Health Services Act 1988 AMALGAMATION OF WIMMERA BASE HOSPITAL AND DIMBOOLA DISTRICT HOSPITAL TO BE KNOWN AS WIMMERA HEALTH CARE GROUP

The Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Minister for Health made after receiving advice from the Secretary to the Department of Health and Community Services ("the Secretary") under section 64A of the Health Service Act 1988 ("the Act"), and acting under section 65 of that Act, by this Order—

- 1. Directs under section 65 (1) of the Act, that the Wimmera Base Hospital and the Dimboola District Hospital be amalgamated.
- 2. Specifies under section 65 (2) of the Act, 1 November 1995 as the date that—
 - (a) the incorporation of Wimmera Base Hospital and Dimboola District Hospital, each being registered funded agencies, under the Health Services Act 1988 shall be cancelled; and
 - (b) a new registered funded agency to be known as the Wimmera Health Care Group comes into existence as if on that date it had been incorporated under the Health Services Act 1988;
 - (c) the initial board of management of the Wimmera Health Care Group shall be constituted as specified in the table below and appointed for the terms as specified below:

- 3. Orders under section 65 (3) of the Act that:
 - (a) the by-laws of the Wimmera Health Care Group shall be the by-laws approved by the delegate of the Secretary on 5 October 1995 and as altered by the Wimmera Health Care Group from time to time in accordance with the Health Services Act 1988; and
 - (b) the objects of the Wimmera Health Care Group shall be the objects approved by the delegate of the Secretary on 5 October 1995 and as altered by the Wimmera Health Care Group from time to time in accordance with the Health Services Act 1988.
- 4. Declares under section 65 (4) of the Act, that the new registered funded agency named the Wimmera Health Care Group shall be a public hospital.
- 5. Amends pursuant to section 8 (1) (a) and (b) of the Act, Schedule 1 by:
 - (a) removing the names of Wimmera Base Hospital and Dimboola District Hospital; and

(b) adding the name of Wimmera Health Care Group;

to take effect from 1 November 1995.

Stock Diseases Act 1968 DECLARATION OF A DISEASE AND A CONTROL AREA FOR RABBIT CALICIVIRUS DISEASE

The Governor in Council, acting under section 4 of the Stock Diseases Act 1968, hereby—

1. Declares the following contagious or infectious disease to which any stock is subject to be a disease for the purposes of the Act—

Enzootic Disease: Rabbit Calicivirus Disease

- 2. Declares the State of Victoria to be a control area in respect of rabbit calicivirus disease (RCD) in domesticated rabbits;
- 3. Declares that the following requirement is to operate in the control area:

The Chief Inspector of Stock may release RCD vaccine to registered veterinary surgeons to administer to rabbits under domestic control on the following conditions—

- * that the distributors of the vaccine keep records of—
 - the doses distributed to registered veterinary surgeons;
 - the date of distribution; and
 - supply details of the distribution to the Chief Inspector of Stock on a weekly basis;
- * that the registered veterinary surgeons must—
 - only apply the vaccine to rabbits under domestic control not being wild rabbits;
 - only use the vaccine in accordance with the manufacturer's written instructions;
 - optimise the use of the vaccine by scheduling vaccine use to maximise the number of rabbits vaccinated out of each bottle;

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- maintain a record of all vaccine use by date, owner and address;
- forward vaccination schedules to the Chief Inspector of Stock weekly; and
- advise the Chief Inspector of Stock of any adverse reactions to the vaccine within 48 hours of the
