

By virtue of the powers conferred by the *Health Act* 1958, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the No. 116—70100/83—Price 60 cents, delivered \$1.20. Subscription rate: \$80 per annum

said State, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamation dated 24 December 1975 and published in the Government Gazette of 7 January 1976, and declare, constitute and define as Health Areas the areas following, namely:

Central Highlands-Wimmera Health Area, comprising the Cities of Ararat, Ballaarat, Horsham, the Town of Stawell, the Borough of Sebastopol, the Shires of Arapiles, Ararat, Avoca, Ballan, Ballarat, Birchip, Bungaree, Buninyong, Creswick, Daylesford and Glenlyon, Dimboola, Donald, Dunmunkle, Grenville, Kaniva, Karkarooc, Kowree, Lexton, Lowan, Ripon, Stawell, Talbot and Clunes, Warracknabeal, Wimmera.







"Fingerprint Expert" means a member who has been appointed to the Fingerprint Bureau and who has been engaged in fingerprint duties for at least five years and who is certified in writing by the Officer in Charge of the Fingerprint Bureau, as fully qualified to classify, search, file and identify fingerprints, to search for, preserve and develop fingerprints and to give expert evidence regarding fingerprints.

"Government premises" means living accommodation owned or leased by the Crown and

- (a) which is provided for use by and allocated to a member of the Force appointed to a District, Division, or Sub-district and which, in the opinion of the Chief Commissioner, the member should occupy in order to discharge his duties efficiently; or
- (b) which is part of or in the vicinity of a Police Station and which for the greater security and continuous operation of a station is required by the Chief Commissioner to be occupied by a member for the performance of his duties on a station; or
- (c) which comprises quarters or barracks.
- "Member" means any person (whether male or female) employed in the Police Force of Victoria, and includes an Officer of or below the rank of Commander and a Detective.
- "Officer" means any Commander, Chief Superintendent, Superintendent, Chief Inspector, Inspector.
- "Qualified accountant" means a member who has qualified by examination to become an associate or a member of any organization of accountants approved by the Police Service Board or holds a degree or diploma in accountancy from a university or from any other educational establishment which is accepted by any such approved organization of accountants. (The Police Service Board has accepted the Australian Society of Accountants as an approved organization of accountants.)
- "Spouse" shall be deemed and taken to include the partner of a de facto marriage, proof of which is to be established on the provision of reasonable evidence, such as a statutory declaration, that the member and de facto partner are normally accommodated as a family unit.
- "Substantially dependent spouse" means a spouse whose total income, including income in addition to salary and wages, is less than the adult minimum wage rate for Victoria as decided from time to time by the Australian Conciliation and Arbitration Commission.
- "Substantially dependent child" means a child under the age of 16 years, or a student under the age of 21 years if attending full-time at a school, college or university.
- "Sub-Officer" means any Senior Sergeant or Sergeant.
- "Year" means a calendar year.
- 3. No member shall be entitled to receive, in respect of duties performed by him as a member of the Force or in respect of any associated expenses arising therefrom, any salary, penalty payments or allowances other than those provided in this Determination.
- 4. Where the context requires, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include the feminine, and the singular to include the plural, and the plural the singular.

