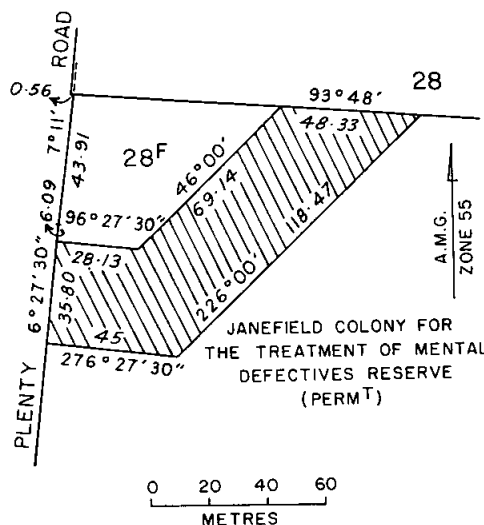

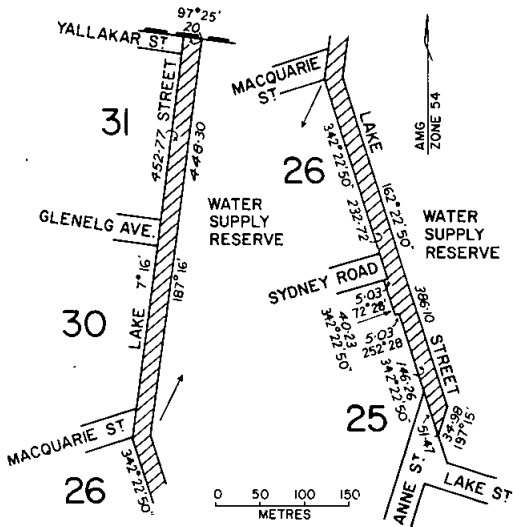

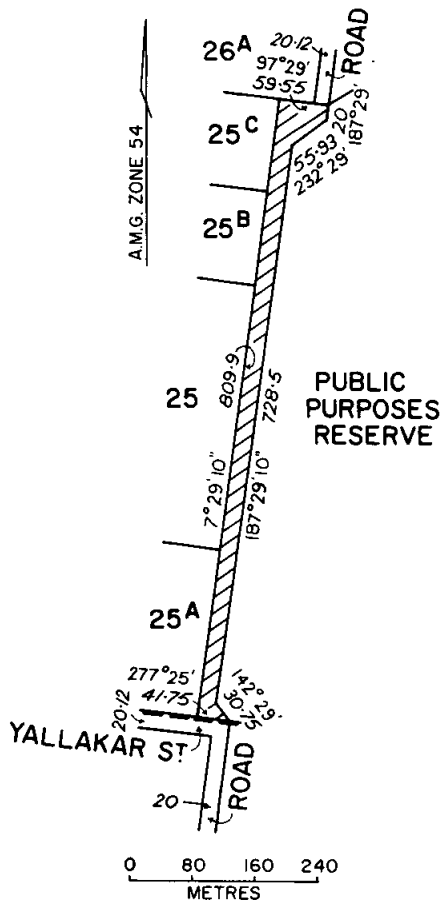

PROHIBITION OF ENTRY INTO SAFETY ZONE —
WHITING — 1 SUBSEA WELL

I, David Ronald White, Minister for Minerals and Energy for the State of Victoria, the Designated Authority in respect of the area specified as being adjacent to the State of Victoria, under the provisions of Section 119 of the Act hereby prohibit from entering into or remaining in, except with my consent in writing, the area of the safety zone described hereunder all vessels other than vessels engaged in or in connexion with petroleum exploration operations or operations for the recovery of petroleum authorised by me in the area concerned.

Description of Area in Safety Zone

The area which extends to a distance of five hundred metres measured from a subsea well known as Whiting situated at or about Latitude 38 deg. 14 mins. 07 secs. south, Longitude 147 deg. 53 mins. 01 sec. east and located by means of a well head marker buoy described hereunder.

Description of Wellhead Marker Buoy

A yellow buoy fitted approximately three metres above the water line with a radar reflector and a solar actuated lantern having a flashing yellow light showing the letter U in Morse Code at intervals of thirty seconds. The buoy is marked "Esso-Hematite".

