perusal whether or not the property of the Shire of Flinders Council.
- “Council” means the Council of the Shire of Flinders.
- “Committee” means the Peninsula Regional Library Service Committee as constituted under an agreement dated 18 April 1968 and any subsequent agreement amending or replacing it for library services between the Shires of Flinders, Mornington and Hastings.
- “Library Service” means all the library facilities, resources and activities provided by the Council (or the Committee under the said agreement).
- “Librarian” means the person for the time being in charge of the library service generally, or any section or portion thereof.

- (f) "Library" means all or any library outlet under the management and control of the Council (or the committee under the same agreement) and includes without limiting the generalities of the foregoing, all buildings or portions thereof, mobile libraries, and other areas, facilities and vehicles used in connection with the provision of the library service.
- (g) "Member" means a person or institution holding a current and valid membership card issued in accordance with this By-Law.
- (h) "Membership Card" means a current and valid card issued to a member by the Librarian in accordance with this By-Law as an authority to borrow books.
- (i) "Library Service Area" means the whole of the municipal district/s of the Shires of Flinders, Mornington and Hastings.
- (j) "User" means any person making use of the library service.

D. Administration

4. The Librarian is responsible for the management and administration of the library service in accordance with the policies and directions of the Committee as shall be determined from time to time.

5. Any person using the library service shall obey the lawful directions of the Librarian.

E. Access and Use

6. The Committee shall determine the hours the library will be open for use by the public. These hours will be prominently displayed in the library and advertised by other methods as shall be determined from time to time.

7. Subject to the provisions of this By-Law any person shall have access to the library for the purpose of using the services and facilities on the premises during the hours it is open to the public.

8. Subject to the provisions of this By-Law, members shall have access to the library for the purpose of borrowing books and their representatives will be admitted for that purpose at the discretion of the Librarian.

9. No charges shall be made for the registration of members, except as provided in Clauses 12 (e) and 12 (f) of this By-Law, or for the borrowing of books for use on or off the premises, or for reference and information services, including those provided from computer data bases, provided that charges may be made for reservation of books, including those borrowed from other libraries on behalf of a member; or for photo— or other copies which will remain the property of the member.

10. No person other than library staff or persons duly authorized by the Librarian or the Council (or the Committee) shall enter or remain in the Library except during the hours of opening.

F. Membership

11. Subject to Clause 15 of this By-Law members shall be entitled to borrow books from the library.

12. Subject to the approval of the Librarian the following persons shall be eligible to become members:

- (a) Any ratepayer of the member municipalities of the service;
- (b) Any resident of the library service area;
- (c) Any non-resident who is employed in or who attends any educational institution in the library service area;
- (d) Any person eligible to join another Victorian subsidized public library;
- (e) Any temporary visitor to the library service area from outside Victoria. These persons may be admitted to temporary membership for a period to be determined by the Librarian and may be required to pay a monetary deposit to be determined by the Committee from time to time;
- (f) Any Victorian resident who does not qualify for membership under (a)–(d) above on payment of an annual fee to be determined from time to time by the Committee.

13. All persons in the categories listed in clause 12 of this By-Law shall provide such proof of eligibility as shall be required by the Librarian.

14. Institutional Membership may be extended to any association, society, institution, business or agency at the discretion of the Librarian, provided that such body's premises, predominant area of service or activity, or normal place of meeting is within the library service area.

15. Persons wishing to borrow books shall:

- (a) complete and sign the appropriate application form which shall include an undertaking to comply with the provisions of this By-Law;
- (b) satisfy the Librarian that he or she is eligible for membership.

16. Persons under the age of 18 may be required by the Librarian to have a guarantee to make good the loss or damage to any book whilst in the member's use or possession signed by an adult.

17. Every member on being issued with a membership card shall:

- (a) be responsible for the custody of the card;
- (b) produce the card to the Librarian whenever a book is borrowed;
- (c) report the loss of the card to the Librarian immediately such loss is discovered;
- (d) notify any change of address to the Librarian;
- (e) surrender the card to the Librarian on ceasing to be eligible for membership.

18. The Librarian may suspend or cancel the membership of any member who habitually retains books beyond the loan period or who habitually loses or damages books.

19. Membership shall be current for a period of three years unless previously surrendered or cancelled. Persons whose membership has lapsed may be required by the Librarian to re-register before borrowing books.

20. Membership cards are not transferable.

G. Conditions of Borrowing

21. The Committee shall make rules from time to time stating the maximum number of books which may be borrowed at any one time.

22. The standard time(s) allowed for retaining a book shall be fourteen (14) days and the date for return of each book shall be clearly indicated to the member. However, at the discretion of the Librarian, variant loan periods may be applied to some books, or granted to the member on application at time of borrowing.

23. A member is responsible for the safe care of every book borrowed on his or her membership card and for its return to the library by the due date.