#### SUB-DIVISION VIII

Expenses — Travelling, Incidental, Meal, Course or Conference and Miscellaneous

### Travelling and Incidental Expenses

- 42(1) Subject to the provisions of this sub-division, members shall be entitled by way or reimbursement to allowances for travelling, incidental and meal expenses.
  - (2) In all cases where travelling expenses for absence on duty are claimed, the hours of duty must be continuous before allowances become payable.
  - (3) (i) Under this sub-division, the terms 'breakfast', 'lunch', 'dinner' and 'night meal' shall be defined respectively as follows
    - (i) any meal purchased between 0601-1200 hours
    - (ii) any meal purchased between 1201-1800 hours
    - (iii) any meal purchased between 1801-2400 hours
    - (iv) any meal purchased between 0001-0600 hours
    - (ii) The term 'metropolitan area' shall be deemed to include all police stations and places within a radius of 45 kilometres of the Post Office situated at the corner of Bourke and Elizabeth Streets, Melbourne but excluding any part of the Bellarine Peninsula.
    - (iii) The boundaries of the suburban areas of Ballarat, Bendigo and Geelong shall be defined by the Chief Commissioner who may at any time and from time to time alter or vary such boundaries as he thinks necessary.
  - (4) Where a member stationed in the metropolitan area or within the urban or suburban areas of Ballarat, Bendigo or Geelong is withdrawn from his station or place of employment for:
    - (i) duty within such areas, he shall not be entitled to claim travelling expenses under this sub-division in relation to duties undertaken within an area of 24 kilometres radius of his station or place of employment.
    - (ii) any special or emergency duty within such areas and is thereby required to work for a consecutive period of 5 hours, and by doing so has incurred out of pocket expenses, he shall be reimbursed such expenses or any portion thereof which is not payable under any of the provisions of this sub-division.
  - (5) A member attached to motor car and motor cycle patrols shall not be entitled to claim travelling expenses under this sub-division whilst performing patrol duty, unless such duty entails his being absent from his station or place of employment for at least 9 hours.
  - (6) In no circumstances shall travelling expenses be paid to any member doing duty at his own station.
- 43(1) Where in the opinion of the Chief Commissioner special circumstances exist for which provision is not herein made, he may authorize the payment of such allowances as is considered reasonable under the circumstances.
  - (2) Where the actual and necessary expenses incurred by a member exceed the rates herein provided, an additional sum by way of reimbursement may be granted by the Chief Commissioner.
- Where the duty to be performed by a member is of such a nature that it is reasonable to believe he will be detained for a period of several days away from his station or place of employment, he may receive, where practicable, an adequate advance of travelling expenses commensurate with the period of absence.

- Members approved and required to use their own motor vehicles on police duty which necessitates the use of a motor vehicle, who do not reside at the station where they are usually stationed and who use such vehicle to travel between such station and the place where the vehicle is usually garaged when commencing and finishing their prescribed period of duty, shall be paid the appropriate kilometre rate for the distance actually travelled, if less than 10 kilometres in all both ways, and if the distance actually travelled both ways exceeds 10 kilometres, for 10 kilometres only.
- 61 If the Police Service Board is satisfied that because of special circumstances any rate fixed herein should be increased such increased rate of payment may be allowed as the Board shall determine.

1.5 By inserting immediately after Sub-Division IX of Division III the following new "Sub Division X — Transfer Expenses" —

#### SUB-DIVISION X

#### Transfer Expenses

- 62(1) Subject to the provisions of other sub-paragraphs of this paragraph, transfer expenses of members, their substantially dependent spouse and/or substantially dependent children, and reasonable costs of removing furniture and effect shall be reimbursed, including the cost of comprehensive insurance cover for such furniture and effects whilst in transit, up to a maximum of \$25 000 when such members are transferred from one station or district to another station or district.
  - (2) Members shall not be allowed transfer expenses under paragraph 62(1) if, at their own request, they are transferred to a station and their transfer expenses have been paid within 3 years of appointment thereto in respect of any transfer for which they had applied. Such members must not use railway requisitions.
  - (3) Where a member is transferred from one station to another and is entitled under paragraph 62(1) or allowed by the Chief Commissioner under paragraph 62(7) to receive transfer expenses, he shall also be paid the sum of \$260 as compensation for accelerated depreciation and extra wear and tear on furniture and effects and for replacing or altering carpets, linoleums, curtains, blinds and household goods resulting from the transfer. Where the Chief Commissioner is of opinion, upon consideration of all the facts, the sum of \$260 is not sufficient compensation, he may allow such further reasonable sum as he thinks fit.
- (4) Where members who are entitled to transfer expenses under this paragraph and who own motor cars, transport themselves and their substantially dependent spouse and/or substantially dependent children by car when on transfer, such members may claim the equivalent of first class rail fares or the kilometre rate, whichever amount is the lesser cost to the Government. Where a member is travelling to a station where he will be performing motor car duties or is travelling from a station where he has been performing motor car duties he shall be allowed the kilometre
- (5) Subject to the provisions of other sub-paragraphs of this paragraph, a member who is entitled to transfer expenses as therein provided and who by reason of the transfer concerned is obliged to sell a residence occupied by him at his old location and to purchase or build another residence for permanent occupation by him at his new location, shall be entitled to reimbursement of stamp duty paid by him upon the purchase of such residence or land for the purpose of building upon it such a residence at that new location. Provided that such re-imbursement shall not be payable to the member unless and until he enters into occupation of such residence and within a period of 15 months after the effective date of such transfer as recorded in the relevant Notice of Transfer.
- (6) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs 62(5) a member who is entitled to re-imbursement of Stamp Duty paid upon the purchase of a residence or land, shall likewise be entitled to re-imbursement of Stamp Duty paid, on the mortgage instrument, if any, in relation to such purchase.
- (7) Where there are special cirumstances connected with any transfer the Chief Commissioner may, after considering all the facts, allow transfer expenses.
- 63(1) Where a member who maintains his substantially dependent spouse and/or substantially dependent children satisfies the Chief Commissioner that during the first 12 months of service or

