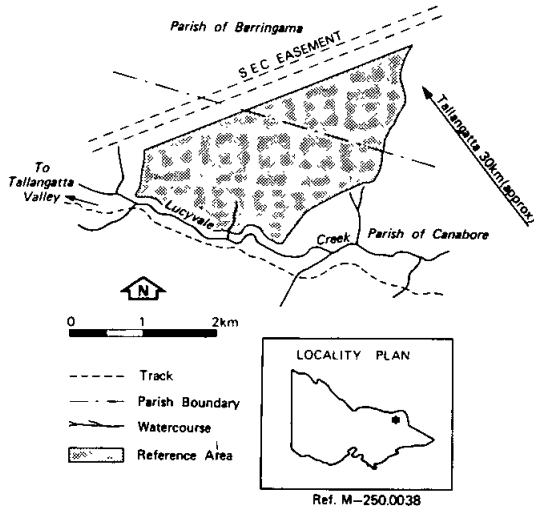

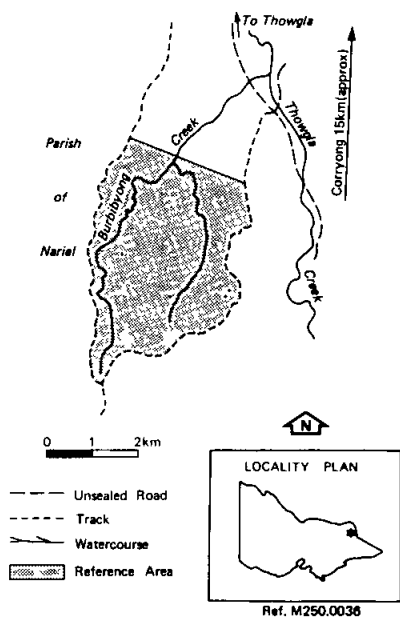

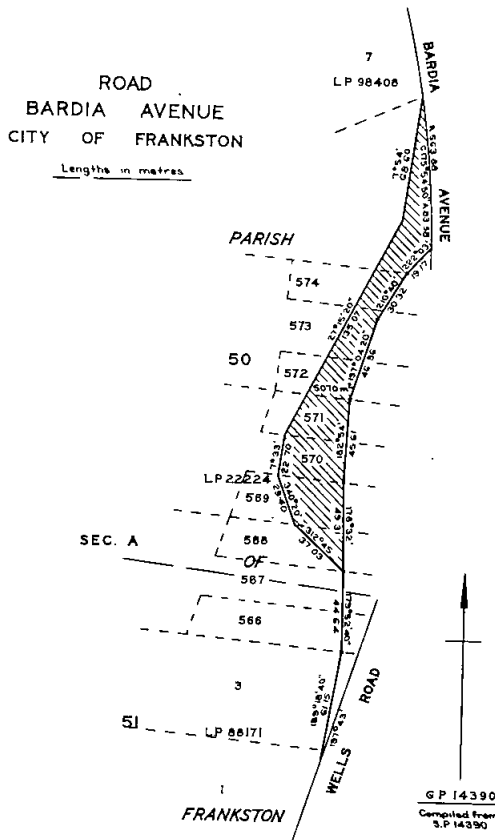
RESOLUTIONS OF THE COUNTRY ROADS BOARD

TRANSFER OF BELLARINE WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM AND TRANSFER OF LAND, EASEMENTS, WORKS,  
PROPERTY, POWERS, RIGHTS, LIABILITIES, OBLIGATIONS AND OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES FROM STATE  
RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION TO GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST

Whereas Section 57A (4) of the *Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1958* provides that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, transfer from the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, hereinafter referred to as "the Commission" to the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust, hereinafter referred to as "the Trust", any land, easements, works, property, powers, rights, liabilities and obligations and any officers or employees of the Commission which are specified in an application made by the Trust and the Commission to the Governor in Council as are necessary to facilitate the transfer of the Bellarine Water Supply System to the Trust and for the adjustment of the respective liabilities of the Trust and the Commission.

And whereas the Trust and the Commission have made the aforesaid application (81/386).

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, in pursuance of the hereinbefore recited powers doth hereby declare order and direct that:

1. The date of transfer under Section 57A of the said Act shall be 1 July 1983 (hereinafter referred to as the operative date).
2. There shall be transferred from the Commission to the Trust as on and from the operative date:
  - (i) all land, easements, works, property of the Commission related to the aforesaid Bellarine Water Supply System including all that property both freehold and easements owned by vested in or existing in favour of the Commission as set out in the Schedule numbered 1 hereto.
  - (ii) all rights and liabilities in respect of an easement in the process of being acquired for a water supply pipeline under Notice to Treat No. 13688 in part of Plan of Consolidation No. 104555 being part of Allotment 6, Section 1, at Queenscliff in the Parish of Paywit and being part of the land in Certificate of Title Volume 9123 Folio 517.
  - (iii) all powers, obligations and rights of the Commission in relation to the supply of water within the Bellarine Peninsula Waterworks District, the Bellarine Urban District and the Mount Duneed Rural District and to various properties outside those districts which are supplied by the Bellarine water supply system and in respect of which agreements for supply have been entered into between the Commission and the property owners concerned.
  - (iv) the ownership of all the works of water supply hereinbefore described.
3. All monies due and payable to the Commission as at the operative date in respect of the supply of water to the Bellarine Peninsula Waterworks District the Bellarine Urban District and the Mount Duneed Rural District and to the various properties aforementioned shall be due and payable to the Trust.
4. As on and from the operative date the officers and employees of the Commission whose names are set forth in the Schedule numbered 2 hereto shall cease to be officers or employees of the Commission and shall become officers or employees of the Trust.
5. As soon as practicable after the operative date there shall be paid, from the Consolidated Fund in the Department of Management and Budget, by the Commission to the Trust:
  - (i) the nett cash surplus in the books of the Commission of the Bellarine Peninsula Waterworks District, the Bellarine Urban District and the Mount Duneed Rural District (at present estimated at \$285 000).
  - (ii) an amount being the balance of the total monies received and expended in accordance with Section 58A of the Water Act and applicable in the books of the Commission to Bellarine Peninsula Water Supply System (at present estimated to be \$120 000).
  - (iii) an amount being the balance of total monies raised, received and expended in accordance with Section 83A of the Water Act and applicable in the books of the Commission to the Bellarine Peninsula Waterworks District, the Bellarine Urban District and the Mount Duneed Rural District (at present estimated to be \$1 000).
6. On and as from the operative date there shall be transferred in the books of the Department of Management and Budget from the Commission to the Trust the works at cost (at present estimated to be \$12 450 000) in respect of the Bellarine Peninsula Waterworks District, the Bellarine Urban District and the Mount Duneed Rural District. As from 1 January 1984 an amount (at present estimated to be \$1 440 000) being that portion of the estimated amount of \$12 450 000 which is capital expenditure borne by the State shall be charged in the books of the Department of Management and Budget and the Trust to the districts of the Trust.
7. On and as from the operative date there shall be transferred in the books of the Department of Management and Budget from the Commission to the Trust the nett capital liability (at present estimated to be \$11 750 000) in respect of the Bellarine Peninsula Waterworks District, the Bellarine Urban District and the Mount Duneed Rural District. As from 1 January 1984 an amount (at present estimated to be \$1 440 000) being that portion of the estimated amount of \$11 750 000 which is nett capital liability borne by the State shall be charged in the books of the Department of Management and Budget and the Trust to the districts of the Trust.
8. The Trust shall pay to the Department of Management and Budget interest and redemption in respect of the cost of works and nett capital liability transferred at the rates prescribed from time to time in accordance with Section 289 of the Water Act.

