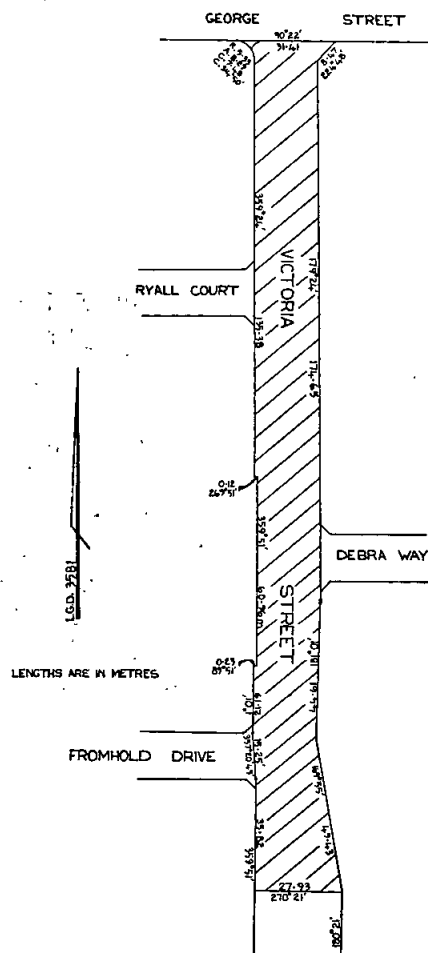
By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas by the *Local Government Act 1958*, section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan of subdivision delineating that street road lane or passage has been sealed with the seal of the

municipality under subdivision (3) of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958* or a corresponding previous enactment to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

And whereas the Council of the City of Doncaster and Templestowe has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, being land used and reserved as a street or road be declared to be a public highway.

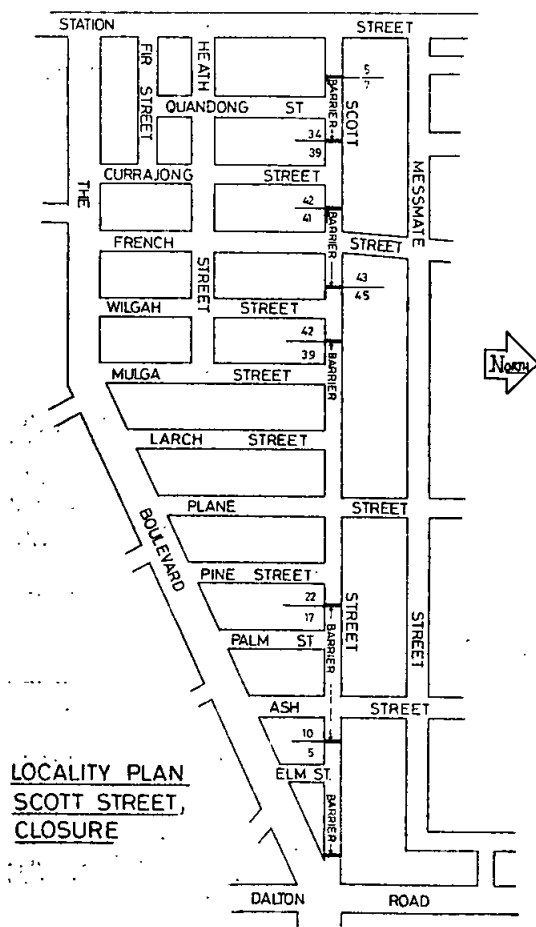

CLOSURE**

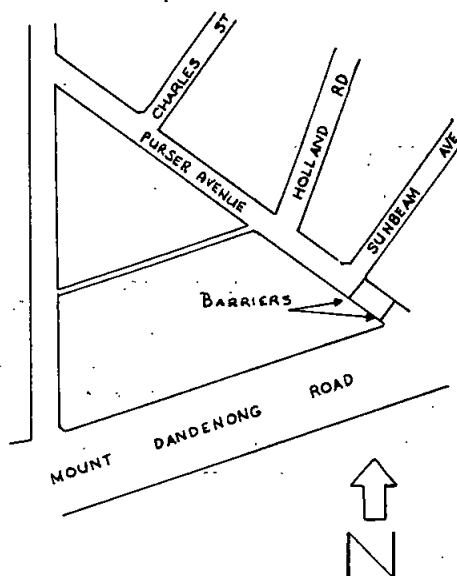

Rescind sub-clause 6 (k) and substitute therefor the following sub-clause:

