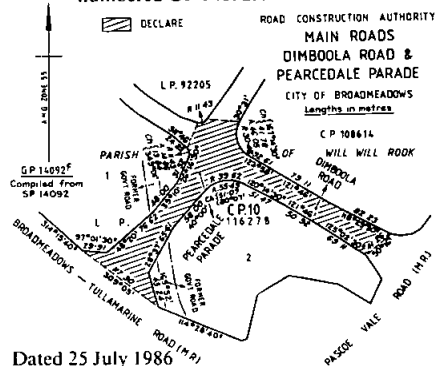

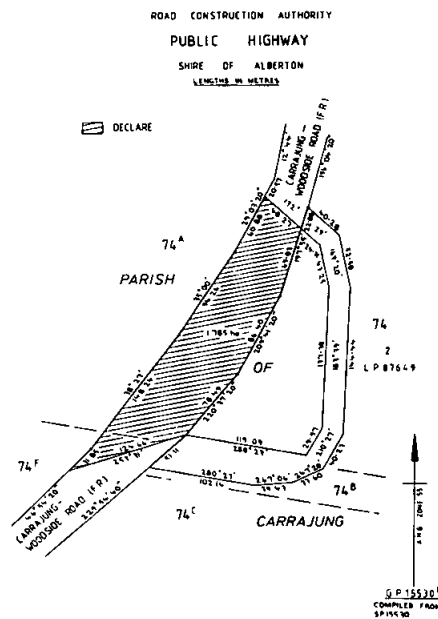

Reasons for the Proposed Regulations

The *Adoption Act* 1984 provides for fees to be charged by an agency arranging inter-country adoptions. The proposed regulations are to be made to prescribe the level of fees that can be charged.

The proposed regulations replace the Adoption (Inter-country Adoption Fees) Regulations 1986 made in February 1986.

Objectives of the Regulations

To prescribe fees for assessment of persons applying to adopt a child from overseas.

To prescribe fees for supervision of overseas children placed in Victoria with persons assessed as suitable to adopt.

Results of Regulatory Impact Statement

The regulatory impact statement examines two alternatives:

making the regulations so that inter-country adoption services can be provided on a fee-for-service basis;

not making the regulations and providing inter-country adoption services on a government funded basis.

The fee-for-service option is assessed as being able to provide substantially reduced waiting periods for assessment and adequate and accessible post-placement supervision.

Although these benefits are at a significant cost to those wishing to adopt they outweigh the delays associated with the government funded option.

(b) the goods are intended for use in connection with that farming undertaking.

(2) In sub-clause (1) "goods" means—

(a) a commercial vehicle; or

(b) farm machinery.

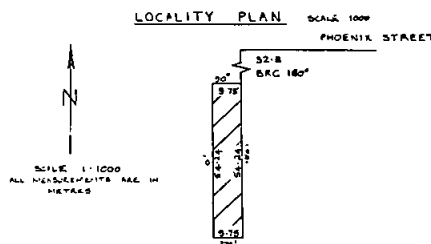

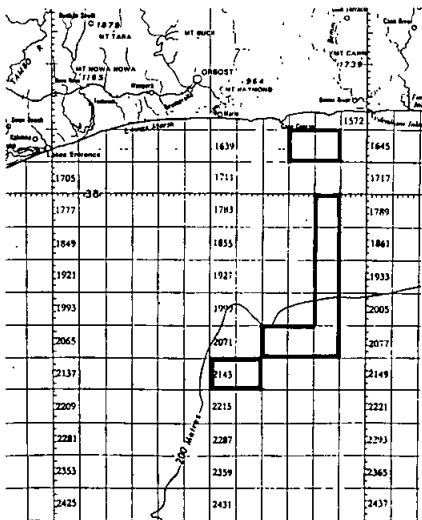

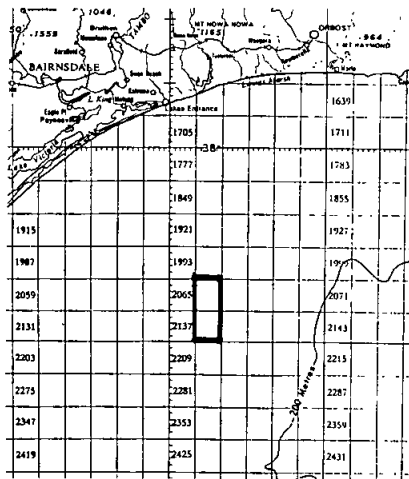
