PROCLAMATIONS

Agricultural Chemicals Act 1958 PROCLAMATION

Prescribing Certain Organochlorine Insecticides to be Prohibited

Constituents of Agricultural Chemicals Used or Intended to be Used for Prescribed Purposes

- I, J. Davis McCaughey, Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council and under sections 6A and 10A of the Agricultural Chemicals Act 1958:
- 1. Revoke the Proclamation made on 11 April 1989 and published in the Government Gazette on 12 April 1989.
- 2. Amend the Proclamation made on 20 January 1987 and published in the Government Gazette on 21 January 1987 as amended by proclamations made on 28 July 1987, 29 November 1988, 30 May 1989 and 8 November 1989 and published respectively in the Government Gazette on 29 July 1987, 30 November 1988, 31 May 1989 and 8 November 1989 by deleting items 2, 6, 13 and 15 of the Proclamation made on 20 January 1987.
- 3. Revoke paragraph 3 of the Proclamation made on 28 July 1987 and published in the Government Gazette on 29 July 1987.
- 4. Define the following terms used in this Proclamation:
 - "farm land" means a property which is used wholly or mainly for the purpose of growing stock or crops, viticulture, horticulture or fruit growing.
 - "residential premises" means any building or part of a building used as or for the purposes of a private residence or residential flat and any outbuilding used in connection with those premises.
- 5. Prescribe the substances specified in column 1 of each item in the Schedule to be a prohibited constituent of any agricultural chemical used or intended to be used for any of the purposes set out in column 2 of that item provided that—
 - (a) where the substance is present in an agricultural chemical as an impurity or a contaminant and a standard has been prescribed for that chemical by proclamation under section 4 of the Act and a maximum level for the substance has been set in that standard, that substance is not prohibited by reason of this Proclamation;
 - (b) where an agricultural chemical is being used for a scientific experiment carried out by a person who has been issued with a permit under section 10B of the Act, that

substance is not prohibited by reason of this Proclamation.

As an agricultural chemical for any use except as an insecticide used by a licensed pest control operator against subterranean termites—

- (i) on farm land applied to soil under a slab floor during construction of a building to be used solely for residential purposes;
- (ii) on land other than farm land applied to soil to provide vertical or horizontal barriers for buildings during construction or existing buildings other than buildings used or intended to be used for housing animals or processing or storage of animal feed.

2. Chlordane

As an agricultural chemical for any use except by a licensed pest control operator—

- (a) as an insecticide against subterranean termites—
 - (i) on farm land applied to soil under a slab floor during construction of a building to be used solely for residential purposes; and
 - (ii) on land other than farm land applied to soil to provide vertical or horizontal barriers for buildings during construction or existing buildings other than buildings used or intended to be used for housing animals

or processing or storage of animal feed:

- (b) as an insecticide against wood boring insects that is incorporated in the glue line treatment of plywood for use in the construction and repair of shipping containers.
- 3. Dieldrin

4. Heptachlor

As an agricultural chemical.

- (i) on farm land applied to soil under a slab floor during construction of a building to be used solely for residential purposes; and

5. Lindane

Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958 PROCLAMATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF PREVENTING THE SPREAD OF THE ELM LEAF BEETLE PYRRHALTA LUTEOLA

- I, J. Davis McCaughey, Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council and under section 5A of the Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958-
- 1. Declare that there is danger of a plague of the parasite Pyrrhalta luteola (Elm Leaf Beetle) in the Mornington Peninsula region of Victoria.
- 2. Require every occupier or owner of land to give notice of the presence of the parasite Pyrrhalta luteola (Elm Leaf Beetle) on the land of which he is the occupier or owner to the Chief

General Manager of the Department of Agriculture and Rural Affairs immediately the occupier or owner becomes aware that the parasite Pyrrhalta luteola (Elm Leaf Beetle) is present on the land of which he is the occupier or owner giving the following particulars-

- (a) name of the occupier or owner;
- (b) address of the occupier or owner.
- (c) telephone number of the occupier or owner:
- (d) location of the area or areas where the parasite is present.
- 3. Require every occupier or owner of land where the parasite Pyrrhalta luteola (Elm Leaf Beetle) is present to take the action specified by the Chief General Manager of the Department of Agriculture and Rural Affairs for the control, destruction or prevention of the spread of Pyrrhalta luteola (Elm Leaf Beetle) on the property.



