ALPINE NATIONAL PARK—HUNTING OF DEER BY STALKING

I, Donald Sydney Saunders, Director of National Parks and Wildlife, under section 37 (3) of the National Parks Act 1975, authorise any person who is the holder of a current shooters licence and an authority to hunt to carry and use a firearm and the holder of a current bow hunter's licence to carry and use a bow in the Alpine National Park during the period 15 February to 15 December inclusive each year for the purpose of hunting Sambar Deer by stalking.

Authorisation is subject to the following conditions and restrictions:


- (1) Only firearms, ammunition and bows as defined in the Wildlife (Game) Regulations 1976 No. 2 as suitable for hunting Sambar Deer are permitted.
 - (2) Discharge of a firearm for any purpose other than Sambar Deer hunting is not permitted.
 - (3) The use of dogs is not permitted.
 - (4) Firearms must be kept unloaded within 100m of any camping or picnic area.
 - (5) The carrying and use of spotlights is not permitted for hunting purposes.
- (6) Within the Alpine National Park, hunting hounds are permitted to be carried or transported in vehicles en route to areas outside the park on the following roads:

Tamboritha Road, which will allow access to the Bennison Plains Road (not in the Park) and tracks in the adjacent State Forest.

Cobbler Lake Road to the intersection with Little Cobbler Track, and Little Cobbler Track, which will allow access to the Rose River area.

Such other roads and tracks as the Director of National Parks and Wildlife approves from time to time.

(7) Hunting may only take place in areas in which hunting by stalking is permitted. These areas are shown on the accompanying map.