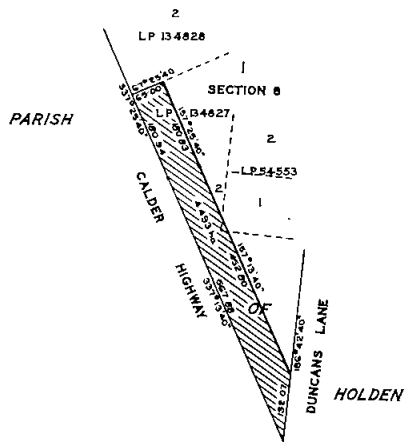

FREWAY CALDER FREEWAY SHIRES OF BULLA AND MELTON

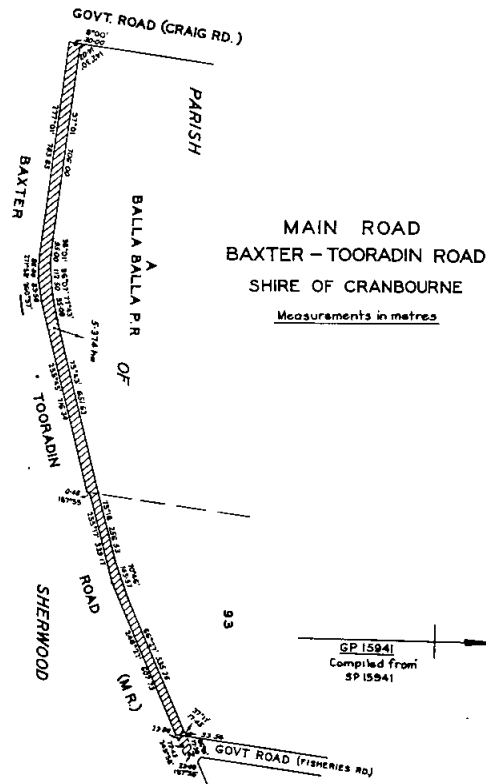

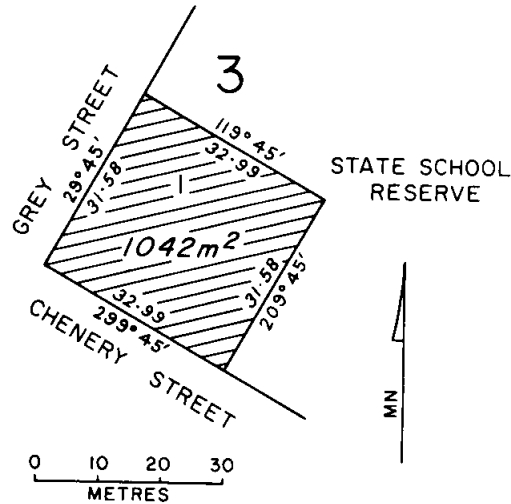

CONSTITUTION OF COUNCIL OF BENDIGO COLLEGE OF  
TECHNICAL AND FURTHER EDUCATION

Whereas sub-section (2) of section 23 of the *Post-Secondary Education Act 1978* (hereinafter called "the Act") provides that where the governing body of a post-secondary education institution makes application to the Victorian Post-Secondary Education Commission (hereinafter called "the Commission") for the incorporation under the Act of a council to manage and control the institution, the Governor in Council may on the recommendation of the Commission by Order published in the *Government Gazette*—

- (a) constitute a council by such name as is specified in the Order as a body corporate to manage and control the institution;
- (b) make such provision for or with respect to the membership of the council as he thinks fit;
- (c) confer on the council such powers as he thinks necessary or expedient for the purpose of managing and controlling the institution; and
- (d) make such other provision for or with respect to the constitution powers duties and functions of the council as is in his opinion necessary or expedient.