Environment Effects Act 1978

ENVIRONMENT EFFECTS STATEMENT

VIC ROADS has been investigating the location and form of the Western Bypass, a road link between Tullamarine Freeway and Footscray Road, and has prepared an Environment Effects Statement (EES). The project will improve road access at the western end of the Central Activities District and will link major radial routes including Tullamarine Freeway, Flemington Road, Mt Alexander Road, Dynon Road and Footscray Road.

- The recommended alignment for the Western Bypass proposal provides a new road link, closely following the Moonee Ponds Creek, extending from the Tullamarine Freeway to Footstray Road.
- From the Tullamarine Freeway the alignment enters a tunnel from Mt Alexander Road to Racecourse Road.
- South of Racecourse Road the alignment occupies the Upfield rail reserve and returns to ground level between Alfred and Sutton Streets.
- From Mark Street the alignment rises up on structure to pass over Macaulay Road, Arden Street, Dynon Road and the railways.
- Access to the Bypass would be provided at Racecourse Road, Dynon Road and Footscray Road.

PORT OF MELBOURNE PLANNING SCHEME - AMENDMENT L2

The Minister for Planning and Environment has prepared the above amendments to the Planning Schemes, which provide for the future construction of the Western Bypass between Tullamarine Freeway and Footscray Road.

The amendments are:

- a new road reservation from the southern terminal of Tullarnarine Freeway to Pootseray Road including the deletion of part of the Upfield rail line south of Flemington Road
- rezonings of land in the vicinity of the Western Bypass including the deletion of road reservations made redundant by this proposal.





REGULATIONS

Olinda Gold Course Reserve

I, Kay Setches, Her Majesty's Minister for Conservation, Forests and Lands in and for the

Victoria Government Gazette

State of Victoria, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 13 of the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978 do hereby make the following Regulations for or with respect to the area of land in the Parish of Monbulk, temporarily reserved for Public Recreation by Order in Council of 28 November 1989 (vide Government Gazette dated 29 November 1989 herein known as the "Reserve".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

Regulations

- 1. For the purpose of these Regulations—
 "Act" means the Crown Land (Reserves) Act
- "Appointed Officer" means a person specially authorised in writing by the Committee for the purposes of these Regulations and (except for the purpose of receipt of any fees or the grant, variation or revocation of any permit) also includes any member of the Police Force and any person appointed or deemed to be appointed under section 83 of the Conservation, Forests and Lands Act 1987.

"Firearm" includes any rifle, gun, pistol, air pistol or airgun, bow and arrow, catapult or any other implement designed to discharge missiles capable of injuring, damaging or destroying any person, animal or thing.

"Golf Course" means the land set aside by the Committee for the purpose of playing golf.

"Lessee" means a person who in respect of land within the reserve holds a lease granted under the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978.

"Licensee" means a person who in respect of land within the reserve holds a licence under the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978.

"Litter" includes any bottle, carton, package, paper, glass, food, offal animal carcass or other refuse or rubbish.

"Permit" includes any authority, approval, consent, permission, receipt, ticket or the like given, granted or issued under these Regulations.

- "Regional Manager" means the Regional Manager of the Dandenong Region of the Department of Conservation, Forests and Lands whose office is at 205 Thomas Street, Dandenong.
- 2. (1) Any member of the Committee or appointed officer may order any person to leave the reserve who has offended against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
- (2) Any Conservation, Forests and Lands officer may order any person to leave the reserve when in the opinion of the officer this is desirable for fire protection purposes or for reasons of safety.

