CONSTITUTION ACT 1975
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Whereas it is provided by section 35 of the *Constitution Act 1975* that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* divide any Electoral District of the Legislative Assembly into subdivisions, specify the names and boundaries of subdivisions and alter the name and boundaries of any subdivision and that the subdivisions and the names and boundaries thereof shall be such as are specified in any such Proclamation.

And whereas by a Proclamation made on 29 November 1984, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 3 December 1984, the Electoral Districts of Benalla and Rodney as published in the *Government Gazette* of 13 April 1984, were divided into subdivisions and the names and boundaries thereof were specified as set out in the Schedule to the said Proclamation.

And whereas it is desirable that the said Electoral Districts of Benalla and Rodney shall be divided into subdivisions in some respects differing from the subdivisions named and specified in the Proclamation published as aforesaid in the *Government Gazette* of 3 December 1984.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation divide the Electoral Districts of Benalla and Rodney aforementioned into the subdivisions the names and boundaries of which are specified in connexion therewith in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE**ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF BENALLA****SUBDIVISION OF BENALLA**

Commencing on the Great Dividing Range at the south-eastern angle of the Parish of Koonika; thence northerly and westerly by the eastern and northern boundaries of that parish to the Dandongadale River; thence generally northerly by that river to a point in line with the south-western boundary of allotment 24, Parish of Matong North; thence north-westerly by a line, the south-western boundary of allotment 24, a line, the south-western boundary of allotment 24A and

a line to the Rose River; thence generally north-easterly by that river to the eastern boundary of the Parish of Winteriga; thence generally northerly by that boundary and the eastern boundary of the Parish of Bungamero to the southern boundary of the Parish of Whorouly; thence generally westerly and north-westerly by the southern and western boundaries of that parish to the southern boundary of the Parish of Oxley; thence generally westerly by that boundary and the southern boundary of the Parish of Laceby to the eastern boundary of the Parish of Glenrowan; thence generally southerly, westerly and north-westerly by the eastern, southern and western boundaries of that parish to shore of Lake Mokoan; thence generally south-westerly and north-westerly by the southern and western shores of that lake to the Mokoan Outlet Channel; thence generally westerly by that channel to the Broken River; thence south-easterly by that river and southerly by the eastern boundaries of the Parishes of Goomalibee and Warrenbayne to the southern boundary of the Parish of Kelfeera; thence easterly by the boundary to the western boundary of the Parish of Rothesay; thence southerly and easterly by the western and southern boundaries of that parish to the Holland Creek; thence generally south-easterly by that creek to the northern boundary of the Parish of Dueran East; thence westerly by that boundary to the 40-23 metre road forming the eastern boundary of allotment 13C, section A; thence generally southerly and south-easterly by that road to a road forming the south-eastern boundary of allotment 9; thence north-easterly by that road to a road forming the north-eastern boundary of allotment 24B, section B; thence south-easterly by that road to a road forming the northern and eastern boundaries of allotment 25; thence easterly and southerly by that road to the south-western angle of allotment 8, section C; thence easterly by the southern boundary of that allotment and a line to the King River West Branch; thence south-easterly by a direct line to Mount Howitt on the Great Dividing Range; and thence generally north-easterly by that range to the point of commencement.

