MOTOR CAR TRIALS OF SPEED WITHIN THE CITY OF SALE

Whereas it is enacted by sub-section (2) of section 83 of the Motor Car Act 1958 that, if a motor car is used in a highway for the purposes of racing or of trial of speed, the driver or the person in charge thereof shall be liable to a penalty of not more than five hundred dollars for the first offence and one thousand dollars for the second offence, provided that the said sub-section (2) shall not apply to a motor car used as aforesaid on any highway or portion thereof specified by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette and on such days and during such hours as are specified in the Order.

And whereas the City of Sale has requested that such an Order be made to enable motor car trials of speed to be conducted by the said City of Sale on 7 October 1984.

Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Motor Car Act 1958 and all other powers him thereunto enabling, doth by this Order specify McIntosh Drive and that part of Foster Street between Elgin and York Streets, within the City of Sale, as a highway in respect of which any motor car may, without being subject to the application of the said Act, be used for purposes of trials of speed under the control of the said City of Sale, on 7 October 1984, between the hours of 1.00 o'clock and 3.00 o'clock in the afternoon, provided that the Officer-in-Charge of Police in attendance is satisfied that the highway is in a satisfactory condition for racing purposes and that adequate arrangements have been made for the safety of the public.

And the Honourable Steven Marshall Crabb, Her Majesty's Minister of Transport for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
