Camping (Amendment No. 1)

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City of Coburg proposes to make a Local Law for the following purposes:

1. To regulate camping on—
 - (a) roads; and
 - (b) land.
2. To amend the Camping Local Law No. 16.

The general purport of the Local Law No. 20 is as follows:

1. To prohibit the occupation and use of tents, caravans and annexes on roads and in public places.
2. To regulate the owners and occupiers of land allowing others to occupy tents, caravans and annexes on that land, by requiring a permit to be obtained (and by exempting persons holding a planning permit or a licence issued under the *Caravans Parks and Movable Dwellings Act 1988* from the need to obtain a permit).

Any person affected by the proposed Local Law may make a submission relating to the proposed Local Law under section 223 of the *Local Government Act 1989*, and all submissions must be lodged within fourteen (14) days of the publication of this notice.

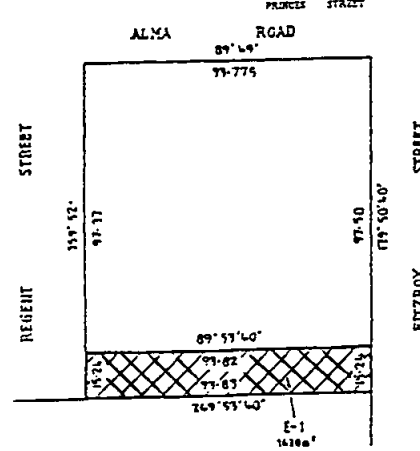
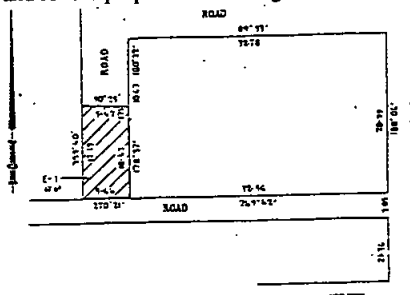

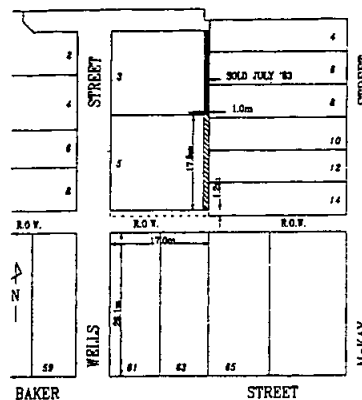

 - (ii) behaviour on or in Council land and municipal places which is offensive, dangerous or threatening or which, for other reasons, is inappropriate on or in Council land and municipal places;
 - (iii) conditions upon which alcohol may be consumed;
 - (iv) smoking in specified municipal places;
- (h) to provide generally for the peace, order and good government of the municipal district;
- (j) to provide for the administration of the Council's powers and functions.

The amendment affects land at:

the existing Werribee Plaza Shopping Centre property on the north-west corner of Derrimut and Heaths Roads, Hoppers Crossing; and

amending the approach to the approval of future extensions to Werribee Plaza from a planning permit to a development plan approach, and requiring that the provisions of the Werribee Plaza Structure Plan as a matter with the Responsible Authority must consider before deciding on a development; and

including the Werribee Plaza Structure Plan, which is also on exhibition, as an incorporated document in the Planning Scheme.

An indicative development plan of what the first stage of an expanded Werribee Plaza (i.e. up to 49 000 GLFA), which is provided for under this amendment, may include has been submitted and is also on display as a supporting document to this amendment. The plan generally accords with the objectives of the Structure Plan, but it is not part of the amendment itself.