SUBDIVISION OF GOULBURN

of that parish to the southern boundary of the Parish of Kelfeera; thence westerly by the southern boundary of that parish to the Benalla-Warrenbayne Road; thence northerly by that road and the eastern boundaries of the parishes of Warrenbayne and Goomalibee to the Broken River; thence generally westerly by that river to a point in line with the road forming the eastern boundary of allotment 17, Parish of Caniambo; thence southerly by a line, that road and Keallys Road to Bells Road; thence westerly by that road to Thorns Road; thence southerly by that road to Cemetery Road; thence westerly by that road to the road forming the western boundary of the Parish of Caniambo; thence southerly by that road to the Murchison-Violet Town Road; thence westerly by that road to the road forming the western boundary of allotment 74, Parish of Molka; thence southerly by that road to the road forming the northern boundary of allotment 81C; thence westerly by that road to the road forming the western boundary of allotment 43A, Parish of Dargalong; thence southerly by that road to the road forming the northern boundary of allotment 25B; thence westerly by that road and a line in continuation to the Goulburn River; thence generally westerly and southerly by that river to the road forming the south-western boundary of allotment 1240A, Parish of Noorilim; thence north-westerly by that road to the northern boundary of that parish; thence south-westerly and westerly by that boundary and generally westerly by the northern boundaries of the Parishes of Bailieston and Wirrate and southerly by the western boundary of the last named parish to the southern boundary of the County of Rodney; thence generally south-westerly by that boundary to the eastern boundary of the Parish of Costerfield; thence generally south-easterly by that boundary to Splitters Creek; thence generally south-easterly by that creek, and generally easterly by Wappentake Creek to Major Creek; thence generally southerly by that creek to the northern boundary of the Parish of Warrowitue; thence generally easterly by that boundary and the northern boundary of the Parish of Puckapunyal and generally southerly by the eastern boundary of the last named parish to the south-western angle of allotment 5A, section C, Parish of Northwood; thence southerly by a line to the northern boundary of allotment 4; thence easterly by the northern boundary of that allotment, the northern boundary of allotment 4B and the northern boundary of allotment 4 again, and southerly by the eastern boundaries of allotments 4 and 4A to the south-eastern angle of allotment 4A; thence westerly by the southern boundary of that allotment and north-westerly by the south-western boundary of allotment 12B, section A, Parish of Puckapunyal to a point in line with the north-western boundary of allotment 12A; thence south-westerly by a line and the north-western boundary of allotment 12A to the northern boundary of the Shire of Pyalong; thence easterly by that boundary and southerly by the eastern boundary of that shire to the south-eastern angle of allotment 23; thence westerly by the southern boundary of that allotment to the north-western angle of allotment 24; thence southerly by the western boundary of that allotment to the road forming the southern boundary of the said allotment; thence easterly by that road to the road forming the western boundary of allotment 27A; thence southerly by that road and easterly by the road forming the southern boundary of

that allotment to the eastern boundary of the Shire of Pyalong; thence generally southerly by that boundary to the northern boundary of the Shire of Broadford; thence easterly by that shire boundary to Dabyminga Creek; thence generally south-easterly by that creek to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 13, section D, Parish of Kerrisdale; thence easterly by a line, the northern boundary of allotment 13, a line and the southern boundary of allotment 10 and northerly by the eastern boundary of the last mentioned allotment to the southern boundary of allotment 10C; thence easterly by that boundary and northerly and westerly by the eastern and northern boundaries of that allotment to the northern boundary of the Parish of Kerrisdale; thence northerly and generally easterly and south-easterly by that parish boundary to the western boundary of the Parish of Windham; thence generally northerly by that boundary to the Goulburn Valley Highway; thence generally south-easterly by that highway to the King Parrot Creek; thence generally south-westerly and south-easterly by that creek to a point in line with the road forming the northern boundary of allotment 113A, Parish of Windham; thence easterly by a line, the road forming the northern boundary of allotment 113A, a line, and generally easterly by the road forming the northern boundary of allotment 113B, and northerly by the road forming the eastern boundary of allotment 112A to the road forming the northern boundary of allotment 112C; thence easterly and generally south-easterly by that road to the northern boundary of allotment 256, Parish of Yea; thence easterly by that boundary and southerly by the eastern boundary of that allotment to the southern boundary of allotment 255; thence easterly by that boundary to the road forming the south-western boundary of allotment 196; thence south-easterly by that road to the Whittlesea-Yea Road; thence generally easterly by that road to the road forming the eastern boundary of allotment 212E; thence generally south-easterly by that road to Ti Tree Creek; thence generally by that creek and northerly by the Yea River to the Murrindindi River; thence generally south-easterly by that river to a point in line with the northern boundary of allotment 5B, Parish of Murrindindi; thence easterly by a line, the northern boundaries of allotments 5B and 5A, a line, the northern boundary of allotment 5 and the northern boundary of allotment 37, section A, and southerly by the eastern boundary of the last mentioned allotment to the road forming the northern boundary of allotment 41; thence north-easterly by that road to the south-western angle of allotment 40; thence easterly by the southern boundary of that allotment, the southern boundary of allotment 40A and a line in continuation to the summit of the range forming the watershed between the Acheron River and the Murrindindi River; thence generally southerly by that watershed to the southern boundary of the Parish of Glendale; thence easterly by that boundary and southerly by the Acheron River to the southern boundary of the Parish of Taggerty; thence north-easterly, south-easterly and easterly by the southern boundary of the Parish of Taggerty to the south-eastern angle of allotment 26; thence south-easterly by a direct line to Mount Arnold on the Great Dividing Range; and thence generally south-easterly, easterly and north-easterly by that range to the point of commencement.

