PART-TIME EMPLOYMENT

130. This Determination is applicable to part-time members in the Victoria Police Force, for a twelve month trial period to commence at the convenience of the Force.

131. In this Determination "part-time member" means a member of the Police Force who is engaged in police duties for more than 16 hours per week and less than 38 hours per week.

The term "trial period" means a twelve month period. "Time fraction" refers to the proportion of time actually worked in a part-time capacity to full time employment (i.e. 38 hours per week) (e.g. person working 20 hours per week $20/38$ hours = 0.52 of full time employment).

132. A full-time member may convert to part-time employment with the approval of the Chief Commissioner of Police.

A member of the Police Force participating in the part-time employment project will be required to transfer to Force Reserve for the period of the trial.

Unless otherwise authorised by the Chief Commissioner of Police at the conclusion of the trial period all members participating in the part-time employment will be eligible to be transferred to a full time position and may be subject to nomination according to the requirements of the Force.

133. Persons eligible to apply for part-time employment are;

- members appointed by the Chief Commissioner of Police pursuant to the Police Regulation Act with more than four years service in the Victoria Police Force; and
- members below the rank of Senior Sergeant.

RATE OF PAY

134. The rate of pay for a part-time member will be the rate of pay for a full time member occupying the same rank and length of service multiplied by the time fraction.

SHIFT WORK

135. Every member in addition to their base salary will be paid penalty rates for duty performed in the following categories.

- (a) *Afternoon Shift*—Consisting of any shift commencing at or after 1.00p.m. and before 4.00p.m.
- (b) *Twilight Shift*—Consisting of any shift commencing between 4.00p.m. and 7.00p.m. inclusive.
- (c) *Night Shift*—Consisting of any shift commencing after 7.00p.m. and before 2.00a.m.

Afternoon Shift

A member not above the rank of Sergeant who performed duty on an afternoon shift in addition to their base salary, allowances and any other penalty payments (commuted or otherwise), receive for each period of duty, a payment equivalent to 11.43% of the daily base salary of a Senior Constable, (Level 2) at Increment 1 of Band 1, such rate of salary being calculated for this purpose on an 7.6 hour per day basis multiplied by the time factor.

Twilight Shift

A member not above the rank of Sergeant who performed duty on a twilight shift in addition to their base salary, allowances and any other penalty payments (commuted or otherwise), receive for each period of duty a payment equivalent to 13.5% of the daily base salary of a Senior Constable, (Level 2) at Increment 1 of Band 1, such rate of salary being calculated for this purpose on an 7.6 hour per day basis multiplied by the time factor.

Night Shift

A member not above the rank of Sergeant who performed duty on a night shift in addition to their base salary, allowances and any other penalty payments (commuted or otherwise), receive for each period of duty a payment equivalent to 15% of the daily base salary of a Senior Constable, (Level 2) at Increment 1 of Band 1, such rate of salary being calculated for this purpose on an 7.6 hour per day basis multiplied by the time factor.

PERFORMANCE OF DUTY ON SATURDAY, SUNDAY OR PUBLIC HOLIDAY*Commuted Penalty Rates*

136. A member in addition to his base salary, allowances and other penalty payments (commuted or otherwise) be paid a further thirteen per centum of his base salary by way of annual commuted penalty rates for the performance of duties on Weekends, Public Holidays and Shift Work.

OVERTIME

137. Work performed in excess of the fixed number of working hours of a part-time member shall be at the ordinary hourly rate.

Provided that a part-time member shall be entitled to overtime for work performed outside the ordinary hours as prescribed.

SICK LEAVE

138. On completion of 2 years of service and each years service thereafter a full-time member is entitled to 15 days (112.5 hours) sick leave on full pay. The entitlement for a part-time member is to be calculated by multiplying the time factor by 112.5 hours.

Conditions for sick leave as prescribed elsewhere in Determination 179 are applicable to part-time members on a pro-rata basis.

RECREATION LEAVE

139. The Chief Commissioner of Police will in each year and at such times as maybe convenient grant to every member 35 days leave of absence for recreation (of which 10 days shall be deemed to be rest days) paid at the appropriate fraction of the rate of pay.