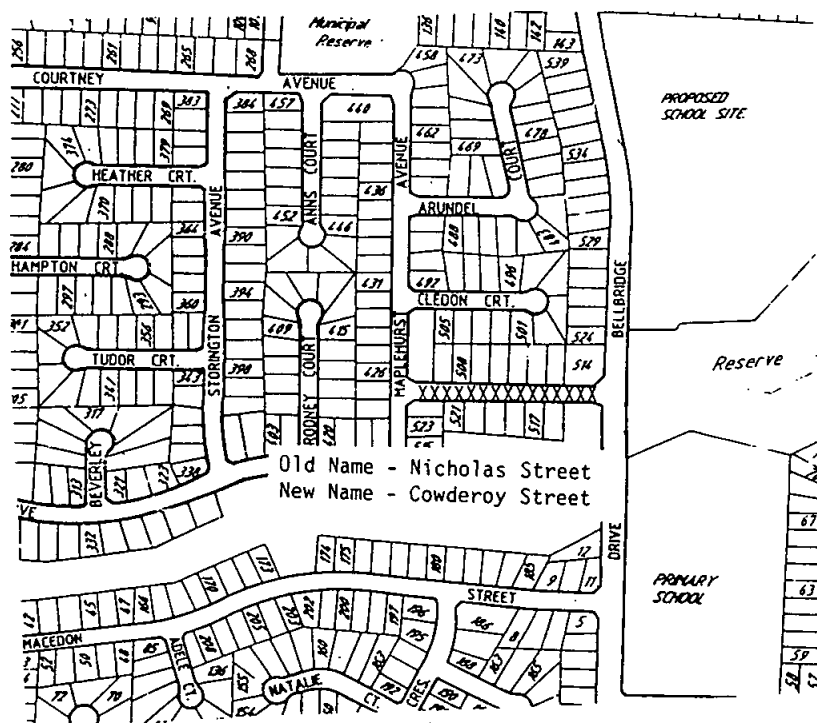

WHITTLESEA PLANNING SCHEME

Notice of Amendment to a Planning Scheme
Amendments L82, L83 and L84

The City of Whittlesea has prepared Amendments L82, L83 and L84 to the Whittlesea Planning Scheme.

Amendment L82—affects about 700 ha of land at South Morang, basically divided in two parts by Plenty Road. The larger area is centred around Gordons Road (west) bounded by

Quarry Hill, and the SEP terminal station/easement. The smaller area is on the eastern side of Plenty Road, bounded by the proposed Plenty Gorge Park, Gordons Road (east) and Gorge Road.

The amendment proposes to change the Planning Scheme by:

Incorporating the South Morang Local Structure Plan into the Planning Scheme.
Making a number of Planning Scheme Ordinance and Map changes to reflect the Local Structure Plan.

Amendment L83—affects about 2000 ha of land at Mernda and Doreen, centred on the existing Mernda Township generally bounded by Masons Road (west) and Arthurs Creek Road to the north; Yan Yean Road to the east; Wilton Vale Road and Hunters Road to the south; and Sackville Street to the west.

The amendment proposes to change the Planning Scheme by:

Incorporating the Mernda Local Structure Plan into the Planning Scheme.

Making a number of Planning Scheme Ordinance and Map changes to reflect the Local Structure Plan, including the introduction of a new Rural—Residential Zone and the rezoning of some areas on the periphery of the Plan area to this zone.

Amendment L84—affects about 200 ha of land on the periphery of the existing Whittlesea Township.

The amendment proposes to change the Planning Scheme by:

Incorporating the Whittlesea Township Local Structure Plan into the Planning Scheme, with consequential ordinance changes to reflect the Plan.

Rezoning about 80 ha of land to the north and west of the existing township to Urban Development Zone.

Rezoning about 120 ha of land on the south, west and east periphery of the existing township to Rural Residential Zone.

DECLARATION OF THE ORBOST WATERWORKS DISTRICT AREA OF INTEREST No. 4 (ORBOST/MARLO) ORDER 1993

1. This Order is called the Declaration of the Orbost Waterworks District Area of Interests No. 4 (Orbost/Marlo) Order 1993.

2. This Order is made under section 106 (1) of the *Water Act* 1989 (the Act) and all other available powers.

3. This order takes effect on the date on which it is published in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

4. (a) An area of interest in relation to the Orbost Waterworks District is declared.