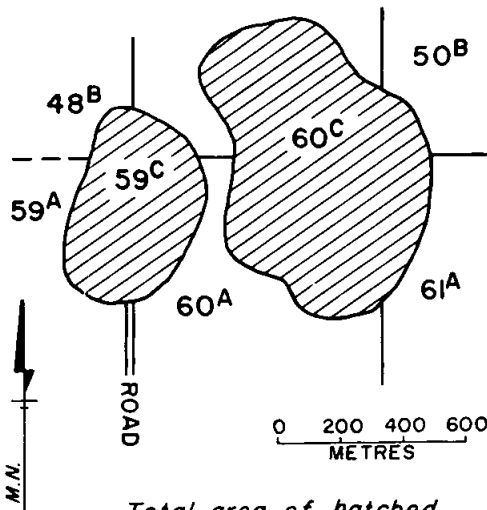

ORDER OF EXEMPTION ISSUED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 80F

Pursuant to the provisions of section 80F of the *Labour and Industry Act 1958*, I, Steven Marshall Crabb, Minister of Labour and Industry, having considered an application from the Council of the City of Moorabbin, hereby make this Order exempting shopkeepers of shops in Centre Road, East Bentleigh between the intersection with Tucker Road and No. 801 and those shops in East Boundary Road within 100 metres of Centre Road which form part of the East Bentleigh Shopping Centre, from being required to close and keep closed their shops during a Community Festival from 12.00 noon until 6.00 p.m. on Saturday 29 October 1983.

This Order does not operate to permit the sale or disposal of liquor within the meaning of the *Liquor Control Act 1968* by any shopkeeper at any time when he would, but for this Order, be required to close and keep closed his shop in accordance with Part VI.

State Electricity Commission Act No. 6377

State Electricity Commission (Amendment) Act 1979, No. 9296

Pursuant to the Sixth Schedule of the *State Electricity Commission Act 1958* as amended, the State Electricity Commission hereby gives notice of the supplementary terms and conditions on which the State Electricity Commission of Victoria supplies electricity to customers who elect to take Standby and Parallel Supplies (Cogeneration) Tariff S or All Purposes Contract Demand (High Voltage) Tariff H. These conditions are in addition to the standard tariff conditions listed in the *Victorian Government Gazette* No. 80 — 17 August 1983 which may be amended from time to time.

STANDBY AND PARALLEL SUPPLIES: HIGH VOLTAGE SUPPLEMENTARY TARIFF CONDITIONS

1. *General*

1.1 These conditions apply to installations in which all or part of the total electricity requirements are generated from private generation which, subject to the approval by the Supply Authority, is operated in parallel with the Supply Authority System.

1.2 Standby is available only to high voltage customers who take standard contract or maximum demand tariffs (Tariffs H or M respectively) for the normal portion of their supply.

1.3 These conditions, which are supplementary to the Standard Tariff Conditions for Victoria, may be varied by the Supply Authority from time to time.

2. *Definitions*

2.1 Standby supply is one which is required from the Supply Authority for the operation of electrical equipment normally supplied from power plant owned by the customer.

2.2 Maximum Contract Demand (MCD) is the demand in kilowatts negotiated or taken by the customer under the current contract and is the sum of two components, viz—

- The Normal Contract Demand (NCD) which is the demand in kilowatts up to which the standard tariff (Tariff H or Tariff M as appropriate) may apply for both demand and energy quantities.
- The Standby Contract Demand (SCD) is the demand in kilowatts nominated by the customer to be his standby requirement and as agreed by the Supply Authority. Tariff S shall apply to both SCD and to energy quantities which are in excess of NCD. The customer may elect to have the SCD between zero and the MCD provided that the SCD does not exceed the nameplate rating of the customer's installed private generation plant.

3. *Contract Period*

Customers taking supply at voltages from 6.6 kV to 66 kV inclusive, shall enter into a contract to take supply on the tariff for a minimum period of five years. Special contractual conditions apply for 220 kV supplies.

4. *Changes to Contract Demands*

The Contract Demands are established by negotiation between the customer and the Supply Authority. They may be changed by subsequent re-negotiation, or by the metered maximum demand in a month exceeding the Maximum Contract Demand. In either event, unless a higher MCD is subsequently established, or unless special exemptions apply as detailed in Item 4.2 (b) below, a MCD shall apply for a period of not less than 12 months.

