

 NOTICE OF AMENDMENT TO A
 PLANNING SCHEME**

The City of Bendigo has prepared Amendment L35 to the Bendigo Planning Scheme. The amendment applies to land bounded by Finn, O'Dwyer and Koomba Streets, the Long Gully Creek, and to the east the Bendigo Linear Park.

The amendment proposes to change Planning Scheme Maps 1, 2 and 4 by rezoning the subject land (as shown on the map forming part of the amendment) from a Public Purpose 15, Mental Health Division Reservation and Proposed Public Purpose 11, Department of Conservation and Environment Reservation partly to a Residential zone and partly a Public Open Space 1, Public Park Reservation.

The amendment can be inspected at the Department of Planning and Development, Ground Floor, The Olderfleet Buildings, 477 Collins Street, Melbourne; the Department of Planning and Development, 426 Hargreaves Street, Bendigo; Loddon-Campaspe Regional Planning Authority, 261 Hargreaves Street, Bendigo and City of Bendigo, Municipal Offices, Lytleton Terrace, Bendigo.

**CITY OF FOOTSCRAY
 Local Law No. 17
 Notice of Proposed Local Law
 Streets and Roads (General Regulation) Local
 Law**

The Council of the City of Footscray proposes to make a Streets and Roads (General Regulation) Local Law to—

- (a) regulate the exhibition of merchandise on pavements;
- (b) regulate the exhibition of advertising signs on pavements;
- (c) regulate the placement of seats, tables, chairs and other furniture on pavements;
- (d) regulate the exhibition of merchandise and advertising signs on vehicles left standing near retail premises;
- (e) regulate the protrusion of verandahs and awnings into the airspace about pavements;
- (f) regulate the deposit of shopping trolleys in streets, car parks and other public places;

- (g) regulate the use of skateboards on pavements;
- (h) prohibit the dismantling and painting of vehicles on roads and in public places;
- (i) regulate the repair of vehicles on roads;
- (j) prevent the deposit of dog litter on roads and in other public places;
- (k) prohibit and destruction or removal of, or damage to, street furniture;
- (l) regulate the distribution of advertising and promotional material;
- (m) regulate the identification of premises;
- (n) regulate the growth of trees and plants so as to prevent accidents;
- (o) prohibit obstructions; and regulate behaviour on pavements;
- (p) provide for the construction and maintenance of permanent and temporary vehicle crossings.

DIVISION 1—PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS

Detail the title, purpose, authorising provision, commencement and revocation dates of the Local Law, area of operation, and definition of words and phrases used in the Local Law.

DIVISION 2—MERCHANDISE ON PAVEMENTS

Need for Permit

An owner or occupier of retail premises must not, without first obtaining a permit nor otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of such permit—

- (i) exhibit;
- (ii) place out for exhibition; or
- (iii) allow to be exhibited or place out for exhibition—

any merchandise on the pavement adjacent to, or near the retail premises.

Applications for Permit

Any person applying for a permit must lodge with the Municipal Clerk an Application in a form approved by Council, and any Application Fee fixed by Resolution of Council.

Council may in its discretion, grant the Application, grant the Application with conditions, or refuse to grant the Application.

Form of Permit

Any permit granted by Council shall be in a form approved by Council, and not be operative

until the Applicant pays any Permit Fee fixed by Resolution of Council.

DIVISION 3—EXHIBITION OF ADVERTISING SIGNS

An owner or occupier of retail premises must not, without first obtaining a permit nor otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of such permit—

- (i) exhibit;
- (ii) place out for exhibition; or
- (iii) allow to be exhibited or place out for exhibition—

any advertising sign on the pavement adjacent to, or near the retail premises.

Application for Permit

Any person applying for a permit must lodge with the Municipal Clerk an Application in a form approved by Council, and any Application Fee fixed by Resolution of Council.

Council may in its discretion, grant the Application, grant the Application with conditions, or refuse to grant the Application.

Form of Permit

Any permit granted by Council shall be in a form approved by Council, and not be operative until the Applicant pays any Permit Fee fixed by Resolution of Council.

DIVISION 4—FURNITURE ON PAVEMENTS

Need for Permit

An owner or occupier of retail premises must not, without first obtaining a permit nor otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of such permit—

- (i) provide for public or other use; or
- (ii) allow to be provided for public or other

use any—

- (v) seats;
- (w) umbrellas;
- (x) tables;
- (y) chairs; or
- (z) other furniture—

on the pavement—

- (aa) adjacent to; or
- (bb) near—

the retail premises.

Applications for Permits

Any person applying for a permit must lodge with the Municipal Clerk an Application in a

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form approved by Council, and any Application Fee fixed by Resolution of Council.

Council may in its discretion, grant the Application, grant the Application with conditions, or refuse to grant the Application.

Form of Permit

Any permit granted by Council shall be in a form approved by Council, and not be operative until the Applicant pays any Permit Fee fixed by Resolution of Council.

DIVISION 5—VEHICULAR ADVERTISING

Need for Permit

An owner or occupier of retail premises must not, without first obtaining a permit nor otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of such permit, leave standing on any road or in any public place a motor vehicle—

- (i) on which there is placed any merchandise referable to retail premises; or
- (ii) to which is fitted or otherwise attached an advertising sign which advertises any retail premises or merchandise.

Application for Permits

Any person applying for a permit must lodge with the Municipal Clerk an Application in a form approved by Council, and any Application Fee fixed by Resolution of Council.

Council may in its discretion, grant the Application, grant the Application with conditions, or refuse to grant the Application.

Form of Permit

Any permit granted by Council shall be in a form approved by Council, and not be operative until the Applicant pays any Permit Fee fixed by Resolution of Council.

DIVISION 6—PROTRUDING MATERIALS

Need for Permit

An owner or occupier of retail premises must not, without first obtaining a permit nor otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of such permit—

- (i) attach; or
- (ii) allow to be attached—
to any verandah or awning which forms part of the retail premises—
 - (y) an advertising sign; or
 - (z) any banner, flag, bunting or like decoration.

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Application for Permit

Any person applying for a permit must lodge with the Municipal Clerk an Application in a form approved by Council, and any Application Fee fixed by Resolution of Council.

Council may in its discretion, grant the Application, grant the Application with conditions, or refuse to grant the Application.

Form of Permit

Any permit granted by Council shall be in a form approved by Council, and not be operative until the Applicant pays any Permit Fee fixed by Resolution of Council.

DIVISION 7—SHOPPING TROLLEYS

General Obligation

A person must not leave a shopping trolley on a road, in a car park, or in any other public place.

Power to Impound

If an Authorised Officer finds a shopping trolley on a road, in a car park, or in any other public place, he or she may arrange for the shopping trolley to be removed to a place appointed or approved by Council, and be retained there subject to this Local Law.

Impound Shopping Trolleys

Where a shopping trolley has been impounded, Council may serve a notice on each of the persons who appear to be the owner of the shopping trolley.

Each notice must be served personally or by certified mail, and be in a form approved by Council.

Surrender of Shopping Trolleys

A shopping trolley which has been impounded must be surrendered to the owner or any person acting on the owner's behalf if—

- (a) in the event of a claim being made by a person acting on the owner's behalf, satisfactory evidence is provided of that person's authority from the owner; and
- (b) in the event, there is paid to Council a fee fixed by Resolution of Council.

Power to Sell, Destroy or Give Away

(a) If 14 days from the removal of a shopping trolley to a place appointed or approved by Council, and the shopping trolley is not surrendered to—

- (a) its owner; or
- (b) a person acting on its owner's behalf—
Council may—

- (i) destroy the shopping trolley;
 - (ii) deliver the shopping trolley to a municipal tip;
 - (iii) give the shopping trolley away; or
 - (iv) sell the shopping trolley by auction, public tender or private sale.
- (b) Where a shopping trolley is sold in accordance with sub-clause (a) (iv) above, the net proceeds from sale shall belong to the Council and be paid into the Municipal Fund.

DIVISION 8—STATIONARY VEHICLES ON ROADS

Dismantling and Painting Vehicles

A person must not assemble, dismantle or paint a vehicle on a road or in a public place.

Repairing Vehicles

A person must not repair a vehicle on a road or in a public place. This does not apply to a person who is repairing a vehicle because of any emergency or a breakdown.

DIVISION 9—SKATEBOARDS

A person must not ride or otherwise use any skateboard on a pavement so as to injure, inconvenience, or endanger the safety of any person using the pavement, or damage any premises which abut the pavement.

DIVISION 10—DOG LITTER

A person who is the effective control of a dog must not permit that dog to excrete faeces on a road, or in any other public place.

If a dog which is under the effective control of a person excretes faeces on a road, or in any other public place, that person must immediately remove the faeces, or cause the faeces to be removed.

DIVISION 11—STREET FURNITURE

A person must not without the authority of Council, destroy, remove, deface, interfere or tamper with, damage, or attack or affix an advertisement sign to any street furniture, or any tree or plant under the care and management of Council.

DIVISION 12—JUNK MAIL

(a) A person must not deliver, or cause to be delivered, to any part of premises, advertising or promotional material if the words "No Junk Mail" or words to the like effect are displayed on those premises or any part of those premises.

(b) A person on whose behalf advertising or promotional material is printed must give an Authorised Officer the name and address of the

person who was responsible for distributing and advertising or promotional material to the premises described in sub-clause (a).

(c) A person must comply with the obligation imposed by sub-clause (b) within seven days (7) days of receiving a written request for such information from the Authorised Officer.

(d) A person who engages another person (whether as an employee or agent) to deliver advertising or promotional material to premises described in sub-clause (a) must give an Authorised Officer the name and address of that other person.

(e) A person must comply with the obligation imposed by sub-clause (d) within seven (7) days of receiving a written request for such information from the Authorised Officer.

DIVISION 13—IDENTIFICATION OF PREMISES

(a) If Council has allotted a numbered premises abutting the road so that they may be identified, the owner and occupier of those premises must mark or cause to be marked, and maintain or cause to be maintained, that number on part of the premises.

(b) The number must be marked such that it can, at any reasonable time, be clearly seen by any person using the road which abuts such premises.

DIVISION 14—OVERHANGING VEGETATION

General Prohibition

The owner and occupier of land must not permit any tree or part of a tree, or plant or part of a plant, to grow in such a manner as to overhang the boundary of the land and obstruct or impair the vision of the driver of any vehicle travelling along a road abutting the land, or otherwise prejudice the safe and convenient use of any pavement or road abutting the land.

If an Authorised Officer reasonably suspects that an owner or occupier of land is contravening the above, he or she may serve a notice on the owner or occupier.

Upon receiving any such notice, the owner or occupier must cease his or her contravention in accordance with the notice.

DIVISION 15—OBSTRUCTIONS

General Prohibition

A person must not obstruct any road or pavement.

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This shall not extend to any person who holds or operates under a permit issued with the authority of an Act or this or another Local Law, or to whom section 4 (e) of the *Summary Offences Act 1966* applies.

Enforcement

If an Authorised Officer finds a person contravening the above, Council or that Authorised Officer, may remove the obstruction or cause the obstruction to be removed.

Any expenses incurred shall be a debt due and payable to the Council by the person found to be contravening.

DIVISION 16—VEHICLE CROSSINGS

Permanent Vehicle Crossings

The owner and occupier of premises must not, without first obtaining a permit nor otherwise in accordance with the conditions of such permit, construct or cause to be constructed, and maintain or cause to be maintained, a permanent vehicle crossing.

General Prohibition

An owner or occupier of land who proposes to carry out, or cause to be carried out, building works on the land must not, unless the vehicle crossing adequately protects any pavement, drain, culvert or kerb adjacent to or near the land, commence the building works, or allow the building works to be commenced, without constructing a temporary vehicle crossing.

Need for Permit

An owner or occupier of land must not, without first obtaining a permit nor otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of such permit, construct or cause to be constructed, a temporary vehicle crossing.

If Council is satisfied that a permanent or temporary vehicle crossing is no longer required, or is no longer of use, it may serve on the owner or occupier who constructed the permanent or temporary vehicle crossing, a notice requiring him or her to remove or reconstruct the permanent or temporary vehicle crossing, or cause it to be removed or constructed, within 30 days of service,

If a person does not comply in accordance with the notice, Council may remove or reconstruct it, or cause it to be removed or reconstructed, and recover the costs of doing so from that person.

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Application for Permits

Any person applying for a permit must lodge with the Municipal Clerk an Application in a form approved by Council, and any Application Fee fixed by Resolution of Council.

Council may in its discretion, grant the Application with conditions, or refuse to grant the Application.

Form and Operation of Permit

Any permit granted by Council shall be in a form approved by Council and may contain any guidelines or policy adopted by Council from time to time, and not be operative until the Applicant pays any Permit Fee fixed by Resolution of Council.

DIVISION 17—BEHAVIOUR ON PAVEMENT

A person must not, without the authority of Council—

- (a) use or play any musical or broadcasting equipment, or use any loud-hailer, on a pavement;
- (b) solicit custom or gifts of money on a pavement;
- (c) organise or sponsor any demonstration, exhibition, entertainment, meeting or other gathering on a pavement;
- (d) distribute any handbill, pamphlet, paper or like material on a pavement; or
- (e) preach, declaim, harangue or deliver an address on a pavement.

DIVISION 18—GENERAL PROVISIONS

Advertisement of Applications

(a) Before considering any Application under this Local Law, Council may require the Applicant to—

- (i) give notice of the Application to any persons whom Council considers may be detrimentally affected by the grant of the Application; and
- (ii) publish notice of the Application in a newspaper generally circulating in the municipal district.

(b) Every notice given or published must consist of—

- (i) a true copy or summary of the Application;
- (ii) an indication that Council will consider the Application after the expiry of 14 days following the giving or publication of the notice;

- (iii) an indication that all persons affected by the grant of an Application may send to Council any written submissions they may have in relation to the Application; and
 - (iv) an indication that all written submissions received within 14 days of the date of the notice will be taken into account in the determination of the Application.
- (c) Where Council has required the giving or publication of a notice it must not further consider the Application until—
- (i) it is satisfied that the Applicant has given and/or published the notice in the required manner; and
 - (ii) at least 14 days have elapsed since the giving or publication of the notice.
- (d) All written submissions received within the 14 day period must be considered by Council or a special committee of Council.

- (b) for a subsequent offence, not exceeding 20 penalty units (\$2000.00).

A copy of the proposed Local Law can be obtained from the Administration Department, 2nd Floor, Municipal Offices, corner Napier and Hyde Streets, Footscray.

Written submissions regarding the proposal received at the Municipal Offices, Napier Street (PO Box 58), Footscray 3011 within 14 days of the date of this notice will be considered by the Resources and Planning Committee of the Council in accordance with section 223 of the *Local Government Act 1989*, and any person who has made a written submission and requested to be heard in support of that submission shall be entitled to appear in person, or by a person acting on his or her behalf, before the Resources and Planning Committee.

Revocation of Permits

If, in the opinion of Council, a permit-holder fails to comply with any conditions of the permit, or obstruct or unduly interferes with pedestrian traffic, it may involve revoke the permit.

Correction of Permits

Council may correct a permit if it contains a clerical error, omission or mistake.

Currency of Permits

Unless revoked, a permit will continue in force for the period specified in the permit, or for 12 months if no period is specified, and the permit holder must not assign, transfer or encumber his or her permit.

Record of Permits

Council must keep a record of all permits issued under this Local Law.

Infringement Notices

Provides for the serving of Infringement Notices as an alternative to prosecution.

Offences and Penalties

A person who contravenes this Local Law is guilty of an offence, and liable to a penalty—

- (a) for an initial offence, not exceeding 10 penalty units (\$1000.00);

CITY OF FOOTSCRAY Notice of Proposed Local Law Streets and Roads (Parking) Local Law Local Law No. 16

The Council of the City of Footscray proposes to make a Streets and Roads (Parking) Local Law to—

- (a) regulate parking within the municipal district; and
- (b) make provision for—
 - (i) resident parking schemes; and
 - (ii) parking by disabled drivers.

DIVISION 1—PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS

Details the title, purpose, authorising provision, commencement and revocation dates of the Local Law, area of operation, and definition of words and phrases used in the Local Law.

DIVISION 2—PARKING

Clause 7

- (a) The owner of; and
- (b) A person who leaves a motor vehicle standing in a parking area must ensure that such motor vehicle is not left standing in that parking area—
 - (i) on a day other than a day;
 - (ii) at a time other than a time; or
 - (iii) for a period exceeding a period—
allowed by Council.

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DIVISION 3—RESIDENT PARKING
SCHEMES

Resident Parking Areas

Clause 8

Council may set aside an area as a "resident parking area".

Residents may be Applicants

Clause 9

A person who resides within an area set aside as a "resident parking area" may apply for a parking permit in respect of each motor vehicle of which he or she is the sole or joint owner or user, together with a parking permit referable to any person visiting him or her.

Applicants for Permits

Clause 10

The applicant must lodge with the Municipal Clerk an Application in a form approved by Council.

Clause 11

The Council may, in its discretion, grant an Application, grant an Application with conditions, or refuse to grant an Application.

Issue and Form of Permit

Clause 12

Any permit granted by Council shall be in A form approved by Council, and effective only upon the payment of any permit fee fixed by Resolution of Council.

Revocation of Permit

Clause 13

If, in the opinion of Council—

- (a) the permit-holder has failed to comply with the conditions of the permit;
- (b) there has been a material misstatement or concealment of fact in relation to the grant of the permit;
- (c) there has been a material change of circumstances since the grant of the permit; or
- (d) the permit-holder no longer resides within the area set aside as a "resident parking area"—

it may revoke the permit.

Currency of Permit

Clause 14

(a) Unless it is sooner revoked, a permit will continue in force for the period specified in the permit; and

(b) The permit-holder must not assign, transfer or encumber his or her permits.

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Obligations of Permit-Holder

Clause 15

A permit-holder or other person visiting the permit-holder must—

- (a) affix the relevant permit against or adjacent to the interior of the windscreen of the relevant motor vehicle; and
- (b) ensure that all—
 - (i) printed material; and
 - (ii) figures and symbols—appearing on the permit are capable of being read by any person standing immediately beside the motor vehicle.

Rights of Permit-Holder

Clause 16

A permit-holder or person visiting the permit-holder under this Division who complies with—

- (a) Clause 15; and
 - (b) the conditions of the relevant permit;
- shall be exempt from Clause 9 if any motor vehicle owned or used (whether solely or jointly) by him or her is left standing in a "resident parking area".

DIVISION 4—COUPON PARKING

Coupon Parking Area

Clause 17

Council may set aside an area as a "coupon parking area".

General Prohibition

Clause 18

The owner of any motor vehicle which is left standing in a "coupon parking area" must ensure that a coupon—

- (a) issued by or on behalf of Council;
 - (b) validated in accordance with the instructions detailed in such coupon—
- is immediately and remains affixed against or adjacent to the interior of the windscreen of the motor vehicle, such that all—

- (i) printed material; and
 - (ii) figures and symbols—
- appearing on the coupon are capable of being read by any person standing immediately beside the motor vehicle.

Clause 19

The owner of any motor vehicle which is left standing in a "coupon parking area" and who complies with Clause 18 must ensure that—

- (a) such motor vehicle is not left standing for a period exceeding that—

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- (i) which is allowed; or
- (ii) for which the coupon is or remains operative;
- (b) the coupon affixed in accordance with Clause 18 is not transferred to any other motor vehicle; and
- (c) any conditions appearing on the coupon are observed.

**DIVISION 5—PARKING AND DISABLED
MOTORISTS
General Prohibition**

Clause 20

A person must not, without a disabled person's parking permit nor otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of such a permit—

- (a) leave a motor vehicle standing; or
- (b) own a motor vehicle which has been left standing—

in a parking space set aside for the holder of a "disabled person's parking motorist permit".

Privileges of Permit-Holder

Clause 21

Notwithstanding Clause 9, a person may leave a vehicle standing in a parking area for twice the period allowed by Council if—

- (a) there is exhibited on the vehicle a "disabled person's parking permit";
- (b) the manner of exhibition is in accordance with the Code of the Disabled Person's Parking Scheme; and
- (c) the vehicle is left standing in accordance with the conditions of the permit.

Infringement Notices

Clause 22

Local Law No. 2 constitutes part of this Local Law.

Part 2—

- (a) controls and regulates the movement of vehicles likely to damage roads;
- (b) controls and regulates the movement of livestock travelling on roads;
- (c) controls and regulates the movement of horses on roads within urban areas; and
- (d) controls and regulates the short term grazing of livestock on roads.

Part 3—

- (a) controls and regulates the use of advertising signs on roads;
- (b) controls and regulates roadside trading on roads;
- (c) controls and regulates the display of goods for sale on roads;
- (d) controls and regulates any outdoor eating facilities on roads;
- (e) controls and regulates the use of bulk rubbish containers on roads;
- (f) controls and regulates the occupation of the roads for works;
- (g) prohibits the use of roads for the maintenance of vehicles other than maintenance necessary to move them;
- (h) prohibits the depositing of substances on roads from vehicles or livestock within the municipal district; and
- (i) regulates and controls street parties, street festivals and processions within the municipal district.

Part 4—

- (a) controls and regulates the use of loading ramps for livestock abutting a road or on a road within the municipal district; and
- (b) authorises Council to move any unlawful obstructions from a road within the municipal district.

Part 5—

- (a) controls and regulates the planting of trees and other flora on roads to ensure the free passage of people and goods on those roads;
- (b) controls and regulates the naming of roads and allocation of property numbers abutting those roads;
- (c) controls and regulates the use and construction of vehicle crossings;

- (d) controls and regulates fencing of properties abutting roads to ensure animals are contained on the property, and kept from entering the property when being driven along a road; and
- (e) requires that all fencing on titled boundaries abutting a road be constructed on the correct title boundary so as not to encroach on any adjacent road.

Any person affected by the proposed Local Law may make a written submission relating to the proposed Local Law in accordance with section 223 of the *Local Government Act 1989*. Any submissions must be received at the Shire Offices by 11 June 1993.

If making a submission, an affected person may request to be heard in support of this submission, and appear in person or have another person on their behalf before the Council or a committee of the Council.