Additional leave days paid at the appropriate fractional rate are added for any Public Holiday worked.

A member of or below the rank of Sergeant shall receive an additional amount of 17.5% of the member's weekly base salary for the first 4 weeks of recreation leave on a pro-rata basis. For part-time members the following calculation is applicable;

(fractional rate of pay) x 4 weeks x 17.5 = entitlement.

MATERNITY LEAVE

140. A female part-time member who produces to the Chief Commissioner of Police a certificate of a registered medical practitioner stating that she is pregnant and specifying the day on which it is expected that she will give birth is entitled to leave at a rate of pay equal to a full time member of similar rank and years of pay multiplied by the time fraction for a continuous period of 12 calendar weeks commencing—

- (a) 6 calendar weeks prior to the expected date of birth; or
- (b) at such time within 6 calendar weeks prior to the expected date of birth as the member elects where she is able to produce a certificate of a registered medical practitioner certifying fitness for duty; or

- (c) where the birth occurs earlier than 6 calendar weeks prior to the expected date of birth, on the day she ceases duty on account of the birth.

Where the pregnancy of a female member terminates earlier than 20 weeks prior to the expected date of delivery her entitlement to leave under this paragraph in relation to that pregnancy shall cease upon the date of that termination.

A female member who produces to the Chief Commissioner of Police satisfactory evidence of being an approved applicant for the adoption of a child and of the date of placement of a child for adoption is entitled to leave at a rate of pay equal to a full time member of similar rank and years of pay multiplied by the time fraction for a continuous period of 6 weeks commencing from the date of placement of the child with her.

The conditions as prescribed elsewhere in Determination 179 apply.

PATERNITY LEAVE

141. A male member who furnishes a statutory declaration that he is the father of, or has accepted responsibility for the care of, a child, will be granted leave of absence on full pay for a period not exceeding 1 week multiplied by the time factor, or for periods that in the aggregate do not exceed 5 working days multiplied by the time factor for the purpose of caring for such child and/or mother of child.

Provided that such leave shall commence not more than:

- (a) 1 week prior to the expected date of birth of the child; or
(b) 6 weeks after the birth of the child.

Provided further that if the pregnancy terminates other than by way of the birth of a child such leave shall be granted in the period up to 6 weeks after the termination.

Leave shall not be granted under this clause in respect of pregnancy which terminates earlier than 20 weeks prior to the expected date of delivery.

UNIFORM MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE

142. Each member is required by the Chief Commissioner of Police to have a uniform and will be paid the following maintenance allowance by way of reimbursement \$245 per year multiplied by time factor.

ACCRUED TIME OFF

143. Members participating in the part-time employment pilot project are not eligible for Accrued Time Off days as the time fraction was based on 38 hour week."

"NINTH SCHEDULE

Disputes Settlement Procedures

It is the basic intention of this procedure to remove, through direct negotiation between the parties, any dispute regarding terms and conditions of employment that may arise between police members and the Victoria Police Force. The parties will make every endeavour to ensure that any dispute between them will be resolved as quickly as possible, using the procedure set out immediately below:

STEP 1: The dispute will be submitted by the aggrieved member to their immediate supervisor. If not settled at this level, the member/s or Association work place delegate will submit the matter to the Officer-In-Charge (or other appropriate representative of the Victoria Police Force) for settlement. If not settled at this level the Victoria Police Association district delegate may:

submit the matter to the District Chief Superintendent for settlement or submit the matter to the Police Association who will further submit it to the Director, Industrial Relations Division, Victoria Police Force.

Time Elapsed

This Step must be concluded within a period of seven (7) working days.

STEP 2: If the matter is not settled at Step 1, the Secretary of the Police Association or the Secretary's delegate will formally notify in writing the Chief Commissioner of Police setting out the details of the dispute. The Chief Commissioner of Police (or delegate) will then meet with Police Association officials within a period of seven (7) working days of receiving formal notification and endeavour to reach a satisfactory settlement.

Cooling Off Period

If the matter remains unresolved, the Police Association or Chief Commissioner of Police may undertake a "cooling off" period of seven (7) working days whereby all parties referred to in Step 2 can review their positions individually or in joint discussion. If there is still no resolution the parties may:

STEP 3: Submit the matter for resolution to the Board or, where the parties agree, a mutually agreed independent arbitrator.

