ALLOWANCES FOR POSTAL VOTING OFFICERS IN OTHER AUSTRALIAN STATES AND LONDON

The Governor in Council, under section 315 of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1958* authorises and directs that each of the Commonwealth Divisional Returning Officers in states other than Victoria, who acts as a Victorian Postal Voting Officer, be paid an allowance of \$106 and that an amount of \$1.06 be paid to each Divisional Returning Officer, or his or her assistants, for each postal vote application dealt with or each postal vote issued at his or her Office.

It is further authorised and directed that the Postal Voting Officer at the Office of the Agent-General in London be paid an annual retainer of \$545.

and other materials at a Returning Officer's office, after polling day (payment to be at the rate of \$11.00 per hour, in addition to payment for use of car at the rate of 47-00 cents per kilometre. Provided that in respect of any such duty performed on the Sunday after polling day, payment shall be at the rate of \$22.00 per hour);

- (c) to assist the Returning Officer after polling day with the sorting of absent votes, and postal votes for other electorates, and the preparation of parcels of such votes for despatch to other Returning Officers (payment to be at the rate of \$11.00 per hour. Provided that in respect of any such duty performed on the Sunday after polling day, payment shall be at the rate of \$22.00 per hour).

8. Travelling Expenses—

To a Returning Officer, a Substitute Returning Officer, a polling official (including an Electoral Visitor and an Electoral Visitor's Assistant) and to a Special Messenger (with prior approval of Chief Electoral Officer)—only where indispensably necessary, the actual expense incurred.

In all the above cases, where the travelling can be done by railway or by road service the actual fares only.

Provided that the cost of travelling shall not in any case exceed 47 cents per kilometre each way, the number of kilometres travelled to be specified on each account.

Where a person is engaged by a Returning Officer to act as a Special Messenger on polling day, payment shall be at the rate of \$13.00 per hour plus payment for use of his/her car at the rate of 47-00 cents per kilometre.

In any instance where a Returning Officer, or Substitute Returning Officer, travels a distance exceeding 130 kilometres in his/her official capacity at the direction of, or with the approval of, the Chief Electoral Officer, he/she shall be paid reimbursement of his/her expenses at the appropriate rates prescribed by the Public Service Board.

9. Hire or Erection of Booths and the Transport of Materials—

The actual cost as proved by vouchers.

When a poll is taken in any school-house or building not used exclusively for religious services, and which is supported wholly or in part by any public funds or by any perpetual endowment or which has been built or is supported wholly or in part by any grant from the public revenue, the actual cost of erection of the "compartments" and the cost of cleaning only will be allowed.

In Metropolitan and Urban Districts, whenever it is necessary to engage a contractor to transport voting screens and ballot-boxes or to erect voting screens, a quotation should be obtained from a reliable contractor if the original quotation is considered excessive in price or otherwise unsatisfactory.

If a Relieving Deputy Returning Officer (or Deputy Returning Officer) has agreed to erect voting screens or supervise their erection by some other person, payment to that officer shall be at the rate of \$13.00 per hour.

10. Electoral Visitors—

Persons appointed to take votes at special hospitals.

(a) Office assistance before close of poll—

A person, or persons, may be employed by a Returning Officer to assist with clerical duties, or the answering of enquiries, in an Assembly Returning Officer's Office before polling day and up to the close of the poll at the rate of \$10.50 per hour. Employment before the close of nominations to be subject to approval by the Chief Electoral Officer.

The maximum number of hours for which payment will be authorised in respect of the Assembly Returning Officer's Office is 200 hours of which at least 100 hours must be between the hours of 8.30 am and 5 pm on weekdays between the close of nominations and polling day for the election.

(b) Preparation of income tax group certificates, statements of earnings and accounts records—

Persons preparing income tax group certificates and statements of earnings for issue to election officials employed by an Assembly Returning Officer and assisting with the preparation of accounts records shall be paid at the rate of \$10.50 per hour for a total period not exceeding a maximum of 80 hours in respect of an Electoral District.

(c) To a Returning Officer for an Electoral District of the Legislative Assembly, or proportionately to such persons as may be nominated by the Returning Officer and at the amounts determined by him—