PETITION

Section 355 (a) and (aa)

I, Ivan Pavlekovich-Smith, who was a registered Senate Candidate (Vic) for the 13 March 1993 Federal Parliamentary Elections, do hereby swear the following:

On 2 March 1993 I facsimile transmitted a letter of appeal to the Queen and the Governor-General regarding the undemocratic conduct of the election. I stated that incumbent Members of Parliament (MPs) had and still have a political advantage over all other candidates in that they received taxpayer funded benefits/entitlements during the campaign and use these benefits/entitlements directly for their campaigns. These benefits/entitlements are not illegal but they are definitely advantageous in the quest to be elected. All other candidates did not receive such entitlements during the campaign. I might also add that the entitlements, having few restrictions, were enacted by incumbent MPs for incumbent MPs.

The Constitution states in section 1 that:

The legislative power of the Commonwealth shall be vested in a Federal Parliament, which shall consist of the Queen, a Senate, and a House of Representatives, and which hereinafter called "The Parliament", or "The Parliament of the Commonwealth".

I appealed directly to the Queen to "do what is necessary in order to achieve a democratic election". Since the Parliament consisted of the Queen etc. then I had in fact raised the issue of a disputed election in Parliament and under section 47 of The Constitution the Queen or her representative would be responsible to determine the question/appeal.

The Governor-General acknowledged my letter of appeal and had directed the Electoral Commissioner to consider the appeal. I have in my possession the Governor-General's letter dated 4 March 1993.

On 5 March 1993 I made an application in the Federal Court seeking an injunction to suspend the Federal Parliamentary Elections until the appeal was determined.

It was my political right to make such an application and it was considered appropriate by the Crown Solicitors of Vic, NSW, ACT, NT, WA, SA and Tas, as they did not wish to intervene in my Constitutional Challenge in the Federal Court. I did not get a response from the Federal Attorney-General's office.

It should be noted that my appeal to the Queen was not considered frivolous, vexatious or an abuse of process by the Governor-General.

The Federal Court refused to accept my application citing ORDER 46 RULE 7A—ABUSE OF PROCESS. I have a note signed by the District Registrar Peter Seccombe stating that "Justice Jenkinson refuses to accept or issue the document submitted by me or any document in the same terms". I requested a formal explanation for the refusal. Peter Seccombe handed back two of the three copies I had submitted. The Court had in fact kept a copy of my application together with my application to waive all fees.

A Federal Court letter dated 22 March (9 days after polling day) was received by me stating that "his honour does not propose to provide written reasons to" my note requesting an explanation for refusal to accept my application.

I believe that my political liberty to seek an injunction was hindered or interfered with and under section 327 of the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918, I petition the Court of Disputed Returns to grant the reliefs I seek.

To date, the Queen, the Governor-General and the Commonwealth Electoral Commissioner have not determined my appeal regarding the undemocratic conduct of the election. Correspondence has been received by me from the Electoral Commissioner and the Department of Administrative Services explaining the legality of the entitlements and funding. I am aware that the entitlements and funding are legal but my concern is that they advantaged the incumbent MPs in the 13 March 1993 Federal Parliamentary Elections.

Section 355 (b)

My prayer requests the following relief:

- (i) That the 13 March 1993 Federal Parliamentary Elections be declared absolutely void due to the fact that incumbent Members of Parliament had an advantage over other candidates. During the election campaign incumbent MPs used their tax payer funded Parliamentary entitlements/benefits to assist their and/or their party's election campaign. All other candidates received no such entitlements/benefits.
- (ii) That the 13 March 1993 Federal Parliamentary Election be declared absolutely void due to interference with my political liberty to seek an injunction on 5 March 1993.
- (iii) That all candidates for future elections be treated equally according to democratic principles.
- (iv) That election funding by the tax payer be fairly distributed to all candidates.
- (v) That all candidates receive compensation for losses incurred in the event that the election is declared absolutely void.
- (vi) That a determination be made by the Court or by the Queen regarding the conduct of the election, i.e. Was each candidate given equal political rights according to democratic principals?
- (vii) That an independent investigation take place to determine why the Federal Attorney-General's office never responded to my Notice of Constitutional Matter and why they have not responded to my appeal to investigate the Federal Court's refusal to accept my injunction application of 5 March 1993?
- (viii) That all costs be waived in relation to this matter due to financial hardship. Find enclosed High Court official application.



“Approved lifejacket” means a lifejacket that—

"Coastal waters" means the territorial sea adjacent to the State and the sea on the landward side of that territorial sea that is not within the limits of the State.

"Flag" means a burgee white to the mast and blue to the fly, corresponding to Flag A of the International Code of Signals, indicating "diver below".

"Hire and Drive Vessel" means a vessel (other than a recreational vessel) that is intended to be let for hire or reward or for any other consideration and includes a vessel provided at a holiday establishment or hotel for the use of tenants or guests.

"Houseboat" means any boat, vessel or pontoon having a fixed house above the deck with accommodation which may be used by persons residing on board for an overnight period or longer.

"Inland waters" means waters within the limits of the State which are not within a port or an associated port under the *Port of Melbourne Authority Act 1958*, the *Port of Geelong Authority Act 1958* or the *Port of Portland Authority Act 1958*.

"No wash zone" means an area of water specified in a Schedule through which a vessel must only pass at a speed which creates minimal wash or no wash.

"Owner", in respect of a Hire and Drive vessel includes a part owner or a person who for the time being has possession of the vessel, but does not include a person who is a hirer or a person who has a conditional or unconditional right to take possession of the vessel under a hire purchase agreement, bill of sale or other similar instrument and who has not yet exercised that right.

"Power ski" includes an aqua-scooter, jet bike, jet ski, wave runner, wave jammer, ski-free, motorised surfboard and any similar vessel that has an engine used for propulsion.

"Schedule" means a Schedule to this notice.

"Speed restriction zone" means an area of water specified in a Schedule within which a vessel must not be operated in excess of the speed designated in the Schedule.

"State waters" means—

- (a) the territorial sea adjacent to the State; and
- (b) the sea on the landward side of the territorial sea adjacent to the State that is not within the limits of the State; and
- (c) waters within the limits of the State.

"Water-skier" means a person being towed by a vessel which has an engine that is used for propulsion whether or not the person is wearing water-skis or—

- (a) is being towed bare-footed; or
- (b) is being towed on a surfboard or similar device; or
- (c) is engaging in para-sailing or in a similar activity.

SPEED LIMITS AND SAFETY DISTANCES *State Waters*

2. A person must not operate a vessel on any State waters at a speed exceeding 5 knots—

- (a) within 30 metres of a person in the water; or
- (b) within 90 metres of a vessel or buoy on which is displayed a burgee or replica, white to the mast and blue to the fly corresponding to International Code Flag "A" indicating "diver below"; or
- (c) within 30 metres of another vessel excepting where both vessels are either—
 - (a) engaged in competition or in bona fide training organised in accordance with the rules of a

State or Nationally recognised water sporting association; or

- (b) within an exclusive area prescribed in a Schedule to this Notice which is set aside for a specific activity under Clause 13 in which the width of water prevents the keeping of that distance.

Inland Waters

3. Unless otherwise specified in a Schedule, a person must not operate a vessel on any inland waters at a speed exceeding 5 knots—

- (a) within 30 metres of the waters edge; or
(b) within 30 metres of a fixed or floating structure in or on the water—

except in an access lane.

Coastal Waters and Ports

4. Unless otherwise specified in a Schedule, a person must not operate a vessel in coastal waters or in a port or an associated port under the *Port of Melbourne Authority Act 1958*, the *Port of Geelong Authority Act 1958* or the *Port of Portland Authority Act 1958* at a speed exceeding 5 knots—

- (a) within 200 metres of the waters edge; or
(b) within 60 metres of a wharf, jetty, slipway, diving platform or boat ramp; or
(c) when passing through a recognised anchorage for small craft—

except in an access lane.

CATEGORISATION AND USE OF WATERS
Establishment of Access Lanes

5. (1) An area of water specified in a Schedule as an access lane for the purposes of this clause is an access lane.

(2) Subject to a Schedule specifying a different means of establishing an access lane, an access lane may be established—

- (a) by a line through green buoys on each side boundary of an access lane defining the boundary of that side of the access lane; or
(b) by a line extending 200 metres to seaward from the transit of two beacons on the shore on each side boundary of an access lane defining the boundary of that side of the access lane, the two beacons consisting of a

beacon having an orange disc topmark and a beacon between that beacon and the water having a black and yellow chequered triangular topmark.

Use of Access Lanes

6. (1) A person who—

- (a) operates a vessel which is towing a water-skier; or
(b) engages in the activities of a water-skier—

at a speed exceeding 5 knots must depart from and return to the shore only through an access lane.

(2) A person must not use an access lane except for the purposes of—

- (a) dropping off or picking up a water-skier; or
(b) launching or retrieving a vessel at a boat ramp when the ramp is located within an access lane; or
(c) operating a vessel whose operation necessitates unrestricted speed departure from and approach to the shore.

(3) A person operating any vessel in an access lane—

- (a) must not—
(i) if dropping off or picking up a water-skier, operate the vessel at a speed greater than that reasonably required to drop off or pick up the water-skier; or
(ii) if operating a vessel for the purposes of seeking access to or from a boat ramp within the access lane, operate that vessel at a speed greater than that reasonably required to maintain control of the vessel; and
(b) must remove or beach the vessel and secure all equipment as soon as practicable after accomplishing the purpose for which he or she entered the access lane; and
(c) must keep—
(i) as far to the right as practicable when entering or leaving the access lane; or
(ii) as far to the left as possible when entering or leaving the access lane where a Schedule prescribes that vessels must be operated in a

clockwise direction in relation to the approximate centre of the waterway; and

- (d) must give right of way—
- (i) to any vessel proceeding past the access lane; or
 - (ii) to any vessel about to enter or which is already in the access lane for the purpose of dropping off a water-skier; or
 - (iii) to a vessel which is about to enter or is already in the access lane for the purpose of gaining access to a boat ramp located in the access lane.

Speed Restriction Zones

7. (1) A person must not operate a vessel at a speed exceeding the speed specified in a Schedule for an area of water specified in the Schedule.

(2) Despite sub-clause (1), a speed restriction specified in a Schedule for an area of water may be expressed so as not to apply on particular days or at particular times specified in the Schedule.

Areas where Water-skiers are Prohibited

8. A person operating a vessel towing a water-skier or a water-skier must not enter an area of water specified in a Schedule as an area where water-skiers are prohibited.

Areas where Vessels are Prohibited

9. (1) A person must not operate a vessel in an area of water specified in a Schedule as being prohibited to vessels.

(2) Despite sub-clause (1), a prohibition on vessels specified in a Schedule may be expressed so as not to apply on particular days, or at particular times, or to particular vessels, or to particular vessels travelling at designated speeds.

Prohibition on Vessels with Engines

10. (1) A person must not operate a vessel which has an engine that is used for propulsion in an area of water specified in a Schedule as being prohibited to those vessels.

(2) Despite sub-clause (1), a prohibition on vessels with engines used for propulsion specified in a Schedule may be expressed to apply to vessels with engines of a particular type or capacity.

No Wash Zones

11. A person must operate a vessel in a manner which creates minimal wash or no wash in an area of water specified in a Schedule as a no wash zone.

Prohibition of Specific Activities

12. A person must not operate a vessel or engage in an activity when that operation or activity is prohibited in an area of water specified in a Schedule.

Exclusive Use and Special Purpose Areas

13. Where an area of water specified in a Schedule has a condition or conditions of use prescribed in the Schedule for the use of that area of water, a person must not use that area of water in contravention of the condition or conditions of use.

Direction of Travel on Inland Waters

14. A person must operate a vessel with an engine used for propulsion on inland waters—

- (a) in an anti-clockwise direction in relation to the approximate centre of the waterway; or
- (b) in a clockwise direction where a Schedule prescribes that such a vessel must be operated in that direction in relation to the approximate centre of the waterway—

except when the vessel is operating in a speed restriction zone or an access lane or is being operated at a speed of less than 5 knots.

Giving Way

15. A person operating a vessel with an engine used for propulsion must give way to all other vessels when departing from the shore at any location.

BATHERS

Areas where Bathers are Prohibited

16. A person must not bathe—

- (a) within 30 metres of any launching ramp that is being used or is about to be used for the launching or recovery of any vessel; or
- (b) within an access lane.

SAILBOARDS

Operation of Sailboards

17. A person operating a sailboard or similar vessel on any State waters—

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- (a) must not impede the progress of a tug or other vessel assisting the movement, berthing or unberthing of a vessel;
- (b) must not approach within 200 metres of any berth used for the purposes of commercial shipping;
- (c) must not cross a shipping channel or shipping lane except when it is safe to do so and then by the shortest possible route;
- (d) must not navigate along or within a shipping channel or shipping lane.

WATER—SKIERS

Lifejackets etc. for Water-skiers

18. A water-skier must wear an approved lifejacket, an approved buoyancy vest, an approved buoyancy garment or an approved personal flotation device at all times.

Towing Water-skiers etc.

19. A person must not operate a vessel on any State waters—

- (a) when towing a water-skier unless in addition to the operator there is in the vessel a person aged 12 years old or more who is in a position to observe and communicate to the operator of the vessel the progress of the person being towed;
- (b) when towing more than 3 water-skiers or a lesser number as prescribed in a schedule;
- (c) when towing a water-skier between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise;
- (d) when towing a water-skier who is not wearing an approved lifejacket, an approved buoyancy vest, an approved buoyancy garment or an approved personal flotation device.

EXCESSIVE SMOKE NOISE OR SMELL

Smoke or Smell

20. A person must not operate on any State waters a vessel which emits smoke or visible vapour or smell of such a quantity or extent as to be an annoyance or a danger to the public.

Noise

21. (1) A person must not operate on any State waters a vessel with an engine used for propulsion unless the vessel has a silencing device—

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- (a) securely fixed to its engine so that all the exhaust gases from the engine pass through the silencing device in such a manner as to prevent undue noise; and
 - (b) which does not have attached to it a cut out or a device capable of producing an open exhaust.
- (2) A person must not operate a vessel on any State waters which is creating undue noise.

DIVERS

Diving Operations

22. The operator of any recreational vessel or hire and drive vessel engaged in diving operations on any State waters must ensure that there is exhibited on that vessel where it can clearly be seen a flag indicating there is a diver below, or a rigid replica of that flag, and—

- (a) in the case of a vessel of 10 metres or more in length, the height of such flag or replica must not be less than 1 metre; and
- (b) in the case of a vessel of less than 10 metres in length, the minimum size of such flag or replica shall be 750 millimetres by 600 millimetres.

Divers' Personal Flags

23. (1) Subject to sub-clause (2) any person engaged in diving in any State waters must use a buoy attached to himself or herself by a length of rope, such buoy having attached to it a flag or a rigid replica of that flag, the dimensions of such flag or replica being not less than 300 millimetres by 200 millimetres.

(2) Sub-clause (1) does not apply to a person who—

- (a) is operating from a recreational vessel or hire and drive vessel which complies with the requirements of Clause 22; or
- (b) is within an area in which the operation of vessels is prohibited or in which vessels are not permitted to exceed a speed of 5 knots; or
- (c) is engaged in diving solely for recreation and is not equipped with any breathing apparatus designed to facilitate diving,

MOORING OR ANCHORING OF VESSELS
Vessel not to be Moored to Navigation Marker or Buoy

23A. The owner or the person in charge of a vessel must not permit that vessel to be moored, secured to or in any other way made fast to any navigation marker, beacon, buoy, pole or post fixed in or on any State waters.

Vessel not to be Anchored in Navigation Channel

23B. The owner or person in charge of a vessel must not permit that vessel to be anchored in any channel or in any other area of State waters so as to impede or potentially impede the safe navigation of any other vessel.

OBSTRUCTING CHANNELS
Boats, Persons or Equipment Obstructing Channels

23C. Where a channel or waterway has been obstructed by a vessel or its equipment, occupants or persons, the owner or person in charge of that vessel and equipment must remove the obstruction from the channel or waterway without undue delay.

GENERAL
Search and Rescue and Enforcement Vessels Exempted

24. The provisions of this notice do not apply to—

- (a) a person who is operating a search and rescue vessel in search and rescue operations; or
- (b) a person who is operating a vessel for the purpose of the enforcement of the *Marine Act 1988* and any Regulations and notices made under the Act.

HIRE AND DRIVE VESSELS
Owner of Hire and Drive Vessel to Comply with Regulations

25. The owner of a vessel must not permit that vessel to be used as a hire and drive vessel unless that vessel complies with regulation 601 of the *Marine (Vessels) Regulations 1988*.

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SCHEDULE 1
WATERS—THE PORT OF PORT PHILLIP
*Port Authority—The Port of Melbourne
Authority*

1. Excluded speed limit for the purposes of Clause 4 (a)

The waters of the Port of Port Phillip are not subject to the requirements of Clause 4 (a) of this notice.

2. Access lanes for the purposes of Clause 5
The waters of the Port of Port Phillip described below are access lanes:

- (a) An area between two lines extending to seaward, each line passing through a separate set of beacons the two sets of beacons being situated on the foreshore approximately 140 metres apart at Apex Reserve, Altona;
- (b) An area between two lines extending to seaward, one line passing through a set of beacons on the foreshore near the seaward end of Martin Street and the other line passing through another set of beacons on the foreshore between North Road and Kent Avenue, in the City of Brighton;
- (c) An area between two lines extending to seaward, one line passing through a set of beacons on the foreshore near the prolongation to seaward of Mundy Street and the other line passing through another set of beacons situated on the foreshore approximately 180 metres east of the Beaumaris Motor Yacht Squadron building, in the City of Mordialloc;
- (d) An area between two lines extending to seaward, each line passing through a separate set of beacons, the two sets of beacons being situated on the foreshore approximately 120 metres apart, between Park Lane and Alexandra Avenue, City of Chelsea;
- (e) An area between two lines extending to seaward, each line passing through a separate set of beacons, the two sets of beacons being situated on the foreshore approximately 120 metres apart, south of the prolongation to seaward of The Glade, City of Chelsea;
- (f) An area between two lines extending to seaward, each line passing through a separate set of beacons, the two sets of

beacons being situated on the foreshore approximately 120 metres apart, immediately south of the Riviera Outfall drain, Seaford;

- (h) An area between two lines extending to seaward, each line passing through a separate set of beacons, the two sets of beacons being situated on the foreshore approximately 90 metres apart, at Mills Beach, Mornington;
- (i) An area between two lines extending to seaward, each line passing through a separate set of beacons, the two sets of beacons being situated on the foreshore approximately 90 metres apart, at Mount Martha Beach north of Balcombe Creek;
- (j) An area between two lines extending to seaward, each line passing through a separate set of beacons, the two sets of beacons being situated on the foreshore approximately 140 metres apart, near Victoria Street, Safety Beach;
- (k) An area between two lines extending to seaward, each line passing through a separate set of beacons, the two sets of beacons being situated on the foreshore approximately 140 metres apart at the locality known as the Rocks, Dromana West;
- (l) An area between two lines extending to seaward, each line passing through a separate set of beacons, the two sets of beacons being situated on the foreshore approximately 90 metres apart, near Laura Street, Rye;
- (m) An area between two lines extending to seaward, each line passing through a separate set of beacons, the two sets of beacons being situated on the foreshore approximately 90 metres apart, near St. Aubins Way, Sorrento;
- (n) An area between two lines extending to seaward, one line passing through a set of beacons on the foreshore approximately 310 metres north-eastward of Point George and the other line passing through another set of beacons approximately 450 metres north-westward of Point George; Shire of Bellarine;
- (o) An area between two lines extending to seaward, each line passing through a

separate set of beacons, the two sets of beacons being situated on the foreshore approximately 140 metres apart opposite the southern end of the salt lake, St. Leonards.

Distance of Extension of Access Lanes

Access lanes on the waters of the Port of Port Phillip extend 200 metres from the edge of the water, except that in the case of Item 2 (k) and (l) above, the access lanes extend 760 metres from the edge of the water.

3. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

Unless otherwise specified in an item in this Schedule as an access lane under Clause 5 or as an exclusive use and special purpose area under Clause 13 of this notice, the following waters of Port Phillip are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots:

- (a) The waters between the shore and a line following the course of the shore at a distance of 200 metres from the low water mark on the foreshore between—
 - (i) A line extending to seaward at right angles to the shore from a post with a red triangular topmark on the foreshore approximately 150 metres south-westward of the Werribee River mouth and the prolongation to seaward of the western boundary of the Royal Australian Air Force Base, Point Cook; and
 - (ii) A line extending to seaward at right angles to the shore from a post with a red triangular topmark on the foreshore approximately 100 metres north of the mouth of Laverton Creek, Altona and a line extending to seaward at right angles to the shore from the boundary of the Port of Melbourne, Williamstown; and
 - (iii) The prolongation of seaward of McGregor Street, City of South Melbourne, and a line extending to seaward following the eastern side of Dromana Pier, Shire of Flinders; and
 - (iv) Blairgowrie Yacht Squadron slipway and a line extending from Point Nepean to Point Lonsdale lighthouse; and

- (v) A line extending from Point Lonsdale Lighthouse to Point Nepean and the southern boundary of the Port of Queenscliff; and
 - (vi) A line extending seawards at right angles to the shore at Edwards Point, south of St. Leonards and the prolongation to seaward of the western boundary of Sproat Street, Portarlington;
- (b) The waters between the shore from Dromana Pier to the Blairgowrie Yacht Squadron slipway and a line commencing at the north-east corner of the Dromana Pier, passing through white single pile beacons standing within 760 metres of the low water mark on the foreshore and ending at the north-west corner of the Blairgowrie Yacht Squadron slipway;
 - (c) The waters of the Port of Port Phillip that form the waters—
 - (i) of St. Kilda Harbour southward of a line extending from the north-western end of the stone breakwater to the prolongation to seaward of Fraser Street; and
 - (ii) of Brighton Harbour southward of a line extending from the northern end of the stone breakwater to the prolongation to seaward of Bay Street; and
 - (iii) of Sandringham Harbour southward of a line extending from the northern end of the stone breakwater to the Hampton Lifesaving Club club-house; and
 - (iv) of Half Moon Bay south-eastward of a line extending from Red Bluff to the hulk of the Cerberus; and
 - (v) south-westward of a line extending from the north-east corner of the Mornington Pier to the north-east corner of the Mornington Lifesaving Club clubhouse; and
 - (vi) of the Werribee River, Mordialloc Creek, Patterson River and Kannanook Creek;
 - (d) Within 100 metres of the western side of the stone breakwaters forming St. Kilda Harbour, Brighton Harbour and Sandringham Harbour.

4. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The following waters of the Port of Port Phillip are prohibited to vessels:

- (a) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore near Mount Street, Altona, and extending approximately 240 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 200 metres in a westerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending northward to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (b) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore near Garden Street, Williamstown, and extending approximately 150 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 250 metres in a westerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending northward to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (ba) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore near Langridge Street, South Melbourne and extending approximately 120 metres to seaward to a yellow buoy or pile thence by a line extending in a north-westerly direction which is an extension of the seaward boundary of the "No Boating" area described in Schedule 2 Item 2, to the boundary with the Port of Melbourne;
- (c) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore near the St. Kilda Life Saving Club clubhouse and extending approximately 170 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 300 metres in a northerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending northerly to the seaward end of the groyne immediately south of the St. Kilda Pier; thence by a line extending eastward to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (d) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore near the Elwood Life Saving Club clubhouse and extending approximately 150 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 200 metres in a south-easterly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending in a north-easterly direction to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (e) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore near the Brighton Life Saving Club clubhouse and extending approximately 120 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 270 metres in a south-easterly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending eastward to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (f) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore near the Sandringham Lifesaving Club clubhouse and extending approximately 140 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 500 metres in a north-westerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending eastwards to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (g) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore north of Half Moon Bay Lifesaving Club clubhouse and extending approximately 90 metres to seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 200 metres in a northerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending easterly to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (h) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore north of Black Rock Lifesaving Club clubhouse and extending approximately 130 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or

- pile; thence by a line extending approximately 230 metres in a south-easterly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending north-easterly to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (ha) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore approximately 30 metres west of the Beaumaris Life Saving Club and extending approximately 150 metres to seaward to a yellow buoy or pile thence by a line extending approximately 400 metres in an easterly direction to a yellow buoy or pile, thence by a line extending in a northerly direction to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (i) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore near Kitchener Street, Mentone and extending approximately 150 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 280 metres in a north-westerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending north-easterly to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (j) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore near the Mordialloc Life Saving Club clubhouse and extending approximately 170 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 300 metres in a north-westerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending north-easterly to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (k) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore near Foster Street, Aspendale and extending approximately 170 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 350 metres in a south-easterly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending north-easterly to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (l) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore near Avondale Avenue, Chelsea, and extending approximately 170 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 270 metres in a south-easterly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending eastwards to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (m) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore near Williams Grove, Bonbeach and extending approximately 170 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 250 metres in a southerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending eastwards to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (n) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore at the Carrum Life Saving Club clubhouse and extending approximately 170 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 270 metres in a southerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending eastwards to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (o) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore near Wells Street, Frankston and extending approximately 170 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 160 metres in a southerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending eastwards to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (oa) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore north-east of Mornington Life Saving Club clubhouse at Mills Beach and extending approximately 150 metres to seaward in a north-westerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile thence by a line extending south-westwards to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;

- (p) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore near Williams Road, Mornington and extending approximately 180 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 170 metres in a northerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending eastwards to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (q) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore near Dominion Road, Mt Martha and extending approximately 130 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 150 metres in a southerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending eastwards to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (r) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore north of Balmoral Avenue, Safety Beach and extending approximately 170 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 220 metres in a south-westerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending south-easterly to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (s) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore north of St. Leonards Jetty and extending approximately 120 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 300 metres in a north-westerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending south-westerly to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (t) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore near Pigdon Street, Indented Head and extending approximately 120 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 300 metres in a south-easterly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending south-westerly to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (u) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore west of Portarlington Jetty and extending approximately 100 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 300 metres in a westerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending southwards to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore.

5. Prohibition of specific activities of the purposes of Clause 12.

(a) The following waters of the Port of Port Phillip are prohibited for the use of power skis and sailboards:

- (i) The waters extending from the waters edge to 200 metres seaward between the northern boundary of the "Boating Only" Zone described in Item 6 (b) and the boundary with the Port of Melbourne;
- (ii) The waters extending from the waters edge to seaward between the northern boundary of the "Sailboard Exclusive Use" Zone described in Item 6 (d) and the alignment of the Frankston Jetty, Frankston. The seaward boundary defined by a line between the seaward end of the Frankston jetty and the north-west corner of the "Sailboard Exclusive Use" Zone.

(b) The following waters of the Port of Port Phillip are prohibited for the use of power skis:

- (i) The waters extending from the waters edge to 200 metres to seaward between an extension of the alignment of Royal Avenue, Sandringham and an extension to seaward of the northern alignment of Second Street, City of Sandringham and northward to Black Rock Point, Half Moon Bay.
- (ii) The waters extending from the waters edge to 200 metres seaward between a position on the foreshore on an extension of the alignment of Bay Street, Mordialloc and an extension to seaward of the alignment of the "No Boating" Zone near the Mordialloc Life Saving Club described in Item 4 (j)

- (iii) The waters extending from the waters edge to 200 metres seaward between an extension to seaward of the alignments of Sproat Street and Brown Street, Portarlington.

6. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purposes of Clause 13.

- (a) The following waters of the Port of Port Phillip are set aside for the use of vessels only and are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots:

- (i) The waters bounded by a line commencing at the seaward end of Mordialloc Pier and following the south eastern side of such pier and the retaining wall along the northern bank of the creek to a line joining opposite banks of the creek at a position 30 metres upstream from the eastern alignment of the road bridge crossing such creek; thence by a line crossing such creek; thence by a line following the southern bank of the creek to the seaward end of the rock groyne at the mouth; thence by a line following the prolongation of such groyne to seaward to a position opposite the seaward end of Mordialloc Pier; thence to the point of commencement;

- (ii) The waters from a north-south line joining opposite banks of the Patterson River 30 metres upstream from the eastern alignment of the railway bridge crossing such river; thence by lines following the northern and southern banks of the river and the prolongations thereof to seaward into Port Phillip Bay to a position 100 metres from shore; thence by a north-south line joining such prolongations.

- (b) Between sunrise and sunset the following waters of the Port of Port Phillip are set aside for the exclusive use of vessels:

The waters extending from the waters edge to a distance of 200 metres to seaward between two lines extending in an approximate south-westerly direction. The alignment of each line is marked by a "Boating Only" sign on

the foreshore and red and yellow striped buoys in the water. The southern sign is positioned on the approximate extension of the alignment of Fraser Street and the northern sign on the approximate extension of the alignment of Langridge Street, South Melbourne.

- (c) Between sunrise and sunset the following waters of the Port of Port Phillip are set aside for the exclusive use of power skis.

- (i) The waters extending from the water edge to a distance of 200 metres to seaward between two lines extending to seaward. The alignment of each line is marked by a "Power Skis Only" sign on the foreshore and red and yellow striped buoys in the water. The two "Power Skis Only" signs are positioned approximately 20 metres and 300 metres north-east of the Olivers Hill Boat ramp, Frankston.

- (d) Between sunrise and sunset the following waters of the Port of Port Phillip are set aside for the exclusive use of sailboards:

The waters extending from the waters edge to a distance of 200 metres to seaward between two lines extending to seaward. The alignment of each line is marked by a "Sailboards Only" Sign on the foreshore and buoys in the water. The two "Sailboards Only" signs are positioned approximately 300 metres and 400 metres north-east of Olivers Hill boat ramp, Frankston. The southern boundary buoys are red and yellow striped and the northern boundary buoys yellow.

- (e) Patterson River entrance—control of vessels.

A person in charge of a vessel in the waters of the Patterson River downstream of the Nepean Highway road bridge crossing the river, must not—

- (i) anchor or moor the vessel; or
- (ii) beach the vessel on either bank between the road bridge and the river entrance except for the

purpose of rigging or unrigging masts in the minimum time necessary prior to or subsequent to proceeding under the Patterson River bridges—

unless prior permission has been obtained from an officer authorised by the Port of Melbourne Authority or unless compelled by an emergency.

SCHEDULE 2
WATERS—THE PORT OF MELBOURNE
Port Authority—The Port of Melbourne Authority

1. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The following waters of the Port of Melbourne are prohibited to vessels:

- (a) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore west of the Middle Park Life Saving Club clubhouse and extending approximately 110 metres to seaward to a yellow buoy or pile thence by a line extending in a south-easterly direction towards the yellow buoy or pile described in Item 4 (ba) of Schedule 1 to this Notice, to the boundary with the Port of Port Phillip.
- (b) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore south-east of the South Melbourne Life Saving Club clubhouse and extending approximately 110 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 200 metres in a north-westerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending in a north-easterly direction to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;
- (c) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore south-east of the Port Melbourne Life Saving Club clubhouse and extending approximately 200 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 270 metres in a north-westerly direction to a yellow marker on the pier; thence by a line extending in a north-easterly direction

to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore;

- (d) The waters bounded by a line commencing at a "No Boating" sign situated on the foreshore south-east of the Sandridge Life Saving Club clubhouse and extending approximately 140 metres seaward to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending approximately 135 metres in a south-westerly direction to a yellow buoy or pile; thence by a line extending in a north-westerly direction to a "No Boating" sign on the foreshore.

2. Prohibition of specific activities for the purposes of Clause 12.

The waters of the Port of Melbourne that extend from the waters edge to 200 metres seaward between an extension of the alignment of Pickles Street, South Melbourne and the boundary with the Port of Port Phillip are prohibited for the use of power skis and sailboards.

SCHEDULE 3
WATERS—THE YARRA RIVER
Local Authority—Melbourne Water Corporation

1. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of the Yarra River upstream of Spencer Street Bridge are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

SCHEDULE 4
WATERS—THE MARIBYRNONG RIVER
Local Authority—Melbourne Water Corporation

1. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of the Maribymong River upstream of Shepherds Bridge on Footscray Road are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

SCHEDULE 5
WATERS—THE PORT OF WESTERN PORT
Port Authority—The Port of Melbourne Authority

1. Excluded speed limit for the purposes of Clause 4 (a).

Those waters of the Port of Western Port which are not otherwise specified as a 5 knot speed restriction zone, access lane, an area

prohibited to vessels, or exclusive use area are excluded from the provisions of Clause 4 (a) of this notice.

2. Access lanes for the purposes of Clause 5.

The following waters of the Port of Western Port are access lanes:

- (a) The waters between two lines extending to seaward, one line passing through a set of beacons on the foreshore near the prolongation to seaward of Coughlans Road, Cowes and the other line passing through a set of beacons on the foreshore approximately 140 metres westward of that prolongation;
- (b) The waters between two lines extending to seaward, one line passing through a set of beacons on the foreshore near the mouth of Saltwater Creek, Ventnor and the other line passing through a set of beacons on the foreshore approximately 140 metres north-eastward of the mouth of that creek.

3. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The following waters of the Port of Western Port are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots:

- (a) The waters within 200 metres to seaward from the edge of the water for the time being between—
 - (i) two lines extending to seaward at right angles to the shores, one line extending from a beacon on the foreshore at the northern boundary of the West Head firing range and the other line extending from a similar beacon on the foreshore approximately 100 metres north of Flinders Jetty;
 - (ii) two lines extending to seaward at right angles to the shore, one line extending from a beacon on the foreshore at Point Leo and the other line extending from a similar beacon on the foreshore at the prolongation to seaward of South Beach Road, Somers;
 - (iii) two lines extending to seaward at right angles to the shores, one line extending from a beacon on the foreshore approximately 60 metres north of the Lang Lang boat

ramp and the other line extending from a similar beacon on the foreshore at Bluff Point;

- (iv) two lines extending to seaward at right angles to the shore, one line extending from a beacon near the prolongation to seaward of Norseman's Road and the other line extending from a similar beacon on the foreshore near the prolongation to seaward of Cutty Sark Road, Coronet Bay;
 - (v) two lines extending to seaward at right angles to the shore, one line extending from the navigation light beacon at McHaffies Point, Ventnor, and the other line extending from a beacon on the foreshore near the northern prolongation of the boundary between Crown Allotment 94A and the 102nd S.E.C. Reserve;
 - (vi) two lines extending to seaward at right angles to the shore, one line extending from a beacon on the foreshore near the seaward end of Reid Road, Rhyll, and the other line extending from a similar beacon on the foreshore near the seaward end of Zelma Drive, Rhyll;
 - (vii) two lines extending to seaward at right angles to the shore, one line extending from a beacon on the foreshore near the seaward end of Boys Home Road, Newhaven, and the other line extending from a similar beacon on the foreshore approximately 250 metres south of the seaward end of Cottlesloe Road in the area known as Woolamai Waters.
- (b) The waters of Rutherford Inlet between—
 - (i) a line joining speed limit notices on opposite shores approximately 800 metres south of Warneet South Jetty; and
 - (ii) a line joining speed limit notices on opposite shores approximately 450 metres east of the overhead electric power cables running north and south over Rutherford

Inlet between the townships of Warneet and Cannons Creek—

but excluding those waters of Rutherford Inlet, locally known as Tommy's Inlet, which are delineated by a line joining speed limit notices on opposite shores at the entrance to Tommy's Inlet, the easternmost of which is in a position approximately 900 metres north of the navigation light on the seaward end of Warneet South Jetty;

- (c) The waters of Sawtell's Inlet upstream from a line joining speed limit notices on opposite shores at the entrance to such inlet;
- (d) The waters of Hastings Bight north of a line extending south-westerly from a white survey beacon on Long Island Point to a beacon with a red triangular topmark on the foreshore approximately 1000 metres south of Hastings jetty;
- (e) The waters of Rhyll Inlet west of a line extending northward from a sign on the foreshore near the northern prolongation of McIlwraith Road, Rhyll to a similar sign on Observation Point.

4. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of the Port of Western Port inshore of a line commencing at a beacon with a red triangular topmark on Erehwon Point, Phillip Island, thence north-westerly to a sign inscribed "No Boating" on Cowes Jetty approximately 70 metres from its root; thence along the eastern side of that jetty to the shore are prohibited to vessels.

5. Areas where vessels with engines are prohibited for the purposes of Clause 10.

The following waters of the Port of Western Port are prohibited to vessels with engines used for propulsion:

- (a) At Rutherford Inlet inshore of a line commencing at a point on the southern end of the masonry seawall approximately 94 metres south-west of the intersection of the south side of the Warneet North Jetty with the shore; thence north-easterly for approximately 97 metres to a red post on that jetty; thence easterly for

approximately 53 metres to a red post survey mark; thence south-easterly to a red post on the shore;

- (b) At Rutherford Inlet inshore of a line commencing at the navigation lightpost adjacent to the Warneet Motor Yacht Club clubhouse; thence southerly for approximately 100 metres to a red post on the Warneet South Jetty; thence along the north side of that jetty to the shore.

6. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purposes of Clause 13.

The following waters of the Port of Western Port are set aside for vessels only:

At Rutherford Inlet inshore of a line commencing at the intersection of the north side of the Warneet South Jetty with the shore; thence along the north side of that jetty to a red post; thence south-easterly for approximately 130 metres to a red post on the shore.

SCHEDULE 6

WATERS—LAKE LYSTERFIELD

Local Authority—Secretary, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources

1. Vessels with engines prohibited for the purposes of Clause 10.

All of the waters of Lake Lysterfield are prohibited to vessels with engines.

SCHEDULE 7

WATERS—THE BARWON RIVER

(UPSTREAM OF THE LOWER BREAKWATER)

Local Authority—The Geelong and District Water Board

1. Excluded speed limit for the purposes of Clause 3 (a).

Those waters of the Barwon River not otherwise subject to a speed restriction, prohibition or otherwise designated for specific or exclusive use under this Schedule are not subject to the requirements of Clause 3 (a) of this notice.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

Those waters of the Barwon River between—

- (a) an imaginary line joining two signs headed "Speed Limit 5 Knots" situated on opposite banks of the river where the southerly prolongation of the centre line of Coppards Road intersects the respective banks; and

(b) the structure known as the Lower Breakwater situated on the river approximately 107 metres upstream of the Parish of Connewarre eastern boundary—

are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

3. 35 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

Those waters of the Barwon River not subject to Item 2 of this schedule or which are not otherwise prescribed as prohibited under Clause 10 or designated as exclusive use zones under Clause 13 are subject to a speed restriction of 35 knots.

4. Areas where vessels with engines are prohibited for the purposes of Clause 10.

The following waters of the Barwon River are prohibited to vessels with engines.

Those waters of the Barwon River which lie—

(a) between—

(i) an imaginary line joining two signs headed "Rowing Zone—Power Boat Zone" situated on opposite banks of the river at the eastern side of the Princes Bridge; and

(ii) an imaginary line joining two signs stating "Motor Boats Prohibited" situated on opposite banks of the river where the common boundaries of the City of South Barwon and the Shire of Barrabool in the Parish of Barrabool intersect the respective banks;

(b) between—

(i) an imaginary line joining two signs headed "Motor Boats Prohibited" situated on opposite banks of the river, which line is approximately 43 metres east of the eastern boundary of Crown Allotment 2, Section 1, Parish of Connewarre; and

(ii) a imaginary line joining two other similar signs situated on opposite banks of the river where the southerly prolongation of the centre line of Breakwater Road intersects the respective banks;

(c) between—

(i) an imaginary line joining two signs headed "Rowing Zone—Power Boat Zone" situated on opposite banks of the river at the eastern side of the Princes Bridge; and

(ii) an imaginary line from a similar sign situated on the north bank of the river approximately 115 metres west of the western boundary of Swanston Street south-westerly approximately 26 metres to a line of orange buoys thence westerly approximately 410 metres through a line of orange buoys, thence southerly approximately 22 metres through a line of orange buoys to a similar sign situated approximately 10 metres west of the boat ramp on the south side of the river—

other than on a Sunday between the hours of midday and sunset and between Christmas Day and the following New Year's Day or any public holiday gazetted in substitution for that New Year's Day (both days inclusive);

(d) despite (a), (b) and (c) above the use of any vessel with an engine used for propulsion at a speed of not more than five knots which is used solely for the purpose of coaching rowing crews on the river is permitted.

5. Prohibition of specific activities for the purpose of Clause 12.

No vessel of more than 6 metres in length and two and one half metres in beam is permitted on the Barwon River.

6. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purpose of Clause 13.

(a) The waters of the Barwon River which are between—

(i) an imaginary line joining two signs headed "Motor Boats Prohibited" situated on opposite banks of the river, which is approximately 43 metres east of the eastern boundary of Crown Allotment 2, Section 1, Parish of Connewarre; and

(ii) an imaginary line joining two signs headed "Speed Limit 5 Knots" situated on opposite banks of the river where the southerly prolongation of the centre line of Coppards Road intersects the respective banks—

are set aside for vessels with engines used for propulsion which are engaged in competitive water-skiing or the practising of water-skiing.

(b) A vessel with an engine used for propulsion of less than 12 kilowatts of developed power may transit the special purpose area but must keep as near to the starboard bank as is practicable.

Those waters of the Port of Queenscliff

are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

1A. Excluded speed limit for the purposes of

Those waters specified in Item 3 of this
Schedule as exclusive use and special purpose
areas for the purposes of Clause 13 are not
subject to the requirements of Clause 4 (a) of
this notice.

2. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes
of Clause 9.

The following waters of Bass Strait adjacent

(a) The waters within 200 metres to seaward of the low water mark on the foreshore between two lines passing through separate sets of beacons in line on the foreshore and approximately 100 metres apart near the easterly prolongation of Cowrie Road, Torquay; and

(b) The waters within 200 metres to seaward of the low water mark on the foreshore between two lines passing through separate sets of beacons in line on the foreshore, one set being situated near the easterly prolongation of Bell Street, Torquay, and the other set being situated near the southerly prolongation of the Esplanade, at Point Danger, Torquay.

(2) The waters of Bass Strait adjacent to the City of South Barwon are set aside for vessels with engines used for propulsion only within 200 metres to seaward of the low water mark on the foreshore between two lines passing through separate sets of beacons in line on the foreshore and approximately 150 metres apart to the south of the boat launching ramp at Torquay.

SCHEDULE 12

WATERS—BLACKBURN LAKE

Local Authority—The Council of the City of Nunawading

1. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The whole of the waters of Blackburn Lake are prohibited to vessels.

SCHEDULE 13

WATERS—THE ANGLESEA RIVER

Local Authority—The Council of the Shire of Barrabool

1. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of the Anglesea River between the entrance and the road bridge at Coalmine Road are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

2. Prohibition of specific activities for the purposes of Clause 12.

Sailing vessels of more than 3 metres in length are prohibited on the waters of Anglesea River between the entrance and the bridge at the Great Ocean Road.

3. Exclusive use and special purpose area for the purposes of Clause 13.

The waters of Anglesea River between the bridge at the Great Ocean Road and the bridge at Coalmine Road are set aside for the exclusive use of vessels with an engine used for propulsion or manually propelled vessels subject to the 5 knot speed restriction in Item 1 of this Schedule.

SCHEDULE 14

WATERS—PAINKALAC CREEK

Local Authority—The Council of the Shire of Barrabool

1. Areas prohibited to vessels with engines for the purposes of Clause 10.

The waters of the Painkalac Creek between Boundary Road and the entrance are prohibited to vessels with engines used for propulsion.

2. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purposes of Clause 13.

The waters of Painkalac Creek between Boundary Road and the entrance are set aside for vessels without engines used for propulsion which are less than 3 metres in length.

SCHEDULE 15

WATERS—BASS STRAIT—URQUHARTS BLUFF

Port Authority—The Port of Melbourne Authority

1. Excluded Speed Limit for the purpose of Clause 4 (a).

Those waters of Bass Strait that are between Urquharts Bluff and Point Roadknight are not subject to the requirements of Clause 4 (a) of this Notice.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

Those waters of Bass Strait that are between the "vessels only zone" and the "vessels prohibited zone" and between the "vessels prohibited zone" and the "power ski zone" as specified in this Schedule and extending 200

metres to seaward from the low water mark are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

3. Area prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

Those waters of Bass Strait that are between two lines passing between two separate sets of beacons in line on the foreshore and approximately 50 metres and 250 metres respectively north east of the "vessels only zone" referred to in Item 4 (a) of this Schedule and extending 200 metres to seaward from the low water mark are prohibited to vessels.

4. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purposes of Clause 13.

(a) The waters of Bass Strait that are between two lines passing through separate sets of beacons in line on the foreshore and approximately 80 metres apart in front of the public convenience building, Urquharts Bluff and extending 200 metres to seaward from the low water mark are set aside for vessels only.

