**NOTICE OF INDEXED BENEFIT LEVELS AND OTHER AMOUNTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH SEC. 100(1) OR SEC. 180 OF THE ACCIDENT COMPENSATION ACT 1985**

Section 100(1) of the Accident Compensation Act 1985 provides for the amounts and rates referred to in Part IV of the Act, (excluding weekly payments made under Part IV) to be adjusted on 1 July in each year in line with the variation in the Victorian average weekly earnings over the 12 months ending in the previous December quarter, as published by the Australian Statistician at 15 June in that year. Weekly payments will be indexed on the anniversary of the claim as detailed in Section 100(2) of the Act.

The Victorian average weekly earnings for the December quarters of 1990 and 1991 were \$488.20 and \$512.00, respectively, and the indexation factor to apply from 1st July 1992 is 4.88%.

Notice is hereby given that calculations in accordance with Section 100(1) produce the following statutory amounts and rates which are applicable, on and from 1 July 1992, instead of the amounts and rates currently applicable.

MELBOURNE PLANNING SCHEME  
Notice of Approval of Amendment  
Amendment L91**

The Minister for Planning and Housing has approved Amendment L91 to the Local Section of the Melbourne Planning Scheme.

The amendment comes into operation on the date this notice is published in the *Government Gazette*.

The amendment affects land at 17-27 Cobden Street, North Melbourne. It allows the land to be used and developed for attached houses and flats without a planning permit if the use and development is in accordance with plans referred to in the amendment and provided a number of conditions are met.

#### CODE OF PRACTICE FOR CARE AND USE OF ANIMALS FOR SCIENTIFIC PROCEDURES

##### Purpose of Code

The purpose of the Code is to ensure the humane care of animals used in scientific procedures.

##### Authority

The Code is made under section 7 of the *Prevention to Cruelty to Animals Act 1986* (the Act).

##### Status of Code

It is an offence under section 32 of the Act for a person to carry out a scientific procedure except in accordance with this Code.

It is a defence to any proceedings under the Act that the act complained of was carried out in accordance with the Code.

##### Definition of Terms Used in this Code

The terms "animal", "scientific procedure", "scientific establishment" and "breeding establishment" have the same definitions as contained in the Act.

A reference to the National Code of Practice is a reference to the "Australian Code of Practice for the Care and Use of Animals for Scientific Purposes" prepared for and issued jointly under the auspices of the National Health and Medical Research Council, CSIRO and the Australian Agricultural Council, and published by the Australian Government Publishing Service, Canberra 1990.

##### General

The—

- (a) care or use of animals on which or in connection with which scientific procedures are carried out; and

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- (b) keeping, care, treatment, handling or use of animals at or the premises, facilities, equipment or conditions at any scientific establishment or breeding establishment—

must be in compliance with the National Code of Practice.

It may be noted that the National Code of Practice covers fish. Fish do not fall within the scope of this Code.

##### Scientific Establishments

Scientific establishments at which animals are used for scientific procedures must observe the following:

- (a) Each establishment must have an Animal Experimentation Ethics Committee (AEEC).
- (b) All experiments must be properly designed, and detailed proposals of the experimentation should be approved by the AEEC before any work is commenced.
- (c) Proper care should be given to the selection of the species of animals to be used, and all animals to be used in scientific procedures should be healthy and properly housed and maintained.
- (d) All staff involved in the care and maintenance of animals, or in carrying out scientific procedures of animals, should be properly supervised.

##### Breeding Establishments

Breeding establishments should ensure that—

- (a) all animals at the premises are healthy and are properly housed and maintained; and
- (b) all staff involved in either the care or maintenance of animals are properly trained or supervised.

1. This notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Scallop Fishing—Ocean Fishery) Notice No. 7/1992.

*Commencement*

2. This notice comes into operation on the date of this notice.

*Objectives*

3. The objectives of this notice are to—  
(a) fix and enforce bag limits and possession limits; and  
(b) set times for when fishing can occur—  
for scallops taken from Victorian waters, other than Port Phillip Bay, and/or landed in Victoria, for a period commencing on the date of this notice and ending on 30 August 1992.

*Authorising Provision*

4. This notice is made under section 80 of the Fisheries Act 1968.

*Definitions*

5. "Act" means the Fisheries Act 1968.  
"Authorised Officer" means an authorised officer appointed under Part 9 of the Conservation, Forests and Lands Act 1987.

"Crate" means a wire mesh container with external dimensions not exceeding 100 centimetres by 50 centimetres by 50 centimetres and constructed as specified in the diagrams in FORM 1 in the Schedule to this notice.

"Crate Tag" means a tag as specified in the diagram in FORM 2 in the Schedule to this notice.

