



WE, the Honorable William Pearson, M.L.C., William Patten, George Cornelius Gooch, and George Campbell Coulson, the duly appointed committee of management of the reserve for a Raccourse in the parish of Sale, laving framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other

charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regula-tions to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the Land Act 1890.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

 2. No person, except the members of the committee of management, shall be permitted to enter the grand stand or against the control of the committee of management. ment, shall be permitted to enter the grand stand, or any enclosure within the reserve without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers, or climb, jump over, remove, or destroy the fences or gates, or roll or throw stones or glass in or upon the reserve; nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management.
- 4. No person shall graze upon the reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, or goats, or put therein any pigs or geese without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, or in liquidation of any liability already incurred in the crection of improvements, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- 5. No person shall be permitted to discharge firearms within the reserve unless the written permission of the committee of management be first obtained.
- No person shall be permitted to train any horse within the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management.
- 7. No person shall erect within the reserve any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
- 8. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
- 9. No person shall be allowed to cart any material through or within the reserve, nor remove any turf or other material from any part thereof, nor shall any loaded dray, cart, or waggon be driven through or within the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management.
- 10. No person, unless authorized by the committee of management, shall ride or drive any animal with or without vehicles upon that part of the reserve used for racing purposes.
- 11. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the grand stand and saddling paddock, and the remainder of the reserve :—

 For admission of each person to the grand stand £ s. d. and saddling paddock, on such days as the reserve may be set apart for racing, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding.
- 12. No person shall, after the 17th day of September, 1891, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker except in and on such portions of the reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the

Second.—That during the time he shall be in or upon the reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker he shall wear a ticket to be supplied by the committee of management of the reserve or the committee or stewards of the Sale Racing Club, or those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards, which ticket shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

AS THE HANGING ROCK WATER AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works, and the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Newham, in respect of the Reserve for Public Recreation, and for affording access to Water in the parish of Newham, known as the "Hanging Rock Water and Recreation Reserve," it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a place for recreation and amusement, and for affording access to water, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor, or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the colony of Victoria with the consent of the Executive Conneil thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works, and the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shiro of Newham: And whereas by section 137 of the Land Act 1890, it is provided that where any such land has been vested in trustees or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in clause 1 of the said section. Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the Shire of Newham do hereby make the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve for public recreation, and for affording access to water, in the parish of Newham, known as the Hanging Rock Water and Recreation Reserve.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding seven (7) in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions fees as under may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve:

6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the trustees first

obtained.

7. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

8. No person shall interfere with the fish, birds, or animals, or commit any nuisance, or leave bottles or broken glass in the

No person shall in any way break up or disturb the soil of

9. No person shall in any way break up or disturb the soil of the reserve.

10. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the reserve any goods, articles, or things of any description without having first obtained the permission, in writing, of the trustees.

11. No races or sports shall be held in the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the trustees.

12. All revenue derived from the reserve shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement thereof.

13. Nothing contained in the foregoing regulations shall in any way restrict the right of the public to the free use of the reserve for obtaining water for domestic purposes or of the unenclosed portion thereof for watering stock.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 137 of the Land Act 1890, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and overy person who so offends and who, after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the trustees or by any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such officer, servant, or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Fin pounds.

DIRECTORS' REPORT.

THE Board of Management have great pleasure in presenting to the shareholders the First Annual Report and Balancesheet of the Yarra Yarra Starr-Bowkett Building Society, with the fullest confidence that the result will be deemed eminently

the fullest confidence that the result will be deemed eminently satisfactory.

In consequence of the rapidity with which the shares were taken up (the total number, 5,000, having been sold in about five weeks), the success of the society was assured from its very inception, as the Board of Management were enabled to commence the real business of the society, viz., the granting of loans, within one week after the first pay day, and since then the monthly meetings for ballots and sales have taken place with the greatest regularity. During the year members have obtained appropriations amounting to 27,500. Of these, appropriations to the extent of £5,000 were carried through, and others to the amount of £2,500 were in the course of completion at the close of the society's books. The amount of £3,430 has been sold at premiums amounting in cumulo to £4,133. Of these advances by sale, loans to the extent of £4,850 were completed, and the remaining loans, to the extent of £1,600, werein the course of completion at the close of the financial year. They have since been completed.

In estimating the value of properties accepted as securities, the Board of Management have only had regard to the present saleable prices, and not to the prices which the various properties might fairly be expected to realize in better times. It is also satisfactory to state that none of the society's securities were in any way affected by the recent disastrous floods, and that all the borrowers are making their repayments with great regularity.

As will be observed from a glance at the Supplementary Statement appended to the balance-sheet, the total profits accruing from the past year's transactions, which will in the ordinary course be available for distribution among the members at the termination of the society, amount to the handsome sum of £4,156 0s. 1d.

In conclusion, the Board of Management think that, considering the universal depression in all branches of trade which has existed in the colony during the past year, the wonderful success of the society justifies their opinion that the members may look forward with confidence to the prospect of a still more lucrative business being done in the future.

The retiring members of the board are Messrs. Beazley, Owen, and Fawcett, who, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.