“(k) *Excess industrial experience.*

- (i) Excess industrial experience as approved by the Director-General shall entitle entrants to the Technical Schools Division from 1 January 1982 to appointment at a higher subdivisional salary point on the Assistant Class scale than would otherwise be their entitlement under this Regulation.
- (ii) The commencing salary of a teacher shall be increased by one increment for each completed two years of such industrial experience to a maximum of three increments.
- (iii) Excess industrial experience credited shall include only that experience which in all cases exceeds a minimum of two years.  
Provided that where a period of industrial experience is currently prescribed for permanent appointment or fully qualified status under Regulation 9 of the Teaching Service (Teachers Tribunal) Regulations, any such longer period shall be the minimum.
- (iv) Excess industrial experience shall relate directly to the qualifications of the teacher and to the subject areas taught by the teacher.
- (v) Other than in special circumstances approved by the Director-General, only that experience shall be credited which was gained concurrently with or after the acquisition of the related qualifications.”

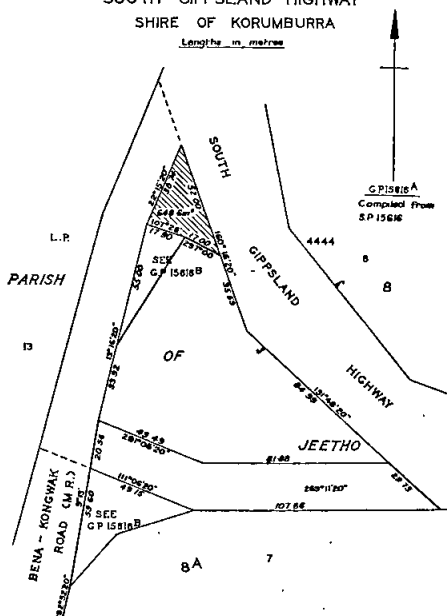

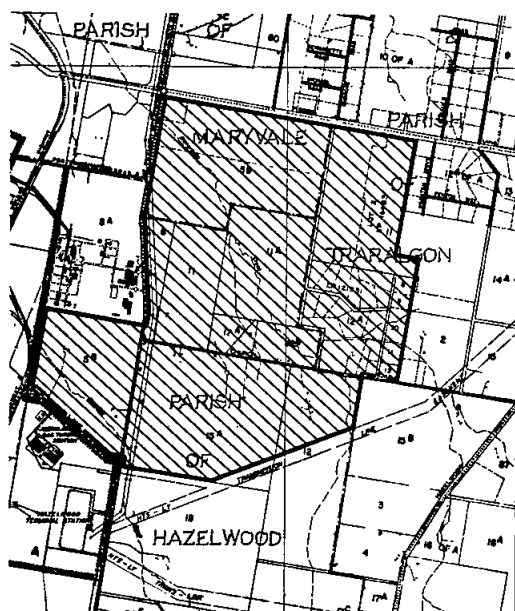

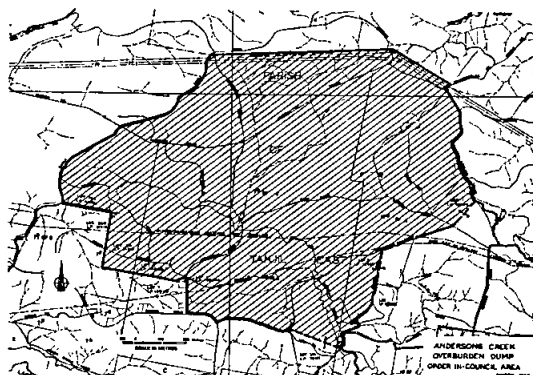


BENNETTS CREEK POWER STATION

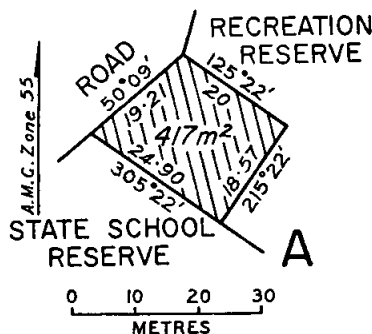

**CRANBOURNE PUBLIC PARK RESERVE**

**REGULATIONS**

I, William Vasey Houghton, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 13 of the *Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978*, do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Crown land in the Township and Parish of Cranbourne temporarily reserved for a Public Park by Order in Council of 20 October 1981 (vide *Government Gazette* dated 28 October 1981) hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.