(b) Between one hour before sunrise and one hour after sunset, the waters of Bass Strait that are between two lines passing between two separate sets of beacons in line on the foreshore and approximately 300 metres and 600 metres respectively north-east of the "vessels only zone" referred to in Item 4 (a) above are set aside for the exclusive use of power skis.

5. Prohibition on vessels with engines for the purposes of Clause 10.

Those waters of the Bass Strait at Urquharts Bluff that are between the line passing between the beacons that mark the western limit of the "vessels only" zone and westward to the line passing between two beacons in line on the foreshore and approximately 150 metres distant and extending to seaward from the low water mark to a distance of 200 metres are prohibited for vessels with an engine used for propulsion.

WATERS—LAKE CRAVEN

Local Authority—Secretary, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources

1. 8 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

All of the waters of Lake Craven are subject to a speed restriction of 8 knots.

2. Area prohibited to water-skiers for the purposes of Clause 8.

All of the waters of Lake Craven are prohibited to water-skiers and vessels towing water-skiers.

SCHEDULE 17

WATERS—LAKE COSTIN

Local Authority—Secretary, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources

1. 8 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

All of the waters of Lake Costin are subject to a speed restriction of 8 knots.

2. Area prohibited to water-skiers for the purposes of Clause 8.

All of the waters of Lake Costin are prohibited to water-skiers and vessels towing water-skiers.

SCHEDULE 18

WATERS—LAKE HORDEN

Local Authority—Secretary, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources

1. 8 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

All of the waters of Lake Horden are subject to a speed restriction of 8 knots.

2. Area prohibited to water-skiers for the purposes of Clause 8.

All of the waters of Lake Horden are prohibited to water-skiers and vessels towing water-skiers.

SCHEDULE 19

WATERS—BASS STRAIT—PORT OF LORNE

Port Authority—The Port of Geelong Authority

1. Excluded speed limit for the purposes of Clause 4 (a).

The speed restriction prescribed in Clause 4 (a) of this notice does not apply between the hours of one hour before sunrise and one hour after sunset on any day in the waters of the Port of Lorne within lines running respectively to seaward through two beacons in line situated on the foreshore 60 metres north-westward of Lorne Pier and two beacons in line situated on the foreshore approximately 730 metres north westward of Lorne Pier to the line delineating the seaward boundary of the waters referred to above.

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SCHEDULE 20

WATERS—THE PORT OF PORT FAIRY
Port Authority—The Port of Portland Authority

1. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

Those waters of the Port of Port Fairy that are—

- (a) within 200 metres of the shoreline between—
 - (i) a line to seaward from a beacon on the foreshore situated on the south-easterly prolongation of the northern boundary of Crown Allotment 32, Borough of Port Fairy; and
 - (ii) another line at right angles to the shoreline such line passing through the northern end of the stone groyne which adjoins the north mole of the Moyne River.
- (b) between the shoreline and the stone groyne referred to in (a);
- (c) between—
 - (i) a line which extends south-easterly from the eastern end of the north mole of the Moyne River to the eastern end of the south mole of the river; and
 - (ii) a bridge which crosses the river at Griffith Street, Port Fairy—are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

SCHEDULE 21

WATERS—GELLIBRAND RIVER
(DOWNSTREAM OF THE BRIDGE AT PRINCETOWN)

Local Authority—Secretary, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources

1. 8 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

All of the waters of the Gellibrand River downstream of the bridge at Princetown are subject to a speed restriction of 8 knots.

2. Area prohibited to water-skiers for the purposes of Clause 8.

All of the waters of the Gellibrand River downstream of the bridge at Princetown are prohibited to water-skiers and vessels towing water-skiers.

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SCHEDULE 22

WATERS—HOPKINS RIVER

Local Authority—Hopkins River Authority

1. 10 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The following waters of the Hopkins River are subject to a speed restriction of 10 knots subject to the conditions specified in (2) and (3) below.

(1) The waters of the Hopkins River from the mouth to an imaginary line across the river, being 100 metres south of the prolongation of the centre line of Bostock Street and marked by a beacon erected on each bank of the river.

(2) Between the hours of sunset and 8.00 a.m. on successive days, the waters of the Hopkins river bounded—

- (a) by an imaginary line across the River, being 100 metres south of the prolongation of the centre line of Bostock Street and marked by beacons erected on each bank of the river; and
- (b) by an imaginary line across the river as marked by beacons erected on each bank of the river approximately 700 metres east of the imaginary line in (a).

(3) Between sunset on any day and 12.00 noon on the following day, the waters of the Hopkins River bounded—

- (a) by an imaginary line across the river approximately 700 metres east of the imaginary line in (2) (a) above; and
- (b) by an imaginary line from a point on the north bank of the river, known as the One Mile Post, in a direct line to the south bank of the river to a point marked by a beacon erected on the river bank.

(4) The waters of the Hopkins River bounded—

- (a) by an imaginary line referred to in (3) (b) above; and
- (b) a line marked by the Tooram Stones.

(5) The waters of the Hopkins River, known as a transit lane, extending along the south bank of the river from an imaginary line across the river by 100 metres south of the prolongation of the centre line of Bostock Street to a point directly opposite the One Mile Post and extending into the river for a distance of not more than 30 metres.

2. Prohibition on specific activities for the purposes of Clause 12.

(1) A person must not anchor, moor or cause to be anchored or moored a vessel (except in an emergency) in a transit lane during the periods when there are no speed restrictions in the adjacent areas.

(2) A person must not anchor, moor or cause to be anchored or moored any vessel or obstruction in a waterway other than to the banks or to an object approved by the Hopkins River Authority.

(3) A person must not anchor, moor or cause to be anchored or moored any vessel or obstruction in a waterway within a radius of 25 metres from the centre of any launching ramp.

(4) A person must not anchor, moor or cause to be anchored or moored any obstruction in a waterway floating or otherwise unless by permission in writing given by the Hopkins River Authority.

SCHEDULE 23

WATERS—THE MERRI RIVER

Local Authority—The Council of the Shire of Warrnambool

1. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

Those waters of the Merri River that are between the river mouth and the weir at the northern end of Bromfield Street, Warrnambool are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

2. Water-skiing prohibited for the purposes of Clause 8.

The waters of the Merri River where the 5 knot speed restriction applies are prohibited to water-skiers and vessels towing water-skiers.

SCHEDULE 24

WATERS—CURDIES RIVER AND CURDIES INLET

Local Authority—The Committee of Management of Curdies Inlet and River Reserve

1. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The following waters of Curdies River and Curdies Inlet are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

(1) The waters of Curdies River—

- (a) which lie between two lines extending between beacons on the opposing banks, one line being located approximately 125 metres upstream and the other approximately 45 metres downstream from Curdievale Bridge; and

- (b) which lie between two lines extending between beacons on the opposing banks, one line being located approximately 1000 metres upstream and the other approximately 1000 metres downstream from the Lodge track.

(2) The waters of Curdies Inlet which lie between the Great Ocean Road Bridge at Peterborough and an east-west line across the Inlet approximately 45 metres northwards of the launching ramp and marked by beacons on the opposing shores and by yellow buoys on the water.

2. Prohibition of water-skiing for the purposes of Clause 8.

The waters of Curdies River between French's Bridge and a line marked by beacons on the opposing bank where the river enters Curdies Inlet are prohibited to water-skiers and vessels towing water-skiers.

3. No wash zone for the purposes of Clause 11.

A person must not operate a vessel at a speed which would cause wash within the 5 knot speed restriction zone of the Curdies River at Curdievale.

4. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purposes of Clause 13.

The parts of the waters of Curdies River described below are set aside for vessels with engines used for propulsion and for water skiing—

- (a) Commencing at a line between beacons on opposing banks 125 metres upstream from Curdievale Bridge and extending 1.6 kms upstream therefrom to a line between beacons on the opposing banks;
- (b) Commencing at a line between beacons on opposing banks 45 metres downstream from Curdievale Bridge and extending 1.6 kms downstream therefrom to a line between beacons on the opposing banks.

SCHEDULE 25

WATERS—FITZROY RIVER

Local Authority—Secretary, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources

1. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

All of the waters of the Fitzroy River are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

SCHEDULE 26

WATERS—SURREY RIVER (UPSTREAM FROM THE SEAWARD OUTLET TO THE PRINCES HIGHWAY BRIDGE)

Local Authority—The Committee of Management of the Narrawong Camping and Recreation Reserve Corporation

1. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

Those waters of the Surrey River between the Narrawong Camping and Recreation Reserve boat ramp and the Princes Highway Bridge are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

2. Water-skiing prohibited for the purposes of Clause 8.

The waters of the Surrey River between the seaward outlet and the Princes Highway Bridge are prohibited to water-skiers and vessels towing water-skiers.

3. Vessels with engines prohibited for the purposes of Clause 10.

The waters of Surrey River between the seaward outlet and the Narrawong Camping and Recreation Reserve boat ramp are prohibited to vessels with engines used for propulsion.

4. Prohibition of specific activities for the purposes of Clause 12.

The waters of the Surrey River between the seaward outlet and the Princes Highway Bridge are prohibited to jet-skis and similar vessels.

SCHEDULE 27

WATERS—SURREY RIVER (UPSTREAM OF THE PRINCES HIGHWAY BRIDGE)

Local Authority—Secretary, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources

1. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

All of the waters within Barmah State Park Browns Swamp are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

SCHEDULE 28

WATERS—LAKE MONEBEONG (LAKE BUNG BUNG)

Local Authority—Secretary, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources

1. Vessels with engines prohibited for the purposes of Clause 10.

All of the waters of Lake Monebeong (Lake Bung Bung) are prohibited to vessels with engines used for propulsion.

SCHEDULE 29

WATERS—MALSEEDS LAKE

Local Authority—Secretary, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources

1. Vessels with engines prohibited for the purposes of Clause 10.

All of the waters of Malseeds Lake are prohibited to vessels with engines used for propulsion.

SCHEDULE 30

WATERS—SWAN LAKE

Local Authority—Secretary, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources

1. Vessels with engines prohibited for the purposes of Clause 10.

All of the waters of Swan Lake are prohibited to vessels with engines used for propulsion.

SCHEDULE 31

WATERS—THE GLENELG RIVER WITHIN VICTORIA BETWEEN THE MOUTH AND THE JUNCTION WITH THE CRAWFORD RIVER AT DARTMOOR

Local Authority—Secretary, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources

1. Interpretation

(a) For the purposes of this Schedule "Special Purpose Areas" means—

- (i) the section of the Glenelg River known as Taylors Straight; and
- (ii) the section of the Glenelg River known as Sandy Waterholes.

(b) Each special purpose area is marked by beacons at its extremities.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

All of the waters of the Glenelg River upstream of beacons at Wild Dog Bend and downstream of Crawfords River at Dartmoor are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

3. 8 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

All of the waters of the Glenelg River downstream of the "Taylors Straight" Special Purpose Area and all waters between "Taylors Straight" and "Sandy Waterholes" Special Purpose Area are subject to a speed restriction of 8 knots.

4. 10 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

All of the waters of the Glenelg River upstream of the "Sandy Waterholes" Special

Purpose Area and downstream of Wild Dog Bend are subject to a speed restriction of 10 knots.

5. Special purpose area for the purposes of Clause 13.

(i) Vessels with engines used for propulsion and water-skiing shall only be permitted in the special purpose areas at the following times:

- (a) December, January and February—between 8.00 a.m. to 8.00 p.m. (Summer Time);
- (b) March—between 8.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. (Eastern Standard Time) or between 9.00 a.m. to 7.00 p.m. when Summer Time applies;
- (c) November—between 9.00 a.m. to 7.00 p.m. (Summer Time);
- (d) April—between 8.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. (Eastern Standard Time);
- (e) May, August, September, October—between 9.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. (Eastern Standard Time);
- (f) June, July—between 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. (Eastern Standard Time).

(ii) Vessels other than those engaged in water-skiing or power boating activities shall be permitted to pass and re-pass through the special purpose areas providing such vessels—

- (a) keep as close as possible to the portside upstream bank of the river when travelling in either direction and at no time during transit exceeding a distance of 15 metres from the portside upstream bank; and
- (b) proceed as expeditiously as possible during transit through these special purpose areas; and
- (c) do not stop during transit through the special purpose areas; and
- (d) do not exceed a speed of 8 knots.

(iii) Vessels engaged in water-skiing or power boating activities must give way to transit boats operating according to the conditions outlined in (ii) above.

6. Prohibition of Specific Activities for the purposes of Clause 12.

- (i) A person must not operate, anchor, or moor a houseboat on any of the waters of the Glenelg River within Victoria from the mouth of the river to the junction with the Crawford River at Dartmoor.

- (ii) A person must not moor a houseboat to any jetty or structure on any of the waters of the Glenelg River within Victoria from the mouth of the river to the junction with the Crawford River at Dartmoor.

SCHEDULE 32

WATERS—THE PORT OF PORTLAND

Port Authority—The Port of Portland Authority

1. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9

The area of the waters of the Port of Portland within 150 metres of the tanker vessel is prohibited to vessels during that period that a tanker vessel is berthed at the "S. L. Patterson" tanker berth.

SCHEDULE 33

WATERS—LAKE MODEWARRE

Local Authority—The Council of the Shire of Barrabool

1. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of Lake Modewarre in the area between the shore line and an imaginary line marked by buoys defined by the following traverse directions (all bearings are magnetic unless otherwise specified) are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

Commencing at the south-east corner of Crown Allotment 5, Section VIII, in the Parish of Modewarre and extending 205.19 metres due south; thence 424.47 metres on a bearing of S.62° 30' W.; thence 418.63 metres on a bearing of S.36° 10' W.; thence 261.72 metres on a bearing of N.53° 50' W.; thence 40.23 metres on a bearing of S.53° 50' W.; thence 261.72 metres on a bearing of S.53° 50' E.; thence 253.27 metres on a bearing of S.36° 10' W.; thence 1153.31 metres on a bearing of S.5° 40' W.; thence 176.02 metres on a bearing of S. 73° 40' W.; thence 40.23 metres on a bearing of S. 16° 20' E.; thence 192.32 metres on a bearing of N.73° 40' E.; thence 519.82 metres on a bearing of S.38° 20' E.; thence 189.10 metres due south; thence 281.03 metres on a bearing of S.75° 00' E.; thence 251.46 metres due north; thence 300.75 metres on a bearing of S.87° 50' E.; thence 915.32 metres on a bearing of N.44° 00' E.; thence 150.88 metres on a bearing of S.46° 00' E.; thence 41.24 metres on a bearing of N.57° 00' E.; thence 160.13 metres on a bearing of N.46° 00' W.; thence 110.64 metres on a

bearing of N.44° 00' W.; thence 456.05 metres on a bearing of N.9° 30' E; thence 208.21 metres due east; thence 40.23 metres due north; thence 201.57 metres due west; thence 458.66 metres on a bearing of N.9° 30' E.; thence 291.29 metres on a bearing of N.8° 30' W.; thence 553.21 metres due east; thence 40.23 metres due north; thence 559.25 metres due west; thence 472.75 metres on a bearing of N.8° 30' W.; thence 503.53 metres on a bearing of N.87° 00' W.; thence 122.71 metres on a bearing of S.62° 30' W.; thence 196.14 metres due north; thence 197.14 metres on a bearing of S.64° 49' W. to the commencing point.

SCHEDULE 34

WATERS—LAKE TOOLIOROOK

Local Authority—The Council of the Shire of Hampden

1. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

Those waters of Lake Tooliorook around the perimeter of the Lake for a distance of 100 metres from the edge of the water are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

SCHEDULE 35

WATERS—LAKE PURRUMBETE

Local Authority—The Lake Purrumbete Foreshore Committee of Management

1. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

The whole of the waters of Lake Purrumbete are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

2. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Lake Purrumbete in the vicinity of Hoses Rocks extending 75 metres from the edge of the water for the time being between side boundaries approximately 150 metres apart each of which is marked on the shore by a notice inscribed with the words "No Boating", and on the water by a red buoy are prohibited to vessels.

SCHEDULE 36

WATERS—LAKE LINLITHGOW AND BULLRUSH SWAMP

Local Authority—The Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse

1. Excluded speed limit for the purposes of Clause 3 (a).

The waters of Lake Linlithgow and Bullrush Swamp which are not otherwise specified as a speed restriction zone or an area prohibited to vessels are excluded from the requirements of Clause 3 (a) of this notice.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of Lake Linlithgow that are within 20 metres of the eastern and western sides of the boat ramp situated in the southern part of the lake are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

3. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Lake Linlithgow that are—

(a) south of an imaginary line commencing at a beacon on the shoreline situated at the intersection of the easterly prolongation of the southern boundary of Crown Allotment 34, Parish of Linlithgow with the shoreline; thence east to a similar beacon on the shoreline situated at the intersection of the northerly prolongation of the eastern boundary of Crown Allotment 44, Parish of Linlithgow with the shoreline;

(b) contained within an imaginary line commencing at the last mentioned beacon referred to in (a); thence in a generally easterly direction to a yellow buoy situated approximately 20 metres west of the north-western corner of the boat ramp; thence approximately 56 metres south to the shoreline; thence via the shoreline to the point of commencement—

are prohibited to vessels.

4. Direction of travel for the purposes of Clause 14.

All vessels with an engine used for propulsion must proceed in a clockwise direction in relation to the approximate centre of the waterway on the waters of Lake Linlithgow.

SCHEDULE 37

WATERS—DEEP LAKE

Local Authority—The Committee of Management of Deep Lake Recreational Reserve

1. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

Those waters of Deep Lake that are—

(a) bounded by the shore, the jetty and a line extending from a yellow beacon situated on the seaward end of the jetty to another yellow beacon situated on the south-eastern shore approximately 340 metres south of the jetty; and

(b) south of a line extending from a yellow beacon situated midway along the western shore to the yellow beacon situated on the south-eastern shore referred to in (a)—
are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

2. Vessels with engines prohibited for the purposes of Clause 10.

The waters of Deep Lake, between two lines extending to seaward at right angles to the shoreline for a distance of approximately 40 metres from each of two white beacons situated on the foreshore approximately 40 metres apart, the northernmost beacon being situated approximately 14 metres south of the jetty are prohibited to vessels with engines.

3. Prohibition of specific activities for the purposes of Clause 12.

A person must not at any time anchor or moor, or cause to be anchored or moored, any vessel within 30 metres of any buoy or any structure placed in the waters of Deep Lake without the permission of the Committee of Management of Deep Lake Recreational Reserve.

4. Exclusive use or special purpose areas for the purposes of Clause 13.

The use of those waters of Deep Lake that lie within 14 metres of the jetty is set aside for vessels without engines used for propulsion.

SCHEDULE 38
WATERS—LAKE HAMILTON

Local Authority—The Council of the City of Hamilton

1. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of Lake Hamilton—

- (a) in the northern part of the lake east of a line commencing on the northern shore at a point approximately 110 metres north-east of the launching ramp and marked by a beacon inscribed "5 knots" and thence extending approximately 150 metres in a south-easterly direction passing through a number of yellow buoys to a point on the opposite shore marked by a beacon inscribed "5 knots"; and
- (b) extending approximately 50 metres from the shore in an area approximately 40 metres wide with the centre of the outward boundary marked

by one yellow buoy inscribed "5 knots" in water immediately in front of the launching ramp located on the western shore of the lake—
are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

2. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Lake Hamilton—

- (a) adjacent to the spillway near the south-west corner of the lake and west of a line commencing at a point on the western shore approximately 50 metres north of the spillway and marked by a beacon inscribed "Stop No Boats. Prohibited Water Beyond This Point" and extending in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 150 metres through a number of red buoys to the southern shore of the lake at a point approximately 50 metres from the south-west corner of the lake marked by a beacon inscribed "Stop No Boats. Prohibited Water Beyond This Point"; and
- (b) in a swimming area located on the southern shore in the northern part of the lake and bounded by the shore and a line commencing at a point on the southern shore approximately 100 metres west of the large island and marked by a beacon inscribed "Stop No Boats. Prohibited Water Beyond This Point" and extending approximately 50 metres in a north-westerly direction to a large red buoy and thence extending approximately 300 metres through a number of red buoys situated approximately 50 metres from the shore to a large red buoy and thence extending approximately 50 metres in a south-easterly direction to the shore at a point marked by a beacon inscribed "Stop No Boats. Prohibited Water Beyond This Point"—

are prohibited to vessels.

3. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purpose of Clause 13.

- (a) The waters of Lake Hamilton that are not otherwise restricted by the provisions of this schedule are subject to exclusive use as follows:

- (i) For the use of vessels engaged in competitive rowing practice and other non-powered vessels from 10 a.m. on each even numbered calendar day.
 - (ii) For the use of vessels engaged in competitive rowing practice, other non-powered vessels and vessels with an engine used for propulsion that are restricted to a speed of 5 knots or less up to 10.00 a.m. on any day.
 - (iii) For the use of vessels with an engine used for propulsion only from 10.00 a.m. on each odd numbered calendar day except that non-powered vessels have right of way to travel within 40 metres of the waters edge between the signposted launching area adjacent to the boatramp and the 5 knot speed restriction zone defined in item 1 (a) of this Schedule.
- (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-item 3 (a) above, vessels with engines used for propulsion may be used for coaching purposes or as safety boats during those times that the waters of Lake Hamilton are set aside for vessels without engines used for propulsion.
4. Access lanes for the purposes of Clause 5. Those waters of Lake Hamilton that are within 30 metres of the shore and lying between—
- (a) two signposts on the lake shore that are 100 metres apart, the northern most of which lies 60 metres south of the southern limit of the 5 knot speed restriction zone adjacent to the boatramp; and
 - (b) two signposts that are 50 metres apart and on the lake shore close to the intersection of Hensley Park Road and Mill Road—
- are access lanes.

5. Prohibition of specific activities for the purposes of Clause 12.

A person must not—

- (a) operate a vessel on the waters of Lake Hamilton at a speed exceeding 5 knots after sunset and before sunrise; or

- (b) launch any vessel onto the waters of Lake Hamilton except at the launching ramp constructed for that purpose, provided that yachts of less than 3 metres "off the beach" class yachts, sailboards and rowing hulls may be launched from the shore at those locations so marked by signposts.