- (3) A person shall comply forthwith with any order given under sub-regulation (1) or (2).
- 3. (1) The Committee, with the approval of the Regional Manager, may fix parking fees payable in respect of any bus, van, motor car, motor cycle, caravan, trailer or any other vehicle parked within the reserve as for time to time is determined.
- (2) An appointed officer may upon receipt of the appropriate fee issue a permit authorising a person to park a vehicle within the reserve.
- (3) Except with the provision in writing of the Committee a person other than a lessee or licensee or the holder of a permit to play golf shall pay the appropriate fee in respect of a vehicle parked within the reserve.
- (4) The provisions of this regulation do not apply to any part of the reserve which is subject to a lease licence or permit granted under section 17 of the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978.
- 4. A person shall not park any vehicle within the reserve except:
- (1) In an area set aside for the purpose by the Committee; and
- (2) In accordance with any instructions in that behalf given by a member of the Committee or appointed officer.
- 5. A person shall not play golf within the reserve except in the area set aside for the purpose by the Committee (such area hereinafter called the Golf Course).
- 6. (1) The Committee, with the approval of the Regional Manager, may fix fees payable in respect of any person playing golf, as from time to time is determined.
- (2) An appointed officer may upon receipt of the appropriate fee issue a permit authorising a person to play golf on the golf course.
- (3) Except with the permission in writing of the Committee a person shall pay the appropriate fee in respect of playing golf on the golf course.
- 7. Except with the permission in writing of the Committee a person shall not within the reserve:
- (1) Affix a bill or sign to any tree, rock or structure;
 - (2) Conduct or take part in any public meeting;
 - (3) Offer for sale any article or service;
- (4) Set any snare, trap or lay poison of any description; or
- (5) Operate or use any loud speaker or amplifier.
 - 8. A person shall not within the reserve:
- (1) mark, write or deface or in any way damage any building, notice, sign, seat, table, gate, post, fence, railing or other structure or property or natural object;

- (2) commit any nuisance or behave in such manner as to cause danger, inconvenience or annoyance to any other person;
- (3) camp or establish an encampment of any kind:
- (4) reside or remain overnight;
- (5) obstruct, interfere with or annoy any person who is taking part or has made preparation to take part in any golf, match, game or practice;
- (6) damage or interfere in any way with the tees, greens, bunkers, mounds or the approaches thereto on the sloping sides thereof on the fairways; or
- (7) take a golf bag, golf buggy or other wheeled conveyance or permit any such bag, buggy or conveyance to be taken on to those parts of the golf course known as the greens.
- 9. A person other than an appointed officer in the course of his duties or a person who has been issued with a permit to play golf shall not within the golf course:
- (1) enter or pass over on the playing ground during any golf, match, game or practice when such entry or passage would be injurious to or an undue interference with the progress of any such golf, match, game or practice;
- (2) enter or pass over those portions of the golf course being the tees, greens, mounds, bunkers, or the approaches thereto on the sloping sides thereof; or
- (3) pick up, remove or have in his possession any golf ball.
- 10. A person shall not play or practise golf on the golf course if in the opinion of a member of the Committee or appointed officer such person is not in possession of sufficient and suitable equipment for the purpose.
- 11. A person playing golf on the golf course shall play the holes in the correct sequence commencing at the first hole unless otherwise permitted or instructed by a member of the Committee or an appointed officer.
- 12. A person playing golf on the golf course shall enable the players following to play through when such person is unable to progress either or account of looking for a lost ball or from any
- 13. The number of persons playing golf together in one group on the golf course shall not exceed four and in order to facilitate the even plan of play a member of the Committee or appointed officer may direct players to amalgamate into groups not exceeding four.
- 14. A male person over the age of 5 years shall not enter or use any place, room, convenience or building or any separate passage or approach thereto set apart for the use of females only within

the reserve and no female shall enter or use any place, room, convenience or building or any passage or approach thereto set apart for the use of males only within the reserve.