Except where a bona fide occupational health and safety issue is involved, work will continue during the processing of a dispute without interruption from industrial stoppages, bans and/or limitations. The matters which caused the dispute will not be implemented pending the resolution of the dispute.

Failure at any stage and by either party, to adhere to the process outlined in the above may result in the matter being referred immediately to the Board.

A dispute terms of settlement may be incorporated into a written agreement that is signed and binding on both parties."

1.9 By inserting immediately after the "Ninth Schedule" the following new "Tenth Schedule":

"TENTH SCHEDULE

New Technology

- (a) The Victoria Police Force will fully consult with the Police Association prior to decisions to introduce new technology that are likely to have significant effects on members. The Force will notify the members who may be affected.
- (b) "Significant effects" include major changes in the composition, operation or size of the Force's work force or in the skills required, the elimination or diminution of job opportunities, promotion opportunities, the alteration of hours of work, the need for retraining or transfer of members to other work or locations, the restructuring of positions, provided that where the determinations makes provision for alteration of any of the matters referred to herein an alteration shall be deemed not to have significant effect.
- (c) The Force will in consultation with the Police Association provide in writing to the members concerned all relevant information about the introduction of proposed new technology however the Force is not required to disclose any confidential information that is inimical to the Force interests."

SOLICITORS' (AUDIT AND PRACTISING
CERTIFICATES) (AMENDMENT No. 1)
RULES 1991

In the pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1958* and all other powers thereunto enabling the Council of the Law Institute hereby makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the Solicitors' (Audit and Practising Certificates) (Amendment No. 1) Rules 1991 and shall come into operation on the date of their publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

2. The Solicitors' (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules 1990 are in these Rules referred to as the Principal Rules.

3. Rule 41 of the Principal Rules is repealed and the following substituted for it—

"41. (1) Subject to sub-rules (2), (3) and (4), the practising certificate fees for the year 1991 and subsequent years shall be:

(a) For a Full Practising Certificate—

(i) for solicitors who principally practise in Victoria and who have not reached the age of 68 years—\$515.00;

(ii) for solicitors who principally practise in Victoria and who have reached the age of 68 years—\$310.00;

(iii) for solicitors who principally practise outside Victoria—\$257.50;

(b) For an Employee Practising Certificate or a Corporate Practising Certificate—

(i) for solicitors who principally practise in Victoria and who have been admitted as practitioners of the Supreme Court of Victoria before 1 November of the year before application for the practising certificate—\$310.00;

(ii) for solicitors who principally practise in Victoria and who have been admitted as practitioners of the Supreme Court of Victoria in the year of or in the months of November or December of the year before application for the practising certificate—\$170.00;

(iii) for solicitors who principally practise outside Victoria—\$155.00;

(c) For an Incorporated Practitioner's Practising Certificate—\$55.00.

(2) For solicitors who practise as employees of the Legal Aid Commission of Victoria the fee for a practising certificate shall be \$115.00.

(3) For solicitors who apply for a practising certificate to commence between 1 July and 31 October of any year, the fee for a practising certificate shall be half that otherwise payable.

(4) Solicitors who apply for a practising certificate to commence on or after 1 November of any year need not pay a fee provided that at the time of application the solicitor has applied and paid the fee for a practising certificate for the following year.

(5) An honorary life member of the Institute need not pay a practising certificate fee.

(6) The practising fee payable in accordance with this Rule shall be paid to the Secretary of the Institute on lodging the application to which it relates.

(7) A solicitor who surrenders a practising certificate between 1 January and 31 March of the year of its currency shall be entitled to a refund of three quarters of the fee paid for the certificate.

(8) A solicitor who surrenders a practising certificate between 1 April and 30 June of the year of its currency shall be entitled to a refund of one half of the fee paid for the certificate.

(9) A solicitor who between 1 January and 31 March of any year surrenders a Full Practising Certificate and immediately applies for an Employee Practising Certificate or a Corporate Practising Certificate for the same year shall be entitled to a refund of three quarters of the difference between the fee paid by the solicitor for the Full Practising Certificate and the Employee Practising Certificate or Corporate Practising Certificate.

