PROCLAMATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF PREVENTING THE SPREAD OF THE ELM LEAF BEETLE PYRRHALTA LUTEOLA

I, J. Davis McCaughey, Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council and under sections 3 (1), 5 and 5A of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958*:

1. Revoke the Proclamation made on 23 January 1990 and published in the *Government Gazette* on 24 January 1990.

2. Declare *Pyrrhalta luteola* (Elm Leaf Beetle) to be a parasite.

3. Declare that there is danger of a plague of the parasite *Pyrrhalta luteola* (Elm Leaf Beetle) in the Mornington Peninsula region of Victoria and in the municipalities of Berwick and Pakenham.

4. Require every occupier or owner of land to give notice of the presence of the parasite *Pyrrhalta luteola* (Elm Leaf Beetle) on the land of which he is the occupier or owner to the Manager of Parks and Gardens of the local municipal council immediately the occupier or

owner becomes aware that the parasite *Pyrrhalta luteola* (Elm Leaf Beetle) is present on that land giving the following particulars—

- (a) name of the occupier or owner;
- (b) address of the occupier or owner;
- (c) telephone number of the occupier or owner;
- (d) location of the area or areas where the parasite is present.

5. Prohibit the removal of elm tree prunings or felled elm trees from the municipalities of Mornington, Frankston, Hastings, Flinders, Berwick and Pakenham into any other part of Victoria.

6. Require every occupier or owner of land in the municipalities of Mornington, Frankston, Hastings, Flinders, Berwick and Pakenham to dispose of any elm tree prunings or felled elm trees on that land or at a municipality tip within one of those municipalities.

DECLARATION OF A PRESCRIBED RECORD

The Governor in Council, under sub-section 16 (1) of the *Public Records Act 1973*, declares the records described in Schedule A to be prescribed records.

Schedule A

DESCRIPTION OF RECORDS TO BE PRESCRIBED

Two hundred and eighty-four documents, the majority being correspondence of the Victorian Aboriginal Protectorate and the Port Phillip Branch of the Surveyor General's Department, and dating from 1839 to 1841. The letters are without coversheets or any other attachments or administrative notes. They have been folded into a docket format, although some have subsequently been unfolded and are kept flat.

The documents comprise:

Aboriginal Protectorate Correspondence

(1) Letters from the Chief Protector of Aborigines, G. A. Robinson, to C. W. Sievwright, Assistant Protector for the Western District, 1839-1841. The letters contain instructions to Sievwright regarding his duties as Assistant Protector, some of a general nature, but the majority relating to particular instances of violence or crime between Aborigines and European landholders in the District, or to instances of illness or distress requiring supplies of food or medicine to be sent to the District. Most of the letters bear a registration or cross referencing number. They are in a common handwriting and are probably office copies of Robinson's outward correspondence.

Approximately 84 documents as set out in Sub-Schedule 1.

(2) Letters to the Chief Protector of Aborigines, G. A. Robinson, from various correspondents, the majority dated 1839. The letters, most of which are from the four Assistant Protectors (Siewwright, Thomas, Parker and Dredge) or from settlers, inform of the "condition" of Aborigines throughout the Port Phillip District and of particular incidents of violence between Aborigines and Europeans. A few letters bear registration or cross referencing numbers or are annotated "copy". The majority, however, are original, unregistered inwards correspondence to the Chief Protector.

Approximately 67 documents as set out in Sub-Schedule 2.

(3) Other documents of the Aboriginal Protectorate including depositions of evidence sworn before the Assistant Protectors relating to attacks by Aborigines on Europeans' property and to the shooting of Aborigines in the Western District, and miscellaneous letters, original and copies, to and from the Assistant Protectors, 1839 and 1940.

Approximately 23 documents as set out in Sub-Schedule 3.

Surveyor General's Office, Port Phillip Branch, Correspondence

(4) Letters from the Surveyor General's Department, Sydney, to R. Hoddle, Senior Surveyor at the Melbourne Survey Office, dated 1837 to 1842. The letters are original inwards correspondence bearing a registration number in annual single number format and the majority are signed by S. A. Perry, Deputy Surveyor General of New South Wales. The letters give instructions relating to the very earliest surveys and land sales in the Port Phillip District, primarily around Melbourne.

Approximately 39 documents as set out in Sub-Schedule 4.

(5) Letters to Robert Hoddle, Senior Surveyor for the Port Phillip District and, from 1851, Surveyor General of Victoria, from various correspondents including assistant surveyors. The majority are unregistered.

(6) Working documents and staff records of the Surveyor General's Department, Port Phillip Branch, dating from 1843 to 1847, including printed notices of land sales, working notes regarding land sales, and documents authorising the payment of salaries and expenses to surveyors.