2. No person shall—

- (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner or create or take part in any disturbance;
- (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication or whilst under the influence of drugs, nor bring into, consume or sell any drugs in the Reserve;
- (c) use indecent or offensive language in the Reserve;
- (d) offer any article of food or drink or any other commodity whatsoever for sale in the Reserve or bring intoxicating liquor thereon without the written consent of the Committee first obtained;
- (e) remove or displace or damage in any way whatsoever the whole or any part of any notice or sign or of any board, tablet, plate or any support or fastening or fitting used or constructed or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any notice, sign or Regulations in the Reserve and fixed or set up by the Committee;
- (f) obstruct, hinder or interfere with any person employed on the Reserve;

- (g) climb, jump on or get over any of the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, or stick bills or advertisements or cut names thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, furniture or fittings, gates, stiles, fences, seats, or other structures in the Reserve;
- (h) interfere with, break or damage in any way any of the trees, shrubs or plants, or pluck flowers or destroy or cut grasses in the Reserve;
- (i) leave or deposit any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, refuse or rubbish whatsoever in the Reserve, except in the receptacles provided, nor roll or throw stones or missiles of any kind therein, or leave anything that might injure a person;
- (j) light a fire in the Reserve except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee;
- (k) carry or discharge any firearms or air guns in the Reserve, or shoot, snare or destroy any animals or birds thereon;
- (l) bet publicly in the Reserve without written permission of the Committee;
- (m) spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure in the Reserve;
- (n) erect any building, tent or structure, or camp on any portion of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee;
- (o) bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission in writing of the Committee first obtained;
- (p) do anything whatsoever in the Reserve for the purpose of making money without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained;
- (q) remain in the Reserve between sunset and sunrise without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee.

Every person infringing this Regulation in any respect shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable.

3. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by a member or employee of the Committee, a member of the Police Force or any Crown Lands Bailiff, to leave the same.

4. No club or association shall hold or take any part in any game of any description, entertainment, performance, show or ceremony in any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee first obtained and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms and conditions as the Committee deems to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

5. No person shall park a motor car within the Reserve except at such places, if any, as are set apart for the purpose.

6. No person shall take or put or allow to be taken or put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals, except as hereinbefore provided, without written permission of the Committee.

7. The owner of any horses, sheep, cattle, goats, pigs or other animals that are found wandering upon any part of the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

8. The driver of a motor car entering the Reserve shall proceed at a speed not exceeding five (5) kilometres per hour and only within such areas, if any, as are set apart for vehicular traffic.

9. The use of mini bikes, trail bikes and similar recreational vehicles shall not be permitted on the Reserve without the written authority of the Committee and then only under such conditions as may be determined by the said Committee.

10. The Committee shall have the right to charge or, subject to such terms and conditions as it deems to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, to

authorize any club, association or person to charge a fee for admission to the Reserve for picnics or other recreational activities.

11. The foregoing Regulations shall not restrict the Committee or its officers or employees in the proper execution of their duty or work in or on the Reserve —(Rs.11852).

"Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Richmond;

"Person" includes a Body Corporate.

4. No person shall light or being the owner or occupier of property shall cause or permit any person to light any fire or suffer any fire to remain alight in the open air on such property save and except:

(a) with the prior consent in writing of an authorized Officer of the Council and in accordance with any conditions set out in such consent; or

(b) in a barbeque constructed of brick, masonry or other material approved by the Council; or

(c) in an incinerator which is:

(i) constructed of brick, masonry or other material approved by the Council, and

(ii) fitted with a lid and a spark arrestor and be so constructed as to prevent the emission of sparks or the spread of fire therefrom, and

(iii) situated at least 1.5 metres from the nearest point of any fence or the boundary of the land, and

(iv) situated at least 3 metres from the nearest point of any building whether on the same or adjoining land, and

(v) surrounded for a distance of 1.5 metres by open ground which is free of all combustible material,

provided that such specified distances may in any particular case be modified varied or waived by the Council or an authorized Officer.

