FISHERIES (SCALLOP FISHING—PORT PHILLIP BAY FISHERY) NOTICE No. 20/1994

Objectives

1. The objectives of this Notice are to—
 - (a) fix a close season for scallop fishing in specified areas of Port Phillip Bay; and
 - (b) fix a catch rate limit (bag limit); and
 - (c) set times when fishing is permitted; and
 - (d) specify other management arrangements—
for scallops taken from Port Phillip Bay for the period commencing on 5 September 1994 and ending on 4 December 1994.

Authorising provision

2. This notice is made under section 80 of the Fisheries Act 1968.

Commencement

3. This Notice commences on 5 September 1994.

Revocation

4. The *Fisheries (Scallop Fishing—Port Phillip Bay Fishery) Notice No. 17/1994 is revoked.

Definitions

5. "Act" means the Fisheries Act 1968;

"Crate" means a wire mesh container with external dimension not exceeding 100 centimetres by 50 centimetres by 50 centimetres and constructed as specified in the diagram in Schedule 2 of the **Fishing (Scallop) Regulations 1985.

Close season

6. (1) A person must not, during the period commencing on 5 September 1994 and ending on 4 December 1994—

- (a) use a dredge for taking scallops from the waters of that part of Port Phillip Bay described in the Schedule to this Notice; or
- (b) have a scallop dredge on board any boat on the waters of that part of Port Phillip Bay described in the Schedule to this Notice.

(2) The provisions of paragraph (1) (b) do not apply to a person proceeding via the most direct route to waters outside the area described in the Schedule.

Fishing times

7. Subject to clause 6 and to section 15 (1) (h) of the Act the holder of a scallop licence endorsed "valid for scallop fishing in all Victorian waters" or "valid for scallop fishing in the waters of Port Phillip Bay" must only dredge for or take scallops for sale from the waters of Port Phillip Bay—

- (a) on any Monday, on any Tuesday, on any Wednesday and on any Thursday; and
- (b) between the hours of 5.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. on the days on which dredging for or taking scallops is permitted under paragraph (a).

Catch limits

8. A master fisherman operating a registered fishing boat for which an appropriately endorsed scallop licence has been issued, must not take from Port Phillip Bay or have on board that boat on Port Phillip Bay more than five (5) crates of scallops on any one day.

9. A master fisherman in charge of a boat must ensure that any scallops taken from Port Phillip Bay are not contained on board or landed in any container other than a crate.

10. A master fisherman in charge of a boat must ensure that when a crate containing scallops is landed that the crate is closed and the pin inserted.

Penalty

11. Any person who contravenes any provision of this Notice is liable to a penalty of 20 penalty units.

Schedule

Area in which a close season applies

All the waters to the east of a straight line running between the eastern edge of the Portarlington Pier and the southern bank of the western side of the mouth of the Werribee River.

KNOX PLANNING SCHEME

**Notice of Approval of Amendment
Amendment L79**

The Minister for Planning has approved Amendment L79 to the Local Section of the Knox Planning Scheme.

The amendment comes into operation on the date this notice is published in the Government Gazette.

The amendment alters the site specific controls over the former Swagman site, 1009 Burwood Highway, situated to the north-west corner of Burwood Highway and Station Street, Ferntree Gully (Plan of Consolidation 352356H) which is located in the Knox Commercial General Zone to enable the responsible authority to consider the granting of a permit to use the land for a restaurant, place of assembly and an amusement parlour.