"Bag" means a mesh bag of a rectangular shape measuring 900 millimetres high by 580 millimetres wide and having a volume of 0.08 cubic metres.

"Bag Tag" means a tag as specified in the diagram in FORM 3 in the Schedule to this notice.

PROPOSED CONSUMER AFFAIRS  
(PRODUCT SAFETY) (SPIRIT STOVES)  
REGULATIONS 1991

Some portable stoves (used for hiking and camping) are designed to burn only methylated spirits. To minimise burns through accidental misfuelling, they are required to have a warning label attached, which says "Use methylated spirits only" in English and other major community languages. This is required by the Consumer Protection (Product Safety) (Spirit Stoves) Regulations 1973.

As the 1973 regulations will lapse soon, the Ministry of Consumer Affairs proposes to remake them. A Regulatory Impact Statement has been prepared under the Subordinate Legislation Act 1962. The statement concludes that the regulations should be remade, requiring the same safety warning.

FISHERIES NOTICE No. 7/1992

I, Barry Pullen, Minister for Conservation and Environment, after consultation with the Victorian Fishing Industry Federation, make the following Fisheries Notice:

*Fishing Times*

6. Subject to section 15 (1) (h) of the Act the holder of a scallop licence may dredge for or take scallops for sale from Victorian waters, other than Port Phillip Bay, on any day during the period commencing on the date of this notice and ending 30 August 1992.

*Catch Limits*

7. A master fisherman operating a registered fishing boat for which a scallop licence has been issued must not take from that boat from Victorian waters or have on board that boat on Victorian waters more than ten crates of scallops during a seven day period commencing on each Monday during the period this notice is in operation.

*Tagging of Crates*

8. Every holder of a scallop licence permitting the dredging or taking of scallops from any Victorian waters other than Port Phillip Bay may on production of his or her scallop licence make application to an authorised officer for an allocation of the number and colour of crate tags prescribed in the Table to this clause for the period prescribed in the Table to this clause.

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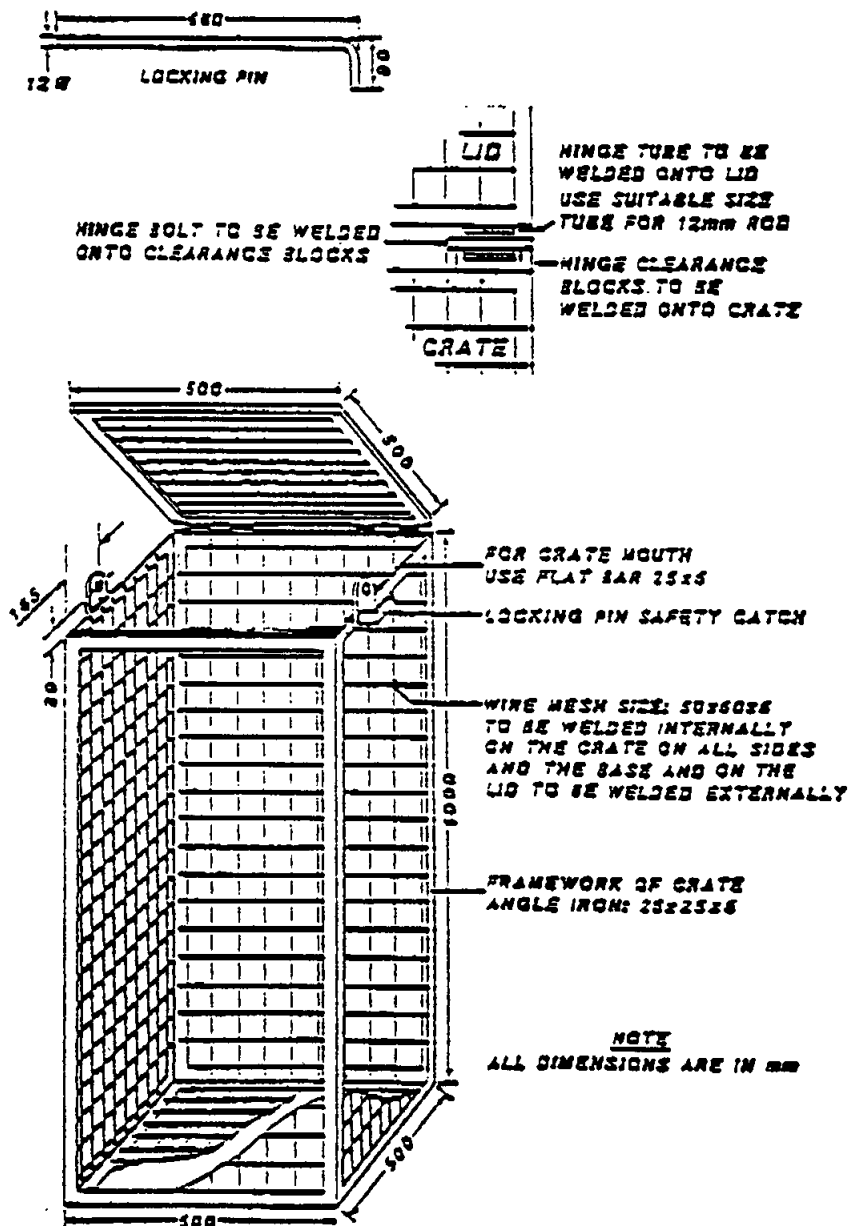
10. (1) A person in charge of a boat must ensure that—