6. Revocation of Notice.

This Schedule is revoked 12 months after the date of publication in the *Government Gazette* on 22 April 1993.

SCHEDULE 39

WATERS—LAKE SURPRISE (MOUNT ECCLES NATIONAL PARK)

Local Authority—Secretary, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources

1. Vessels with engines prohibited for the purposes of Clause 10.

All of the waters of Lake Surprise are prohibited to vessels with engines used for propulsion.

SCHEDULE 40

WATERS—LAKE BOLAC

Local Authority—The Lake Bolac Foreshore Committee

1. Access lanes for the purposes of Clause 5.

The waters of Lake Bolac described below are access lanes:

- (a) Extending 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being and approximately 220 metres wide situated on the southern shore with the eastern boundary located approximately 140 metres east of the launching ramp and the western boundary being located approximately 80 metres west of the launching ramp;
- (b) Extending 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being and approximately 570 metres wide with the eastern boundary situated approximately 100 metres west of the spillway on the southern shore;
- (c) Extending 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being and approximately 220 metres wide with the southern boundary situated approximately 200 metres south of the launching ramp on the eastern shore;
- (d) Extending 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being and

approximately 340 metres wide with the west boundary situated approximately 110 metres west of the launching ramp on the northern shore.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of Lake Bolac—

- (a) around the perimeter of the lake for a distance of 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being except in the area prohibited to vessels and in the access lanes; and
- (b) north of a north east-south west line between beacons situated on the east and west shore at the narrow section in the northern part of the lake—

are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

3. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The following waters of Lake Bolac are prohibited to vessels:

- (a) In a circular area approximately 50 metres in diameter located approximately 200 metres from the eastern shore of the Lake due west of the point where the Fiery Creek enters the lake the centre of the area being defined by a red buoy in the waters;
- (b) In an area approximately 50 metres wide extending 180 metres from the edge of the water for the time being excluding the area within 60 metres of the edge of the water for the time being wherein operating a vessel at a speed in excess of 5 knots is prohibited and located adjacent to the south-east shore of the lake approximately 130 metres east of the spillway the boundaries being marked on the water by red buoys;
- (c) In swimming areas extending 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being between side boundaries marked by a sign on the shore inscribed "Swimming Area" and red buoys in the water at the following locations:
 - (i) In an area approximately 510 metres wide on the northern shore of the main body of the lake and approximately 290 metres east of the launching ramps; and

- (ii) in an area approximately 750 metres wide on the northern shore of the main body of the lake and approximately 830 metres east of the launching ramp.

4. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purposes of Clause 13.

(1) The waters of Lake Bolac set aside for a slalom course area are the waters extending 160 metres from the edge of the water for the time being, excluding the area within 60 metres of the shore for the time being where operating a vessel at a speed in excess of 5 knots is prohibited, in an area between a northerly boundary situated approximately 290 metres south of the launching ramp on the western shore and a southerly boundary approximately 1090 metres south of the launching ramp.

(2) A person operating a vessel on Lake Bolac must not enter the area permitted for use as a slalom course without prior consent of the Lake Bolac Foreshore Committee when white flags are in place on the buoys delineating the four corners of the slalom course area.

- (i) Metcalfe Caravan Park—west of a line across the small bay located on the western side of the Metcalfe Pool adjacent to the northern boundary of the Metcalfe Caravan Park;
- (ii) Metcalfe Housing Co-operative—extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 250 metres wide located along the western shore of the Campaspe River Arm adjacent to the Metcalfe Housing Co-operative.

M. Lakeshore Caravan Park—extending approximately 30 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 30 metres wide located adjacent to the Lakeshore Caravan Park between the island and the mainland.

N. Derrinal Pool

- (i) Moorabbee Lodge Caravan Park—in McIvor Bay east of a line located in the inlet on the eastern side of the Bay and adjacent to the western shore of the Moorabbee Lodge Caravan Park;
- (ii) Public Boat Launching Ramp—extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 80 metres wide located approximately 30 metres north of the public boat launching ramp;
- (iii) Coliban Water Sports Club—extending approximately 60 metres from the edge

of the water for the time being in an area approximately 100 metres wide located along the northern shore of the Derrinal Pool adjacent to the Coliban Water Sports Club site.

- (iv) Victorian Speed Boat Club—extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 80 metres wide located along the southern shore of the Victorian Speed Boat Club site.

4. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purposes of Clause 3.

The waters of Lake Eppalock north of a line between signs inscribed "Area for Manually Operated Boats and Windsurfers" located on the foreshore each side of the entrance to Strath Bay, excluding the prohibited area, are set aside for manually operated vessels and windsurfers.

SCHEDULE 50

WATERS—GOLDFIELDS RESERVOIR *Local Authority—The Council of the City of Maryborough*

1. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purposes of Clause 13;

- (a) A person must not operate a vessel on Goldfields Reservoir when there are two vessels with engines used for propulsion exceeding 8.0 kilowatts developed power already operating on the reservoir;
- (b) The waters of Goldfields Reservoir are prohibited to bathers when vessels with engines used for propulsion are operating on the waters;
- (c) A person must not operate a vessel with an engine used for propulsion for more than 4 circuits of the reservoir at any one time or for continuous period of 15 minutes if there is another vessel waiting to operate;
- (d) A person must not operate a vessel with an engine used for propulsion exceeding 8.0 kilowatts developed power after sunset or before 8.00 a.m.;
- (e) A person must not operate a vessel with an engine used for propulsion at speeds exceeding 5 knots during the period 1 April to 30 November.

2. Direction of travel for the purposes of Clause 14.

All vessels with an engine used for propulsion must proceed in a clockwise direction in relation to the approximate centre of the waterway around the waters of Goldfields Reservoir.

SCHEDULE 51 WATERS—LAKE VICTORIA

Local Authority—The Council of the City of Maryborough

1. Prohibition on vessels with engines for the purposes of Clause 10.

The whole of the waters of Lake Victoria are prohibited to vessels with engines used for propulsion.

SCHEDULE 52

WATERS—CAIRN CURRAN RESERVOIR *Local Authority—The Rural Water Corporation*

1. Access lanes for the purposes of Clause 5.

The following waters of Cairn Curran Reservoir are access lanes:

- (a) The waters extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 150 metres wide located approximately 200 metres south of the south-east boundary of the swimming area in Woolshed Bay;
- (b) The waters extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 300 metres wide and located adjacent to the south-west point of Woolshed Bay;

- (e) in Bryant's Bay west of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores at the entrance to the bay—

are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

3. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Cairn Curran Reservoir—

- (a) between the main dam wall and a line approximately 200 metres to the south thereof between two beacons inscribed "Stop" and "Prohibited Water Beyond this Point" located on opposite shores of the reservoir;
- (b) between the secondary embankment and a line approximately 200 metres to the east thereof between two beacons inscribed "Stop" and "Prohibited Water beyond this Point" located on opposite shores of the reservoir;
- (c) in a swimming area located at the north-east end of Woolshed Bay between a line of red buoys and the foreshore, the line commencing at a point approximately 50 metres east of the launching ramp and extending approximately 240 metres in a south easterly direction and then for approximately 240 metres in an easterly direction to the foreshore;
- (d) in a swimming area located in the bay on the eastern side of the reservoir approximately 500 metres south of the main dam wall, between a line of red buoys and the foreshore;
- (e) in a swimming area located in Lethbridge Bay approximately 75 metres north-east of the launching ramp between the foreshore and a line between two beacons inscribed "Stop No Boats" located on opposite shores of the bay—

are prohibited to vessels.

SCHEDULE 53
WATERS—LITTLE LAKE BOORT
Local Authority—The Council of the Shire of Gordon

1. Access lane for the purposes of Clause 5.

The following waters of Little Lake Boort are an access lane.

Commencing at the waters edge adjacent to the south-eastern corner of the Ski Club House, thence along a magnetic bearing of 135°, a distance of approximately 35 metres to a buoy, thence generally westerly at a distance of 25 metres from the waters edge to a buoy, thence along a magnetic bearing of 045°, a distance of approximately 35 metres to the waters edge, thence easterly, a distance of approximately 60 metres to the point of commencement.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

The following waters of Little Lake Boort are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

Commencing at the eastern edge of the access lane, thence generally easterly and southerly at a distance of 25 metres from the waters edge for a distance of approximately 400 metres to a buoy, thence along a magnetic bearing of 210° to a buoy situated 25 metres west of a beacon on Pelican Point, thence in a clockwise direction around the lake at a distance of 25 metres from the waters edge to a buoy situated 25 metres from the waters edge on line with a beacon on the south shore (opposite the Lake Boort Motel), thence on a bearing of 354° to a buoy situated east of the Sailing Club, thence on a bearing of 059° to a buoy situated 25 metres from the waters edge near the south-eastern corner of the water dam, thence in a clockwise direction around the lake at a distance of 25 metres from the waters edge to the western boundary of the access lane.

3. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The following waters of Little Lake Boort are prohibited to vessels:

Commencing at a point on the waters edge 100 metres south of the beacon on Pelican Point, thence generally westerly a distance of 15 metres to a buoy, thence generally southerly at a distance of 15 metres from the waters edge a distance of 120 metres to a buoy, thence easterly to the water's edge and northerly to the point of commencement.

4. Direction of travel for the purposes of Clause 14.

All vessels with an engine used for propulsion must proceed in a clockwise direction in relation to the approximate centre of the waterway around the waters of Little Lake Boort.

SCHEDULE 54

WATERS—GREEN HILL LAKE

Local Authority—The Council of the City of Ararat

1. Access lane for the purposes of Clause 5.

The waters of Green Hill Lake extending 30 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 150 metres wide and situated between two points approximately 230 metres and 380 metres east of the spillway on the high water line of the southern bank are an access lane.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

All of the waters of Green Hill Lake which are not prohibited to vessels or set aside as an unrestricted boating area are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

3. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Green Hill Lake—

- (a) adjacent to the spillway near the south-west corner of the lake commencing at a point approximately 150 metres north of the spillway at the high water line of the western bank to a point marked by a red buoy being approximately 80 metres directly east of the middle of the spillway to a point approximately 230 metres east of the spillway on the high water line of the southern bank;
- (b) in the swimming area located in the area bounded by the southern point of the island which is due west of the eastern swimming beach thence south-easterly to a point on the high water line on the Lake shore thence northerly along the shore line to a point due north of the island which is west of the eastern swimming beach thence to a point on the northern tip of the island which is due west of the eastern swimming beach and thence along the high water line of the eastern shore line of the island which is west of the eastern swimming beach to the commencement point—

are prohibited to vessels.

4. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purposes of Clause 13.

(1) The following waters of Green Hill Lake (known as the unrestricted area) are set aside for the purposes set out below and are subject to the controls prescribed:

An area bounded by a point on the high water line of the southern shore 380 metres east of the spillway to a point 50 metres south-west of the island situated in the south-east corner of the Lake thence north-westerly to a point 50 metres west of the north-west corner of Lake Island thence due west to a point 150 metres from the north-west corner of Lake Island and thence south-westerly to a point 360 metres north of the spillway on the high water line of the western bank of the lake and thence to the commencing point by a line generally bounded by the high water lines of the western and southern shore lines of the lake excluding the prohibited area and access lane.

- (2) (a) On even numbered days of the month a person must not operate a vessel on the waters of Green Hill Lake other than a vessel with an engine used for propulsion.
- (b) A person must not operate a vessel with an engine used for propulsion—
 - (i) when five other such vessels are operating in the area; or
 - (ii) for more than 5 circuits or for a continuous period of more than 20 minutes when another vessel with an engine used for propulsion is waiting in the access lane to operate; or
 - (iii) unless the vessel completes an entire circuit before re-entering the access lane; and must not
 - (iv) stop or anchor the vessel or otherwise not complete the circuit, except for the purpose of assisting a water-skier or another person in the water or where for emergency reasons it is not practicable to complete a circuit
- (c) A person operating a vessel with an engine used for propulsion must—
 - (i) if it is necessary to stop during a circuit, immediately take appropriate action to remove the vessel from the circuit as soon as practicable; and

- (ii) only enter the unrestricted boating area through the access lane.

(3) On odd numbered days of the month a person must not operate a vessel with an engine used for propulsion, excepting that such vessels up to 4.3 metres in length and not exceeding 7.5 kilowatts developed power may be operated at speeds not exceeding 5 knots.

(4) A person must not operate a vessel in the unrestricted boating area at a speed exceeding 5 knots after sunset and before sunrise.

1. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The whole of the waters within the Volcano Storage are prohibited to vessels.

The whole of the waters within the Volcano Storage are prohibited to bathers.

1. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The whole of the waters of the St. Arnaud Reservoir are prohibited to vessels.

2. Areas prohibited to bathers for the purposes of Clause 12.

The whole of the waters of the St. Arnaud Reservoir are prohibited to bathers.

SCHEDULE 57

1. Area prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Greens Lake (Corop)—

- (a) around the perimeter of the lake for a distance of approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being except in the access lane and in the prohibited areas;

- (b) south of a line passing east-west between netting boundary signs erected on opposite sides of the lake—

are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

3. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Greens Lake (Corop)—

- (a) extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in a swimming area approximately 100 metres wide located approximately 100 metres south-east of the public launching ramp, the

boundaries of the swimming area being marked by red buoys;

- (b) adjacent to the Rural Water Corporation pump house between the edge of the water for the time being and two lines of red buoys in the water, one line commencing from the shore line approximately 350 metres north-east of the pump house and the other line commencing from the shore line approximately 350 metres south-west of the pump house and each line extending until they both meet at a point indicated by a marker buoy situated in the water approximately 400 metres south-east of the pump house—

are prohibited to vessels.

are access lanes.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of Lake Hindmarsh extending approximately 160 metres from the edge of the water—

- (a) at Four Mile Beach between two lines extending from two signs on the shore to two yellow buoys in the water, the signs on the shore being approximately 100 metres apart with the westernmost

sign being approximately 70 metres west of the boat ramp;

- (b) at Schulze's Beach between two lines extending from two signs on the shore to two yellow buoys in the water, the signs on the shore being approximately 70 metres apart with the southernmost sign being immediately south of the boat ramp—

are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

3. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Lake Hindmarsh extending approximately 160 metres from the edge of the water for the time being—

- (a) at Four Mile Beach between two lines extending from the signs on the shore to two red buoys on the water, the signs on the shore being approximately 300 metres apart with the easternmost sign being approximately 70 metres west of the boat ramp;
- (b) at Schulze's Beach between two lines extending from two signs on the shore to two red buoys in the water, the signs on the shore being approximately 250 metres apart with the northernmost sign being approximately 100 metres south of the boat ramp—

are prohibited to vessels.

4. Areas where vessels with engines are prohibited for the purposes of Clause 10.

The waters of Lake Hindmarsh—

- (a) immediately west of the area at Four Mile Beach prescribed as prohibited areas and bounded by the Western Boundary of that area, the westerly prolongation of the northern boundary of that area and the edge of the water;
- (b) extending approximately 160 metres from the edge of the water in an area of Schulze's Beach between two lines extending westerly from two signs on the shore approximately 200 metres apart, the northernmost sign being approximately 350 metres south of the boat ramp—

are prohibited to vessels with engines used for propulsion.

SCHEDULE 62
WATERS—LODDON RIVER
(AT BRIDGEWATER BETWEEN FLOUR
MILL AND SWEENEYS LANE)
*Local Authority—The Committee of

1. Excluded speed limit for the purposes of Clause 3 (a).

Those waters of the Loddon River not otherwise specified as being subject to a speed restriction or prohibited to boating, are not subject to the requirements of Clause 3 (a) of this Notice.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

(1) Those waters of the Loddon River between the Flour Mill Weir and the Calder Highway Road Bridge are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

(2) Those waters of the Loddon River between the Calder Highway Road Bridge and Sweeneys Lane are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots between the following dates and times:

- (a) Between 1 December and 30 March between 7.30 p.m. and 8.30 a.m. the next morning.

4. Areas prohibited to bathers for the purposes of Clause 12.

Those waters specified in Clause 5 are prohibited to bathers.

5. Exclusive and special purpose area for the purpose of Clause 13.

Those waters of the Loddon River between the Calder Highway Road Bridge and Sweeneys Lane which are not subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots are set aside for the exclusive use of water-skiing and activities associated with water-skiing.

6. Revocation of Notice.

This Schedule is revoked 12 months after the date of publication in the *Government Gazette* on 8 July 1993.

- (b) The waters within an area approximately 314 metres wide situated south of a beacon on the rock retaining wall adjacent to the boat launching ramp on the eastern shore;
- (c) The waters within an area approximately 250 metres wide situated adjacent to the southern shore east of the inlet of an unnamed creek in the Learmonth Shore Park.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of Lake Learmonth—

are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

3. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Lake Learmonth—

- (a) bounded by a line commencing at a beacon on the northern shore located 30 metres east of the Water Race Reserve known as Morton's Cutting and extending in a southerly direction for approximately 200 metres to a red buoy and thence by a line extending in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 190 metres to another red buoy and thence in a northerly direction to the jetty on the northern shore;
- (b) bounded by a line commencing at a beacon at the south-east end of the rock retaining wall and north of the boat launch ramp on the eastern shore and extending in a north-westerly direction to a red buoy and then by a line extending in a northerly direction to a beacon on the north shore—

are prohibited to vessels.

4. Prohibition on Vessels with Engines for the purposes of Clause 10.

In this Schedule—

"Circuit" means a path commencing immediately adjacent to the eastern boundary of the access lane proceeding in a clockwise direction and terminating at the commencement point keeping at all times to the left of a line between two red and yellow buoys located in the water approximately 100 metres from the northern and southern ends respectively of the speed boating area.

"Speed Boating Area" means those waters of the reservoir which are not prohibited areas or on which a speed limit applies.

1. Access lane for the purposes of Clause 5.

The waters of Laanecoorie Reservoir extending approximately 30 metres from the edge of the water in an area approximately 200 metres wide located approximately 20 metres north-west of the launching ramp are an access lane.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The following waters of Laanecoorie Reservoir are subject to a 5 knot speed restriction.

(1) The whole of the waters of Laanecoorie Reservoir between sunset and 11.00 a.m. on any day.

(2) The waters of Laanecoorie Reservoir—

- (a) around the perimeter of the reservoir for a distance of approximately 30 metres from the edge of the water for the time being except in the access lane and in the prohibited areas;
- (b) in Waanyarra Inlet west of a line between signs located on the foreshore each side of the entrance to the inlet;
- (c) in Bolands Lagoon south-east of a line between signs located on the foreshore each side of the entrance to the lagoon;
- (d) south of a line between a beacon located on the north shore of the reservoir approximately 60 metres north of the entrance to Waanyarra Inlet and a beacon located on the south-east shore of the reservoir

approximately 180 metres south of the entrance to Bolands Lagoon.

3. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Laanecoore Reservoir—

- (a) between the dam wall and a line approximately 200 metres to the south thereof between two beacons inscribed "Stop" and "Prohibited Water Beyond This Point" and located on opposite shores of the Reservoir;
 - (b) extending approximately 30 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in a swimming area approximately 60 metres wide located approximately 20 metres east of the launching ramp, the boundaries of the swimming area being marked by red buoys—
- are prohibited to vessels.

4. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purposes of Clause 13.

The following rules must be observed in the speed boating area:

- (a) A person must not operate a vessel with an engine used for propulsion at a speed exceeding 5 knots—
 - (i) when six other vessels are operating in that area apparently at a speed exceeding 5 knots; or
 - (ii) for more than four circuits or, when engaged in water-skiing, for more than four circuits or for a continuous period of more than 20 minutes, when another vessel with an engine used for propulsion apparently capable of speeds in excess of 5 knots is waiting within the access lane to operate;
- (b) A person operating a vessel with an engine used for propulsion at a speed in excess of 5 knots—
 - (i) must complete an entire circuit before pulling into shore; and
 - (ii) must, when necessary to stop during a circuit, immediately pull in as close as is practicable to the shore, secure all equipment and proceed and complete the circuit only when it is safe to do so and so as not to impede the progress of other vessels in that area;
- (c) A person operating a vessel with an engine used for propulsion at a speed not exceeding 5 knots during the time

when speeds exceeding 5 knots are permitted must not, except for the purpose of assisting a water-skier or another person in the water or for emergency reasons when it would not be practicable to complete a circuit, stop or anchor and must operate in a clockwise direction as close as practicable to the shore line;

- (d) A person operating a vessel which is manually or wind propelled during the time when speeds exceeding 5 knots are permitted must not stop or anchor or operate in a manner so as to impede the operation of other vessels.

5. Direction of travel for the purposes of Clause 14.

All vessels must proceed in a clockwise direction in relation to the approximate centre of the waters of Laanecoore Reservoir.

SCHEDULE 66
WATERS—LAKE WALLACE

Local Authority—Lake Wallace Foreshore Reserve Committee of Management

1. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

- Taylor's Creek being 100 metres south-west of the Murray Valley Highway Reserve and parallel to that reserve; or
- (b) enclosed by an imaginary line across the waterway of Gunbower Creek located on the south-east side of the Cohuna Weir and an imaginary line across the waterway parallel to and 128 metres distant from the north-eastern boundary of the Murray Valley Highway on a true bearing of the Murray Valley Highway Reserve at this point being 128°30' being adjacent to Crown Allotment 1 of 3 Parish of Gunbower West, County of Gunbower—

are prohibited to vessels.

5. Area where vessels with engines are prohibited for the purposes of Clause 10.

The waters of Gunbower Creek the boundaries of which are marked by beacons on the shore, enclosed by an imaginary line across the waterway of Gunbower Creek, parallel to and 128 metres distant from the north-eastern boundary of the Murray Valley Highway on a true bearing of the Murray Valley Highway Reserve at this point being 128°30' being adjacent to Crown Allotment 1 of 3 Parish of Gunbower West, County of Gunbower and a further imaginary line across the waterway of Gunbower Creek being adjacent to the northern boundary of the Cohuna Caravan Park and being a prolongation of the western boundary of Crown Allotment 1 of 3 Parish of Gunbower West and having a true bearing of 032°44', are prohibited to vessels with engines used for propulsion.

6. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purposes of Clause 13.