- 15. A person shall not light, kindle or maintain any fire or solid fuel in the open air within the reserve except in the fireplaces set aside for the purpose.
- 16. A person other than a member of the Committee or appointed officer in the course of his duties shall not:
- (1) bring into the reserve any seed, plant or porture of any plant; or
- (2) enter any plot enclosed for the protection of turf, trees, shrubs or flowers; or
- (3) enter any enclosure area or building set aside for the storage or use of equipment or machinery.
- 17. A person shall not construct any building, booth, fence, gate or other improvement within the reserve except in accordance with the provisions of a lease licence or permit granted under the Crown Land (Reserves) Act 1978.

A person shall not:

- (1) give, sell or offer to sell to any person any ticket, permit form or consent relating to the reserve issued by or on behalf of the Committee unless he has the written authority of the Committee to so do;
- (2) obstruct, hinder or interfere with any member of the Committee or appointed person in the execution of his duty; or
- (3) cause or permit any dog, cat, horse or other animal to enter the reserve, except a blind person having in the reserve a dog that is used by that person as a guide dog.
- 19. No person shall in the Reserve except in accordance with a written permit:
 - (a) shoot trap catch maim injure kill or destroy any bird or animal;
 - (b) have in his possession or carry any firearm poison trap snare or net.
 - No person shall:

- (3) shall expend any tolls fees rents charges and other moneys received by it or the car protection and management of the reserve; and
- (4) shall furnish a full particular account of all sums of money received and expended by it and shall annually furnish to the Regional Manager a statement of such receipts and expenditure and of the balance in hand and if so by the Department full particulars of any or all of such receipts and expenditure.
- 23. Every person infringing these Regulations in any respect shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable—(Rs. 14116). Dated 17 December 1989

The gross mass of a trailer may not exceed the gross mass of the towing motor vehicle.

DETERMINATION

This Determination is made by the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority under the powers conferred by section 44 of the *Dairy Industry Act* 1984 after consultation with the Prices Commissioner and shall come into operation on 1 January 1990.

The Determination of milk prices made by the Victorian Dairy Industry Authority and published in the Government Gazette dated 6 December 1989 is hereby revoked.

Part 1

PRICES PAYABLE FOR SALES OF MILK

The prices payable for sales of daily pasteurised milk in all Milk Districts other than the Border Milk District shall be in accordance with Schedule 1.

The prices payable for sales of packaged milk in the Border Milk District, shall be in accordance with Schedule 2.

The retail price for sales of packaged Ultra Heat Treated Milk in all Milk Districts shall not be less than the prices shown in Schedule 3.

The prices payable for milk and milk products in the package types as shown in column 1 of the attached schedules shall be as indicated in the appropriate columns according to the category of sale.

The categories of sale are defined as:

- (1) Wholesale sales are those by a milk processor to the owner of a dairy.
- (2) Semi-wholesale sales are those by the owner of a dairy to the owner of a milk shop, or other approved person.
- (3) Retail sales are sales by the owner of a dairy, a milk processor or a milk vendor of not more than 16 litres to a person on any one day, or any sale made by the owner of a milk shop.
- (4) Export sales are sales for the purpose of human consumption as a liquid beyond the territorial limits of the Commonwealth of Australia.
- (5) Vending machine sales are retail sales from an automatic vending machine. The maximum retail price for vending machine sales of unflavoured milk shall be at the nearest five (5) cent multiple above the maximum gazetted retail price.
- (6) In the Border Milk District, vendor sales are those by the owner of a dairy to a milk vendor located in that District who does not operate licensed dairy premises. The price of plain milk to vendors in the Border Milk District shall be in the range of 75% of the gazetted minimum and maximum retail prices set out in Schedule 2.
- (7) An institutional sale is a sale by the owner of a dairy or a vendor to-
 - (a) a charitable institution or benevolent society which is either exempt and/or registered under the Health Services Act and subsidised by the Health Department of Victoria for maintenance purposes; or
 - (b) an institution which is operated under the Community Welfare Services Act.
- (8) Sales to institutions by the owner of a dairy shall be in the range of 95% of the gazetted minimum and maximum semi-wholesale delivered prices.

