1. This by-law may be cited as By-law No. 3 Duck Shooting.

Objectives

2. The objective of this By-law is to regulate the shooting of game birds on Authority property during the open season declared under the provisions of the Wildlife Act 1975.

Authorising Provision

3. This By-law is made under the provisions of section 160 of the Water Act 1989.

Definitions

- 4. In this By-law—
- "Act" means the Water Act 1989.
- "Authority" means the Goulburn-Murray Rural Water Authority.
 - "Authorised Officer" means-
 - (a) any officer or employee of the Authority;
 - (b) any person appointed in writing by the Authority as an authorised officer for the purpose of the by-law.

"Authority property" includes any lands, works or waters vested in or under the control of the Authority.

"Motor Boat" has the same meaning as contained in the Wildlife (Game) Regulations 1990.

"Game Birds" means those birds described in Part 2 of the second schedule of the Wildlife (Game) Regulations 1990 but excluding therefrom those birds commonly known as Stubble Quail and Latham's or Japanese Snipe.

Shooting

5. A person must not shoot game birds on Authority property—

(b) within the shooting exclusion zones specified in Schedule 2, Schedule 3 and Schedule 4.

Structures and Buildings

6. A person must not shoot within one kilometre of any Authority structure, house or other building located on Authority property.

Shooting from boats

- 7. (a) A person must not hunt or take game birds from a motor boat whose motor is running, whether in gear or not, on Authority property.
 - (b) Sub-clause (a) does not apply to a motor boat under power which is operating at a speed of 5 knots or less for the purposes of retrieving dead or wounded game birds.

Dogs

8. A person may use a dog solely for the retrieval of wild ducks and allow that dog to enter the water for that purpose.

Directions to leave

- (a) An authorised officer may direct any person who offends against this by-law to leave Authority property.
 - (b) A person must comply immediately with any such direction.

Penalty

 A person who contravenes this by-law is liable to a penalty not exceeding 20 penalty units.

Power to require person to state name and address

11. An Authorised Officer may require a person to state his or her name and address if that officer has reasonable grounds for believing that he or she has committed an offence against this by-law.