A customer first taking supply under these conditions will be allowed three months operational experience before selecting firm Contract Demand quantities to apply for the following 12 months. Within this three-month period, the customer may modify his Contract Demand quantities after each month's operation, but such modification shall take effect on supply received following the next meter reading after request for such modification.

Any increase in MCD will be subject to the necessary capacity being available in the Supply Authority System.

4.1 *Negotiated Changes*

Where a customer requires an increase in the MCD, written advice should be lodged with the Supply Authority at the earliest opportunity to enable, if required, augmentation of the supply system.

Where a customer requires a reduction in the MCD or a change to NCD or SCD, 12 months written notice shall be given to the Supply Authority. Such changes shall apply to supply provided after the meter reading date first following the expiration of the 12 months' notice.

Any reduction in MCD shall be conditional upon such reduced MCD being not exceeded for 12 months following its application. Any MCD recorded within the 12 months' period which exceeds such reduced MCD shall become the MCD retrospectively for the full period.

4.2 *Changes Following MCD being Exceeded*

In the event that a new MCD is established by the recording of a higher demand, the following shall apply:

- (a) A corresponding increase shall apply to the Normal Contract Demand.
- (b) The new MCD shall apply for at least 12 months unless exempted under either of the following circumstances:
 - If it is a fault on the customer's electrical installation which caused a new MCD to be established, the MCD may be reduced back to the previous level after three months provided that the customer can demonstrate to the Supply Authority's satisfaction the cause of the fault and that the fault has been corrected; or
 - Where the capacity of the existing electricity supply system is inadequate to make supply available at a higher rate on a continuous basis. In this case the customer shall be advised that the new MCD would only apply for the month in which it was established, pending augmentation of the supply system and re-negotiation of revised contract demands. The MCD thereafter would be limited to the available capacity, as determined by the Supply Authority, of the existing supply system by suitable load limiting equipment installed by the customer to the satisfaction of the Supply Authority.

5. *Buy Back Provision*

The Supply Authority may purchase energy from private generation at the rates as determined under Tariff S (Buy Back Component). Suitable protection and control equipment shall be installed by the customer to the satisfaction of the Supply Authority to limit the buy back demand to the Buy Back Contract Demand as specified in the Supply Agreement.

6. *Conditions for Parallel Supply*

6.1 A customer may operate generators in parallel with the supply grid with or without standby subject to the following conditions:

- The requirements of SEC Wiring Regulations 1981 are satisfied.
- The technical conditions of parallel operation as required by the Supply Authority are satisfied.

6.2 *Programmed Outages of Units Greater than 50 MW*

A customer taking supply under Tariff S who has individual alternators of 50 MW or greater nameplate rating, will be required to maintain close co-operation with the Commission in matters relating to scheduling of plant maintenance. Details of these requirements will be included in the Supply Contract.

7. *Other Conditions*

7.1 *Normal Contract Demand Component — Tariffs H or M*

Rates for this component are those effective for the standard demand tariff for high voltage supply.

- A customer supplied under Tariff M may select Tariff H or elect to remain on Tariff M.
- A new customer, or customer previously supplied on other than Tariff M, shall be supplied under Tariff H for this component.

7.2 The minimum charge shall be the sum of four charges—

- Minimum demand charge under Tariffs H or M as appropriate (for Tariff H, 1000 kW or NCD whichever is the greater; for Tariff M, 500 kW or 60 per cent of NCD whichever is the greater).
- The product of the Standby Contract Demand and the demand charge under Tariff S.
- The energy charge under Tariffs H or M as appropriate for all energy consumption up to the NCD (or corrected NCD if appropriate).
- The energy charge under Tariff S for all energy in excess of the NCD.

7.3 The prescribed off-peak hours under Tariff S, and Tariff H if applicable, shall be Standard Time except during periods of daylight saving when such times shall be Summer Time.

TARIFF H SUPPLIES

SUPPLEMENTARY TARIFF CONDITIONS

These Conditions which are supplementary to the Standard Tariff Conditions for Victoria may be varied by the Supply Authority from time to time.

1 *Changes to Contract Demand*

The Contract Demand which is established by negotiation between the customer and the Supply Authority may be changed by subsequent renegotiation, or by the metered maximum demand in a month exceeding the Contract Demand. In either event, unless a higher Contract Demand is subsequently established, or unless special exemptions apply as detailed in Item 1.2 below, a Contract Demand shall apply for a period of not less than 12 months.