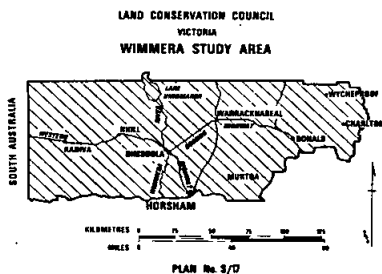

1. This By-Law shall be known as the Shire of Eltham Building By-Law.

2. This By-Law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district for the Shire of Eltham.

3. This By-Law shall be read and construed subject to the *Local Government Act 1958*, the *Building Control Act 1981* and the Victoria Building Regulations 1983 and not so as to exceed the by-law making power of the municipality to the extent that where any clause of this by-law would, but for this clause, have been construed as being in excess of that power, it shall nevertheless be intended to continue to be a valid enactment to the extent to which it is not in excess of that power.

Part II—Definition

4. In this by-law inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:

- (a) words appearing herein shall have the same respective meanings as in the *Building Control Act 1981* and the *Victoria Building Regulations 1983* by virtue of the definitions appearing therein:

"regulations" means the *Victoria Building Regulations 1983*.

Part III—Building Control

5. (a) The minimum setback of an external wall of a Class I or X building from the frontage of the allotment upon which such building is sited, is hereby prescribed as 6.00 metres.

(b) The minimum setback of an external wall of a Class I or X building from any other street alignment, other than the frontage, upon which such building is sited, is hereby prescribed as 3.00 metres.

(c) The minimum setback of an external wall of a Class I or X building from any other boundary, other than a street alignment, upon which such building is sited, is hereby prescribed as 1.800 metres.

(d) Subject to sub-clause (a) hereof, Column 5 of Table 11.6 of the Regulations is hereby adopted as the minimum requirements applying to an allotment and the siting of any Class I, II or X building thereon.

6. Subject to Regulation 11.9 of the Regulations, the number of Class Ia buildings constructed on an allotment shall not exceed two unless the Council shall have so consented.

7. The number of Class Xa buildings constructed on an allotment shall not exceed one unless the Council shall have so consented.

Part IV—Enforcement

8. For the purposes of Clauses 5, 6 and 7 hereof, "council" shall include any person to whom the exercise of the relevant power of consent has been delegated by the Council either specifically or generally and pursuant to power to so delegate pursuant to the *Local Government Act 1958*, the *Building Control Act 1981* or the Regulations.

9. Any person who:

- (a) does or causes to be done any act prohibited by or under this by-law; or
(b) fails to do any act required pursuant to this by-law;

shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

Resolution for making and passing this By-Law was agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Eltham on 10 December 1984 and confirmed on 4 February 1985.