And whereas the interim governing body of the Technical and Further Education Division of the Bendigo College of Advanced Education (being a committee appointed for this purpose by resolution of the Council of the Bendigo College of Advanced Education pursuant to paragraph (g) of Clause 4 of the Constitution of the said Council) has applied in writing to the Commission for the incorporation under the Act of a council to manage and control such Division:

And whereas the Commission has recommended to the Governor in Council that a council be incorporated to manage and control the said Technical and Further Education Division on the terms hereinafter contained:

And whereas pursuant to sub-section (1) of Section 26 of the Act upon the publication of this Order all the real and personal property vested immediately before the making of this order in the said Technical and Further Education Division of the Bendigo College of Advanced Education or its governing body, or in any person in trust for the said Division or its governing body, shall without any further or other authority than the Act be vested in the council incorporated by this Order, subject to any trusts attaching to the property, and all the liabilities and obligations of the said Division or of the governing body thereof existing immediately before the making of this Order shall by virtue of the Act become liabilities and obligations of the Council incorporated by this Order:

Now therefore His Excellency, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order provide as follows:

*Objects*

1. There shall be a Bendigo College of Technical and Further Education to serve the community by providing Technical and Further Education to serve the community by providing Technical and Further Education opportunities to enhance the personal and vocational development of members of the community. The specific objects for which the College is established are as follows—

- (1) to advance directly or indirectly Technical and Further Education in all its aspects including professional commercial technical scientific artistic classical and general

education and to provide such education for students both part-time and full-time:

- (2) to award certificates or other qualifications.

*Definitions*

2. In this Order, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"The Act" means the *Post-Secondary Education Act 1978* as amended from time to time or any re-enactment or consolidation thereof.

"Board of the North Central TAFE Centre" means the Board established under sub-clause 8 (2) of this Order.

"College" means Bendigo College of Technical and Further Education including the Council, staff, students, facilities, land, buildings and equipment at all campuses for which the Council is responsible.

"Commission" means the Victorian Post-Secondary Education Commission.

"Council" means the council of the Bendigo College of Technical and Further Education established under this Order.

"Director" means the chief executive officer of the Bendigo College of Technical and Further Education.

"educational programme" means an organised activity of any duration the major objective of which is to increase the knowledge understanding and skill of the participant and includes without affecting the generality of the foregoing any course of study as defined in the Act.

"general staff" means all persons in the employment of the Council other than the teaching staff.

"North Central TAFE Centre" means the technical and further education complex at Charlton which is a campus of the College.

"prescribed" means prescribed by this Order or by Regulation made under this Order.

"Regulation" means a regulation made under this Order.

"staff" means the general staff and teaching staff.

"student" means a person enrolled in such educational programmes of the College as are prescribed.

"TAFE Board" means the Technical and Further Education Board of Victoria.

"teaching staff" means those persons or categories of persons employed by the Council who are prescribed as undertaking teaching duties and those persons appointed to the staff of the College employed under the *Education Services Act 1981*.

Unless the context otherwise requires, words importing the singular include the plural and the masculine includes the feminine.

*Constitution of Council*

3. There shall be a council to be known as the Council of the Bendigo College of Technical and Further Education which shall be a body corporate to manage and control the College and shall be capable of exercising all the functions of a body corporate and of suing and being sued and having perpetual succession and a common seal and power to acquire and hold land or any estate in land.

*Membership of Council*

4. (1) The Council shall consist of not more than sixteen (16) members and shall be constituted as below, provided that at least one of the appointees under the provisions of paragraphs 4 (1) (a) or 4 (1) (h) shall be a member of the Council of the Bendigo College of Advanced Education.

(a) Four (4) members shall be appointed by the Governor in Council but no member of the staff nor any student of the College shall be eligible to be a member under this paragraph.

(b) The Director of the College shall be a member *ex officio*.

(c) The Deputy Director of the College shall be a member *ex officio*.

- (d) The Director of the Bendigo College of Advanced Education shall be a member *ex officio*.
- (e) One (1) shall be a member of the full-time teaching staff elected by the teaching staff in a manner prescribed pursuant to sub-clause 4 (8).
- (f) One (1) shall be a member of the full-time general staff elected by the general staff in a manner prescribed pursuant to sub-clause 4 (8).
- (g) One (1) shall be a member of the Board of the North Central TAFE Centre appointed by that Board but no student of the College shall be eligible to be a member under this paragraph, and no member of staff shall be appointed under this paragraph if any other member of the Board is available for membership.
- (h) Five (5) shall be persons who have a special interest in Technical and Further Education from time to time appointed by co-option by the Council, but no member of the staff nor any student of the College shall be a member under this paragraph.
- (i) One (1) shall be a student of the College appointed in a manner prescribed by the Council; but no member of staff of the College shall be eligible to be a member under this paragraph.
- (2) A member of the Council elected pursuant to paragraph (e) and (f) of sub-clause (1) is hereinafter called an "elected member".
- (3) A member appointed by the Governor in Council may be removed by the Governor in Council.
- (4) (a) Appointed members of Council shall be entitled to hold office for three years from the date of such member's appointment provided that in the case only of the first appointments under paragraph (a) of sub-clause 4 (1) three shall be appointed for three years and one for two years and of the first appointed under paragraph (h) of sub-clause 4 (1) three shall be appointed for one year and two for two years.
- (b) Each elected member other than the first elected members shall hold office for two years from the day after the date of expiry of the term of office of that elected member's predecessor in office.
- (c) In the case only of the first elected members, one who shall be chosen in a manner determined by the Council shall hold office until 30 June 1984 and the other shall hold office until 30 June 1985.
- (d) A member appointed under paragraph 4 (1) (i) shall hold office for one year from the date of such member's appointment.
- (5) A member of the Council shall be eligible to be reappointed or re-elected (as the case may be), but a member shall not be elected or appointed for more than three successive terms unless such member is eligible to be appointed by co-option for a further term under paragraph (h) of sub-clause 4 (1) and is so appointed.
- (6) If a member of the Council (other than members *ex officio*)—
- (a) resigns his office by writing under his hand addressed to the President of the Council;
- (b) becomes of unsound mind or becomes a person whose person or estate is liable to be dealt with in any way under the law relating to mental health;
- (c) becomes bankrupt or suspends payment of his debts by arrangement or compound with his creditors or assigns his estate for the benefit of his creditors;
- (d) is convicted of any indictable offence;
- (e) without special leave previously granted by the Council absents himself from three consecutive scheduled meetings of the Council;
- (f) ceases to hold any qualification required for his becoming or being a member of the Council or being appointed pursuant to paragraph (a), (g) or (h) of sub-clause 4 (1) becomes a member of staff or a student;
- (g) being a member appointed by the Governor in Council is removed from office;
- (h) dies—  
his office shall become vacant so as to create a casual vacancy.
- (7) Every vacancy in the office of any appointed or elected member of the Council arising otherwise than by the expiration of the term for which the member was appointed or elected shall be deemed a casual vacancy.
- (8) (a) Elections for elected members of the Council shall be conducted in a manner prescribed.
- (b) The Regulations may provide for voting by post or by personal ballot and for preferential or any other system of voting at any such elections.
- (c) Any breach of the Regulations, either by an election being held later than prescribed or by those entitled to vote being inadequately notified of the election or otherwise, may be waived by the Council if it deems fit. Except as aforesaid, any election which is carried out in a manner contrary to the Regulations shall be void and of no effect.
- (9) Subject to paragraph (a) of sub-clause 4 (10), an election to fill a vacancy caused by the retirement or resignation of an elected member shall be conducted so as to ensure, as far as possible, that the newly-elected member assumes his duties within one month from the date of retirement or resignation of the elected member whom he replaces.
- (10) (a) Any casual vacancy in the office of an elected or appointed member of the Council shall be filled by the election or appointment as the case may be of a person to fill the vacancy except that if any casual vacancy occurs in the office of a member appointed under paragraphs (a), (h) or (i) of sub-clause 4 (1) within three months before the expiration of the term of office of such member, or if any casual vacancy occurs in the office of an elected member within two months before the expiration of the term of office of such elected member, the vacancy shall not be filled for the remainder of the term.
- (b) The election or appointment shall be made by the person or body of persons by whom the member whose office has become vacant was elected or appointed.
- (c) A member elected or appointed to fill a casual vacancy shall subject to this Order be entitled to hold office during the residue of the term of the member whose place he fills.
- (d) A part term served by a member elected or appointed to fill a casual vacancy shall not be considered a term of office for the purpose of sub-clause 4 (5).
- (11) (a) No proceedings of the Council or of any committee thereof shall be invalidated or rendered illegal by reason of there having been at the time of such proceedings no person or persons appointed or elected to fill a casual vacancy or vacancies and all proceedings of the Council or of any committee thereof or of any person acting as a member of the Council shall, notwithstanding that it may afterwards be discovered that there was some defect in the election or



