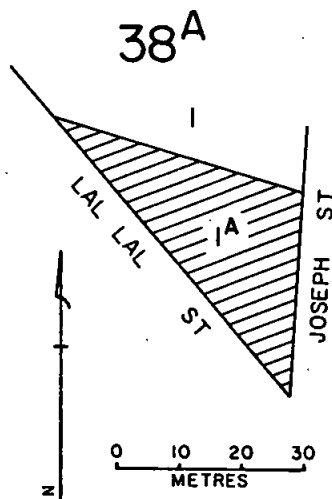

**RICHMOND PLANNING SCHEME**  
Notice of Approval of Amendment  
Amendment L13

The Minister for Planning and Housing has approved Amendment L13 to the Local Section of the Richmond Planning Scheme.

The amendment comes into operation on the date this notice is published in the *Government Gazette*.

The land affected by the amendment is known as the Richmond TAFE site and adjoins the Yarra River generally north of River Street and Clarke Street, Richmond.

Amendment L13 introduces a new sub-clause, Number 116A, Richmond Comprehensive Development Zone No. 1, to the Richmond Planning Scheme. A Concept Plan has been prepared as part of the amendment.

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The amendment makes provisions for—

the future extension of River Street to link with the adjoining Victoria Gardens Project on the former Vickers Ruwold site;  
an increase of public open space;  
enhanced public access to the Yarra River;  
major points of access to the various land uses.

The land uses provided for in the Concept Plan are as follows:

A mix of medium density family housing and housing for the elderly on approximately 12 300 sqm of the site.

This housing will help to meet local community demand.

A mix of small office, light industrial, retail, and other commercial uses on approximately 8400 sqm of the site. The commercial/industrial components of the development will provide local employment.

A child care and community centre.

Additional public open space adjacent and supplementary to the Yarra River.

  - (vi) advertising bill posting and junk mail; and
  - (vii) camping and temporary dwellings; and
  - (viii) circuses, carnivals and festivals; and
  - (ix) water quality, including interference with water courses; and
  - (x) animals, including animal numbers and the keeping, housing and control of animals; and
  - (xi) disposal of waste and use and location of waste containers; and
- (f) To provide for the peace order and good government of the municipal district; and

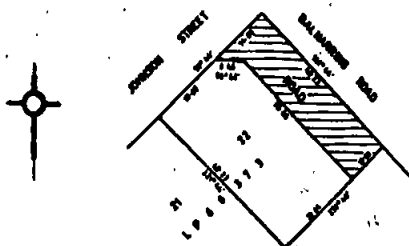

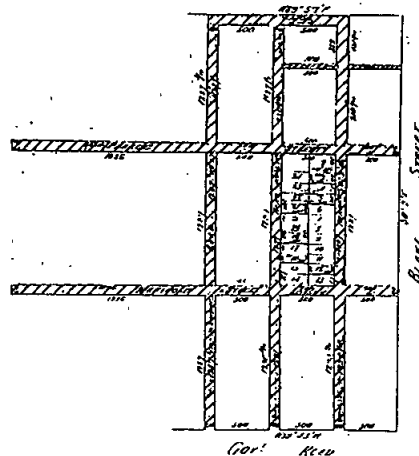