1.1 *Negotiated Changes*

Where a customer requires an increase in the Contract Demand, written advice should be lodged with the Supply Authority at the earliest opportunity to enable, if required, augmentation of the supply system. An increase in Contract Demand will be subject to capacity being available in the Supply Authority System.

Where a customer requires a reduction in the Contract Demand, 12 months' written notice shall be given to the Supply Authority. Such reduction shall apply to supply provided after the meter reading date first following the expiration of the 12 months' notice.

Any reduction in Contract Demand shall be conditional upon such reduced Contract Demand being not exceeded for 12 months following its application. Any demand recorded within the 12 months' period which exceeds such reduced Contract Demand shall become the Contract Demand retrospectively for the full period.

1.2 *Changes Following Contract Demand Being Exceeded*

In the event that a new Contract Demand is established by recording of a higher demand, the following shall apply:

The new Contract Demand shall apply for at least 12 months unless exempted under either of the following circumstances:

- If it is a fault on the customer's electrical installation which caused a new MCD to be established, the MCD may be reduced back to the previous level after three months provided that the customer can demonstrate to the Supply Authority's satisfaction the cause of the fault and that the fault has been corrected; or
- Where the capacity of the existing electricity supply system is inadequate to make supply available at a higher rate on a continuous basis. In this case the customer shall be advised that the new MCD would only apply for the month in which

it was established, pending augmentation of the supply system and re-negotiation of revised contract demands. The MCD thereafter would be limited to the available capacity, as determined by the Supply Authority, of the existing supply system by suitable load limiting equipment installed by the customer to the satisfaction of the Supply Authority.

2 *Metering Changes*

An existing customer electing to transfer to Tariff H must agree to pay the costs of any necessary metering change.

3 *Multiple Supplies*

Normally, a single high voltage supply should be adequate to satisfy a customer's total needs for electricity on a property. Where, in accordance with Tariff Rulings, multiple supplies are provided to a property, each supply would normally be separately metered and billed under a separate Contract Demand for each supply.

However, where the following conditions apply, combined metering may be offered to enable the application of a coincident Contract Demand to such multiple supplies:

- Where multiple supplies are taken from and metered at a single Supply Authority substation, switch, metering or other single enclosure containing Supply Authority supply terminations. A single enclosure is defined as one which is not separated into two or more parts by customer land or equipment and includes adjacent unenclosed structures displaced by no greater distance than if they were to be in a single enclosure.
- Where multiple supplies are provided to an installation which may be operated as a single interconnected electrical installation.
- The customer must agree to pay all Supply Authority costs in excess of those for a single supply, in particular—

- additional metering costs;
- capital costs of any feeder capacity reserved in excess of the Contract Demand;
- if required by the Supply Authority, the operating and maintenance costs associated with such reserve feeder capacity.

4 *Standard Time*

The times nominated for off-peak rates, notwithstanding the operation of Summer Time, are Standard Time.

However, except in the case of Standby and Parallel Supply customers where special conditions apply, Summer Time may be applied where—

- suitable metering is available to enable Summer Time to be applied without cost to the Supply Authority; or
- where the customer agrees to reimburse the Supply Authority for any changes to the metering to adjust for the Summer Time/Standard Time changeovers.

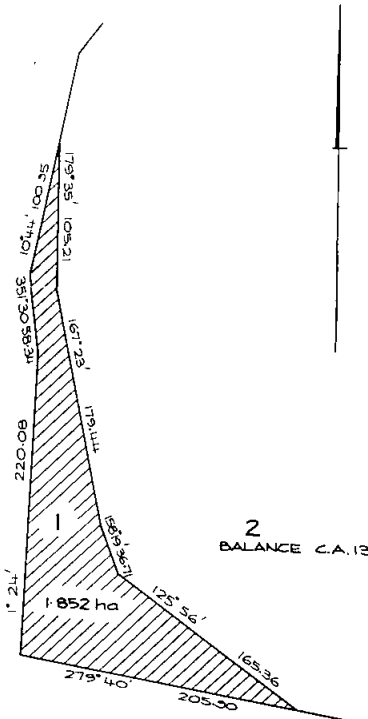