5. No person at any time shall burn or being the owner or occupier of property cause or permit to be burnt any substance in such a manner to such an extent as shall cause quantities of smoke, fumes, odours or ash to be emitted from the said premises so as to cause a nuisance to any person upon any land or upon any public place.

6. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than Four hundred dollars (\$400.00) and any person guilty of a continuing offence against this By-Law after a conviction or order by any Court shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten dollars (\$10.00) for each day on which an offence against this By-Law is continued.

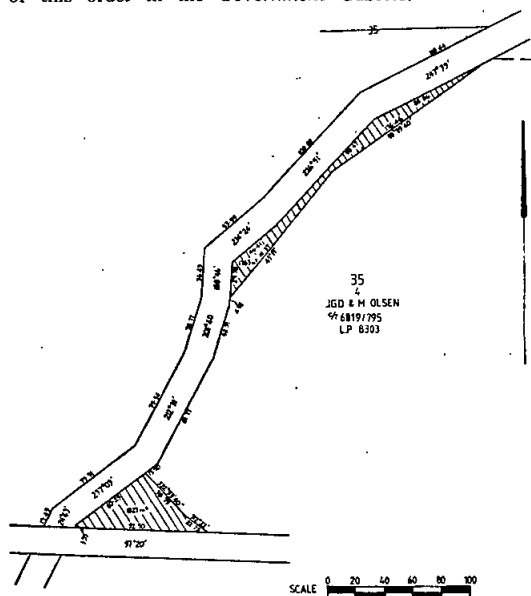

- (b) imposing penalties not exceeding \$100 for breaches of this By-law.

## SHIRE OF MIRBOO

## BY-LAW No. 29

## Library By-Law

A By-law of the Shire of Mirboo made under section 197 (1) of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 29 for the purpose of—

- (a) repealing By-law No. 25 of the Shire of Mirboo;
- (b) regulating the management and control of library services provided by the Council jointly with the West Gippsland Regional Library Service Committee;
- (c) imposing penalties not exceeding \$100 for breaches of this By-law.

Pursuant to the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mirboo order as follows—

## A. Title

1. This By-law shall be known as the Library By-law.

## B. Operation

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Mirboo.

## C. Definitions

3. In this By-law unless the context or subject matter otherwise indicates or requires—

- (a) "Book" includes any and every book, magazine, newspaper, pamphlet, music score, gramophone record, video recording, audio-tape recording, picture, print, photograph, map, chart, plan, film, slide, manuscript, toy, or any other article forming part of the contents of the library available for borrowing reference or perusal whether or not the property of the Mirboo Shire Council.
- (b) "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Mirboo.
- (c) "Committee" means the West Gippsland Regional Library Service Committee as constituted under an agreement dated 21 January 1969 and any subsequent agreement amending or replacing it for library services between the Borough of Wonthaggi and the Shires of Narracan, Mirboo, Warragul, Phillip Island, South Gippsland, Korumburra and Buln Buln.
- (d) "Library Service" means all the library facilities, resources and activities provided by the Council and the Committee.
- (e) "Librarian" means the person for the time being in charge of the library service generally, or any section or portion thereof.
- (f) "Library" means all or any library outlet under the management and control of the Council or the Committee under the said agreement and includes without limiting the generalities of the foregoing, all buildings or portions thereof, mobile libraries, and other areas, facilities and vehicles used in connection with the provision of the library service.
- (g) "Member" means a person or institution holding a current and valid membership card issued in accordance with this By-law.
- (h) "Membership Card" means a current and valid card issued to a member by the Librarian in accordance with this By-law, as an authority to borrow books.
- (i) "Library Service Area" means the whole of the municipal districts of the Borough of Wonthaggi and the Shires of Mirboo, Warragul, Narracan, Phillip Island, South Gippsland, Korumburra and Buln Buln.
- (j) "User" means any person making use of the library service.

## D. Administration

4. The Librarian is responsible for the management and administration of the library service in accordance with the policies and directions of the Committee as shall be determined from time to time.

