11. After Rule 9 of the Principal Rules insert the heading—"Conflict of Interests".

12. After Rule 11 of the Principal Rules insert—
"Communication

12. (1) It is a solicitor's duty to communicate effectively and promptly with the solicitor's clients.

(2) Without limiting sub-rule (1), where the client is a natural person the solicitor shall unless it is inappropriate to do so—

(a) as soon as practicable after first taking instructions from a client, provide to the client written advice of the reasonably estimated costs and disbursements or the method of calculation of those costs;

(b) provide to the client prior to the settlement of a litigious matter negotiated by the solicitor written advice of the minimum net amount that the client will receive should the matter be settled in accordance with the proposed settlement;

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(c) as soon as practicable after taking instructions, inform the client of any rights the client may have to apply for legal aid unless there is no real possibility that the client is eligible to receive legal aid.

(3) Nothing in sub-rule (2) (a) shall oblige a solicitor to provide the required advice if the solicitor has previously provided that written advice to the client."

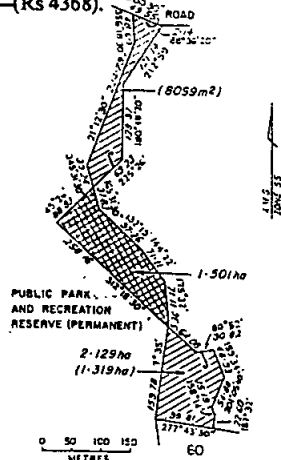

Water Rating By-Law for the Year 1989-90

Water Supply By-Law No. 11

The Municipal Council of the City of Warrnambool in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1958*, hereby makes a By-Law as follows:

1. This By-Law shall have effect as from the commencement of the meter year for the financial year commencing on 1 October 1989.

2. The meter or meters measuring the supply of water to any land or tenement shall be read as near as practicable to twelve months from the date that it was read previously and the quantity of water so measured as having been supplied during the period between any two successive such readings (hereinafter called the "meter year") shall be the basis of the calculating of charges payable under this By-Law provided always that where a meter has been measured as having been supplied during the period between

the date of such installation and the date of the reading shall be the basis of calculating such charges.

3. Subject as is hereinafter provided in respect of any land or tenement by the Council—

(a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any meter year without charge is hereby fixed as a quantity which, if charged at 64 cents per kilolitre for any meter year, would give an amount equal to the amount of the rate payable in respect of the land or tenement for the financial year in which the said meter year ended.

(b) For all water supplied in any meter year in excess of the maximum quantity referred to in paragraph (a) of this clause, the charge is hereby fixed at 64 cents per kilolitre for any meter year.

4. Subject as is hereinafter provided, the charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the council is hereby fixed at 64 cents per kilolitre.

5. The minimum charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Council is hereby fixed at \$140.

6. The aforesaid charges shall be payable within seven (7) days of demand upon the owner or occupier of any property, at the office of the Council during normal business hours.

7. The provisions of clauses 3, 4 and 5 of this By-Law shall not apply to any land tenement or property supplied with water by the Council under a special agreement pursuant to section 215 of the *Water Act 1958*.