appointment of one or more of the members of the Council or of the committee or of the person acting as aforesaid or that they or any of them were incapable of being members of the Council or of the committee, be as valid as if every such person has been duly elected or appointed to the Council or committee and was capable of being a member.

- (b) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order members of the Council shall not be liable for any loss or damage arising out of the bona fide execution or attempted execution arising out of the non-execution of the duties, powers, authorities and discretions conferred or imposed upon them under this Order, save and except loss or damage resulting from their wilful act, default, neglect or fraud and shall be entitled to be indemnified out of the assets of the College for any liability so incurred.
- (12) Any person who has a pecuniary interest, whether directly or indirectly, in any business of the Council or of any committee of the Council of which he is a member shall declare the nature of his interest on every occasion when any business in which he has such interest is being considered at a meeting at which he is present and no person shall be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Council or any committee thereof on any subject in which he has a direct pecuniary interest: Provided that nothing in this sub-clause 4 (12) shall disqualify a staff member who is a member of Council or of a committee of Council from voting on matters affecting the general terms and conditions of the staff of the College.
- (13) Where for any reason the Council appoints a person to be Acting Director or Acting Deputy Director the person so appointed shall, while holding such office, be entitled to attend and vote at any meeting of the Council and shall have all the rights and the privileges of the position in which he is acting.

#### *Proceedings of Council*

5. The following provisions shall apply to the proceedings of the Council:

- (1) The number of members required to constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Council shall be at least one more than half of the maximum number of members as specified in sub-clause 4 (1) and not less than one half of the members present shall be neither members of staff nor students, except that if the number of vacancies is such that it is not possible to achieve a quorum, the members of council may meet for the purpose only of appointing a person or persons to vacancies in the membership of Council pursuant to sub-clause 4 (1) (h) and in such cases a quorum shall consist of at least seventy five percent of the membership of the Council then holding office.
- (2) The Council shall each year, or where a vacancy occurs during any year, on the occurrence of the vacancy, elect members (other than members ex officio, any other member of staff or any student of the College) to be President of the Council and Vice President of the Council respectively.
- (3) The President, or in his absence, the Vice-President of the Council shall preside at any meeting of Council. In the absence of both the President and the Vice-President the members present shall choose a member (other than an ex-officio member, any other member of staff or a student of the College) to preside at the meeting.
- (4) The Council shall meet at least six times in each year.
- (5) Except as otherwise provided in this Order, the decision of the majority of the members present and voting at any meeting of the Council shall be the decision of the Council.
- (6) In the event of equality of votes on any question the member presiding shall have a second or casting vote.
- (7) Subject to this Order, the Council may regulate its own proceedings.
- (8) The Council shall provide for the safe custody of the common seal, which shall only be used by authority of the Council and every instrument to which the common seal is affixed shall be signed by two members of the Council who are members appointed under paragraphs (a) or (h) of sub-clause 4 (1) and shall be countersigned by the Director or by some other person appointed by the Council for that purpose.