(7) Correspondence of the Crown Lands Commissioners, 1845 to 1859, primarily consisting of letters from landholders to the District Commissioners at Broken River, Gisborne and Western Port and the Chief Commissioner at Melbourne. As the responsibilities of the Crown Lands Commissioners were initially vested in the Surveyors of the Port Phillip District, it is possible that these letters were incorporated into the records of the Surveyor General's Department, Port Phillip District.

ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS ORDER (No. 86) 1991

1. This Order is called the Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 86) 1991.
2. This Order is made under the powers conferred by section 4 of the *Administrative Arrangements Act* 1983 and under every other available power.
3. (1) Functions relating to the Community Council Against Violence ("the functions transferred") have been transferred from the Ministry of Police and Emergency Services to the Department of the Premier and Cabinet.
(2) Moneys had been appropriated by the *Appropriation (1990-91, No. 1) Act* 1990 for the purpose of enabling the Ministry of Police and Emergency Services to carry out the functions transferred.
(3) Section 4 of the *Administrative Arrangements Act* 1983 provides that where a function is transferred from a Department to another Department and before the transfer moneys appropriated by an Appropriation Act could lawfully have been issued or applied for to or in respect of the performance by the superseded Department of that function then the Governor in Council may by Order direct that all or part of the moneys may be issued and applied for to or in respect of the performance by the other Department of that function.
4. The provisions of this Order shall take effect from and including 22 February 1991.
5. The amount specified in Column 1 of the Item in the Schedule to this Order ("the Schedule") which was appropriated by the *Appropriation (1990-91, No. 1) Act* 1990 to the Ministry of Police and Emergency Services for the Program specified in Column 2 of that item and which has not been issued or applied for to or in respect of the performance of the functions transferred may be issued and applied to the program specified in Column 3 of that Item for to or in respect of the performance by the Department of the Premier and Cabinet and of the functions transferred.

ORDER OF EXEMPTION No. 31
The Governor in Council under section 4 of the *Boilers and Pressure Vessels Act* 1970 makes the following Order:

1. This Order relates to the boilers of the Hobby Miniature Locomotive type.
2. This Order revokes the following:
The Order made on 5 June 1984 published in the *Government Gazette* on 13 June 1984 and cited as the Boilers and Pressure Vessels Order of Exemption No. 19.
3. For the purposes of this Order "approved inspector" means a person registered with the

Australian Miniature Boiler Safety Committee and approved by the Chief Inspector of Boilers and Pressure Vessels to inspect boilers of the Hobby Miniature Locomotive type.

4. (a) Any boiler of the Hobby Miniature Locomotive type manufactured from Copper having an internal volume no larger than 25 litres and a maximum working pressure no greater than 700 kPa, which is brought into Victoria from elsewhere in Australia is exempted from Parts II, III, IV and V and sections 27 (2), 30, 31 and 32 of the Act, subject to the requirements of clause 5.
- (b) Any boiler of the Hobby Miniature Locomotive type manufactured from Steel

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having an internal volume no greater than 50 litres and a maximum working pressure of 700 kPa which is brought into Victoria from elsewhere in Australia is exempted from Parts II, III, IV and V and sections 27 (2), 30, 31 and 32 of the Act, subject to the requirements of clause 5.

5. The boilers described in clause 4 must—
 - (a) fully comply with all the requirements for such boilers in its State of origin; and
 - (b) have passed a hydrostatic pressure test at the test pressure applicable to the boiler, in accordance with the requirements of the Australian Miniature Boiler Safety Committee Code; and
 - (c) have a current certificate issued by an approved inspector.

6. The certificate issued by an approved inspector under clause 5 (c), may be issued for a period not longer than the period specified in the Australian Miniature Boiler Safety Committee Code and must include certification by the approved inspector that the inspector:

- (a) has sighted the current certificate of inspection for the boiler issued under the Australian Miniature Boiler Safety Committee Code by an approved inspector from the owner's Miniature Locomotive club or by an approved inspector from the State of origin; and
- (b) has inspected the boiler; and
- (c) is of the opinion that the boiler is in a safe and proper condition for use.

7. Where during the currency of a certificate issued under clause 5 an approved inspector is of the opinion that the boiler is not in a safe and proper condition to use or there are circumstances relating to the operation of the boiler which make it unsafe to use, the approved inspector may cancel the certificate.

8. The owner or operator of a boiler must produce, on demand, to an approved inspector, or an Inspector of Boilers and Pressure Vessels the certificate issued for that boiler under clause 5.