(10) A solicitor who between 1 April and 30 June of any year surrenders a Full Practising Certificate and immediately applies for an Employee Practising Certificate or a Corporate Practising Certificate for the same year shall be entitled to a refund of one half of the difference between the fee paid by the solicitor for the Full Practising Certificate and the Employee Practising Certificate or Corporate Practising Certificate.

(11) A solicitor who between 1 July and 30 September of any year surrenders a Full Practising Certificate and immediately applies for an Employee Practising Certificate or a Corporate Practising Certificate for the same year shall be entitled to a refund of one quarter of the difference between the fee paid by the solicitor for the Full Practising Certificate and the Employee Practising Certificate or Corporate Practising Certificate.

(12) A solicitor who between 1 January and 30 June of any year surrenders an Employee Practising Certificate or a Corporate Practising

Certificate and immediately applies for a Full Practising Certificate for the same year shall pay the full difference between the fee paid by the solicitor for the Employee Practising Certificate or Corporate Practising Certificate and the fee payable for the Full Practising Certificate.

(13) A solicitor who between 1 July and 31 October of any year surrenders an Employee Practising Certificate or a Corporate Practising Certificate and immediately applies for a Full Practising Certificate for the same year shall pay one half of the difference between the fee paid by the solicitor for the Employee Practising Certificate or Corporate Practising Certificate and the fee payable for the Full Practising Certificate.

Public Meetings (by applying the provisions of this Local Law to the conduct of Public Meetings, with appropriate modifications);
recording proceedings of meetings (by allowing—

- (i) media representatives to record on audio tape equipment the proceedings of Council and Special Committee Meetings after first obtaining the consent of Council or the Special Committee; and
- (ii) other persons to record the proceedings of Council and Special Committee Meetings on audio tape equipment after first obtaining the written consent of Council or the Special Committee).

Offences (by providing a maximum penalty of 20 penalty units for the following offences:

- (i) not withdrawing an expression when asked to do so by the Chairperson (Councillors);
- (ii) for any person, other than a Councillor, guilty of disorderly conduct to not leave the Chamber when requested;
- (iii) for any person to not obey a direction of the Chairperson relating to the conduct of the meeting and the maintenance of order; and
- (iv) for a Councillor to refuse to leave the Chamber on suspension).

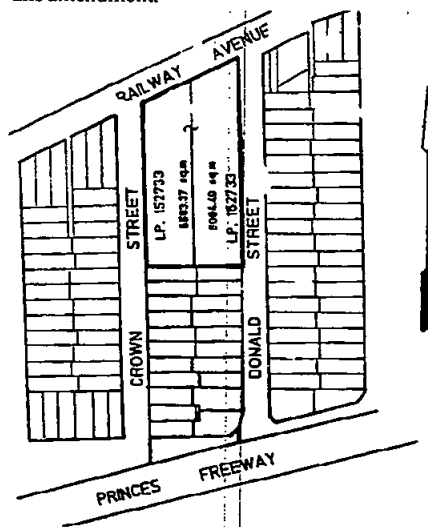

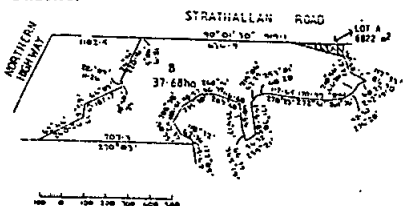

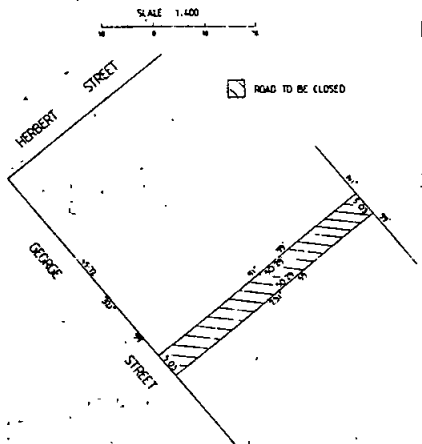