#### *Powers of the Council*

6. The Council shall have the power from time to time to:
- (1) Determine the terms and conditions on which students of the College and any other persons may attend classes or make use of any premises equipment facilities or services of the College.
  - (2) Charge fees or other charges for enrolment and for any examination assessment certificate or other award and for attendance at classes or other activities associated with any educational programme of the College and for the use of any premises equipment facilities or services of the College.
  - (3) Hold examinations and make assessments whenever it deems necessary or desirable in the several subjects and educational programmes offered by the College and issue appropriately entitled documentary evidence other than the award of Degrees, Associate Diplomas, Diplomas and Graduate Diplomas to students who reach the required standard in any subject or educational programme.
  - (4) Grant scholarships and prizes on such terms and conditions as are prescribed.
  - (5) Establish and administer a student loan fund.
  - (6) Do all such things as are calculated to advance the interests of the students and staff.
  - (7) Arrange for the appointment and employment of the Director and other members of the teaching staff subject to such terms and conditions as are determined by the Post Secondary Education Remuneration Tribunal or other appropriate body.
  - (8) Enter into arrangements with the Minister of Education, the Victorian Education Service Conciliation and Arbitration Commission, the Director-General of Education or any other governmental authority or officer to obtain the services of persons employed under the *Education Service Act 1981* to serve as Director or as other full time members of the teaching staff.
  - (9) Appoint and employ members of the general staff subject to such terms and conditions as are determined by the Post-Secondary Education Remuneration Tribunal or other appropriate body.
  - (10) Define the duties of members of the teaching and general staff subject to the provisions of awards, determinations or guidelines established by appropriate authorities.
  - (11) Discipline suspend or dismiss any member of the staff employed by the Council in accordance with the procedures laid down in the industrial award or determination under which they are employed or, if no procedures are so laid down, in accord with the procedures from time to time prescribed. Except as otherwise provided by such industrial award or determination, the dismissal of a member of the teaching staff and such general staff as are prescribed may be carried out only on the resolution of the Council passed by a majority consisting of not less than two-thirds of the total number of members of the Council.

- (12) In addition to the powers contained in sub-clause 6 (8), enter into arrangements with the Public Service Board or any other body or authority for the services of officers or employees of the Public Service or of such body or authority to be made available to the College on such terms as the Council thinks fit.
- (13) Negotiate arrangements with all relevant parties for secondment of staff to other employment provided that the terms and conditions of employment during such secondment which relate to leave entitlements and any other accrued benefits are not (except with the express agreement of the member of staff concerned) inferior to those which would have applied if the member of staff concerned had continued to be employed by the Council and work at the College, and provided further that secondment of a member of staff may not be made except with the consent of such member of staff.
- (14) Provide for the delivery and holding of lectures exhibitions demonstrations seminars tutorials public meetings classes external studies conferences and employ such other means as may be necessary or desirable to advance directly or indirectly Technical and Further Education.
- (15) Provide maintain and establish lecture rooms lecture theatres laboratories libraries scientific engineering trade and technical machinery and equipment and such other places and things as may be necessary or desirable for the purpose of promoting encouraging or carrying on Technical and Further Education in all its aspects.
- (16) Purchase take on lease or in exchange or hire, and sell mortgage lease or dispose of any real or personal property and enter into agreements for the supply of services or the carrying out of any work for the College and in the case of the sale or disposal of real property only with the consent of the Minister of Education on the recommendation of the TAFE Board.
- (17) Let hire or make available the premises, amenities and property of the College to such person or persons as the Council shall determine whether gratuitously or for reward.
- (18) Invest and deal with the money or property of the College not immediately required, provided that the power of investment contained in this clause shall be limited to investments in any securities which are authorized investments within the meaning of the law relating to trustees.
- (19) Borrow moneys—
- (a) at interest for the purpose of carrying out or performing any of its powers authorities duties and functions or for the repayment or partial repayment of any sum previously borrowed;
  - (b) on overdraft of current account at any bank— within such limit and upon such conditions as to security and otherwise as the Governor in Council upon the recommendation of the Treasurer of Victoria may from time to time approve.
- (20) Foster the establishment and maintenance of facilities and amenities for the cultural social recreational and sporting activities of the students and staff and generally foster the health and welfare of students and staff.
- (21) Accept gifts of real or personal property to the College.
- (22) Apply for purchase or otherwise acquire any patents, patent rights, copyrights, trade marks or formulae, licences, concessions and the like conferring any exclusive or non-exclusive or limited right to use which may seem capable of being used for any of the purposes of the College or the acquisition of which may seem calculated directly or indirectly to benefit the College, and to use, exercise, develop or grant licences in respect of or otherwise turn to account the property rights or information so acquired.
- (23) Enter into any arrangements with any government or governmental or other authority, that may seem conducive to the College's objects or any of them, and to obtain from any such government or authority any rights, privileges and concessions which the College may think it desirable to obtain, and to carry out, exercise and comply with any such arrangements, rights, privileges and concessions.
- (24) Act either solely or jointly as trustee or custodian of any property or funds.
- (25) Engage architects and other professional advisers, and enter into contracts, for the erection of buildings, the making of improvements or alterations, or the carrying out of repairs on any land or buildings vested in or occupied or used by the College.
- (26) By resolution delegate, subject to such conditions as it thinks fit, any powers (other than this power of delegation, except as otherwise provided in this Order) or functions vested in the Council to any committee of Council, any member of staff, any committee of members of staff, any joint committee of members of the Council and members of staff or any committee of persons the majority of whom are members of the Council or members of staff.
- (27) By resolution delegate to the Director authority to exercise such powers and duties as it may from time to time confer or impose on him provided that unless otherwise expressly provided by this Order the Regulations or the Council the Director shall have the power to delegate any of his powers and duties other than this power of delegation to any person or committee.
- (28) Do all such other things as are necessary or incidental to the proper management control and safety of the College or the effective exercise of the powers conferred on the Council.

#### *Delegation*

7. A delegation by the Council shall be revocable at will by the Council and shall not prevent the exercise of any power or the performance of any function by the Council.

#### *Special Boards of the College*

8. There shall be two special Boards of the College:

(1) Board of Educational Programmes

- (a) The Council shall establish a Board of Educational Programmes either by that name or by any other name from time to time deemed appropriate by the Council.
- (b) The functions of the Board of Educational Programmes shall be—
  - (i) to advise the Council on the educational programmes of the College;
  - (ii) to exercise such of the powers of the Council as the Council may delegate to it from time to time.
- (c) The members of the Board of Educational Programmes shall be such persons as may be appointed from time to time by the Council and such other representatives of the members of staff or classes of members of staff as the Council may from time to time determine who shall be elected in a manner prescribed.
- (d) Members of the Board of Educational Programmes shall hold office for such period as the Council may from time to time determine.