The following waters of Gunbower Creek the boundaries of which are marked by beacons on the shore are set aside for all classes of vessels:

- (a) The waters defined by the prolongation of the property boundary between Crown Allotments 5 and 6, section 3, Parish of Gunbower West, downstream to a point on the left bank of the Gunbower Creek distant 340 metres north-westerly from the property boundary between Crown Allotments 2 and 3, Section A, Parish of Gunbower West and distant from that boundary along the creek frontage 635 metres;

The waters of Lake Boga within 60 metres of the water's edge, except in an access lane and in the area set aside for water-skier racing are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

3. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Lake Boga extending 60 metres from the edge of the water between side boundaries, each boundary being marked on the foreshore by a beacon inscribed with the words "No Boating" and on the water by a red buoy at the following locations are prohibited to vessels:

- (a) A swimming area, approximately 250 metres wide, situated adjacent to the toilet block on the north-western shore of the lake;
- (b) A swimming area, approximately 220 metres wide, situated adjacent to the toilet block on the northern shore of the lake;

- (d) A swimming area, approximately 220 metres wide, situated adjacent to the eastern shore near the termination point of Hayes Road;
- (e) A swimming area, approximately 200 metres wide, situated adjacent to the south-eastern shore approximately 730 metres south of the termination point of Hayes Road;
- (f) A swimming area, approximately 200 metres wide, situated adjacent to the southern shore approximately 75 metres west of the pump shed;
- (g) A swimming area, approximately 60 metres wide, situated adjacent to the south-western shore approximately 120 metres south-east of the launching ramp;
- (h) A swimming area, approximately 100 metres wide, situated adjacent to the western shore approximately 100

metres south of the Lake Boga Ski Club clubhouse.

4. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purposes of Clause 13.

(1) The waters of Lake Boga extending approximately 200 metres from the edge of the water in an area approximately 700 metres wide situated approximately 380 metres north of the Lake Boga Ski Club clubhouse between side boundaries, each boundary being marked on the foreshore by a beacon inscribed with the words "Skier Racing Only" and on the water by a red and yellow buoy, are set aside for water-skier racing when the buoys are in place.

(2) The waters of Lake Boga extending 60 metres from the edge of the water in an area approximately 210 metres wide situated adjacent to the Yacht Club clubhouse between side boundaries, each boundary being marked on the foreshore by a beacon inscribed with the words "Sail Boating Only" and on the water by a red and yellow buoy. Provided that the waters may be used for Sea Scout Group activities and by the Yacht Club administration.

(3) A person using the waters set aside under (1) above must be a member of the Lake Boga Ski Club or be participating in a regatta conducted under the control of that club and authorised by the Council of the Shire of Swan Hill.

- (a) Extending for a distance of 40 metres south of the Basin embankment as indicated by beacons inscribed "No Boats within 40 metres of Embankment" erected on the embankment except in the 5 knot speed restriction zone in the north-east area of the Basin;
- (b) In the vicinity of the outlet structure in the north-west corner of the Basin in an area approximately 330 metres wide and extending 200 metres from the waters edge for the time being the boundaries being marked by a beacon on the embankment approximately 40 metres east of the outlet structure and another beacon on the foreshore approximately 290 metres west of the outlet structure and red buoys in the water 200 metres from the shore at

right angles to the side boundary beacons and the edge of the water;

- (c) In the Waranga Western Main Channel west of a line between beacons inscribed "Stop" and "Prohibited Water Beyond this Point" located on opposite banks of the channel approximately 500 metres west of the public launching ramp into the channel;
- (d) In the Cattanach Canal south of a line between beacons inscribed "Stop" and "Prohibited Water Beyond this Point" located on opposite banks of the canal approximately 150 metres north of the inlet structure erected in the canal;
- (e) In the north-east corner of the Basin east of a line between a beacon inscribed "Stop" and "Prohibited Water Beyond this Point" erected on the southern bank of the Stuart Murray Canal approximately 40 metres west of the inlet structure and a similar beacon erected on the Basin embankment approximately 50 metres west of the inlet structure;
- (f) Extending 200 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 80 metres wide located adjacent to the Waranga Caravan Park on the western shore of the Basin approximately 40 metres north of the gravel launching ramp the boundaries of the swimming area being marked by red buoys in the water;
- (g) Extending 200 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 50 metres wide located on the western shore of Sapling Point immediately north of the southern boundary of the Victorian Kite Flyers lease area, the boundaries of the swimming area being marked by red buoys in the water.

SCHEDULE 86
WATERS—LAKE MULWALA (VICTORIAN
WATERS) AND OVENS RIVER
(BUNDALONG)

Local Authority—*The Rural Water Corporation*
Interpretation

In this Schedule—

"Ovens River" means the main channel of the Ovens River and all anabranches and lagoons connecting to the main channel when Lake Mulwala is at full supply level upstream from

the junction of the Murray River and Ovens River to a point where the Murray Valley Highway crosses the Ovens River.

1. Excluded speed limits for the purposes of Clause 3 (a).

The waters of Lake Mulwala and the Ovens River are not subject to the requirements of Clause 3 (a) of this notice.

Zone A—Those Waters of Lake Mulwala Adjacent to Yarrowonga Foreshore

2. Access Lane for the purposes of Clause 5.

The waters of Lake Mulwala extending approximately 60 metres from the waters edge between the two 4 knot speed limit zones located adjacent to the Yarrowonga foreshore and east of the Yarrowonga-Mulwala Road Bridge are an access lane.

3. 4 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The following waters of Lake Mulwala adjacent to the Yarrowonga foreshore are subject to a speed restriction of 4 knots.

(a) (i) The waters bounded by the shore and the rock retaining wall adjacent to the Yarrowonga-Mulwala Road Bridge and a line commencing at a speed limit notice situated on that wall and extending approximately 193 metres in an easterly direction through a number of yellow buoys situated approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water thence extending through a yellow buoy to a speed limit notice on the shore;

(ii) The waters bounded by the shore and a line commencing at a speed limit notice on the shore and situated approximately 60 metres east of the main swimming pool structure and extending approximately 60 metres from the waters edge in a northerly direction to a yellow buoy thence extending for approximately 245 metres in a westerly direction through a number of yellow buoys situated approximately 60 metres from the waters edge thence extending in a southerly direction to a speed limit notice on the shore;

(b) Those waters that are within 30 metres radius of the waters edge at the boat-ramp located at the southern end of the Yarrowonga Foreshore and approximately 30 metres east of the prolongation of Ely Street.

Zone B—Those Waters of Lake Mulwala in a Bay West of Rams Head Adjacent to the Yarrowonga Yacht Club

4. 4 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

Those waters of Lake Mulwala bounded by the shore and a line commencing at a speed limit notice on the shore approximately 30 metres west of the public launching ramp situated west of the Yarrowonga Yacht Club and extending approximately 30 metres from the waters edge in a northerly direction to a yellow buoy thence in a north-easterly direction through a number of yellow buoys to a speed limit notice situated on the peninsula known as Rams Head are subject to a speed restriction of 4 knots.

Zone C—Those Waters of Lake Mulwala in the Large Bay on the Eastern Side of Yarrowonga Rowing Club and the Rowing Course

5. Exclusive Use and Special Purpose Area for the purposes of Clause 13.

Those waters of Lake Mulwala in the large bay on the eastern side of the Yarrowonga Rowing Club and the Rowing Course are set aside for rowing. Any person operating any other type of vessel in this area must keep 30 metres clear of a rowing vessel and must not create a wash which may adversely interfere with the operation of rowing vessels.

Zone D—Those Waters of Lake Mulwala that are Adjacent to Hogans Road Recreational Area

6. 4 knot speed restriction for the purposes of Clause 7.

Those waters of Lake Mulwala that are within 30 metres radius of the waters edge at the boat ramps at Hogans Road Recreational Area are subject to a speed restriction of 4 knots.

Zone E—Those Waters of Lake Mulwala that are Adjacent to Woodlands Subdivision

7. 4 knot speed restriction for the purposes of Clause 7.

Those waters of Lake Mulwala that are within 30 metres radius of the waters edge at the boat

ramp adjacent to the Woodlands Subdivision are subject to a speed restriction of 4 knots.

Zone F—Those Waters of Lake Mulwala that are adjacent to the Ski Land Motel At Bathuni

8. 4 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

Those waters that are within 30 metres radius of the waters edge at the boat ramp adjacent to the Ski Land Motel are subject to a speed restriction of 4 knots.

9. Exclusive use and special purposes areas for the purposes of Clause 13.

- (a) A person operating a vessel with an engine used for propulsion at a speed in excess of 10 knots must proceed in a generally easterly direction along the anabranch from the westerly junction to the easterly junctions with the main stream of the Murray River.
- (b) A person operating a vessel with an engine used for propulsion must not operate the vessel at a speed in excess of 20 knots when not towing a water skier.
- (c) A person operating a vessel with an engine used for propulsion which is entering into or departing from the anabranch must give right of way to all other vessels.
- (d) A person operating a vessel at a speed in excess of 10 knots must only enter the anabranch at the western opening to the Murray River.
- (e) A person operating a vessel at a speed in excess of 10 knots must only depart the anabranch at either of the eastern openings to the Murray River.
- (f) A person operating a vessel in the slalom course area must—
 - (i) keep clear of vessels using the slalom course; and
 - (ii) give way to all vessels when departing from the slalom course area.

Zone G—Those Waters of Lake Mulwala that are Adjacent to the Majors Lane Recreational Area and those Waters known as Bourke Street Channel

10. 4 knot speed restriction for the purposes of Clause 7.

Those waters of Lake Mulwala that are within 30 metres radius of the waters edge at the boat ramps at Majors Lane Recreational Reserve are subject to a speed restriction of 4 knots.

11. 10 knot speed restriction for the purposes of Clause 7.

Those waters of Lake Mulwala known as Bourke Street Channel between notices located at the western and at the eastern entrances are subject to a speed restriction of 10 knots.

12. Areas where water-skiing is prohibited for the purposes of Clause 8.

The waters of Lake Mulwala known as the Bourke Street Channel are prohibited to water-skiers.

Zone H—Those Waters of Lake Mulwala at Bundalong Adjacent to Phalaris Lane and Graham Avenue

Interpretation

In Items 13, 14 and 15 "lagoon" means those Victorian waters at Bundalong in the branch adjacent to Phalaris Lane and Graham Avenue.

13. 4 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

Those waters of the lagoon that are—

- (a) in an area approximately 10 metres wide extending across the lagoon at the eastern end of Phalaris Lane and marked by speed limit notices on opposite shores of the lagoon and yellow buoys in the water between the speed limit notices;
- (b) in an area approximately 10 metres wide extending across the lagoon at the eastern end of Graham Avenue and marked by speed limit notices on opposite shores of the lagoon and yellow buoys in the water between the speed limit notices—

are subject to a speed limit restriction of 4 knots.

14. 10 knot speed restriction for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of the lagoon are subject to a speed restriction of 10 knots for vessels with an engine used for propulsion when not towing a water-skier.

15. Exclusive use and Special Purpose Areas for the purposes of Clause 13.

- (a) A person operating a vessel with an engine used for propulsion when towing a water-skier—

- (i) must when departing from shore on the eastern side of Goughs Lane depart in an anti-clockwise direction complete a U" turn when safe to do so and immediately proceed to the central exit and depart from the lagoon;
 - (ii) must when departing from shore on the western side of Goughs Lane depart from shore in an anti-clockwise direction complete a "U" turn when safe to do so and immediately proceed to the exit at the western end of Phalaris Lane and depart from the lagoon;
 - (iii) must when entering the lagoon at the central entrance proceed directly to the shore on the eastern side of Goughs Lane and drop off the water-skier;
 - (iv) must when entering the lagoon at the western end of Phalaris Lane proceed directly to the shore on the western side of Goughs Lane and drop off the water-skier;
 - (v) must when it is necessary to stop immediately pick up the water skier, secure all equipment, pull in as close as practical to the shore and only proceed when safe to do so.
- (b) A person operating a vessel when departing from the lagoon at either exit point must give way to all vessels entering the lagoon or proceeding past the exit points.
 - (c) The branch off the lagoon on the north side adjacent to Graham Avenue is set aside for slalom and ski-jumping and for vessels not exceeding 10 knots provided they stay clear of any vessel using the slalom course or ski jump and do not create a wash which could adversely interfere with a vessel using the slalom course or ski jump.

Zone 1—The Waters of the Ovens River at Bundalong

16. 10 knot speed restriction for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of the Ovens River, its branches and anabranches excluding the main river channel of the Ovens River from the junction of the Murray River and Ovens River upstream for

a distance of approximately 4.5 kilometres to a point marked by beacons inscribed "10 KNOT SPEED LIMIT" "NO WATER SKIING BEYOND THIS POINT", are subject to a speed restriction of 10 knots.

17. Water-Skiing Prohibited for the purposes of Clause 8.

Those waters of the Ovens River that are within 15 metres of a launching ramp are prohibited to water-skiing and to boats towing a water-skier.

18. Exclusive use and Special purposes area for the purposes of Clause 13.

- (a) A person operating a vessel on the waters of the Ovens River on which water skiing is permitted must not when not towing a water skier operate at a speed exceeding 20 knots;
- (b) A person operating a vessel in the water of the Ovens River which is subject to a speed restriction of 10 knots must give way to all other vessels when entering the water area on which water-skiing is permitted.

SCHEDULE 87

WATERS—LAKE MOKOAN

Local Authority—The Rural Water Corporation

1. Access lane for the purposes of Clause 5.

The waters of Lake Mokoan extending approximately 100 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 300 metres wide and located approximately 35 metres east of the public launching ramp on the northern shore are an access lane.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of Lake Mokoan between the shore and a line passing through signs affixed to trees around the perimeter of the large open water area except in the access lane and in the prohibited areas are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

3. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Lake Mokoan—

- (a) between the dam wall and a line located approximately 200 metres east thereof and defined by a line of red buoys;
- (b) south of a line between beacons inscribed "Stop No Boats" located on

the shore on each side of the inlet channel where the channel enters the south-west corner of the lake;

- (c) north of a line between beacons inscribed "Stop No Boats" located on opposite shores of the southern boundary of the wildlife breeding area in the north-west corner of the lake;
- (d) extending approximately 100 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in a swimming area approximately 60 metres wide located adjacent to the northern shore approximately 200 metres west of the public launching ramp the boundaries of the swimming area being marked by red buoys;
- (e) extending approximately 100 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in a swimming area approximately 120 metres wide located adjacent to the northern shore approximately 380 metres east of the public launching ramp, the boundaries of the swimming area being marked by red buoys;
- (f) extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in a swimming area approximately 40 metres wide located adjacent to the western boundary of the Mokoan Aquatic Club area on the northern shore, the boundaries of the swimming area being marked by red buoys—

are prohibited to vessels.

SCHEDULE 88

WATERS—THE GOULBURN RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES WITHIN THE SHIRE OF ALEXANDRA BETWEEN THE SHIRE BOUNDARY WITH THE SHIRE OF YEA AND THE EILDON PONDAGE WEIR
Local Authority—The Shire of Alexandra River Improvement Trust

1. Prohibition on vessels with engines for the purposes of Clause 10.

The whole of the waters of the Goulburn River within the Shire of Alexandra are prohibited to vessels with engines used for propulsion where the engines exceed 12 kilowatts developed power.

2. No wash zones for the purposes of Clause 11.

The waters of the Goulburn River within the Shire of Alexandra are a no wash zone.

SCHEDULE 89 WATERS—LAKE CATANI (MOUNT BUFFALO NATIONAL PARK)

Local Authority—Secretary, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources

1. Vessels with engines prohibited for the purposes of Clause 10.

All of the waters of Lake Catani are prohibited to vessels with engines used for propulsion.

SCHEDULE 90 WATERS—LAKE EILDON AND EILDON PONDAGE

Local Authority—The Rural Water Corporation

1. Excluded speed limits for the purposes of Clause 3 (a).

The waters of Lake Eildon are not subject to the requirements of Clause 3 (a) of this Notice.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The following waters of Lake Eildon are subject to a 5 knot speed restriction:

- (a) *Public Boat Harbour*—South of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores of the Harbour;
- (b) *Point Worner Bay*—South west of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores of the Bay;
- (c) *Anderson Harbour*—South of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores at the entrance to the Harbour;
- (d) *Spade Cove*—South west of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores at the entrance to the Cove;
- (e) *Taylor Bay*—South of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores within the Bay;
- (f) *Barkers Cove*—West of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores of the Cove;
- (g) *Bolte Bay*—East of a line of yellow buoys situated adjacent to the eastern shore of the left arm of the Bay;
- (h) *Coller Bay*—West of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores within the Bay;
- (i) *Aird Inlet*—West of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores within the inlet;
- (j) *Bonnie Doon Area*

- (i) *Sunset Strip*—South of a line of yellow buoys situated in the bay on the western shore approximately, north-east of Sunset Strip Road and approximately 1 kilometre south of the Maroondah Highway Bridge;
 - (ii) *Public Boat Ramps*—Extending approximately 30 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 30 metres wide with the centre of the outward boundary being marked by one yellow buoy in the water immediately in front of the two launching ramps on the south side of the Maroondah Highway Bridge;
 - (iii) *Highway and Railway Bridges*—Within 30 metres of both the Highway and Railway Bridge;
 - (iv) *Brankeet Inlet*—West of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores of the Inlet west of the Bonnie Doon Caravan Park;
 - (v) *Glen Inlet*—North east of a sign located on the western side of the Dry Creek Road bridge crossing the Inlet;
 - (vi) *Hutchinsons Road*—North of a line between two yellow buoys located in the small bay situated on the eastern shore adjacent to Hutchinsons Road and approximately 600 metres south of the Maroondah Highway Bridge;
 - (vii) *Lakeside Caravan Park*:
 - (a) South-east of a line between two yellow buoys located in the small inlet immediately north of the caravan park;
 - (b) South-east of a line between two yellow buoys located in the inlet immediately in front of the caravan park;
 - (viii) *Hutchinsons Road and James Street*—South of a line between two or more yellow buoys located in the bay to the east of the Lakeside Caravan Park and north of the junction of Hutchinsons Road and James Street;
 - (k) *Ford Inlet*—North east of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores within the inlet;
 - (l) *Walsh Cove*—South of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores within the cove;
 - (m) *Woolshed Inlet*—East of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores within the inlet;
 - (n) *Gough Bay*—
 - (i) *Main Bay*—North of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores at the entrance to the bay;
 - (ii) *Mansfield Boat and Yacht Club Bay*—North of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores within the bay;
 - (o) *Macs Cove*—North of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores at the entrance to the cove;
 - (p) *Howqua Inlet*—East of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores of the inlet east of Macs Cove excluding the area east of the Mansfield-Jamieson Road bridge which is prohibited to vessels with engines used for propulsion;
 - (q) *Goulburn Inlet*—South of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores within the inlet;
 - (r) *Big River Inlet*—South of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores within the inlet;
 - (s) *Wilson Creek Inlet*—South of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores at the entrance to the inlet;
 - (t) *Jerusalem Creek Inlet*—South of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores within the inlet;
 - (u) *Gerraty Bay*—North-west of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores of the bay.
3. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9—
- (a) *Eildon Pondage*—The whole of the waters of the Eildon Pondage are prohibited to vessels.
 - (b) *Lake Eildon*—The following waters of Lake Eildon are prohibited to vessels:
 - (i) *Spillway Cut*—The waters of the Spillway Cut from the northern

face of the spillway structure for a distance of approximately 200 metres in a northerly direction to a line between two beacons inscribed "Stop" and "Prohibited Water—No Entry At Any Time" located on opposite shores of the Spillway Cut;

- (ii) *Outlet Tower*—The waters of Lake Eildon for a radius of 60 metres around the outlet tower;
- (c) *Coller Bay*—in a swimming area located in Devils Cove adjacent to the western shore of Coller Bay and west of a line between red buoys situated across the western portion of the bay;
- (d) *Bonnie Doon*—Extending approximately 40 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in a swimming area approximately 60 metres wide and located on the western shore of the Brankeet Arm approximately 300 metres south of the Maroondah Highway Bridge, the boundaries of the swimming area being marked by red buoys.

4. Areas prohibited to vessels with engines for the purposes of Clause 10.

The waters of Lake Eildon within the Howqua Inlet upstream of beacon inscribed "No Power Boats" located on the downstream face of the Jamieson-Mansfield Road bridge are prohibited to vessels with engines used for propulsion.

5. No wash zones for the purposes of Clause 11.

The following waters of Lake Eildon are no wash zones:

- (a) within 40 metres of the houseboats or cabin cruisers moored to marinas or on swing moorings at the following locations:
 - (i) adjacent to Home Point Marina in the Brankeet Arm;
 - (ii) adjacent to Peppin Point Holiday Park in the Brankeet Arm;
 - (iii) adjacent to the Lake Eildon Country Club in Ford Inlet;
 - (iv) adjacent to the Mansfield Boat and Yacht Club at Goughs Bay in the Goulburn Arm;
 - (v) within Frys Bay in the Goulburn Arm;

- (vi) adjacent to the Howqua Valley Caravan Park in Howqua Inlet;
- (vii) adjacent to the Darlingford Waters Boat Club in Jerusalem Creek Inlet;
- (viii) adjacent to the eastern shore of Jerusalem Creek Inlet;
- (b) within 40 metres of the houseboat sewerage barges at the following locations:
 - (i) adjacent to Peppin Point Holiday Park in the Brankeet Arm;
 - (ii) adjacent to Home Point Marina in the Brankeet Arm;
 - (iii) adjacent to the Lake Eildon Country Club in Ford Inlet.

SCHEDULE 91

WATERS—THE GOULBURN RIVER FROM HUGHES CREEK TO GOULBURN WEIR INCLUDING LAKE NAGAMBIE

Local Authority—The Council of the Shire of Goulburn

1. Access lanes for the purposes of Clause 5.

The following waters of Lake Nagambie are access lanes:

- (a) Approximately 120 metres wide situated approximately 90 metres south of the launching ramp at the camping area on the western shore of the lake;
- (b) An area approximately 120 metres wide situated at Sandy Point on the eastern side of the creek at Buckley Park on the southern shore of the lake.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of the Goulburn River from Hughes Creek to the Goulburn Weir including Lake Nagambie—

- (a) within the main channel between Lobbs Lane and a line approximately 400 metres downstream from Chinaman's Bridge between two signs on opposite shores;
- (b) between a line extending east-west across the reservoir between a sign or beacon situated on the west bank approximately 280 metres south of the Cattnach Canal Offtake and a sign or beacon on the opposite bank, and all waters north of such line to the prohibited area at the weir;

- (c) within Lake Nagambie east of a line from Lobb's Point to Hutton's Point;
- (d) within the main channel between a yellow buoy situated approximately 200 metres upstream from the monument at the Mitchelton Winery Landing and a yellow buoy situated approximately 200 metres downstream from such monument—

are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

3. 10 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of the Goulburn River between Lobb's Lane and Kirwan's Bridge are subject to a speed restriction of 10 knots.