24. A member may be required to pay a charge for retaining a book beyond the time allowed. The amount of such charge shall be advertised by notice in a manner to be determined by the Committee. The Library shall have no obligation to send any notice of charges incurred and failure to send such notice shall be no excuse for non payment of such charges. Liabilities incurred by a member under this clause shall be discharged before any other book is issued.

25. A member may apply by telephone, post or in person for extension of the time allowed for retaining a book by describing the book in such terms as fully identify it to the Librarian. Such extension will only be granted if the original loan period has not expired or the book has not been reserved by another member.

26. Any book in the lending stock of the library may be reserved for a member on completion of a form prescribed by the Librarian. The Librarian will notify the member when the book is available. The member may be required to pay the cost of postage involved.

27. A member may recommend that consideration be given to the purchase of any book which is not in the stock of the library, or may request the Librarian to borrow a book from another library for him or her. A fee which shall be determined from time to time by the Committee may be levied where a book is borrowed from another library.

28. Where a book is designated for reference use only, it shall not be borrowed except at the discretion of the Librarian.

29. A member is responsible for reporting to the Librarian any damage discovered in any book on loan to him or her. This damage shall be reported at the time of issue or immediately on return.

30. If a book is lost or damaged beyond repair, or it is stolen from a member he or she shall replace it or pay to the Committee the full replacement value of such books plus such amount for processing costs as shall be determined by the Committee from time to time.

31. Additional charges to be determined from time to time by the Committee shall be made for the loss or damage of membership cards, library stationery or other items issued with a book. These charges will be displayed by notice in the library.

32. No book shall be deemed to have been returned to the library unless it has been handed to the Librarian, or left in a place or receptacle designated for the return of books, or despatched to the library by post or by a means previously approved by the Librarian.

33. The Committee may take such action as it deems necessary for the recovery of a book or the value thereof at any time after the book becomes overdue.

34. Books may be lent at the discretion of the Librarian to other library services in accordance with the *Rules for Inter-Library Lending* issued by the Municipal Inter-Library Committee (Victoria).

35. Books stolen or lost shall remain the property of the Committee although replaced or paid for.

H. Conduct in the Library

36. Users shall not behave in the library in such a manner as may, in the opinion of the Librarian cause serious inconvenience or discomfort to any other person in the library.

37. The Librarian's permission is required to bring any animal, other than a guide dog accompanying a blind person into the library.

38. Users may eat, drink or smoke only in areas which may be designated for such purposes.

39. Users shall not wilfully or negligently break, damage or interfere with the library furniture or fittings.

40. Users shall not deface, mutilate or mark by writing or otherwise any part of any materials belonging to, or in the care of, the library service.

41. Users shall not misplace or hide books or any library records with the intention to withhold their use from others.

42. Users may bring into the library reading and writing materials, a handbag or briefcase, an invalid's chair or baby carriage. Large bags or parcels, or shopping jeeps may be left in the designated areas while their owners are using the library. The Committee takes no responsibility for loss or damage to any bag or other article so left.

43. Persons may distribute or display handbills or literature, or deliver a public address in the library only with the consent of the Librarian.

44. Users shall enter only those parts of the library open for public use, except with the permission of the Librarian.

Persons under the age of 18 shall if restricted from using some section of the library by written direction of parent or guardian, be excluded from the definition of user for the purpose of this clause.

49. All members shall have access on equal terms to all lending collections for borrowing purposes but excluding for the purposes of this clause persons under the age of 18 if restricted by parental direction.

50. Every user may suggest to the Librarian that consideration be given to the purchase by the library service of any book which is not in the stock of the library.

51. Every user shall have the right to comment to the Librarian on the performance of the library service or on the interpretation of this By-Law and through the Librarian to the Council (or Committee). Complaints to the Committee shall be made in writing.

52. Information including information held in files outside the library and in computer files required for membership registration purposes shall not be made available to outside enquirers except in response to a Court Order, or be used by library staff for any purposes other than follow-up of unreturned books, or for statistical purposes. Membership and circulation statistics shall not be produced in such form as will identify individual members.

53. Circulation records and records relating to materials requested from the library shall not be kept after the current transaction is completed. Exceptions may be made with services such as housebound services where selection is done by library staff and the record of past reading is essential to the success of the service.

54. This By-Law shall come into operation on the day after the day of publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

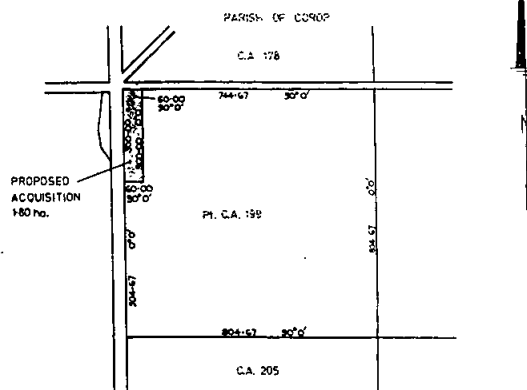