(2) Board of the North Central TAFE Centre

- (a) The Council shall establish a Board of the North Central TAFE Centre either by that name or by any other name from time to time deemed appropriate by the Council.

- (b) The functions of the Board of the North Central TAFE Centre shall be—
  - (i) to advise the Council on the development of the Centre; and
  - (ii) to exercise such powers of the Council as the Council may delegate to it from time to time.
- (c) The members of the Board of the North Central TAFE Centre shall be such persons as may be appointed from time to time by the Council and such other representatives of the members of staff or classes of members of staff as the Council may from time to time determine who shall be elected in a manner prescribed.
- (d) Members of the Board of the North Central TAFE Centre shall hold office for such period as the Council may from time to time determine.

#### *Regulations*

9. (1) Subject to this Order the Council may make regulations for or with respect to all matters concerning the College and in particular without affecting the generality of the foregoing for or with respect to:
  - (a) The organisation and management of the College.
  - (b) Boards and Committees of the Council.
  - (c) The number of and conditions of employment of the staff.
  - (d) The pre-requisites and educational standards for enrolment of students and other persons in any educational programme.
  - (e) The discipline of the College including provisions for the imposition of fines and penalties.
  - (f) The educational programmes of the College and the granting of certificates or other awards.
  - (g) The recognition, in lieu of or for the purpose of an examination or educational programme, of examinations passed in any educational institution or any other relevant experience.
  - (h) Fees to be charged for enrolment in classes educational programmes or lectures or for the use of premises equipment facilities or services.
  - (i) The manner and time of convening meetings of the Council and the conduct thereof.
  - (j) The manner and time of convening meetings of the Special Boards of the Council and the conduct thereof, the quorum required for such meetings, and the powers of members of the Special Boards of the Council to appoint alternative members to attend meetings of such Boards in their absence.
  - (k) The association or affiliation with the College of any other bodies institutions or persons.
  - (l) Regulating the access to the College of vehicles persons and animals and the parking and use of vehicles within the grounds of the College.
  - (m) The conduct of elections of members of the Council, the Board of Educational Programmes, the Board of the North Central TAFE Centre, or of committees constituted by the Council.
  - (n) Generally prescribing or providing for any matter or need authorized or directed to be prescribed or provided for by this Order or necessary to be prescribed or provided for the purpose of this Order.
- (2) No motion to make, revoke or amend any Regulations shall be put unless a motion in writing signifying the intention so to move and the nature of the contents of the proposal has been circulated to the members and placed on the official notice board and otherwise as resolved by Council at least fourteen (14) days before the meeting, except that amendments arising out of the debate may be allowed at the discretion of the Council, and all Regulations made by the Council shall be publicly available.

#### *Use of Land and Buildings*

10. (1) The Council may use all land and buildings vested in or under the management and control of the Minister of Education which immediately prior to the commencement of this Order constituted or were contained in the premises of the Bendigo College of Advanced Education and were used entirely by the Technical and Further Education Division thereof, and from time to time any other land or buildings vested in or under the management and control of the Minister which the Minister agrees in writing may be used by the Council either solely for the purpose of the College or jointly with another institution.
- (2) The Council may use all land and buildings which immediately prior to the date of publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* were leased by the council of the Bendigo College of Advanced Education for sole use by the Technical and Further Education Division thereof and the Council shall as soon as practicable after such day consult with the lessors of such land and buildings to obtain an assignment of the leases to the Council.
- (3) In respect of land and buildings (if any) vested in or under the management and control of the Minister of Education which immediately prior to the day of publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* were being used both for the advanced education and Technical and Further Education purposes of the Bendigo College of Advanced Education, the Council shall negotiate with the Council of the Bendigo College of Advanced Education or its successor with the objective of reaching agreement as to which council the control of such land and buildings shall be assigned. Such negotiation shall take into account the source of the funds used in the acquisition of such land and buildings and the purpose of the provision of such funds. If agreement cannot be reached, the extent to which the Council may use such land and buildings shall be determined by the Minister of Education or his nominee.
- (4) All equipment which immediately prior to the commencement of this Order was being used solely by the Technical and Further Education division of the Bendigo College of Advanced Education and was owned by or held in trust for the governing body thereof shall in accordance with sub-section (1) of section 26 of the Act become vested in the Council.
- (5) In respect of equipment which immediately prior to the commencement of this Order was being used both for the advanced education and the technical and further education purposes of the Bendigo College of Advanced Education the Council shall negotiate with the Council of the Bendigo College of Advanced Education or its successor with the objective of reaching agreement as to which Council the control of such equipment shall be assigned. Such negotiations shall take into account the source of the funds used in the acquisition of the equipment and the purpose of the provision of such funds. If agreement cannot be reached, the matter shall be determined by the Minister of Education or his nominee.
- (6) Any other matter pertaining to the ownership management control or use of property which immediately prior to the commencement of this Order was under the ownership management control or use of the council of the Bendigo College of Advanced Education or any committee appointed by the said council shall, subject to the provisions of the Act and of this Order, be the subject of negotiation

between the said council or its successor and the Council with the objective of reaching agreement on the matter. If agreement cannot be reached, the matter shall be determined by the Minister of Education or his nominee.

*Duties of Council*

11. It shall be the duty of the Council to:

- (1) Arrange for the appointment and employment of a Director to be the chief executive officer of the College responsible to the Council for the proper management and control of the College and with such powers and responsibilities as may be determined from time to time by the Council.
- (2) Within procedures laid down by the TAFE Board, do all things as may be required to be done in order to render the College eligible to receive grants under any law of the Commonwealth of Australia or of the State of Victoria or any other body which provides for the making of grants to educational institutions.
- (3) Establish and keep or cause to be kept full and complete books and accounts of all moneys received and paid by the College and arrange for an audit of income and expenditure of the College to be made at such intervals as the Council directs, and submit the accounts annually for audit by the Auditor-General in compliance with section 27 of the Act.
- (4) Keep or cause to be kept a proper record of the proceedings and decisions of the Council.
- (5) As soon as practicable after 31 March in each year report the proceedings of the College and the audited accounts for the year ended on 31 December then last past to the Minister of Education, the Commission and the TAFE Board.