4. Areas where water-skiing is prohibited for the purposes of Clause 8.

Goulburn River

The waters of the Goulburn River—

- (a) between Lobb's Lane and Kirwan's Bridge; and
- (b) between Hughes Creek and a line approximately 400 metres downstream from Chinaman's Bridge marked by two signs on opposite shores—

are prohibited to water-skiers and vessels towing water-skiers.

5. Areas where vessels are prohibited for the purposes of Clause 9.

The following waters of the Goulburn River from Hughes Creek to the Goulburn Weir including Lake Nagambie are prohibited to vessels:

- (a) Between the weir on the Goulburn River and a line approximately 200 metres upstream therefrom between two beacons on opposite shores marked "Stop" and "Prohibited Water Beyond This Point";
- (b) Within approximately 90 metres of the Cattanach Canal Offtake and the East Goulburn Channel Offtake;
- (c) Lake Nagambie in the vicinity of the swimming pool, extending approximately 45 metres from the edge of the water for the time being between side boundaries marked by two beacons or signs situated at the eastern and western ends of the Buckley Park Reserve with the seaward extremities being marked by red buoys;

- (d) Lake Nagambie within approximately 45 metres of a sign bearing the inscription "Swimming Area", located near the western end of River Street, with the seaward extremities being marked by red buoys;

- (e) Lake Nagambie within approximately 45 metres of a sign bearing the inscription "Swimming Area", located on the western shore of the lake between the launching ramp and access lane at the camping area, with the seaward extremities being marked by red buoys;

- (f) Lake Nagambie within approximately 45 metres of a sign bearing the inscription "Swimming Area" located on the north-eastern shore of the lake at the western end of Lake Road, with the seaward extremities being marked by red buoys.

6. Area where vessels with engines are prohibited for the purposes of Clause 10.

Lake Nagambie

The waters of Lake Nagambie in the vicinity of the park known as Jacobson's Outlook, extending approximately 50 metres from the edge of the water for the time being between side boundaries marked by two signs or beacons situated at the northern and southern ends of the said park with the seaward extremities being marked by red buoys, are prohibited to vessels with engines used for propulsion.

7. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purposes of Clause 13.

Lake Nagambie

The waters of Lake Nagambie enclosed by the following boundaries are set aside for the use of racing shells engaged in or practising at competitive rowing between the hours of 5.30 p.m. and 7.30 p.m. from Monday to Friday and 8.00 a.m. and 10.00 a.m. on Sunday.

Commencing at a point marked by a red buoy approximately 50 metres offshore from a beacon located at the western end of the Buckley Park Reserve; thence by a line in a north-westerly direction for approximately 900 metres to a beacon on the eastern point of an island off Lobb's Point; thence in a north-westerly direction along the shore of the island to a beacon on the northernmost point of the island; thence by a line in a westerly direction for approximately 60 metres to a beacon on the

shore of another island; thence generally northerly around the coast of that island for approximately 60 metres to a beacon on the northernmost point of that island thence northeasterly for approximately 300 metres to a beacon on the shore of Lake Nagambie near the western end of Lobb's Lane; thence by a line to a beacon on Lobb's Point; thence by a line to a point marked by a yellow buoy approximately 50 metres west of Hutton's Point; thence by a line to a point marked by a yellow buoy approximately 150 metres west of Jacobson's Outlook; thence in a south-westerly direction by a line to the point of commencement.

Goulburn River

(1) The waters of the Goulburn River at Nagambie between Crown Allotment 11A and Crown Allotment 41B in the Parish of Mitchell and marked at each end by a notice are set aside for water-skiing from 1 November until 30 April each year on the days and times set out in (2) below.

(2) (a) Between 1 November and 31 March each year—

(i) on Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays from 1.00 p.m. to 7.30 p.m.;

(ii) from Monday to Friday (excluding Public Holidays) from 4.30 p.m. to 7.30 p.m.;

(b) Between 1 April and 30 April each year—

(i) on Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays from 1.00 p.m. to 6.00 p.m.;

(ii) from Monday to Friday (excluding Public Holidays) from 4.00 p.m. to 6.00 p.m.

(3) Persons using waters set aside under (1) above must be a member of the Nagambie Water Ski Club.

(4) A vessel, other than those involved with water-skiing referred to in (1) above may transit the defined area.

(5) The Shire of Goulburn may impose further conditions upon the Nagambie Water Ski Club in the interests of safe boating.

SCHEDULE 92

WATERS—LAKE WILLIAM HOVELL

Local Authority—The Rural Water Corporation

1. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

The whole of the waters of Lake William Hovell except in the prohibited area are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

2. Area prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Lake William Hovell between the dam wall and a line between two beacons inscribed "Stop" and "Prohibited Water Beyond This Point" the beacon on the western shore being located approximately 300 metres south of the dam wall and the beacon on the eastern shore being located approximately 100 metres south of the dam wall, are prohibited to vessels.

3. Prohibition on vessels with engines for the purposes of Clause 10.

The whole of the waters of Lake William Hovell are prohibited to all vessels with engines used for propulsion where the engines are capable of exceeding 8 kilowatts developed powers.

SCHEDULE 93

WATERS—LAKE BENALLA—BROKEN RIVER

Local Authority—The Council of the City of Benalla

1. Vessels with engines prohibited for the purposes of Clause 10.

The whole of the waters of Lake Benalla—Broken River between Ackerly Avenue and a projection of the north boundary of Arundel Street to Parkview Parade, as marked by beacons on the banks are prohibited to vessels with engines used for propulsion.

SCHEDULE 94

WATERS—LOCH GARRY

Local Authority—The Rural Water Corporation

1. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The whole of the waters of Loch Garry except in the prohibited areas are subject to a 5 knot speed restriction.

2. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9:

(a) The whole of the waters of Loch Garry when the Goulburn River has exceeded the eleven metres level at the Shepparton Gauge and the bars have been removed from the Regulator of Loch Garry; and

(b) the waters of Loch Garry which are west of a line between a beacon inscribed "Stop" and "Prohibited Water

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Beyond this Point" located on the levee bank approximately 30 metres north-west of the regulator and a similar beacon located on the levee bank approximately 30 metres south-east of the said regulator—

are prohibited to vessels.

Prohibition on vessels with engines for the purposes of Clause 10.

The whole of the waters of Loch Garry are prohibited to all vessels with engines used for propulsion where the engines are capable of exceeding 7.5 kilowatts developed power.

SCHEDULE 95

WATERS—LAKE HUME

Local Authority—The Rural Water Corporation

1. Excluded speed limits for the purposes of Clause 3 (a).

The waters of Lake Hume are not subject to the requirements of Clause 3 (a) of this notice.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of Lake Hume—

- (a) in the bay immediately south of Jackson's Point Reserve west of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores at the entrance to the bay;
- (b) in the bay immediately north of Kookaburra Point Reserve west of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores near the entrance to the bay;
- (c) in the bay immediately south of Kookaburra Point Reserve west of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores near the entrance to the bay, except all those waters within the bay which are prohibited areas;
- (d) extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 40 metres wide with the centre of the outward boundary being marked by one yellow buoy in the water immediately in front of the launching ramps at the following locations:
 - (i) adjacent to the southern point of Kookaburra Point Reserve;
 - (ii) adjacent to Ludlow's Reserve;
 - (iii) adjacent to the Tallangatta Recreation Reserve;

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- (iv) adjacent to Ebdon Reserve;
 - (e) extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in two areas approximately 20 metres wide and situated—
 - (i) adjacent to the eastern boundary of the swimming area adjacent to the Tallangatta Caravan Park; and
 - (ii) adjacent to the western boundary of the swimming area adjacent to the Tallangatta Caravan Park, the boundaries of each area furthest from the swimming area being marked by a yellow buoy in the water;
 - (f) in the bay adjacent to the western shore of the Tallangatta Recreation Reserve approximately 150 metres south of the swimming area and south of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores at the entrance to the bay;
 - (g) in the bay adjacent to the eastern shore of the Tallangatta Recreation Reserve approximately 600 metres east of the public launching ramp and south-west of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores within the entrance to the bay;
 - (h) in Bethanga Bay north-west of a line between beacons located on the foreshore on each side of the entrance to the bay—
are subject to a 5 knot speed restriction.
3. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.
- The waters of Lake Hume—
- (a) between the dam wall and a line approximately 200 metres to the south thereof passing through a beacon inscribed "Stop" and "Prohibited Water Beyond this Point" on the Victorian shore and red buoys in the water;
 - (b) in a swimming area located in the large central bay adjacent to the southern shore of Kookaburra Point Reserve and north of a line between two beacons inscribed "Swimming Area" located on opposite shores at the entrance to the bay;
 - (c) in a swimming area located in the bay adjacent to the south-west shore of Kookaburra Point Reserve and north of a line between two beacons inscribed

“Swimming Area” located on opposite shores of the bay;

- (d) extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being between side boundaries marked by two red buoys at the following locations:
 - (i) in a swimming area approximately 40 metres wide on the northern shore of Scotchman’s Point;
 - (ii) in a swimming area approximately 80 metres wide located approximately 25 metres north-west of the public launching ramp at Ebden Reserve;
 - (iii) in a swimming area approximately 150 metres wide located approximately 25 metres north of the public launching ramp at Ludlow’s Reserve; and
 - (iv) in a swimming area approximately 130 metres wide located approximately 20 metres west of the concrete retaining wall adjacent to the Tallangatta Caravan Park—

are prohibited to vessels.

SCHEDULE 96

WATERS—LAKE BUFFALO

Local Authority—*The Rural Water Corporation*

- 1. Access lanes for the purposes of Clause 5.

The waters of Lake Buffalo—

- (a) extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 200 metres wide located approximately 10 metres east of the public launching ramp on the northern shore;
- (b) extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 120 metres wide located approximately 10 metres west of the public launching ramp on the northern shore of Marshall’s Ridge—

are access lanes.

- 2. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of Lake Buffalo—

- (a) around the perimeter of the Lake for a distance of 60 metres from the edge of

the water for the time being except in the access lanes and prohibited areas;

- (b) in the Yarrabula Creek Arm east of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores at the entrance to the narrow section of the Arm;
 - (c) in the Croppers Creek Arm west of a line between beacons located on opposite shores at the entrance to the Arm;
 - (d) in the Buffalo River Arm south of a line between beacons located on opposite shores approximately one kilometre south of Marshall’s Ridge—
- are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

- 3. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Lake Buffalo—

- (a) between the dam wall and a line approximately 200 metres to the south thereof between two beacons inscribed “Stop” and “Prohibited Water Beyond this Point” located on opposite shores of the Lake;
- (b) extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 100 metres wide located approximately 50 metres south of the prohibited area adjacent to the dam wall, the boundaries of the swimming area being marked by red buoys in the water;
- (c) extending 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 50 metres wide located approximately 10 metres east of the public launching ramp on the north shore of Marshall’s Ridge, the boundaries of the swimming area being marked by red buoys in the water—

are prohibited to vessels.

SCHEDULE 97

- 1. Access lane for the purposes of Clause 5.

The waters of Lake Nillahcootie extending 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 80 metres wide located approximately 40 metres south of the launching ramp in the public area on the western shore of the Lake are an access lane.

- 2. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of Lake Nillahcootie—

- (a) around the perimeter of the lake for a distance of 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being except in the access lane and in the prohibited areas;
- (b) in Sandy Creek Arm west of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores of the lake immediately downstream from the road bridge on the Midland Highway;
- (c) in the southern portion of the lake south of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores of the lake approximately 1.5 kilometres south of Sandy Creek Arm—

are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

3. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Lake Nillahcootie—

- (a) between the dam wall and a line approximately 200 metres to the south thereof between two beacons inscribed "Stop" and "Prohibited Water Beyond this Point" located on opposite shores of the lake;
- (b) in a swimming area located adjacent to the northern shore of the bay on the western side of the lake approximately 600 metres south of the dam wall, the boundaries of the swimming area being marked by red buoys—

are prohibited to vessels.

SCHEDULE 98

Local Authority—The State Electricity Commission of Victoria

1. 5 knots speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of Junction Dam at Bogong are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

2. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

- (a) All of the waters of—
Mount Beauty Regulating Pondage;

- Rocky Valley Dam;
Junction Dam—
after sunset and before sunrise;
- (b) All the waters of the Kiewa and Rubicon Hydro Electric Schemes excepting Mount Beauty Regulating Pondage Rocky Valley Dam and Junction Dam;
- (c) Those waters at the western end of Mount Beauty Regulating Pondage that are between the outlet structure and a line between red beacons set on the shore;
- (d) All the waters of Junction Dam at Bogong when the water level of the dam exceeds the spill level;
- (e) Those waters in the southern part of Rocky Valley Storage Dam that are between a line between red beacons on opposite shores and the dam wall—

are prohibited to vessels.

3. Prohibition on specific activities for the purposes of Clause 12.

- (1) (a) On the waters of Regulating Pondage at Mt. Beauty no more than two vessels with engines used for propulsion shall be operated at any time and no part of the waters shall be used for boating or like activities except those waters which are outside the waters between the red beacons and the outlet structure.

1. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The whole of the waters of Fletcher's Dam are prohibited to vessels.

SCHEDULE 102
WATERS—LAKE KERFERD
Local Authority—The Council of the United Shire of Beechworth

1. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The whole of the waters of Lake Kerferd are prohibited to vessels.

SCHEDULE 103
WATERS—SHALLOW INLET
Port Authority—The Port of Melbourne Authority

1. 10 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of Shallow Inlet that are north of a line commencing at a beacon on the eastern shore at the mouth of Fishermans Creek to a beacon on the western shore situated at Sandy Point adjacent to the township of Sandy Point are subject to a 10 knot speed restriction.

SCHEDULE 104
WATERS—THE PORT OF GIPPSLAND LAKES
Port Authority—The Port of Melbourne Authority

1. Excluded speed limit for the purposes of Clause 4 (a).

The waters of the Port of Gippsland Lakes which are not otherwise specified as a 5 knot speed restriction zone, 10 knot speed restriction zone, prohibited area or exclusive use area are excluded from the provisions of Clause 4 (a) of this notice.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of the Port of Gippsland Lakes specified below are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots:

- (a) All the waters of the Thomson River and the Latrobe River upstream from the swing bridge;
- (b) All the waters of the Flooding Creek and the Sale Canal;
- (c) The waters of Lake Wellington situated within 100 metres of the water's edge at Marley Point and between lines extending seaward through each of two sets of beacons in line approximately 320 metres apart on the foreshore;
- (d) All the waters of the Perry River and the waters of the Avon River upstream from a speed limit notice situated near the mouth of the Avon River;
- (e) The waters of Lake Victoria, situated within 200 metres of the water's edge at Loch Sport that are—
 - (i) between lines extending seaward through two beacons in line on the shore approximately 60 metres westward of the jetty near Barton Street and two beacons in line on the shore near the western end of Seagull Drive; and
 - (ii) between lines extending seaward through two beacons in line on the shore near the intersection of Seagull Drive and Toorak Avenue and two beacons in line on the shore approximately 300 metres westward of the intersection of The Boulevard and National Park Road;

- (f) All the waters of Bunga Arm eastward of a line extending north-westward from a speed limit notice on the southern shore approximately 8 kilometres eastward of Ocean Grange Jetty to the opposite shore;
- (g) All the waters of Duck Arm, Lake Victoria westward of a line extending south-eastward from a speed limit notice on the northern shore to a yellow post on the southern shore at the entrance to Duck Arm;
- (h) All the waters of McMillan's Strait, Paynesville bounded on the north by a line joining two speed limit notices on opposite shores at the northern end of McMillan's Strait and bounded on the south by a line joining a speed limit notice at Montague Point, Raymond Island, and a speed limit notice at Grassy Point on the mainland;
- (i) The waters of Eagle Point Bay, Lake King, situated within 200 metres of the water's edge that are between lines extending seaward through two beacons in line on the shore approximately 60 metres north-westward of Eagle Point Jetty and two beacons in line on the shore approximately 60 metres south-eastward of Eagle Point boat launching ramp;
- (j) All the waters of the Mitchell River upstream from a speed limit notice situated on the shore at the mouth of such river;
- (k) All the waters of the Nicholson River upstream from a speed limit notice placed on a navigation beacon situated at the mouth of such river;
- (l) All the waters of the Tambo River upstream from a speed limit notice placed on a navigation beacon situated at the mouth of such river;
- (m) The waters of Bancroft Bay situated—
 - (i) westward of a line extending northward from a speed limit notice on Shaving Point to a speed limit notice on the shore approximately 200 metres north-eastward of Metung Yacht Club building; and
 - (ii) within 100 metres of the water's edge and between lines extending seaward from a speed limit marked "5 Knots" on the shore, approximately 800 metres south-westward of Mosquito Point and a similar notice approximately 800 metres south-eastward of Mosquito Point;
- (n) All the waters of Chinamans Creek northward of a line extending south-westward from a speed limit notice on the eastern shore to a yellow post on the opposite shore;
- (o) All the waters of Box's Creek northward of a line extending westward from a speed limit notice on the eastern shore to the most southerly point of the opposite shore;
- (p) All the waters of Cunninghame Arm and North Arm and the waters of Reeves Channel situated eastward of a line from the inner end of the eastern Entrance Wall to the western end of Bullock Island thence north-westward following the training wall to the shore of the mainland;
- (q) The waters of Lake King situated within 200 metres of the water's edge at Metung that are between lines extending seaward from a speed limit notice on the shore approximately 250 metres north-west of Shaving Point navigation light and a similar notice on the shore approximately 700 metres north-westward of the seaward end of Mairburn Road, Metung;
- (r) All the waters of the Hopetoun Channel bounded on the west by a line joining a speed limit notice on the southern shore of Hopetoun Channel approximately 600 metres west of the inner end of the Western Entrance Wall and a speed limit notice on the opposite shore and bounded on the east by a line joining a speed limit notice on the southern shore of Hopetoun Channel at the inner end of the Western Entrance Wall and a speed limit notice on the opposite shore;
- (s) All the waters of Newlands Arm, Paynesville bounded on the east by a line joining a speed limit notice on the southern shore at Butler Point and a

speed limit notice on the northern shore at Commissioner Point;

- (i) All the waters north of a line running from a speed limit notice at Grassy Point, Paynesville to the green starboard hand beacon off Goose Point thence to a speed limit notice at Commissioner Point, Paynesville.

3. 10 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of the Port of Gippsland Lakes specified below are subject to a speed restriction of 10 knots:

- (a) All the waters of the Latrobe River from a speed limit notice situated near the mouth of such river upstream to the swing bridge;
- (b) All the waters of McLennans Strait between a speed limit notice situated at the eastern end of such strait and a speed limit notice situated at the western end of such strait;
- (c) All the waters of the Entrance of the Reeves Channel westward of the line referred to in item 2 (p) of this Schedule to a line commencing at a speed limit notice on the southern shore of Hopetoun Channel at the inner end of the Western Entrance Wall thence to a speed limit notice on the opposite shore thence along the shore of the eastern end of Rigby Island to a speed limit notice opposite Kalimna Jetty thence northward to a speed limit notice on the mainland approximately 60 metres westward of that jetty.

4. Water-skiing prohibited for the purposes of Clause 8.

The waters of the Port of Gippsland Lakes referred to in Item 3 of this Schedule and also the waters of Reeves Channel between a line extending north-westward from a warning notice on the north-western end of Rigby Island to a similar notice on the shore of the mainland at Nyerimilang and a line extending northward from a speed limit notice situated on the shore of Rigby Island opposite Kalimna Jetty to a speed limit notice situated on the mainland approximately 60 metres westward of such Jetty are prohibited to water-skiers and vessels towing water-skiers.

5. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of the Port of Gippsland Lakes specified below are prohibited to vessels—

- (a) The waters that are generally north of a line of red buoys, from a sign inscribed with the words "No Boating" on the foreshore situated at Ogilvey Point, Newlands Arm, to a similar sign on the foreshore situated approximately 250 metres west of the boat launching ramp at Commissioners Point, Paynesville;
- (b) The waters that are generally north of a line of red buoys situated 30 metres offshore from a sign inscribed with the words "No Boating" situated on the foreshore 33 metres west of the boat launching ramp located off The Esplanade, Paynesville adjacent to the Gippsland Lakes Yacht Club to a similar sign on the foreshore approximately 80 metres north-west of that sign.
- (c) The water of Newlands Arm that are generally east of a line of yellow buoys approximately 30 metres offshore between two "No boating" signs situated on the foreshore of Dawson Cove approximately 350 metres and 400 metres south of Butler Point.

6. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purposes of Clause 13

(1) The waters of the Port of Gippsland Lakes that are within 100 metres of the water's edge between lines at right angles to the shore from a sign inscribed with the words "Boating Only" situated at the boat launching ramp jetty at Grassy Point, Paynesville, and a similar sign situated approximately 100 metres to the west of that sign, are set aside for vessels without engines for propulsion.

(2) The provisions of Item 2 (h) of this Schedule shall not apply during the period commencing one hour before sunrise and ending one hour after sunset on any day in the waters of Newlands Arm bounded on the east by a line extending northward from a speed limit notice on Butlers Point to a speed limit notice on the northern shore of the mainland and bounded on the west by a line extending southward from a speed limit notice on the northern foreshore near the house known as "Mentiplays" to a yellow post on the southern shore but excluding those waters that are generally north of a line of yellow buoys commencing at a notice on the foreshore situated at Ogilvey Point to a notice on the

foreshore situated 250 metres west of the boat launching ramp at Commissioners Point, Paynesville.

(3) The provisions of Item 2 (p) and (q) of this Schedule shall not apply during the period commencing one hour before sunrise and ending one hour after sunset on any day in the waters—

- (a) of North Arm between a line from a speed limit notice on the shore at the point known as Stocks Point to a speed limit notice on the opposite shore approximately 30 metres north-eastward of the launching ramp and a line extending westward from a speed limit notice on the shore near the prolongation to seaward of Bongong Street to a speed limit notice on the opposite shore;
- (b) of Cunninghame Arm encompassed by lines extending northward from two speed limit notices on the southern shore to a line through yellow buoys situated off-shore;
- (c) of Lake King that are within lines running to seaward through two sets of beacons in line situated approximately 150 metres apart on the foreshore near the western end of Kurnai Avenue, Metung.