5. Any person using the library service shall obey the lawful directions of the Librarian.

#### E. Access and Use

6. The Committee shall determine the hours the library will be open for use by the public. These hours will be prominently displayed in the library and advertised by other methods as shall be determined from time to time.

7. Subject to the provisions of this By-law any person shall have access to the library for the purpose of using the services and facilities on the premises during the hours it is open to the public.

8. Subject to the provisions of this By-law, members shall have access to the library for the purpose of borrowing books and their representatives will be admitted for that purpose at the discretion of the Librarian.

9. No charges shall be made for the registration of members, except as provided in clauses 12 (e) and 12 (f) of this By-law, or for the borrowing of books for use on or off the premises, or for reference and information services, including those provided from computer data bases, provided that charges may be made for reservation of books, including those borrowed from other libraries on behalf of a member, or for photo or other copies which will remain the property of the member.

10. No person other than library staff or persons duly authorized by the Librarian or the Council or the Committee shall enter or remain in the Library except during the hours of opening.

#### F. Membership

11. Subject to clause 15 of this By-law members shall be entitled to borrow books from the library.

12. Subject to the approval of the Librarian the following persons shall be eligible to become members:

- (a) Any ratepayer of the Shire of Mirboo or the Borough of Wonthaggi or the Shires of Warragul, Narracan, Phillip Island, South Gippsland, Korumburra and Buln Buln.
- (b) Any resident of the library service area.
- (c) Any non-resident who is employed in or who attends an educational institution in the library service area.
- (d) Any person eligible to join another Victorian subsidized public library.
- (e) Any temporary visitor to the library service area from outside Victoria. These persons may be admitted to temporary membership for a period to be determined by the Librarian and may be required to pay a monetary deposit to be determined by the Committee from time to time.
- (f) Any Victorian resident who does not qualify for membership under (a)–(d) above on payment of an annual fee to be determined from time to time by the Committee.

13. All persons in the categories listed in clause 12 of this By-law shall provide such proof of eligibility as shall be required by the Librarian.

14. Institutional Membership may be extended to any association, society, institution, business or agency at the discretion of the Librarian, provided that such body's premises, predominant area of service or activity, or normal place of meeting is within the library service area.

15. Persons wishing to borrow books shall—

- (a) complete and sign the appropriate application form, which shall include an undertaking to comply with the provisions of this By-law;
- (b) satisfy the Librarian that he or she is eligible for membership.

16. Persons under the age of 18 may be required by the Librarian to have a guarantee to make good the loss or damage to any book whilst in the member's use or possession signed by an adult.

17. Every member on being issued with a membership card shall—

- (a) be responsible for the custody of the card;
- (b) produce the card to the Librarian whenever a book is borrowed;

(c) report the loss of the card to the Librarian immediately such loss is discovered;

(d) notify any change of address to the Librarian;

(e) surrender the card to the Librarian on ceasing to be eligible for membership.

18. The Librarian may suspend or cancel the membership of any member who habitually retains books beyond the loan period or who habitually loses or damages books.

19. Membership shall be current for a period of three years unless previously surrendered or cancelled. Persons whose membership has lapsed may be required by the Librarian to re-register before borrowing books.

20. Membership cards are not transferable.

#### G. Conditions of Borrowing

21. The Committee shall make rules from time to time stating the maximum number of books which may be borrowed at any one time.

22. The time allowed for retaining a book shall be 14 days, and the date for return of each book shall be clearly indicated to the member.

23. A member is responsible for the safe care of every book borrowed on his or her membership card and for its return to the library by the due date.

24. A member may be required to pay a charge for retaining a book beyond the time allowed. The amount of such charge shall be advertised by notice in a manner to be determined by the committee. The Library shall have no obligation to send any notice of charges incurred and failure to send such notice shall be no excuse for non-payment of such charges. Liabilities incurred by a member under this clause shall be discharged before any other book is issued.

25. A member may apply by telephone, post or in person for extension of the time allowed for retaining a book by describing the book in such terms as fully identify it to the Librarian. Such extension will only be granted if the original loan period has not expired or the book has not been reserved by another member.

26. Any book in the lending stock of the library may be reserved for a member on completion of a form prescribed by the Librarian. The Librarian will notify the member when the book is available. The member may be required to pay the cost of postage involved.