*Transitional Provisions*

12. In compliance with paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of section 26 of the Act, the Council shall as from the day of commencement of this Order assume all liabilities and obligations of the governing body of the Technical and Further Education Division of the Bendigo College of Advanced Education to all members of the Technical and Further Education teaching staff employed therein, and all members of the general staff employed therein under Technical and Further Education terms and conditions or other recognised awards immediately prior to that day, employing such members of staff on and after that day on terms and conditions of employment which, until an applicable determination is made by the Post-Secondary Education Remuneration Tribunal or other appropriate arbitral body, shall be identical with those enjoyed by such persons immediately prior to that day. The Council may appoint any such member of staff to any position it thinks fit provided that as far as practicable the level of responsibility of such position and the salary and other allowances payable in respect thereof shall be not inferior to those held by and payable to such member of staff immediately prior to the day of publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette*. In the event that any member of the teaching staff or of the general staff was immediately prior to the commencement of this Order employed on duties concerned jointly with the Advanced Education and Technical and Further Education Divisions of the Bendigo College of Advanced Education his employment as from the day of commencement of this Order shall be subject to negotiation between the Council and the council of the Bendigo College of Advanced Education or its successor and in the event that agreement cannot be reached the matter shall be determined by the Minister of Education or his nominee.

And the Honourable Robert Fordham, Her Majesty's Minister of Education for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION ACT 1978

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the  
twenty-eighth day of June, 1983*

Present:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria

Whereas sub-section (1) of section 38 of the *Post-Secondary Education Act 1978* provides that the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Victorian Post-Secondary Education Commission may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confer upon the governing body of a post-secondary education institution the power to award a degree or diploma specified in the Order.

And whereas sub-section (2) of section 38 of the said Act provides that the Governor in Council may in an Order under sub-section (1) make the power to award a specified degree or diploma subject to such terms and conditions as he thinks fit.

And whereas sub-section (3) of section 38 of the said Act provides that the Governor in Council shall not make an Order under this section unless he has received from the Commission a certificate to the effect that the courses of study which lead to the degree are comparable in standard to those which lead to the award of a degree at a university.

And whereas the Victorian Post-Secondary Education Commission recommends that each institution specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto be given power to award the degree specified in relation to that institution in column 2 of the said Schedule, subject to the condition that the institution does not award the degree to any person whose name is not specified in relation to that degree and that institution in column 3 of the said Schedule.

And whereas the Victorian Post-Secondary Education Commission has certified that the courses of study undertaken by the persons specified in column 3 of the Schedule are comparable in standard to those which lead to the award of a degree at a university.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and on the recommendation of the Post-Secondary Education Commission doth by this Order confer upon the governing body of each institution specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto power to award the degree specified in relation to that institution subject to the condition that the institution does not award the degree to any person whose name is not specified in relation to that degree and that institution in column 3 of the said Schedule.

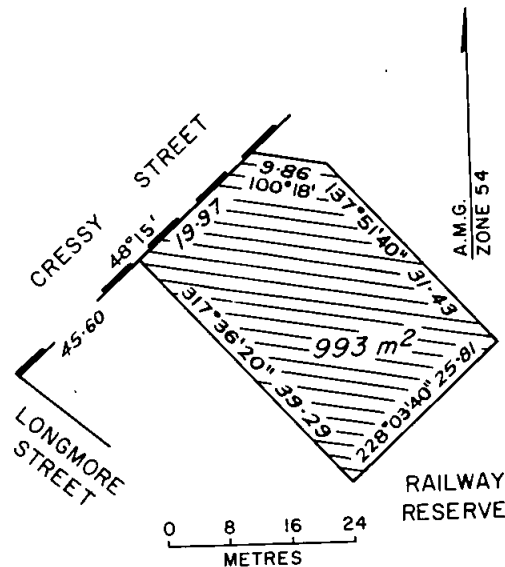

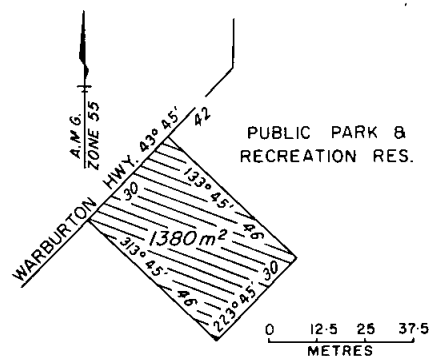

#### REGULATIONS

##### CONSERVATION OF AN AREA OF NATURAL INTEREST RESERVE — PARISH OF YAUGHER

1. Roderick Alexander Mackenzie, Her Majesty's Minister of Lands in and for the State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section 13 of the *Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978* do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the Crown Land in the Parish of Yaugher temporarily reserved for Conservation of an Area of Natural Interest by Order in Council on 21 September 1982 (see *Government Gazette* dated 29 September 1982) such land hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

##### Regulations

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge.
2. No person shall—
  - (a) enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance;
  - (b) carry use or discharge any firearm, air rifle or any other weapon in the Reserve;
  - (c) disturb, interfere with or destroy any animal or bird or its lair or nest in the Reserve;
  - (d) interfere with, mark, deface or damage any buildings, gates, fences, barriers, seats, signs or any other improvement in the Reserve;
  - (e) leave or deposit any glass, bottle, tin, can, waste paper refuse or any other rubbish except in receptacles provided for the purpose in the Reserve;
  - (f) erect buildings, nor sell or offer to sell or hire any article or commodity while on the Reserve or from any building thereon;
  - (g) permit any dog to be in the Reserve unless such dog is at all times controlled by a chain, cord or leash.
3. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Secretary for Lands—
  - (a) interfere with, mark, deface, pick or injure any trees, shrub, flower, plant or any other vegetation within the Reserve;
  - (b) remove any soil, sand, gravel or rock from the Reserve;
  - (c) light or cause to be lit any fire in the Reserve except in any properly constructed fireplace provided for that purpose;
  - (d) drive any vehicle off any formed road or parking area provided within the reserve or in contravention of any authorised sign therein;
  - (e) put or allow to remain in the Reserve any sheep, horses, cattle, pigs or other animals except as hereinbefore provided;
  - (f) organise or take part in any public entertainment, game or sport in the Reserve;
  - (g) camp on the Reserve — (Rs.12045).