- (a) in respect of scallops taken from Victorian waters, other than Port Phillip Bay, that those scallops are not contained on board or landed in any container other than a crate;
- (b) in respect of scallops taken from Commonwealth waters and landed in Victoria that those scallops are not contained on board a boat on Victorian waters or landed in any container other than a bag;
- (c) while a registered fishing boat for which a scallop licence has been issued is on the waters of the Gippsland Lakes, Corner Inlet, Western Port Bay or Port Phillip Bay, every crate of scallops, except one full or partly filled crate, on board the boat must be secured in the manner specified in paragraph (d);
- (d) when a crate containing scallops is landed the crate lid is so closed and secured with a crate tag so that the crate lid cannot be opened without cutting or breaking the crate tag;
- (e) when a crate containing scallops is landed the crate lid is so closed and secured with a crate tag until the scallops are to be removed from the crate at a fish processing premises specified in a processor's licence;
- (f) when a bag containing scallops taken from Commonwealth waters is landed the bag must be stitched along its upper edges with both sides meeting and secured with a bag tag until the scallops are to be removed from the bag at a fish processing premises specified in a processor's licence;
- (g) crate tags are not transferred to any other person; and
- (h) crate tags are not re-used;
- (i) in respect of scallops taken from any waters the entire catch of scallops must be contained on board and landed in only one of the types of containers specified in this notice.

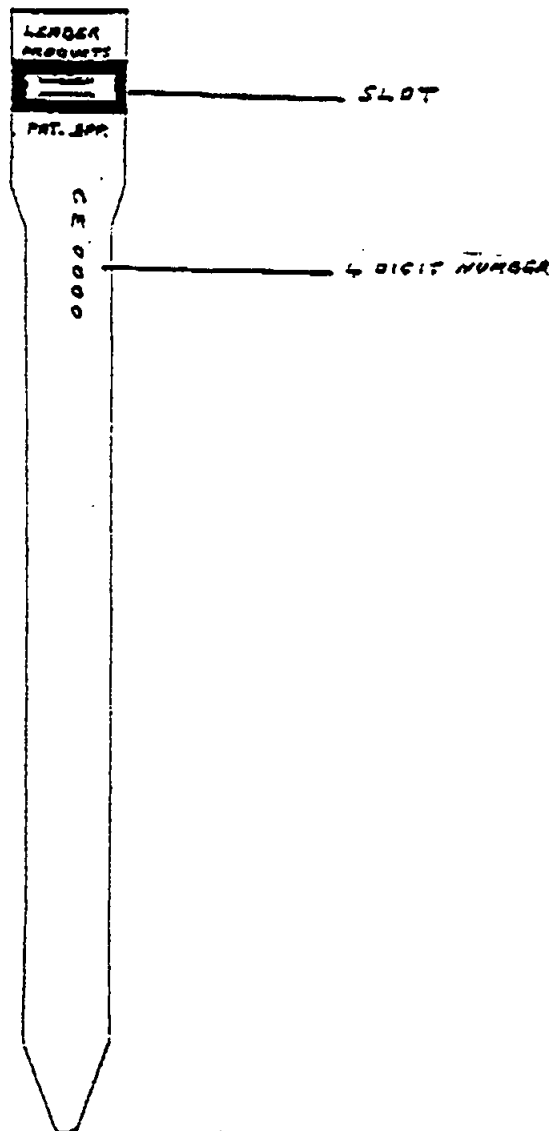

**GUIDELINES TO MEMBERS OF THE  
POLICE FORCE**

Pursuant to section 10 (1) *Director of Public Prosecutions Act 1982*, on 19 June 1992 I furnished the following guidelines to members of the Police Force with respect to the prosecution of charges of Culpable Driving Causing Death contrary to section 318 *Crimes Act 1958*.