(3A) Between sunrise and sunset the waters of the Port of Gippsland Lakes specified below are set aside for the exclusive use of power skis—

- (a) The waters within Cunninghame Arm northward of a line from a "Power Skis Only" sign on the southern end of the Club Hotel Spit and extending north-eastward to a point marked by a yellow buoy located 60 metres south-westward of the south-west extremity of the Western Board Harbour thence northward to a "Power Skis Only" sign on the foreshore 60 metres west of the Western Boat Harbour Jetty; and
- (b) The waters within Eagle Point Bay, Lake King between lines running 200 metres to seaward from a "Power Skis Only" sign on the foreshore 60 metres north-westward of Eagle Point Jetty and a second line running 200 metres to seaward from a "Power Skis Only" sign on the foreshore 260 metres north-westward of Eagle Point Jetty.

Navigation of Entrance

(4) (a) A person in charge of a vessel which is departing Cunninghame Arm must keep out of the way of a vessel navigating Reeves Channel.

(b) Where two vessels in Reeves Channel at its junction with Cunninghame Arm are approaching each other on reciprocal or near reciprocal courses, the person in charge of the vessel stemming the tide must keep out of the way of the vessel proceeding with the tide and nothing in this Schedule shall exempt the person in charge of either vessel from complying with the requirements of section 16 of the Uniform Shipping Laws Code.

(c) The person in charge of a vessel which is proceeding to sea and navigating the waters of the port between the seaward end of the entrance moles and the offshore bar must keep out of the way of a vessel inward bound into the port.

(d) The person of a vessel navigating the waters of the port between the seaward end of the entrance moles and the seaward (outer) edge of the offshore bar must maintain a distance of 100 metres astern of any other vessel proceeding in the same direction as the vessel.

(e) Despite anything contained in this item of this Schedule—

- (i) all vessels must keep clear of the dredger "April Hamer"; and
- (ii) a vessel whether inward or outward bound must not attempt to pass the dredger "April Hamer" whilst the dredger is dredging between the seaward end of the entrance moles and the outer edge of the seaward extremity of the bar or is engaged in swinging at the landward side of the bar.

McMillan's Strait Vehicular Cable Ferry

- (ii) where there is fog or poor visibility, sounds its siren at intervals of not more than one minute one prolonged blast followed by two short blasts, commencing at the time it leaves its berth.

(d) Where the ferry becomes stationary in the strait, the Master of the ferry must ensure—

- (i) that the ferry displays the lights referred to in (c) (i); and
- (ii) in fog or conditions of poor visibility, that a bell rings rapidly for about five seconds at intervals of not more than one minute.

(e) The master of the ferry must ensure that when the ferry is not operating and berthed, the ferry displays at night two fixed white lights vertically disposed at its seaward end

(a) Those matters of Lake Narracan that are east towards the dam wall from a line of red buoys between a signpost on Boom Point and a similar signpost on the northern shore are prohibited to all vessels.

(b) Those waters of Lake Narracan on the north-east shore of Halls Bay within 50 metres of the shore between two signs marked "Swimming Area" and marked by red buoys are prohibited to all vessels.

2. Exclusive use area for the purposes of Clause 13.

(a) Those waters of Lake Narracan designated Area B are set aside for the use of manually operated vessels and vessels with engines used for propulsion where the engines

are not capable of exceeding 6 kilowatts developed power.

(b) Those waters of Lake Narracan designated Area A are set aside for manually operated vessels only.

(c) Those waters of Lake Narracan designated Area C other than the waters within that area which are otherwise specified as an area prohibited to boating, a speed restriction zone or a special purposes area are set aside for water-skiing and for vessels with engines used for propulsion which exceed 6 kilowatts developed power.

(d) Those waters of Lake Narracan on the northern shore of the area known as Thompsons Bay between the shore and a line of yellow buoys are set aside for manually propelled vessels only.

SCHEDULE 131

WATERS—THE WATERS OF THE BARWON RIVER UPSTREAM OF SHEEPWASH ROAD EXTENSION AND ALL THE WATERS WITHIN THE LAKE CONNEWARRE WILDLIFE RESERVE INCLUDING REEDY LAKE BUT NOT INCLUDING THE WATERS OF THE BARWON RIVER UPSTREAM OF THE LOWER BREAKWATER

Local Authority—Secretary, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources

1. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

All the waters of Lake Connewarre Wildlife Reserve including Reedy Lake and the Barwon River downstream to the Port of Barwon Heads are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

SCHEDULE 132

WATERS—THE PORT OF CORNER INLET AND PORT ALBERT

Port Authority—The Port of Melbourne Authority

1. 20 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

For vessels of 25 metres or more in length the waters of Lewis Channel between:

- (i) a line joining No. 1 Beacon Lewis Channel and No. 2 Beacon Lewis Channel; and
- (ii) a line joining No. 14 Beacon Lewis Channel and No. 19 Buoy Lewis Channel—

are subject to a speed restriction of 20 knots.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of the Port of Corner Inlet and Port Albert specified below are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots:

- (i) For vessels of 25 metres or more in length the waters of Lewis Channel that are east of a line joining No. 14 Beacon Lewis Channel and No. 19 Buoy Lewis Channel.
- (ii) All the waters of the Port Albert Channel enclosed by a line joining the south-east corner of Port Albert Jetty to No. 20 Beacon thence to No. 13 Beacon thence northward to a speed limit notice on the foreshore at Magazine Point.
- (iii) All the waters of the Franklin River upstream from a speed limit notice situated on the bank at the mouth of that river.

3. Prohibition of specific activities for the purposes of Clause 12.

(a) The Master or person in charge of a vessel which is departing Lewis Channel must give way to any vessel that is navigating the Toora Channel.

(b) The Master or person in charge of a vessel 10 metres or more in length intending to proceed outward and in the Lewis Channel from the Shipping Pier or the Boat Harbour at Port Welshpool must not proceed whilst a vessel of 25 metres or more in length is proceeding inward in that channel.

(c) The Master or person in charge of a vessel of less than 10 metres in length intending to proceed outward from the Port Welshpool Boat Harbour must not proceed whilst an inward bound vessel of 25 metres or more in length is underway between the Shipping Pier and the Boat Harbour.

(d) The Master or person in charge of a vessel of 25 metres or more in length inward bound for Port Welshpool must not enter Lewis Channel whilst a vessel of 25 metres or more in length is proceeding outward bound in that channel.

SCHEDULE 133

WATERS—LAKE WOOROONOOK

Local Authority—The Council of the Shire of Charlton

1. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

Those waters of Lake Wooroonook that are within an area commencing at a point being the high water level 9 metres south-west of the boat ramp proceed at a magnetic bearing of 127° for 240 metres (following the line of the high water level), then a distance of 50 metres at a magnetic bearing of 222° to a red buoy, then a distance of 220 metres at a magnetic bearing of 307° to a red buoy, then a distance of 50 metres at a magnetic bearing of 16° to the point of commencement are prohibited to vessels.

SCHEDULE 134

WATERS—BRIDGEWATER LAKES (WITHIN DISCOVERY BAY COASTAL PARK)

Local Authority—Secretary of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources

1. Excluded speed limit for the purposes of Clause 3 (a).

Those waters of the Bridgewater Lakes not otherwise subject to a prohibition or otherwise designated for specific use under this Schedule are not subject to the requirements of Clause 3 (a) of this notice.

2. Access Lanes for the purposes of Clause 5.

The following waters of Bridgewater Lakes are access lanes:

(a) Those waters extending approximately 50 metres from the waters edge for the time being in an area approximately 20 metres wide with the northern boundary located 70 metres from the Clubhouse at the southern end of the lake and marked by green buoys.

(b) Those waters extending approximately 30 metres from the waters edge for the time being in an area approximately 20 metres wide adjacent to the beach at the northern end of the lake and marked by green buoys.

3. Speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

Those waters of Bridgewater Lakes which are not otherwise designated as an access lane or prohibited waters that are south of a line between two red markers located one each on opposite shores approximately 120 metres north-west and approximately 100 metres north respectively of the Clubhouse at the southern end of the lake are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

4. Prohibition on vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

Those waters of Bridgewater Lakes extending approximately 20 metres from the edge of the waters for the time being in an area approximately 30 metres wide with the northern boundary located approximately 50 metres north-west from the Clubhouse at the southern end of the lake and marked by red buoys are prohibited to vessels.

5. Prohibition on vessels with engines for the purposes of Clause 10.

Vessels with engines are prohibited within 15 metres of the reed beds or waters edge (where no reeds are present) except within those waters south of a line between two red markers located one each on opposite shores approximately 120 metres north-west and approximately 100 metres north respectively of the Club House at the southern end of the lake and those waters designated as access lanes.

6. Exclusive Use and Special Purpose Areas for the purposes of Clause 13.

(a) (i) Those waters of the Bridgewater Lakes north of a line between two red markers located one each on opposite shores approximately 120 metres north-west and approximately 100 metres north respectively of the Club House at the southern end of the lake area set aside for vessels with engines which are engaged in water-skiing, power ski activity or other power boating activities only during the following times:

December–February 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. summertime

March–May 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. EST
(11 a.m. to 7 p.m. summertime)

June–July 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. EST

August–November 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. EST

(ii) Despite 6 (a) (i), power ski, water-skiing and other powerboat activities may commence at 9 a.m. on those waters south of a line between two white markers one each on opposite shores approximately 1400 metres north of the Club House in the northerly part of the lake.

(b) Fishing from boats and SCUBA diving may only be undertaken in those waters pursuant to Item 6, during those times when water-skiing, power ski and other power boating activities are not permitted in those waters.

(c) The water of Bridgewater Lakes set aside for a slalom course and ski jumping area are the waters within an area approximately 80 metres wide by 200 metres long marked on its perimeter by red and yellow buoys located approximately 600 metres north of the Club House.

7. Direction of Travel for the purposes of Clause 14.

A person must operate a vessel with an engine in a clockwise direction in relation to the approximate centre of the waterway.

1. 10 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

Port Authority—Port of Melbourne Authority

1. Prohibition of specific activities for the purposes of Clause 12.

The following waters of Bass Strait are prohibited for the use of power skis:

The waters of Bass Strait that are between two lines passing through separate sets of beacons in line on the foreshore, between Point Roadknight Headland and a point approximately 300 metres north of the boat ramp located in Roadknight Bay, and extending 200 metres to seaward from the low water mark.

1. Excluded speed limit for the purposes of Clause 3 (a).

The waters of Lake Meering not otherwise specified as a speed restriction zone or an area prohibited to vessels are excluded from the requirements of Clause 3 (a) of this notice.

2. Access lane for the purposes of Clause 5.

The waters of Lake Meering between two signposts located on the shore 147 metres and 207 metres east of the boatramp and extending approximately 50 metres from the shore with the

outer limit marked by green buoys are an access lane.

3. 5 knot speed restriction zone for the purposes of Clause 7.

The waters of Lake Meering that—

(a) are within 50 metres of the waters edge;

(b) generally lie to the south and west of a line of yellow buoys located between a signpost on Condelys Point and another signpost on the eastern shore—

are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots.

4. Area prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Lake Meering between two signposts located on the shore 30 metres and 107 metres east of the boatramp and extending approximately 70 metres from the shore with the outer limit marked by red buoys are prohibited to vessels.

Notice is hereby given under Regulation 800 (3) of the Marine (Fees) Regulations 1988 made under the provisions of the *Marine Act 1988* of exemptions as described in this notice from the requirement of an owner of a recreational vessel to pay a boating facilities and safety education fee paid in respect of the vessel as prescribed in Regulation 800 (1) of the Regulations.

*General Exemptions from Payment of a Boating
Facilities and Safety Education Fee*

1. The owner of a recreational vessel of a class described in this clause is exempt from the requirement to pay a boating facilities and safety education fee in respect of the vessel as prescribed in Regulation 800 (1) of the Marine (Fees) Regulations, subject to the conditions (if any) specified below—

- (a) a Government vessel; and
- (b) a vessel of a statutory corporation; and
- (c) a vessel displaying a special identification plate; and
- (d) a vessel which—
 - (i) is temporarily being operated on State waters; and
 - (ii) is exempt from registration as a vessel in the State or Territory of

the Commonwealth in which the owner of the vessel ordinarily resides; and

- (e) a vessel which—
 - (i) is temporarily being operated on State waters; and
 - (ii) is registered as a vessel in a State or Territory of the Commonwealth; and
 - (iii) displays in accordance with any Act or regulation of the State or Territory an identifying plate, mark or number issued or allocated by the relevant authority for the vessel; and
- (f) a hire and drive vessel which complies with the requirements of Part 6, Division 2 of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations 1988; and
- (g) a vessel operated by a unit of the Australian Sea Cadets Corps.

*Exemption from Payment of a Boating Facilities
and Safety Education Fee—Discharged
Members of the Forces*

2. A discharged member of the forces who by reason of incapacity sustained or suffered as a result of war service is assessed pursuant to the *Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986* of the Commonwealth—

- (a) as being totally incapacitated; or
- (b) as being seriously impeded in his or her powers of locomotion and incapacitated to an extent of not less than seventy five per centum—

is exempt from the requirement to pay a boating facilities and safety education fee in respect of a recreational vessel as prescribed in Regulation 800 (1) of the Marine (Fees) Regulations 1988, subject to the Marine Board of Victoria being satisfied by such evidence as it may require in a particular case that—

- (c) the vessel is owned by the applicant; and
- (d) the applicant is incapacitated as specified; and
- (e) the vessel will not be used for carrying passengers or goods for hire or reward; and
- (f) the vessel will be used primarily for the conveyance of the discharged serviceman and his or her spouse and other family members; and

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- (g) an exemption is appropriate in the circumstances of the case.

Notice is hereby given under Regulation 200 (3) of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations 1988 made under the provisions of the *Marine Act 1988* of exemptions as described in this notice from the requirement of an owner of a vessel to register his or her vessel as prescribed in Regulation 200(1) of the Regulations.

General Exemptions from Registration

1. The owner of a vessel of a class described in this clause is exempt from the requirement to register his or her vessel as prescribed in Regulation 200 (1) of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations 1988, subject to the conditions (if any) specified below—

- (a) a vessel which does not have an engine that is used or capable of being used for propulsion; and
- (b) a Government vessel; and
- (c) a vessel of a statutory corporation; and
- (d) a commercial fishing vessel; and
- (e) a commercial trading vessel; and
- (f) a vessel which—
 - (i) is temporarily being operated on State waters; and
 - (ii) is exempt from registration as a vessel in the State or Territory of the Commonwealth in which the owner of the vessel ordinarily resides; and
- (g) a vessel which—
 - (i) is temporarily being operated on State waters; and
 - (ii) is registered as a vessel in a State or Territory of the Commonwealth; and
 - (iii) displays in accordance with any Act or Regulation of the State or Territory an identifying plate, mark or number issued or allocated by the relevant authority for the vessel; and

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- (h) a hire and drive vessel which complies with the requirements of Part 6, Division 2 of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations 1988.

Exemptions from Registration—Manufacturers and Dealers

2. (1) A manufacturer or dealer in recreational vessels with engines used or capable of being used for propulsion who pays the appropriate fees prescribed in the Marine (Fees) Regulations 1988 and receives from the Marine Board of Victoria a special identification mark and a special identification plate in respect of a recreational vessel, is exempt from the requirement to register the vessel under Regulation 200 (1) of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations in respect of the vessel to which the special identification mark and special identification plate applies, when the special identification plate is displayed on the vessel and vessel is used—

- (a) for the following trade purposes:
 - (i) operating the vessel from place to place while in the process of manufacture; or
 - (ii) operating the vessel from the place of manufacture to the place where it will be offered for sale; or
 - (iii) testing the vessel; or
 - (iv) demonstrating the vessel to a purchaser or prospective purchaser; or
 - (v) delivering the vessel for or after sale; or
 - (b) for the purposes of repair; or
 - (c) during the process of repair; or
 - (d) for the purposes of returning it to the owner after repair.
- (2) The exemption from registration prescribed in sub-clause (1) applies only if the following conditions are observed:
- (a) A person must not operate the vessel displaying a special identification plate unless he or she—
 - (i) is a manufacturer of or dealer in vessels or is a person employed by a manufacturer of or dealer in vessels; and
 - (ii) is operating the vessel for a purpose specified in sub-clause (1).
 - (b) The manufacturer of or dealer in vessels to whom a special

identification plate has been issued by the Marine Board of Victoria must—

- (i) ensure that the plate is fixed to an unregistered vessel where it can best be seen with every letter, figure and symbol on the plate upright and easily distinguishable at a distance of 20 metres from the vessel; and
 - (ii) keep at his or her registered office or place of business a record of the name and address of each person who operates a vessel on which the special identification plate is displayed.
- (c) A manufacturer or dealer in vessels must not enter any particulars which he or she knows or should reasonably have known to be false in any records required to be kept under paragraph (b).

Notice is hereby given under Regulation 603 (4) of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations 1988 made under the provisions of the *Marine Act 1988* of exemptions as described in this notice from the equipment requirements prescribed in Regulations 603 (2) and 603 (3) of the Regulations.

Revocations

This notice revokes all notices previously made under Regulation 603 (4) of the Marine (Vessels) Regulation 1988. These are—

- (1) The notice published in the *Government Gazette* on 21 December 1988, in issue G49 at page 3856; and
- (2) The notice published in the *Government Gazette* on 19 September 1990, in issue G37 at page 2809.

Interpretation

1. In this notice—

“Approved buoyancy garment” means an approved buoyancy garment defined in

Regulation 103 of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations 1988.

“Approved buoyancy vest” means an approved buoyancy vest defined in Regulation 103 of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations 1988.

“Approved lifejacket” means an approved lifejacket defined in Regulation 103 of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations 1988.

“Approved personal flotation device type 1” means an approved personal flotation device type 1 defined in Regulation 103 of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations 1988.

“Approved personal flotation device Type 2” means an approved personal flotation device defined in Regulation 103 of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations 1988.

“Approved personal flotation device Type 3” means an approved personal flotation device defined in Regulation 103 of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations 1988.

“Sailing vessel” means a vessel solely powered by sail.

“Smooth or enclosed waters” has the same meaning as in regulation 603 (1) of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations 1988.

“Tender” means a vessel not more than 5 metres in length which is used as a means of transportation on any inland waters or on the waters of a port or an associated port—

- (a) between the shore and another vessel not more than 300 metres from the shore; or
- (b) between vessels which are not more than 300 metres from the shore.

Total Exemptions from Equipment Requirements

2. A person operating a vessel of a class described in this clause is exempt from the equipment requirements prescribed in Regulations 603 (2) and 603 (3) of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations 1988, subject to the conditions (if any) specified below—

- (a) All racing shells whilst actually engaged in racing or bona fide training.
- (b) A tender.
- (c) A sailing vessel including a sailboard, catamaran or other similar vessel which does not have permanent accommodation but has a permanently enclosed hull, if each occupant of the vessel wears an approved lifejacket, an approved buoyancy garment, an approved buoyancy vest or an

- approved personal flotation device Type 1, Type 2 or Type 3 at all times.
- (d) A canoe, kayak or other vessel of similar construction if each occupant of the vessel wears an approved lifejacket, an approved buoyancy garment, an approved buoyancy vest or an approved personal flotation device Type 1, Type 2 or Type 3 at all times.
 - (e) A motorized jet-ski or similar vessel if each or any occupant of the vessel wears an approved lifejacket, an approved buoyancy garment, an approved buoyancy vest or an approved personal flotation device Type 1, Type 2 or Type 3 at all times.
 - (f) All vessels used by lifesaving clubs affiliated with the Royal Lifesaving Society (Australia) and the Surf Lifesaving Association (Australia) State Centre for and in connection with lifesaving if the vessels are actively engaged in lifesaving patrols or duties off the beaches.
 - (g) A canoe or kayak whilst engaged in competing in a marathon or long distance race or a sprint race, conducted by or with the approval of the Victorian Amateur Canoe Association (Inc.) or any club affiliated with that Association, not being a race any part of which is conducted on water forming rapids.
 - (h) A canoe or kayak each occupant of which is a person registered with the Victorian Amateur Canoe Association (Inc.) as a competitor eligible to compete in races of the kinds described in sub-clause (g), whilst engaged in bona fide training.
 - (i) All vessels engaged in competing in a power boat race on smooth or enclosed waters when under the supervision of the Australian Power Boat Association and the race is conducted in accordance with the Racing and Safety Rules of that Association and the operator of the vessel and any occupant being carried wears an approved personal flotation device type 1, type 2 or type 3, an approved lifejacket, an approved buoyancy vest or an approved buoyancy garment.
 - (j) All vessels fitted with a reinforced cockpit approved by the Australian Power Boat Association and engaged in competing in a power boat race on smooth or enclosed waters when under the supervision of the Association and the race is conducted in accordance with the Racing and Safety Rules of that Association and the operator of the vessel and any occupant being carried wears an approved personal flotation device type 1, type 2 or type 3, an approved lifejacket, an approved buoyancy vest or an approved buoyancy garment or some other type of buoyancy equipment which the Association has specifically approved.

Limited Exemptions from Equipment Requirements

3. A person operating a vessel of a class described in this clause is exempt from the particular equipment requirements specified in this clause and prescribed in Regulations 603 (2) and 603 (3) of the Marine (Vessels) Regulations 1988, subject to the conditions (if any) specified below—

3. (a) A sailing vessel of less than 5 metres in length is exempt from the requirement to carry in anchor and anchor cable.

(b) A sailing vessel of less than 5 metres in length is exempt from the requirement to carry torches or lanterns when engaged in organised racing in daytime.

(c) A sailing vessel 12 metres or more in length which is used solely as a recreational vessel is exempt from the requirement to carry a dinghy or liferaft.

(d) Sailing vessels used for racing are exempt from the requirement to carry lifejackets or personal flotation devices Type 1 where each crew member on board wears either an approved buoyancy garment or an approved buoyancy vest or an approved personal flotation device Type 2 or Type 3 at all times when the vessel is underway.