**CITY OF CROYDON**

By-Law No. 57

*Incinerators and Fires*

A By-Law of the City of Croydon made under Sections 197 and 198 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 57 for the purpose of:

- (a) preventing and extinguishing fires, and
- (b) suppressing nuisances.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* as amended and every and any other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Croydon order as follows:

1. By-Law numbered 50 of the City of Croydon is hereby repealed.

2. This By-Law shall be cited as the Incinerators and Fires By-Law and shall come into operation on the day after the date upon which Notice of its making is published in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

3. This By-Law shall have full force and effect and operate throughout the whole of the Municipal District.

4. In this By-Law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:

“Authorised Officer” means any officer appointed by the Council for the purpose of enforcing the By-Laws of the City of Croydon.

“Council” means the Council of the Municipal District of the City of Croydon.

“Dwelling” means any building or portion of a building which is used or intended, adapted or designed for use or living purposes.

“In the Open” means not in an incinerator as defined herein.

“Incinerator” means any structure, device or contraption used or intended, adapted or designed for the purpose of containing a fire to consume any rubbish, waste or any other matter, material or substance.

“Municipal District” means the Municipal District of the City of Croydon.

5. In the interpretation of this By-Law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed to include the feminine and the neuter gender and words referring to the singular number shall include the plural and the singular and the word person shall include a corporation.

6. (1) No person shall light, cause, permit or suffer to be lit a fire on any land in the open:

(a) when it is unsafe to do so, or

(b) which causes a nuisance to any person residing in the neighbourhood of such land.

(2) Where a fire has been lit in the open and it becomes unsafe or causes a nuisance to any person residing in the neighbourhood of such land, then the person responsible for having lit such fire or the owner or occupier of the property on which the fire was lit shall take all steps which are necessary to ensure the immediate extinguishment of the fire.

(3) If at any time following the lighting of a fire in the open an authorised officer forms the opinion that such fire:

(a) has become unsafe or is likely to become unsafe, or

(b) is causing or is likely to cause a nuisance to any person residing in the neighbourhood of the fire:

he may take all such steps as he considers are necessary to ensure the extinguishment of the fire, including directing the person responsible for the lighting of the fire, or the owner or occupier of the land on which the fire is situated, or the person who appears to the authorised officer to be in charge of such land, to carry out any such measures or steps which appear necessary to the authorised officer to extinguish the fire.

(4) Any person failing to obey any directions given by an authorised officer acting pursuant to the provisions of sub-clause (3) hereof shall be guilty of an offence against this By-Law.

7. No person shall use, cause, permit or suffer to be used any incinerator to burn any matter, materials or substance on any land on a Sunday and a Monday, or between the hours of 4 o'clock in the afternoon and 10 o'clock in the forenoon on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

8. No person shall burn or cause, permit or suffer to be burnt on any land any matter, material or substance which causes a nuisance by the emission of fumes, smoke, ash, soot, flames, odours or any other substance or thing.

9. (1) No person shall use, cause, permit or suffer to be used for burning of any matter, material or substance on any land an incinerator unless the combustion chamber of which is constructed of concrete, steel, brick or a combination of the aforesaid materials or other durable materials approved by the Council fabricated, mortared together or loosely assembled.

(2) Every incinerator shall be so constructed or covered so as to prevent the emission of sparks or burning material or the spread of fire therefrom.

10. No person shall use, cause, permit or suffer to be used any incinerator to burn any matter, material or substance unless such incinerator is constructed or covered in such a manner so as to prevent the emission of sparks or burning material or the spread of fire therefrom.

11. No person shall use, cause, permit or suffer to be used any incinerator to burn any matter, material or substance on any land unless such incinerator is distant:

- (1) at least 8 metres from the nearest point of any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining land;
- (2) at least 2 metres from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;
- (3) at least 15 metres from the boundary of any street or road to which the land has a frontage; and
- (4) at least 5 metres from the boundary of any side street or road to which the land has a sideage.

12. The provisions of Clause 11 hereof shall not apply where an incinerator is so constructed that it forms part of the wall of a dwelling.

13. Notwithstanding anything contained in this part no provision of this By-Law or any permit granted hereunder shall be construed as giving any person authority to light a fire or burn any matter, material or substance without a permit from the Country Fire Authority during a period, or on a day which is declared to be one of total fire ban under the *Country Fire Authority Act 1958*.

14. Every person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$400.00 and not less than \$10.00 and in the case of a continuing offence, to a penalty of not more than \$10.00 for each day on which the offence against this By-Law is continued after a conviction or Order by any Court.

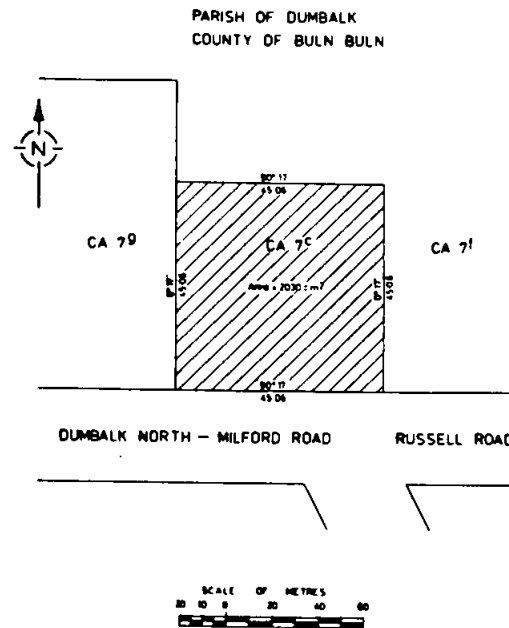