Pursuant to section 53 (1A) *Magistrates' Court Act 1989* the Magistrates' Court has a discretion to hear and determine summarily—

- (a) all cases of Culpable Driving Causing Death where the death occurred between 22 April 1992 and 13 June 1992; and
- (b) arguably, all cases of Culpable Driving Causing Death where the death occurred prior to 22 April 1992.

However, I consider that in only the most exceptional case would it be appropriate for a Magistrate to exercise the jurisdiction conferred by section 53 (1A) *Magistrates' Court Act 1989* in respect of such a charge.

1. All police prosecutors prosecuting persons charged with the offence of Culpable Driving Causing Death which is or may be triable summarily should, prior to the committal mention date of such cases, consider whether it would be appropriate that there be a summary hearing in the particular case.

2. If the police prosecutor considers that a summary hearing is not appropriate in the particular case he or she—

- (a) should oppose any application made pursuant to section 54 (1) *Magistrates' Court Act 1989* by the defendant or his or her solicitor or counsel for a summary hearing in respect of that offence; and/or
- (b) should reject any offer of a summary hearing made by the Court pursuant to section 54 (2) *Magistrates' Court Act 1989* in respect of that offence.

3. Where the police prosecutor considers that it is or may be appropriate for a charge of Culpable Driving Causing Death to be heard summarily, he or she should immediately send the prosecution brief to me for an opinion as to whether it is appropriate for such charge to be heard summarily.

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4. Where, notwithstanding the opposition of a police prosecutor, the Magistrates' Court decides to hear a charge of Culpable Driving Causing Death summarily, the police prosecutor should, immediately upon that decision being given, seek an adjournment of the hearing and refer the brief of evidence together with a report of the proceedings in the Magistrates' Court to me for advice.

To regulate the confirmation of, and the keeping of minutes.

##### Part 5—Business of Meetings

To regulate the order of business.

##### Part 6—Meeting Procedure

To regulate the procedures on voting by members and requests for a division.

##### Part 7—Addressing the Meeting

To regulate the suspension of standing orders and interpretations for points of order.

##### Part 8—Other Meeting Procedures

To regulate: motions; amendments; debate on motions; speaking times and extensions; points of order; notices of motion; notices of amendment or rescission; public participation; closure of meetings to members of the public; petitions and joint letters; the chairperson's duties and discretions.

##### Part 9—Common Seal

To provide for the security and the use of the common seal and to prohibit the use of the common seal (or device resembling the common seal) without the authority of the Council.

##### Part 10—Enforcement and Penalties

To provide for penalties for offences against the Local Law and the procedure for issuance, and withdrawal, of infringement notices.

##### ENVIRONMENT

The general purport of the proposed Local Law includes:

a specification of the ways the Local Law will be administered including permits and fees and the repeal of previous bylaws; controls over dangerous land, chimneys, open air burning, incinerators, the use of recreation vehicles, the fencing of swimming pools and advertising, billposting and junk mail; controls over camping, temporary dwellings, circuses, carnivals and festivals; regulating the keeping of animals and beehives; regulating the disposal of waste and the use of tips, the dumping of ice chests and refrigerators and the tapping of Council drains; enforcement procedures and penalties; standards which state how Council will make its decisions.

Municipal Places

CONSUMPTION OF LIQUOR AND  
BEHAVIOUR IN PUBLIC PLACES

The purpose of the Local Law is to regulate the consumption and possession of liquor on roads and in public reserves and to regulate the behaviour of persons within public reserves.

The general purpose of the Local Law is—

- (i) to allow and protect the quiet enjoyment of public reserves within the municipal district;
- (ii) to enable people to enjoy their recreational pursuits without having their peace and enjoyment interfered with or destroyed;
- (iii) to control and prevent behaviour which is a nuisance, may be detrimental to health and safety, or which affects the enjoyment of recreational or other facilities;
- (iv) to protect Council and community assets and facilities;
- (v) to regulate the places at, and time during, which liquor may be consumed, or under a person's control or possession in public reserves and on roads within the municipality;
- (vi) to provide generally for the peace order and good government of the municipal district;
- (vii) to provide for the administration of the Council's powers and functions.

ACCESS TO INFORMATION

The purpose of the Local Law is to provide the public with access to Council information, to encourage the keeping and flow of accurate and reliable information between the Council and the public, to protect confidentiality when required and to promote the principles of open and accountable government.

The general purport of the proposed Local Law includes—

- (i) the rights and procedures for access to Council information;
- (ii) provisions as to exempt documents;
- (iii) how to amend personal records;
- (iv) who is responsible for access to information;
- (v) a process for review of decisions on requests for information;
- (vi) offences and penalties;
- (vii) fees and charges for information;
- (viii) the time limits which apply to the supply of information.

STREETS AND ROADS