(b) The area of interest is called the Orbost Waterworks District Area of Interest No. 4 (Orbost/Marlo).

(c) The Orbost Waterworks District Area of Interest No. 4 (Orbost/Marlo) is the area of land outside the Orbost Waterworks District within the red border on the accompanying plan (No. A1004).

(d) The Orbost Water Board is the body responsible in the future for carrying out any sewerage functions and exercising any sewerage powers in relation to the land in the Orbost Waterworks District Area of Interest No. 4 (Orbost Marlo).

5 (a) The Orbost Water Board under section 106 (2) (a) (i) of the Act, given notice of the proposed Order at least 30 days before its making to the East Gippsland River Management Board, the Snowy River Improvement Trust, the Mallacoota Water Board, the Tambo Water Board, the Shire of Orbost and the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (Orbost Region).

(b) The Orbost Water Board has, under section 106 (2) (a) (ii) of the Act, published notice of the proposed Order in the Snowy River Mail which is a newspaper circulating generally in the area to be affected by the Order.

(c) In accordance with section 106 (2) (b) of the Act, I am satisfied that all public statutory bodies which may be affected by the proposed Order have been adequately consulted about it.

- (b) the adequacy and appropriateness of buffer zones and other methods for protecting proven reserves and the implications on landowners or long-term zoning and sterilisation of their land for other uses; and
- (c) options to ensure protection of areas in which stone resources are only predicted or inferred on the basis of geological information and for which no demand can be immediately identified.

3. Utilising the information collected and work already completed by the previous Committee make recommendations which consider the previous Committee's interim report and comments made thereon together with the Supplementary Report of the Whittlesea Planning Scheme Amendment L50 Panel prepared by Marshall Baillieu.

4. Consider the adequacy of the *Extractive Industries Act 1966* for the development and effective regulation of the industry.

5. Identify options and recommend a preferred course of action including legislative changes necessary to give effect to the recommendations.

DECLARATION OF EXEMPTION

Under the powers found in section 6 of the *Retirement Villages Act 1986*, the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Attorney-General declares—

Glanville Village Hostel managed by Echuca District Hospital Inc. ("the Manager") and situated at corner Haverfield and Service Streets, Echuca to be an exempt village for the purposes of the following provisions of the *Retirement Villages Act 1986* ("the Act"):

1. Section 19 upon condition that, before a resident enters into any residence contract, the Manager or the Manager's agent gives to the resident all residence documents as defined in the Act relating to the village;
2. Section 24 sub-sections (2), (3), (4), (5), (6) and (7) upon condition that:
 - (1) A resident who signs a residence contract may at any time before the end of the period of 21 business days after signing the contract give notice to the Manager that the resident wishes to rescind the contract and, where the resident has signed the notice and given it in accordance with this paragraph, the contract is rescinded.
 - (2) A notice under paragraph 2 (1) must be given to the Manager or the Manager's agent or left at the address for service of the Manager specified in the residence contract or the address of the Manager's agent within 21 clear business days after the resident signs the contract.
 - (3) If a resident rescinds a contract under these paragraphs the resident is entitled to the return of all moneys paid by the resident under the contract, except for the sum of \$100 or 0.2 per centum of the ongoing contribution paid by the resident (whichever is the greater), which may be retained by the Manager.
 - (4) A contract to which these paragraphs apply must contain a conspicuous notice advising the resident that the resident may

before the end of 21 clear business days after the resident signs the contract give notice that the resident wishes to terminate the contract.

- (5) If a contract to which these paragraphs apply does not contain the notice required by paragraph 2 (4) a resident may rescind the contract.
 - (6) In these paragraphs "business day" means a day which is not a holiday within the meaning of section 44 (3) of the *Interpretation of Legislation Act 1984*;
 3. Section 33 upon condition that the information which would have been required to be presented at an Annual Meeting, is delivered to residents of the village (or their representatives) once a year, and an Annual Meeting is held if a written request is received from more than 20% of the residents in the village (or their representatives);
 4.