27. A member may recommend that consideration be given to the purchase of any book which is not in the stock of the library, or may request the Librarian to borrow a book from another library for him or her. A fee which shall be determined from time to time by the Committee may be levied where a book is borrowed from another library.

28. Where a book is designated for reference use only, it shall not be borrowed except at the discretion of the Librarian.

29. A member is responsible for reporting to the Librarian any damage discovered in any book on loan to him or her. This damage shall be reported at the time of issue or immediately on return.

30. If a book is lost or damaged beyond repair, or it is stolen from a member he or she shall replace it or pay to the Committee the full replacement value of such book plus such amount for processing costs as shall be determined by the Committee from time to time.

31. Additional charges to be determined from time to time by the Committee shall be made for the loss or damage of membership cards, library stationery or other items issued with a book. These charges will be displayed by notice in the library.

32. No book shall be deemed to have been returned to the library unless it has been handed to the Librarian, or left in a place or receptacle designated for the return of books, or despatched to the library by post or by a means previously approved by the Librarian.

33. The Committee may take such action as it deems necessary for the recovery of a book or the value thereof at any time after the book becomes overdue.

34. Books may be lent at the discretion of the Librarian to other library services in accordance with the *Rules for Inter-Library Lending* issued by the Municipal Inter-Library Committee (Victoria).

35. Books stolen or lost shall remain the property of the Committee although replaced or paid for.

#### H. Conduct in the Library

36. Users shall not behave in the library in such a manner as may, in the opinion of the Librarian, cause serious inconvenience or discomfort to any other person in the library.

37. The Librarian's permission is required to bring any animal, other than a guide dog accompanying a blind person, into the library.

38. Users may eat, drink or smoke only in areas which may be designated for such purposes.

39. Users shall not wilfully or negligently break, damage or interfere with the library furniture or fittings.

40. Users shall not deface, mutilate or mark by writing or otherwise any part of any materials belonging to, or in the care of, the library service.

41. Users shall not misplace or hide books or any library records with the intention to withhold their use from others.

42. Users may bring into the library reading and writing materials, a handbag or briefcase, an invalid's chair or baby carriage. Large bags or parcels, or shopping jeeps, may be left in designated areas while their owners are using the library. The Council and the Committee take no responsibility for loss or damage to any bag or other article so left.

Any container or receptacle brought into the library shall be opened for inspection on the request of the Librarian as the user leaves the library.

43. Persons may distribute or display handbills or literature, or deliver a public address in the library, only with the consent of the Librarian.

44. Users shall enter only those parts of the library open for public use, except with the permission of the Librarian.

45. Users shall leave the library at the times fixed for closing the library or at the request of the Librarian.

#### I. Offences

46. Any person who commits an offence against this By-law shall—

(a) give his or her name and address to the Librarian if requested to do so, and

(b) leave the library immediately upon being requested by the Librarian to do so.

47. Any person who commits an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$100.

#### J. Users Rights

48. All users shall have access to all books in the library for consultation on the premises *except that* some books may be on restricted access because of rarity, physical condition, embargo on use set by donors, or by legislation. Persons under the age of 14 years shall if restricted from using some section of the library by written direction of parent or guardian, be excluded from the definition of user for the purpose of this clause.

49. All members shall have access on equal terms to all lending collections for borrowing purposes but excluding for the purpose of this clause persons under the age of 14 years if restricted by parental direction.

50. Every user may suggest to the Librarian that consideration be given to the purchase by the library service of any book which is not in the stock of the library.

51. Every user shall have the right to comment to the Librarian on the performance of the library service or on the interpretation of this By-law, and through the Librarian to the Council or Committee. Complaints to the Council or Committee shall be made in writing.

52. Information including information held in files outside the library and in computer files required for membership registration purposes shall not be made available to outside inquirers except in response to a Court order, or be used by library staff for any purposes other than follow-up of unreturned books, or for statistical purposes. Membership and circulation statistics shall not be produced in such form as will identify individual members.

53. Circulation records and records relating to materials requested from the library shall not be kept after the current transaction is completed. Exceptions may be made with services such as housebound services where selection is done by library staff and the record of past reading is essential to the success of the service.

54. This By-law shall come into operation on the day after the day of publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.