The following interpretations as stated in section 3 (1) of the Dairy Industry Act 1984 shall apply in part 3 of this determination of prices:

Victoria Government Gazette

"Factory" means any premises where-

- (a) dairy produce is manufactured;
- (b) dairy produce other than milk or modified milk which is pasteurised for consumption as a liquid is graded or treated preparatory to sale or manufacture; or
- (c) milk or cream is received direct from a dairy farm.

"Milk processing premises" means any premises where milk or modified milk is pasteurised for the purpose of human consumption as a liquid.

Part 2

PRICES PAYABLE FOR MILK SUPPLIED BY DAIRYFARMERS

The Authority has determined that the price to be paid to the dairyfarmers for milk supplied by dairyfarmers and accepted by the Authority for manufacture, sale or distribution in Victorian Milk Districts shall be 36-97 cents per litre.

Part 3

PRICES PAYABLE FOR MILK SUPPLIED TO PROCESSORS BY THE AUTHORITY

The Authority has determined that the following prices must be paid for milk sold by the Authority to milk processors:

- (a) Standardised raw milk for processing as daily pasteurised milk for sale in Australia will be:
 - For flavoured milk and low fat flavoured milk marketed under processor (non VDIA) brands—44.03 cents per litre.
 - (ii) For all other milk-44-52 cents per litre.

- (e) Standardised raw milk for processing as daily pasteurised ultra filtered milk for sale in Australia but outside Victoria will be 33-18 cents per litre.
- (f) Standardised raw milk for processing as daily pasteurised reverse osmosis milk "Challenge" for sale in Victoria will be 36.30 cents per litre.
- (g) Standardised raw milk for processing as daily pasteurised reverse osmosis milk "Challenge" for sale in Australia but outside Victoria will be 35-38 cents per litre.
- (h) Standardised raw milk for processing as ultra heat treated milk for sale in Victoria will be 42.53 cents per litre where the milk is appropriated in accordance with section 37 (4) (c) of the Dairy Industry Act 1984 and 44.52 cents per litre when delivered by the Authority to milk processing premises.
- (i) Standardised raw milk for processing as ultra heat treated milk for sale in Australia but outside Victoria will be 23-00 cents per litre where the milk is appropriated in accordance with section 37 (4) (c) of the Dairy Industry Act 1984 and 28-17 cents per litre when delivered by the Authority to milk processing premises.
- (j) Standardised raw milk for processing as ultra heat treated milk for sale by export will be 23-00 cents per litre where the milk is appropriated in accordance with section 37 (4) (c) of the Dairy Industry Act 1984 and 28-17 cents per litre when delivered by the Authority to milk processing premises.
- (k) Standardised raw milk for processing as reverse osmosis ultra heat treated milk "Challenge" for sale in Victoria will be 35-08 cents per litre where the milk is appropriated in accordance with section 37 (4) (c) of the Dairy Industry Act 1984.

(1) Standardised raw milk for processing as sterilised milk for sale by export will be 23-00 cents per litre where the milk is appropriated in accordance with section 37 (4) (c) of the Dairy Industry Act 1984 and 28-17 cents per litre when delivered by the Authority to milk processing premises.

Part 4 MINIMUM AND MAXIMUM DETERMINED PRICES



ROAD CLOSURE DIAGRAM PARISH OF KEELBUNDORA COUNTY OF BOURKE PART OF CROWN PORTION 4





- 5. Means by which domestic and commercial waste could be minimised.
- 6. The opportunities for and benefits of the introduction of new technologies in waste sorting, transport and disposal.