following any transfer he has made reasonable efforts to obtain housing accommodation for himself and his family at or near where he is stationed or employed, and has failed to do so and is therefore required to live away from the place where his family is so maintained, he shall be entitled to receive an allowance of \$53.50 per week during the time he is so required to live away from his family and is unable to secure such accommodation. Provided that no member shall receive any such allowance for a period longer than 12 calendar months.

- (2) A member in receipt of an allowance under paragraph 63(1) shall not be entitled to travelling expenses under paragraph 45 for such living away, but if he travels on duty from the place at which he is living away, he shall be paid the appropriate travelling allowance for such travelling in addition to his living away allowance, but his living away allowance shall cease if he is absent travelling on duty for a period in excess of 1 week from the place where he is living away.
- (3) A member in receipt of an allowance under paragraph 63(1) who is on leave for any period of 1 week or less shall be paid such allowance, if he is on leave for any period in excess of 1 week, no portion of such allowance shall be paid.
- A member who, in consequence of having been selected for appointment to the Police Force and who, at the time of his selection was resident interstate or overseas, has necessarily incurred expenditure on the conveyance of himself, his substantially dependent spouse and/or substantially dependent children and furniture and effects from such place of residence to another in Victoria shall:
  - (i) where the member was resident overseas, be entitled to:
    - (a) payment of economy class air fare for himself, his substantially dependent spouse and/or substantially dependent children;
    - (b) re-imbursement of 75 per cent of expenses reasonably incurred up to a maximum re-imbursement of \$3550 for the removal of personal effects; and
    - (c) in the case of a member with a substantially dependent spouse and/or substantially dependent children payment of the allowance prescribed in paragraph 63(1) as compensation for temporary accommodation expenses;
  - (ii) where the member was resident interstate, be entitled to:
    - (a) payment of economy class airfare or first class rail fare for himself, his substantially dependent spouse and/or substantially dependent children or, if the member has used his private motor vehicle, a car kilometre allowance as prescribed in paragraph 56 plus the actual reasonable accommodation and meal costs incurred whilst travelling;
    - (b) re-imbursement of 75 per cent of the cost of removal of furniture and effects, including the cost of comprehensive insurance cover for such furniture and effects whilst in transit up to a maximum cover of \$25 000 up to the following maximum amount:

- (c) in the case of a member with a substantially dependent spouse and/or substantially dependent children, payment of the accommodation expenses prescribed in paragraph 63(1) as compensation for temporary accommodation expenses.
- Where a member is stationed and residing in a different part of the State from that in which he intends to make his permanent home on retirement, he shall before retiring on account of age or ill health be provided with free first class rail fare for himself, his substantially dependent spouse and/or substantially dependent children for the purpose of taking up residence at his proposed permanent home. Where such member uses his own motor car for such purposes for himself and his family, he shall be paid the equivalent of the first class rail fares or mileage rates, whichever amount is the lesser for such journey. In addition he shall be entitled to have his furniture and effects transported to such place at the expense of the Government and that accelerated depreciation under paragraph 62(3) also be paid. The Chief Commissioner shall arrange for such transport, and where practicable railway transport shall be used for the purpose.
- Where a member intends making his permanent home outside the State of Victoria, he shall before retiring on account of age or ill health be entitled so far only as to the Victorian border to the benefits for himself, his substantially dependent spouse and/or substantially dependent children provided for in paragraph 65.




